RAYS REPORT —The Rays continue the third and final leg of their last road trip before the
All-Star break today at Fénway Park, going 2-6 so far against the Twins (1-2), Tigers (1-2) and
Red Sox (0-2, two to play)have lost four of five, six of eight, nine of 12 and 10 of their last

spot...were in fourth place in the divison at the All-Star break last season with a 40-46 d...have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 31 in fourth and four in fifth. The Rays fell, 5-4, in walk-off fashion last night...they have been walked off in three of their last eight games compared to only two of their first 87 contests. Tampa Bay has scored in the opening frame in three of its last four games...it plated a 1st-inning run in only four of its first 38 road games to open the season. Tampa Bay starters have yielded three runs or fewer in all 10 outings in July and have gone 7-2 with a 3.27 ERA (99.01P, 36ER) in their last 19 starts.

The Rays are 22-20 (.524) on the road, second in the majors behind the Tigers (27-20/.574)...they have played the fewest road games in the majors (42) to this point—nine of 15, 21 of 30 and 27 of their next 41 games will come away from home.

The Rays are one loss away from their first season series loss to the Red Sox since 2018...they have won a club-record six consecutive season sets over Boston. Tampa Bay's four-game losing streak vs. Boston is its longest since since Sept. 13, 2020–June 22, 2021 [CG]...each of the last three meetings have resulted in one-run losses, the Rays longest streak against any team since Aug. 13, 2024–May 19, 2025 vs. HOU (3G)...the club record is four straight one-run losses, done twice: April 11–Aug. 5, 2018 vs. CWS and March 30–April 5, 2018 vs. BOS.

The Rays are 4-2 in their last six games when opposed by left-handed starters... their 13-12 record vs. southpaw starting pitchers ranks ninth in the majors.

LATE-INNING LETDOWNS—The Rays have held a multi-run lead in three straight and six of their seven losses in July...entering the month, they led by multiple runs in only five of their first 38 setbacks, and they had 13 blown lead losses all season...despite the recent skid, the Rays 19 blown lead losses on the year are still tied for fourth fewest in the AL, more than only the Tigers (12), Astros (14) and Blue Jays (15)...the bullpen has gone 1-8 with a 7.41 ERA (51.0IP. 42ER) during the team's 4-10 stretch dating back to June 27—only the Yankees bullpen (7.69) has a higher ERA in that span.

**Five of the Rays seven losses this month have come by one run, tied with the Guardians and Pirates for the most in MLB...their 17 one-run defeats this season are fourth most in the AL behind the White Sox (21), Red Sox (19) and Yankees (18).

RON MEN—Following Shane Baz's 19th start this afternoon, all five members of the Rays rotation will have made exactly 19 starts: Baz, Taj Bradley, Zack Littell, Ryan Pepiot and Drew Rasmussen. they are set to join the 2018 Astros (Cole/Keuchel/McCullers Jr./Morton/Cole) as the only clubs to have five pitchers make 19 starts before the Midsummer Classic since the contest first took place in 1933 (Stats Perform)...the Angels are one Kyle Hendricks start away from also accomplishing the feat, but Hendricks is not scheduled to start before the break...previously, the franchise record was three pitchers, set in 2014 (Archer/Odorizzi/Price)...entering this season, only 16 pitchers in Rays history (22x) had reached 19 starts before the Midsummer Classic—from 2020-24, Littell (2024, 19GS) was the only one to turn the trick...including Joe Boyle's spot start on April 13 vs. ATL, the Rays have used six starting pitchers, second fewest in the majors behind the Angels (five)... Tampa Bay's rotation has logged 528.1 IP, third in the majors behind the Royals (531.2IP) and Phillies (531.2IP) and their most before the All-Star break since 2014(561.0IP).

*Tomorrow, Pepiot is scheduled to become the fourth Rays pitcher and third traditional starter to make 20 starts before the All-Star break...he would join Blake Snell (2018, 20GS), David Price (2014, 20GS) and Ryne Stanek (2019), who started 25 games as an opener before the break.

SIMPLE CHAN—Chandler Simpson extended his career-best hitting streak to 15 games last night, the longest by a rookie in franchise history...he is batting .389 (21-for-54) with 2 2B, 13 B 3 RBI, 4 BB, 3 SO and 7 SB during the streak, which is the second-longest active run in MLB behind NYY Cody Bellinger (15C) and ties the longest by any rookie this season, matching ATH Jacob Wilson (15G, March 27-April 12)...the last rookie with a longer streak was BAL Colton Cowser (17G) from July 19-Aug. 4, 2024...Simpson has stolen 26 bases, tied for second in the AL behind teammate José Caballero (31SB) and one steal shy of the Rays rookie record for a full season set by Rocco Baldelli in 2003 (27SB).

