Wins in Fried Starts

Atlanta is just 6-6 in Max Fried's last 12 starts, despite him compiling a 2.47 ERA (20 ER/73.0 IP) and a .217 average against.

The Braves have 69 wins in games started by Fried since the beginning of 2019, the most such wins by a pitcher in the National League. Only Gerrit Cole, whose teams have won 71 of his starts, has more in the majors.

The Braves have not lost consecutive starts by Fried since mid May...Atlanta lost to the Phillies in his last turn.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets open a three-game series tonight with the 17th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...The two teams have not met since August 15-18 here in Atlanta, when the Braves took three-of-four.

A The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their NL East rivals for the fourth consecutive season...They went 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...The Braves need to sweep all three games this weekend to avoid losing the season series.

A The Braves won the last time these two met, August 18, in an identical matchup of tonight's starting pitchers...Atlanta plated a run in the seventh inning to take a 3-2 lead that would stand as the final score, giving Max Fried (7.0 IP, four hits, two runs) his 11th win of the season...Jacob deGrom allowed five hits and three runs over 6.2 innings in his first loss of the year.

A Atlanta is 7-9 against New York this season, but has outscored the Mets by nine runs in their 16 games...The Braves have tallied 76 runs and are averaging 4.8 runs/game, while New York has scored 67 times and is averaging 4.2 runs/game in their matchups.

A LH Max Fried has made 20 career appearances and 15 starts against New York, and is 6-5 with a 2.84 ERA (29 ER/92.0 IP)...Atlanta is an even 10-10 in his 20 total games against the Mets... In four starts this season, he is 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (8 ER/24.0 IP) and 22 strikeouts...Fried has made seven career starts against the Mets here in Atlanta, and has yet to allow more than two runs in a turn...He is 4-2 with a 2.48 ERA (11 ER/40.0 IP) against New York here, and Atlanta is 5-2 in his seven starts as a club.

A RH Jacob deGrom is 10-8 with a 2.08 ERA (40 ER/172.2 IP) in 27 career games, all starts, against Atlanta...He has struck out 222 and walked 35 in his career against the Braves...In two starts against Atlanta this season, deGrom is 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA, allowing five earned runs in 12.1 total innings.

LOSS: The Braves snapped their four-game winning streak with a loss in their last game, 3-2 in 10 innings, on Wednesday night in Washington...Just one of the three runs Atlanta allowed in the game was earned.

A Six Atlanta relievers combined to allow just one hit and one unearned run in 6.0 innings out of the bullpen, with one walk and three strikeouts.

A The Braves bullpen has gone 6-3 with a 1.67 ERA (16 ER/86.0 IP) in September, the best ERA in baseball...Atlanta relievers also lead the majors with a .154 average against them in the month, allowing just 46 hits and fanning 101 in 86.0 innings out of the bullpen.

A The club went 2-for-2 on replay challenges in the game, and is a perfect 5-for-5 in its last five challenges.

BRAVES AND METS: Atlanta trails New York by 1.0 game in the NL East standings, and is looking to overtake the Mets to win its fifth consecutive division title...Both teams have six games remaining, with one three-game series scheduled for next week.

A The Braves were a season-worst 10.5 games behind the first-place Mets after play on June 1...Since the following date, June 2, Atlanta has played to a 73-32 (.695) record, the second-best mark in baseball... New York has gone 63-41 (.606) since that date, fifth best in the majors.

A The Braves are trying to erase their biggest deficit in the division era to win a division title...The team's current record is 10 games in 1993.

A That 1993 club was 10 games behind first-place San Francisco in the NL West after play on July 22...The Braves ended up winning the division by one game with 104 wins.

A Atlanta is on pace to win 100 games, while New York is pacing to 101 victories...No NL East club has won 100 games since the Phillies in 2011, and no two clubs in the division have ever won 100 games in the same year.

A MLB last had two 100-win teams in the same division just last season, when San Francisco won 107 games to win the NL West by a single game over the 106-win Dodgers.

