TONIGHT’S GAME: The St. Louis Cardinals play the final of a three-game series against the Chicago Cubs and the last of a nine-game road trip. The Cardinals are 4-4 with a three-game sweep of Cleveland and were on the losing end of a three-game sweep in Pittsburgh. Following tonight’s game on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball, the Cardinals return home for a six-game homestand into the All-Star Break against Washington and Atlanta.

RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals rallied from a 5-3 deficit to an 8-6 win over their N.L. Central Division rivals, the Chicago Cubs. St. Louis scored five runs in the 8th inning for their 22nd comeback of the season as **Johel Pozo** crushed a pinch-hit three-run home run in the 8th inning onto Waveland Avenue.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis entered today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 5.5 games behind first place Chicago and 1.5 games behind Milwaukee for 2nd place. St. Louis is tied for the 3rd Wild Card position with San Diego and San Francisco, two teams they have yet to play this season.

ESPN SUNDAY NIGHT BASEBALL: St. Louis is 62-68 all-time on the nationally televised ESPN Sunday Night Game of the Week. Tonight is the Cardinals 2nd game on ESPN this season: losing 18-7 to the Boston Red Sox on April 6, as part of a split doubleheader at Fenway Park.

NATIONAL NEWS: During this nine-game road trip, the Cardinals have been televised nationally four times, twice on Apple TV+ (CLE & CHI), once on Roku (CLE) and finish with ESPN Sunday Night Baseball (CHI). St. Louis is 3-0 on National televised games this trip.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: With a win today, the Cardinals would have a winning road trip, marking their second straight of nine games or more after going 7-2 (May 9-18) at WSH, PHI & KC. St. Louis is looking to win their first series at Wrigley Field since June 14-16, 2024.

A BOOM AND A BUNT: **Lars Nootbaar** dropped a bunt last night to keep the Cardinals rally going in the 8th inning leading to a five-run eighth inning. Nootbaar is one of four players, and joins his Cardinals teammate **Alec Burleson** (11 HR-1 bunt hit), to lead his team in home runs and also have a bunt base hit along with the Royals’ **Vinnie Pasquantino** (14-1) and Orioles’ **Cedric Mullins** (13-5). *-Elias Sports Bureau*

DON’T CALL IT A COMEBACK: With the five-run 8th inning, the St. Louis Cardinals completed their 22nd comeback of the season, tied with the Miami Marlins for the 9th-most in Major League Baseball. The Cardinals have four wins when trailing after seven innings.

OH, NO, IT’S POZO!: With his pinch-hit three-run home run last night, **Johel Pozo** tied **Justin-Henry Malloy** of the Detroit Tigers for the most RBI (5) as a pinch-hitter this season. Pozo is one of 33 players to hit a pinch-hit home run, and the only Cardinals player, this season. The last Cardinal with a pinch-hit blast was **Brendan Donovan** vs. Cincinnati on Sept. 12, 2024. In the era since 2022 when designated hitters have been used in both leagues, Pozo ranks T-3rd among Cardinals in pinch-hit RBI with five behind **Albert Pujols** (8) and **Luken Baker** (6). Pozo’s 5 RBI as a pinch-hitter are two shy of the single-season mark by a Cardinals player with seven held by **Tim McCarver** in 1974, the last player with more than five.

CHANGES IN LATITUDES, CHANGES IN ATTITUDE: At the conclusion of this series with the Cubs, the Cardinals will have played 48 straight road games in the Eastern or Central Time Zone to begin the season. The next 12 road games will be in the Mountain or Pacific Time Zones as the Cardinals have yet to play a National League West opponent on the road and only the Texas Rangers (Central Time Zone) from the American League West. Coming out of the All-Star Break, the Cardinals play at Arizona, Colorado, San Diego and Los Angeles-NL.

CHICAGO CUBS CONNECTIONS

Willson Contreras played parts of seven seasons with the Cubs (2016-22)...was a three-time All-Star and member of the 2016 World Series Champions...originally signed as an international free agent with Chicago (July 2, 2009).

Sonny Gray was originally selected by the Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend Vanderbilt University.

Stubby Clapp (June 18, 2001 at Busch II) made his MLB debut vs. the Cubs.

Brant Brown was the Cubs 3rd round draft pick in 1992 and played parts of four seasons (1996-98 & 2000) with the North Siders.

Chip Caray served as the Cubs play-by-play announcer for seven seasons (1998-2004) on WGN...his grandfather, **Harry Caray**, spent the final 16 years of his career broadcasting Cubs games (1982-97).

Daniel Descalso played his final MLB season with the Cubs in 2019.

Jon Jay played in 141 games for the Cubs in 2017 and was part of their playoff run to the NLCS.

Lars Nootbaar and **Shota Imanaga** were teammates on Gold Medal winning Team Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Yohel Pozo’s father, also named Yohel, played 36 games for the Rockies/Cubs partner team in the Arizona Rookie League in 1992.

Carson Kelly was drafted by St. Louis in 2012 and played three seasons (2016-18) for the Cardinals.

Cubs Scouting VP **Dan Kantrovitz** previously was Cardinals Scouting Director (2012-14)...2001 Cards 25th Rd. draft pick from Brown Univ...took first job in MLB as the Cardinals Scouting Coordinator.