** Caballero and Simpson are looking to become the ninth set of teammates in the expansion era (since 1961) to rank first and second in their league (AL/NL) in steals at the All-Star break, including the fourth AL duo...the last teammates to turn the trick in either league were KC Tom Goodwin (26SB) and KC Vince Coleman (21SB) in 1995, according to Stats Perform.

HE'S THE MAN(GUM)—Jake Mangum is 14-for-27 (.519) against Red Sox pitching, tallying five of his 16 career multi-hit games against Boston, the 14 hits are the most in Rays history through a player's first eight career games vs. the Red Sox, surpassing Rocco Baldelli (13H, 2003)...Baldelli also holds the club mark through nine games (14H)...the last AL hitter with more hits through their first eight career games opposite the Red Sox was OAK Brandon Moss (15H) from 2012-13...the last AL East hitter with more was NYY Derek Jeter (15H, 1996).

GO. JONNY, GO.—Jonathan Aranda is 13-for-30 (.433) with 4 2B, 1 HR and 4 RBI during a seven-game hitting streak, raising his average to .327, fourth best in the majors...he is set to become the fourth hitter in Rays history to enter the All-Star break with a .320 average or better (min. 250AB), joining Fred McGriff in 2001 (.330), Yandy Diaz in 2023 (.323) and Carl Crawford in 2010 (.321)...Aranda is 1 RBI shy of becoming the fourth Ray this season to collect 50 RBI, joining Junior Caminero (59), Diaz (52) and Brandon Lowe (50)...it would mark the first time in club history four players have had 50 RBI before the All-Star break.

20-20 VISION—With 19 doubles and 23 homers, 22-year-old Junior Caminero needs one double to become the first player in franchise history with 20 doubles and 20 homers before the All-Star break...since 1901, five players have turned the trick at age 22 or younger: ATL Ozzie Albies in 2018 (29/20), WSH Bryce Harper in 2015 (21/26), LAA Mike Trout in 2014 (26/22), STL Albert Pujols in 2002 (25/21) and CIN Johnny Bench in 1970 (23/28).

STARS OF TODAY...—Four Rays were selected to represent the club as All-Stars: 1B Jonathan Aranda, 3B Junior Caminero, 2B Brandon Lowe and RHP Drew Rasmussen... Aranda, Caminero and Rasmussen are first-time All-Stars, while Lowe was selected for the second time in his career, joining 2019...it marks the fourth time in franchise history the Rays have had four or more All-Stars, joining 2023 (Arozarena/Diaz/Franco/McClanahan), 2010 (Crawford/Longoria/Price/Soriano) and 2009 (Bartlett/Crawford/Longoria/Peña/Zobrist).

On Wednesday, it was announced Junior Caminero will be the ALs starting third baseman, replacing CLE José Ramírez, who won the fan vote...Caminero will be 22 years, 10 days old when the All-Star Game takes place on July 15 in Atlanta, which would make him the third-youngest third baseman to start the Midsummer Classic since the contest's inception in 1933, older than only the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews in 1953 (21.274) and CLE Buddy Lewis in 1938 (21.330).

Caminero is also set to become the fourth Ray to participate in the T-Mobile Home Run Derby, joining Arozarena (2023), Carlos Peña (2009) and Evan Longoria (2008).

STARS OF TOMORROW—RHP Brody Hopkins will represent the Rays as a member of the AL squad at the 2025 Futures Game today at 4:00 p.m. at Truist Park in Atlanta...the game will air on MLB Network and will be simulcast on MLB.TV., MLB.com and the MLB app...rated as the Rays No. 6 prospect (MLB.com), the 23-year-old Hopkins is 4-5 with a 3.35 ERA (80.21P, 30ER) in 17 starts for Double-A Montgomery, leading the Southern League in strikeouts (98) and starts (T1st) while ranking third in opp. average (.203), fifth in innings, and seventh in both ERA and WHIP (1.25)...current Rays to represent the club at the Futures Game in past seasons include Chandler Simpson (2024), Junior Caminero (2023), Taj Bradley (2022), Curtis Mead (2022) and Shane Baz (2021)...Yandy Diaz (CLE, 2016) and Danny Jansen (TOR, 2018) are also Futures Game alumni.

TODAY'S START—Shane Baz will toe the rubber for his 19th start of the season and third against the Red Sox...marks his 42nd career start and fifth against Boston...has gone 6.0 IP or more in three straight starts, pitching to a 2.57 ERA (21.0IP, 6ER)...the Rays have won seven of his last nine starts and are 12-6 in his outings overall (6-2 on the road)...was acquired from the Pirates as a player to be named later (Aug. 14, 2018) along with **RHP Tyler Glasnow** and **OF Austin Meadows** for **RHP Chris Archer** on July 31, 2018.

