To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their seven-game, eight-day road trip against the Rangers (2-1, one to play) and Braves (three to play) today in Arlington with an off day tomorrow...are on a stretch of 14 road games within their final 23 games of the season (Sept. 3-27), going 2-1 thus far...are 11-11 in their last 22 contests (Aug. 14–pres.) in the wake of an 18-4 run between July 20–Aug. 12...despite the 11-11 stretch, they are still an MLB-best 29-15 since July 20...have the toughest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .530...in their seven remaining series (including current set), the Rays will face five opponents that are currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 4.0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings, marking the third-latest date in franchise history they have held a lead of 4.0 games or more (Oct. 3, 2021 – 8.0GA; Sept. 27, 2020 – 7.0GA)...have spent 111 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 71 consecutive days in first place (June 27–pres.)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21...have held the AL's best record outright for 110 days, the most in franchise history, according to Stats Perform.

- ★ The Rays claimed the season series over the Rangers with a 6-3, 10-inning victory last night...the Rays improved to 8-6 in extra-inning affairs this season...they have won back-to-back extra-inning contests (Aug. 30–pres.) for the first time since winning five straight between April 5–May 12.
- ★ With the win, the Rays have won each of **Drew Rasmussen's** last nine starts (July 21–pres.)...it ties **Tyler Glasnow** (9GS, Aug. 13, 2020–April 1, 2021) for the third-longest streak in franchise history, behind **Blake Snell** (10GS, Aug. 10–Sept. 29, 2018) and **Matt Moore** (11GS, Sept. 22, 2012–May 19, 2013). Rasmussen spun 7.0 innings of one-run ball, the 14th time this season a Rays starter has pitched through the 7th inning, with half (7) of the 14 performances coming from Rasmussen...he reached a career-high 153.1 innings pitched on the season, surpassing his 2025 total (146.1IP).
- ★ With his home run, **Junior Caminero** paces the AL in home runs (see more in "Home Run Derby" note below).
- ★ **Jonathan Aranda's** go-ahead, three-run home run in the 10th inning off of **LHP Jacob Latz** was the fourth go-ahead home run in extra innings by a left-handed batter against a left-handed pitcher in franchise history...Aranda joined **Jake Bauers** (June 24, 2018 vs. NYY - **Chasen Shreve**), **Carlos Peña** (May 6, 2009 at NYY - **Phil Coke**), and **Gabe Gross** (June 1, 2008 vs. CWS - **Matt Thornton**).
- ★ After tallying 3 HR last night, the Rays improved to 14-1 when homering three times or more including seven straight wins.
- ★ With a win today, the Rays would claim their second four-game set of the season (also: July 20-23 at TOR, 3-1), marking the first time since 2023 (5x) they have won multiple four-game series in a season...the series win would be their 26th of the season, their most since winning 32 sets in 2023...it would mark their first series win at Globe Life Field since 2021 (2-1, June 4-6) and their second since winning three straight sets in Arlington between 2016-18.

THE LEADING CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** (.308) is seven points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.315) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Díaz** (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he could also become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons, including the third since 1942 along with **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983...after posting a .295 (122-for-109) average last season, he is attempting to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in each season), joining **CHC Starlin Castro** (2010-11), **NY Yankees Robinson Cano** (2005-06), **STL Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and **Suzuki** (2001-02)...Simpson leads the AL in singles (135) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallix Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both singles and triples: **CLE Amed Rosario** in 2022 and **KC Whit Merrifield** in 2019...Simpson needs 10 singles over the Rays final 20 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).

- ★ Per Baseball Savant, his 57 infield hits are the most across a single season by a Ray in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008) are tied for the fifth-most by any player in a single season over that time frame (see table on the right).
- ★ Over his last 65 games (June 19–pres.), Simpson paces the majors in batting average (.357/89-for-249), hits, and stolen bases (24).
- ★ With 38 SB, third most in MLB, Simpson is two steals shy of joining **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NY Yankees Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

HOME RUN DERBY—Last night, Junior Caminero (38HR) surpassed **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (37HR) as the AL's outright leader in home runs, trailing only **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (41) and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (39) across all of MLB...he is two long balls shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025) and needs 8 HR over the Rays final 20 games to tie **Carlos Peña's** franchise record from 2007 (46HR).

- ★ Last night's blast marked the 90th of his career, making him the 12th player in the modern era (since 1900) to reach that mark before his age-23 season (as of June 30), he joined **Mel Ott** (115), **Eddie Mathews** (112), **Alex Rodriguez** (106), **Tony Conigliaro** (104), **Juan Soto** (98), **Mike Trout** (98), **Frank Robinson** (98), **Bryce Harper** (97), **Giancarlo Stanton** (93), **Bob Horner** (91), and **Ted Williams** (91) as the only players to turn the trick.