Nolan Gorman won the 2017 Under Armour High School All-America Game HR Derby at Wrigley Field.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Marquee Sports Network Analyst **Rick Sutcliffe** played for St. Louis in 1994.

Cardinals VP/Special Projects **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

Cubs Special Assistant to the GM **Jaron Madison** previously served as the Cardinals Assistant Director of Scouting (2008-09).

Drew Pomeranz’s older brother, **Stu**, was selected by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2003 MLB Draft and pitched five minor league seasons with the Cardinals (2003-07).

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is making his team-leading 18th start of the season (151st career appearance and 137th start).
- **Trying to move past his struggles of late June when he allowed 7 runs in back/back starts against the Cubs (6/25) & Pirates (6/30)**
- **He'd posted a 2.49 ERA and 1.29 WHIP in his 1st four starts during June**, before his June totals ballooned to a 5.93 ERA & 1.69 WHIP after final two starts of the month.
- **Has gone without a win in 9 straight starts** since his CG shutout of the Washington Nationals on 5/9 and has not been credited with a Home win since 5/4 vs. NYM.
- Since throwing his complete game/shutout at WSH (5/9) is 0-5 with a 5.28 ERA including four no-decisions.
- **Has received just eight runs of support since May 10; His 1.57 run support average over that period is BY FAR the lowest in MLB (Luis Ortiz, CLE - 2.10)**
- Has received just two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 17 starts, however was given 10 runs when he throw a complete-game shutout vs. his former team on May 9 at Washington.
- The Cardinals are 5-12 in his starts in 2025, six of which were quality starts. Has pitched 5.0 innings or more in 15 of his 17 starts.
- Issued 3+ walks in 9 of 17 starts (team-leading 3.98 BB/9 IP, 2nd-highest in N.L.)
- Hadn't allowed a HR in 4-straight starts (6/1-6/19) before allowing a career-high 3 HRs (7th time) in 3.2 IP vs. Cubs on 6/25.
- Is 2nd on the team in total chances (19) amongst the Redbirds pitchers trailing only **Andre Pallante** (27).

LAST TIME OUT: Held the Pirates to just one run (solo HR) over his first 4.0 IP last Mon. (6/30) at PNC Park before taking on water during a 6-run Buccos 5th; It marked his 2nd consecutive start allowing 7 runs; He received zero run support over his 5.0 IP, his 2nd consecutive start with no run support (8-0 & 7-0 losses).

2025 NOTES:

- Holds the Cardinals longest scoreless innings streak this season at 14.2 IP (May 9-14).
- Went his first eight starts at Busch Stadium dating back to last season without allowing a home run before Kerry Carpenter hit one to lead off the game vs. DET (5/20/25). Also snapped his season homerless streak at 28.1 innings.
- Scattered six hits over 9.0 innings in his first complete game/shutout of his career at WSH (5/9), besting his original drafting team (WSH, 1st, 2014) in a 10-0 win. Became the 1st Cardinal with a whitewash since Jordan Montgomery blanked the Cubs on 8/22/22 at Wrigley Field. I was his first appearance at Nationals Park since leaving his drafting organization after 2022.
- His 6.0 no-hit innings on 4/9 at PIT represented the deepest that he had carried a no-no at the MLB level (previous best was 3.0 IP - last on 6/18/21 vs. NYM).

CAREER NOTES:

- Has entered his 8th season in Major League Baseball and his 2nd to begin a season with the Cardinals. Has previously pitched for the Nationals (2017-22) and White Sox (2024) in MLB.
- Went 2-5 with a 3.72 ERA in his 10 starts with the Cardinals last season and had a 7-4 mark with 3.11 ERA in 21 starts for the White Sox.
- Was acquired by the St. Louis Cardinals with OF Tommy Pham in a three-team/nine-player trade from the Chicago White Sox which included the Los Angeles Dodgers on July 29, 2024.
- Played one season for NC Dinos of the KBO League in 2023 where he led the league in wins (20), ERA (2.00), strikeouts (209) and WHIP (0.95) over 30 starts covering 180.1 innings pitched.
- Earned the 2023 Choi Dong-won Award, annually awarded to the best pitcher in the KBO League.
- Played high school baseball at Las Vegas High School where he was teammates with Bryce Harper.

FEDDE vs. CHICAGO (N.L.):

- Making his 6th career appearance and start against the Cubs; It's his 2nd start against the Cubs this season & his 3rd start as a member of the Cardinals.
- Is 0-2, 7.92 ERA career against the Cubs in his previous starts, including an 0-1 mark last season as he appeared at Wrigley Field on 6/5 with the White Sox and on 8/2 for the Cardinals.
- Allowed lead-off HR (Happ) among a career-high tying 3 HR's as he fell 8-0 to the Cubs on 6/25 at Busch Stadium. Failed to reach 5.0 IP for only the 2nd time in his 17 starts this season as he was knocked from game after 3.2 IP, allowing a season-high 7 runs.
- Has been dinged for 10 HR's in 25.0 IP, including 5 HR's in his three career starts at Wrigley Field.
- Is 0-1 career at Wrigley Field in three starts, working 5.0+ IP in all three.
- In 25 career games (24 starts) against N.L. Central opponents, is 4-8 with a 5.94 ERA; Has lost 7-straight decisions to NL Central clubs with last win coming on 6/10/22 vs. MIL.