WINS: With one more victory, the Braves would set their highest single-season win total over the last 19 seasons...The last Braves team to win more than 97 games was the 2003 club, who went 101-61 to win the NL East.

A If the Braves do not win the division this season, it would mark the most victories the team has ever had in a second-place finish.

A The record is currently held by the 1899 Boston Beaneaters, who went 95-57 to finish eight games behind Brooklyn.

OLSON THIRTY HOMERS: 1B Matt Olson drove his 30th home run of the season out to left field on Wednesday night, and has hit that plateau in each of his last three full seasons.

A He is one of just six players in baseball with 30 homers in each of the last three 162-game seasons, joining Pete Alonso, Nolan Arenado, Paul Goldschmidt, Kyle Schwarber and Eugenio Suárez.

A Olson also has 43 doubles on the season, and is one of three players in the majors with 40 doubles and 30 homers this year...Arenado and Goldschmidt have each done so for St. Louis.

A He is just the sixth player in franchise history with 40 doubles and 30 homers in a season, and the first since Ozzie Albies last season...Freddie Freeman (2016), Chipper Jones (1999) and Hank Aaron (1959, 1965) also did so.

Set for his 30th start of the season and the 108th of his career...Is his 125th career appearance.

Has made 20 career appearances and 15 starts against New York, and is 6-5 with a 2.84 ERA (29 ER/92.0 IP)...Atlanta is an even 10-10 in his 20 total games against the Mets.

In four starts this season, is 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (8 ER/24.0 IP) and 22 strikeouts...In his last start, August 18 here at Truist Park, allowed two runs over 7.0 innings in the Braves win, 3-2.

Fried has made seven starts against the Mets here in Atlanta, and has yet to allow more than two runs in a turn...He is 4-2 with a 2.48 ERA (11 ER/40.0 IP) against New York here, and Atlanta is 5-2 in his seven starts as a club.

Started against the Phillies in his last turn, September 22, and allowed five hits and one run over 5.0 innings, walking one and fanning eight...Took the loss after the Braves were shut out, 1-0.

Atlanta is just 6-6 in Fried's last 12 starts, despite him compiling a 2.47 ERA (20 ER/73.0 IP) and a .217 average against...The Braves have 69 wins in games started by Fried since the beginning of 2019, the most such wins by a pitcher in the National League...Only Gerrit Cole, whose teams have won 71 of his starts, has more in the majors.

The Braves have not lost consecutive starts by Fried since dropping back-to-back turns against the Padres and Brewers in mid May...Atlanta lost to the Phillies in Fried's last start.

Since becoming a full-time starter in 2019, Fried's 51 wins are the second most in baseball, trailing only the Yankees' Gerrit Cole's total of 56 for the major league lead.

The Phillies beat the Braves, 1-0, in Fried's last start...He is winless this season when getting two or fewer runs of support, going 0-6 despite a 2.33 ERA.

When getting at least three runs of support, Fried is 13-1 with a 2.55 ERA (38 ER/134.0 IP)...Atlanta is 17-4 as a club when he gets at least three runs.

Fried has made 14 starts this season following a Braves loss, and is 7-3 with a 2.28 ERA (22 ER/86.2 IP) and a .217 average against him in these games.

Atlanta lost to Washington, 3-2 in extra innings, in its last game.

2022 Recap

Pitched against the Marlins, September 4 at Truist Park, and went 5.0 hitless innings with one walk and six strikeouts before a rain delay forced his exit...Got the win after Atlanta beat Miami, 7-1.

The start marked the third time in his career he has carried a no-hitter through 5.0 innings...He also did so on April 19 at the Dodgers earlier this season, and went a career-best 5.2 hitless innings on April 4, 2019 vs. the Cubs.

Pitched against the Mets, August 6 at Citi Field, and allowed four runs, two earned, over 6.0 innings to take the loss...Was placed on the 7-day concussion IL following the start, and was activated on August 18.

Took the loss, just his fourth of the season...Also lost to New York on July 11, and the Mets are the only team in baseball that has beaten Fried since April.