THE YANDY MAN—During his active five-game on-base streak, **Yandy Díaz** has slashed .400/.478/.650 (8-for-20) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 1 RBI, 4 R, and a 1.128 OPS...since Aug. 1, Díaz has collected multiple hits in 15 of his 32 games—in all of MLB, only teammate **Chandler Simpson** (17) has more multi-hit efforts...Díaz is looking to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back seasons with a .300 average or better (min. 502PA)...he would join **Carl Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, doing so in three straight seasons between 2005-07 and in back-to-back seasons from 2009-10...Díaz also finished the 2023 season with an AL-best .330 average...he and Crawford are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in 10 of the last 14 games (Aug. 22–pres.), turning in a 3.19 ERA (127.0IP, 45ER) while holding opponents to a .202/.250/.326 (94-for-466) line—they lead the AL in opp. AVG, opp. OBP, opp. SLG, WHIP (0.97), hits per 9.0 IP (6.66), walks per 9.0 IP (2.06), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.83) over that span...entering that stretch, Rays pitchers had permitted five runs or more in a season-high six consecutive games (Aug. 16-21)...the starting rotation has a 2.83 ERA during the 14-game span, going 7-3 with 66 SO against 10 BB...nine of their last 13 starts have been quality.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays clinched a winning season before the end of August for the fourth time (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (82-52), 2021 (84-48), and 2008 (84-51)...this marks the 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons becoming the Rays in 2008 after the Devil Rays had none across the franchise's first decade of existence (1998–2007)...including results thus far from this season, the 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the Braves and Brewers for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the Dodgers (18), Yankees (17), and Cardinals (16)...the Astros, Guardians, and Red Sox (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

- ★ This marks the fourth time the Rays entered September atop the AL East, joining 2021 (84-48), 2020 (25-11), and 2008 (84-51)...they went on to win the division crown in each of those seasons, including World Series appearances in 2020 and 2008 and a club-record 100 wins in 2021.
- ★ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the Dodgers (7), Astros (6), Braves (6), Brewers (6), and Yankees (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the Astros and Brewers for fifth most in MLB behind the Dodgers (15), Yankees (13), Braves (10), and Cardinals (10).

A LONE STAR SUNDAY—The Rays close their four-game set in Texas against the Rangers today...they took two of their first three in Texas to claim their first season series against Texas since 2022 (4-3)...Friday night's win snapped a 10-game losing streak at Globe Life Field dating back to July 17, 2023...they are 8-17 overall in their last 25 contests vs. the club over that span...prior to that stretch, they went 12-7 between 2016-22 in Arlington.

- ★ In 45 career games vs. the Rangers, **Yandy Díaz** has hit .331 (55-for-166) with 8 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 13 RBI, and 24 R.

LET 'EM KNOW, BRING 'EM OUT—After taking an off day tomorrow, the Rays begin a three-game set with the Braves in Atlanta, their penultimate against the NL in 2026...the Rays and Braves met for a three-game series at Steinbrenner Field last season (April 11-13), with the Rays claiming the rubber game to close out the set...they dropped the series in their last trip to Atlanta in 2024 (1-2), picking up a win in the series finale...Tuesday, the Rays will attempt to win back-to-back games in Atlanta for the second time in franchise history (2G, July 15-16, 2001).

TODAY'S START—**Ian Seymour** is slated to make his 13th start of the season and his 43rd appearance...marks his 62nd career appearance and 18th career start...has gone 3-4 with a 3.35 ERA (45.2IP, 17ER) over his last eight outings (five starts)..leads AL LHP with 86 SO in his last 12 outings (9 starts) since July 1...was selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- Over his last 13 outings (nine starts) since June 25, he leads AL qualifiers in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.15) and ranks highly in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (2nd, 11.96), strikeouts (5th, 93), wins (T5th, 6), and WHIP (9th, 1.04).
- With a win today, he would become the third AL southpaw to reach double-digit wins this season alongside CLE **Parker Messick** (11) and teammate **Shane McClanahan** (10)..Seymour is currently tied with CLE **Joey Cantillo**, CWS **Anthony Kay**, BOS **Jake Bennett**, KC **Noah Cameron**, BAL **Trevor Rogers**, and DET **Framber Valdez** with nine victories.
- Since transitioning to a starting/bulk relief role on June 8, Seymour has turned in a 3.83 ERA (82.1IP, 35ER), 1.06 WHIP, and .222 (70-for-315) opp. average (16G/11GS) compared to a 5.23 ERA (31.0IP, 18ER), 1.35 WHIP, and .239 (27-for-113) across his first 26 appearances of the year (March 26–June 2).
- Among AL pitchers with at least 100.0 innings this season, his 4.31 strikeout-to-walk ratio leads AL southpaws and is eighth best overall.