LAST TIME OUT—Suffered the loss on July 7 at DET (L, 6.0IP, 7H, 3R, 2BB, 7SO, HR) despite a quality start, his fourth in his last five outings...worked around a 1st-inning walk for a scoreless opening frame...**Dillon Dingler** doubled to open the 2nd inning, and was followed three batters later by a two-run homer off the bat of **Javier Báez**...scattered another two doubles and a single over the next two innings...was tagged for a leadoff double to start the 5th inning by **Colt Keith**, who would come around to score on a **Riley Greene** RBI-single...the five extra-base hits he allowed in the contest tied his career high, matching May 1, 2025 vs. KC.

* Baz has struck out seven batters or more in three straight starts for the first time in his career...the last Ray to accomplish the feat was Rvan Pepiot last month (June 5-21).

THE DUGOUT INN—Baz is 3-0 with a 2.96 ERA (24.1IP, 8ER) in four career starts against the Red Sox, with the Rays winning all four games...he has made two starts this season against Boston to a 1-0 record, 3.18 ERA (11.1IP, 4ER) and 0.71 WHIP...his last start against the Sox came on June 9 at Fenway Park (5.1IP, 3H, 3R, 3BB, 5SO)...in his only other start against Boston this season on April 14 at Steinbrenner Field, he went 6.0 innings and allowed one run on two hits (1HR) with a career-high 11 strikeouts.

- Baz has allowed three runs or fewer in all eight career road starts against the AL East, with four of those outings being quality starts... in those contests, opposing hitters have batted .186 (26-for-140) with 5 2B and 5 HR.
- He is 6-1 with a 2.96 ERA (82.0IP, 27ER) in 16 career intra-division starts, with the Rays going 13-3 in those matchups.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN—The Rays have won seven of Baz's nine starts away from home, with the right-hander going 4-2 with a 3.09 ERA (55.1IP, 19ER) in those games...Baz has allowed three runs or fewer in seven of eight road starts in 2025, turning in three scoreless outings.

- Baz turned in back-to-back scoreless starts of 6.0 IP or more on the road between June 15-26, becoming the first Ray to do so since Taj Bradley from July 20-25, 2024.
- He has allowed three runs or fewer in 14 of his last 16 starts on the road dating back to July 5, 2024, going 5-3 with a 2.99 ERA (93.1IP, 31ER), sixth in the AL over that span (min. 75.0IP).

ALL I DO IS WIN—The Rays have won seven of Baz's last nine starts, outscoring opponents, 62-33 (+29), in those games while backing him with 6.09 runs of support per 9.0 IP...this includes a stretch of seven straight wins in his starts from May 24–June 26...he received three runs of support or more in eight straight starts from May 24–July 1, the longest streak of his career...the Rays are 10-2 this season when providing Baz with three runs of support or more and 2-4 with two runs or fewer.

When Baz receives three runs of support or more in his career, he is 13-1 with a 3.11 ERA (124.1IP, 43ER), and the Rays are 19-4 (10-2 in 2025)...in 18 starts with two runs or fewer, he is 2-8 with a 4.73 ERA (99.0IP, 52ER), and Tampa Bay has gone 5-13 (2-4 in 2025).

CUT IT OUT—Baz fully introduced a cutter to his arsenal on June 15 and has held opponents to an 8-for-30 (.267) clip with 8 SO on the offering... opponents were 2-for-17 before the Athletics and Tigers combined to go 6-for-12 against the pitch in his last two outings...the cutter has been his second-most utilized pitch over his last four starts, throwing it 28.8 pct. of the time (142 of 492 pitches), trailing only his four-seam fastball (37.6%/185 of 492)...he has recorded a 3.00 ERA (33.0IP, 11ER) and held opponents to a .200/.278/.358 (24-for-120) line in five starts since fully integrating the cutter into his pitch mix.

RUNNING OUT OF GAS—Over the first three innings, Baz has pitched to a 2.33 ERA (54.0IP, 14ER), 1.00 WHIP and .198 (39-for-197) opp. average... he has held opponents scoreless in the opening frame in 17 of his 18 starts this season and 35 of his 41 career starts...Baz had went 13 straight starts (April 25–July 1) without a run allowed in the first two frames prior to his last outing on July 7 at DET...from the 4th inning on, he owns a 6.52 ERA (49.2IP, 35ER), 1.55 WHIP and .281 (54-for-192) opp. average...36 of his 50 runs allowed (72.0%) have come from the 4th inning on.