Started on July 16th in Washington, going 7.0 innings and earning the victory in a 6-3 win...Fanned four and did not walk a batter, one start after walking a career high-tying five on July 11 vs. New York (NL).

The victory was the 50th of his career, and his 10th of the season...Marked the third time the lefty has reached double-digit wins in his career.

Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, just two pitchers have reached at least 50 wins in as few appearances as Fried...Pat Jarvis won 51 of his first 114 games, while Kevin Millwood won exactly 50...They both started over 105 of their first 114 career games.

Was named to his first career All-Star Game after being selected to the N.L. pitching staff...Joined teammates Ronald Acuna Jr., William Contreras, Travis d'Arnaud, Austin Riley and Dansby Swanson as All-Star selections...He was not active for the game.

He is the first Braves pitcher to be selected to the game since Mike Soroka in 2019, and the first left-hander from Atlanta to go since Jonny Venters in 2011.

Went undefeated in the month of June, posting a 2-0 record and 2.16 ERA (8 ER/33.1 IP), while Atlanta won all five of his starts.

His ERA ranked 12th in baseball, but his 1.91 FIP led the National League and was second lowest in the majors.

- Pitched a scoreless inning in his Braves debut in Cincinnati on July 1.
- Went 2-1 with a 2.08 ERA in four starts and 20 total appearances with Tripe-A Gwinnett this season.
- Acquired by Atlanta from Boston for cash considerations on June 30.
- Born in Maracaibo, Venezuela...Same birthplace as former Braves outfielder Ender Inciarte.
- Made his debut with Arizona on August 20, 2015 and went 2-2 with 4.82 ERA through parts of five seasons.

- Owns a 1.81 ERA in 42 relief appearances with Atlanta (49.2 IP)...Had a 6.35 ERA in three appearances (5.2 IP) with Chicago (NL) and a 7.59 ERA in 11 appearances (10.2 IP) with Los Angeles (AL).
- At the trade deadline was traded to the Los Angeles Angels along with LHP Tucker Davidson in exchange for RHP Raisel Iglesias before returning for his fourth stint with Atlanta after being claimed off waivers from LA... Was also acquired earlier in the season from the Chicago Cubs in exchange for LHP Sean Newcomb on 4/20... Chavez also pitched for Atlanta during the 2021 World Series run and in 2010.
- Played for nine different MLB teams.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 32 yrs • #26

Saves/Opp: 1/2 **Holds:** 11 **1st Batter/Retired:** 24/16 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/1

- Allowed just one earned run in 24 appearances since being acquired by Atlanta on 8/2...His 0.40 ERA during that span is the lowest among pitchers with as many appearances.
- Logged 16 saves and 2-6 record while pitching to a 4.04 ERA in 39 appearances with the Angels this season.
- Acquired from the LA Angels on August 2 in exchange for LHP Tucker Davidson and RHP Jesse Chavez.
- Ranks eighth among active pitchers with 157 career saves.
- Iglesias, teammate Kenley Jansen and Aroldis Chapman are the only pitchers to record at least 30 saves each season dating to 2018 (not including the 2020 shortened season).
- Leads the majors with 37 saves of 4-plus outs since the beginning of the 2017 season.

- Leads the National League and ranks second in the majors with 37 saves.
- Logged his 35th save on 9/19 and has now posted seven seasons with at least 35 saves...Francisco Rodríguez, Joe Nathan and Hall-of-Famers Mariano Rivera and Trevor Hoffman are the only pitchers with more such seasons.
- Recorded his 30th save of the year on 8/31 and has now posted eight seasons with at least 30 saves...His eight such seasons are tied for the sixth most in major league history.
- Jansen now has at least 30 saves in each of his last eight consecutive 162-game seasons dating to 2014...He Joined Hall-of-Famers Mariano Rivera and Trevor Hoffman along with Craig Kimbrel as the only pitchers to do so.
- Passed Joe Nathan and now ranks ninth among all-time saves leaders with his 28th save of the season on 8/18.