LAST TIME OUT—He was dealt his sixth loss of the season after fanning 10 batters in his fifth quality start of the year on Aug. 31 vs. NYM (L, 6.1IP, 6H, 3ER, HR, 10SO)...struck out seven of his first 10 batters faced before a pair of hits and a double-play ball plated the Mets first run in the 4th...worked through two more scoreless frames before a **Mark Vientos** solo home run in the 7th inning...allowed one more baserunner via single, which would later come around to score after he was lifted for reliever **Casey Legumina**.

- Has struck out seven batters or more in each of his last five starts dating back to Aug. 3 at COL...is 2-2 with a 3.68 ERA (29.1IP, 12ER) as a starter in that span...ranks third in the majors with 48 strikeouts in that span, trailing WSH **Cade Cavalli** and PHI **Jesús Luzardo** (both 52).
- Did not receive any run support in the start...the Rays have lost five of his last six outings in which he has not received any support.

ALL MY EX'S LIVE IN TEXAS—Seymour will take the mound for his second career outing (first start) against the Rangers this afternoon...in his only previous outing, on July 29 of this season, he earned the win after working 4.2 scoreless innings of bulk relief in a 3-0 victory at Tropicana Field (W, 4.2IP, 2H, BB, 4SO)...in seven career outings (two starts) against the AL West, he is 2-1 with a 3.57 ERA (22.2IP, 9ER), 23 strikeouts, a 1.28 WHIP, and a .195 (16-for-82) opp. average...five of those outings have come in 2026.

- Seymour is 10-7 with a 3.87 ERA (128.0IP, 55ER), 148 strikeouts, a 1.14 WHIP, and a .208 (99-for-475) opp. average against the AL in his career over 42 outings (12 starts)...the Rays are 22-20 when he pitches against an AL foe in his career.

ROADS UNTRAVELED—Seymour has appeared in 19 games (four starts) on the road this season...over his last 15 road appearances (four starts) as a visitor dating back to April 18 at PIT, he has gone 5-2 with a 3.52 ERA (46.0IP, 18ER), 57 strikeouts, and a .230 (41-for-178) opp. average, allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...the Rays have gone 10-5 in those games.

WHIFF WATCH—He boasts a 29.4 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking fourth among active AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to NYY **Brent Headrick** (32.3%), HOU **Steven Okert** (30.9%), and CLE **Joey Cantillo** (29.7%)...115 of his 138 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, second most on the Rays behind **Drew Rasmussen** (128)...Seymour's 115 swinging strikeouts are fifth most among AL southpaws this season.

- His out-of-zone swing pct. (35.5%) has increased 9.1 points from his mark last season (26.4%).

CHANGE OF PLANS—Seymour has utilized his changeup 29.6 pct. of the time this season, down from his 31.4 pct. usage rate in 2025...his 29.6 pct. usage rate in 2026 ranks sixth in the majors (min. 1,500 pitches) and third among southpaws behind PHI **Cristopher Sánchez's** MLB-leading 37.6 pct. clip and ATL **Martín Pérez** (30.8%)...min. 400 changeups thrown this year, Seymour's 39.4 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the fourth-highest mark in the majors behind DET/LAD **Tarik Skubal** (47.2%), Sánchez (46.5%), and SD **Bradley Rodriguez** (40.3%).

THESEYMOUR SHOW—On June 25 vs. KC, Seymour was utilized as a bulk reliever behind opener **Casey Legumina** and delivered 6.2 hitless innings with one walk and seven strikeouts...the pairing carried a perfect game through 5.1 innings and a no-hitter through the 8th inning before turning the ball over to **Craig Kimbrel**...it marked the 16th time in franchise history Rays pitchers have made it through 5.0 innings with no baserunners allowed (last: June 24, 2025 at KC).

- Became the third pitcher in the majors since 1980 to throw 6.2 hitless innings or more in relief, joining LAA **Félix Peña** (July 12, 2019 vs. SEA) and CLE **Jake Westbrook** (April 19, 2004 vs. DET)...was the sixth southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick alongside BAL **Tippy Martínez** (July 23, 1979 vs. OAK), STL **Al Brazle** (Aug. 1, 1951 vs. BSN), BOS **Herb Pennock** (Sept. 3, 1917 vs. NYY [G2]), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29, 1917 vs. SLB [G2]), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (July 20, 1914 vs. DET)....all six of these instances occurred at home...it was the most innings pitched by a Rays reliever since **Jalen Beeks** (6.2IP) on May 1, 2019 at KC.
