**HERE'S THE STORY:** The D-backs went 2-1 @ Angels last Sept. 15-17, are hosting them for the first time since Aug. 21-22, 2018 (2-game sweep) [also hosted in 2015, '09, '06, '00 and 1998] and are 16-16 all-time.

- ◆ **Merrill Kelly** is facing the Angels for the first time...it will be his eighth Interleague start and fourth start at Chase Field (also: April 7, 2019 vs. Red Sox; May 1, 2019 vs. Yankees; July 23, 2019 vs. Orioles).
  - In his last 13 home starts, since Aug. 5, 2019, is 6-4 with a 3.19 ERA (28 ER in 79.0 IP), .249 opponent average, 23 walks and 72 strikeouts.
- ◆ **Ketel Marte** is batting .432 (16-for-37) with 3 doubles, 2 home runs and 6 RBI in his last 9 games.
- ◆ **Josh Reddick** has hit safely in 6 of 9 home games at a .500 clip (15-for-30)/1.167 OPS with 5 doubles and 5 RBI.

**NEW HITTING COACHES:** Yesterday, the D-backs parted ways with Hitting Coach **Darnell Coles** and Assistant Hitting Coach **Eric Hinske** and named Triple-A Reno Hitting Coach **Rick Short** and Run Production Coordinator **Drew Hedman** as co-hitting coaches.

- Short is in his first season as the Aces' hitting coach...served in the same same role for Double-A Jackson (2019-20) and Single-A Kane County ('18)...was a coach for Rookie Advanced Missoula (2017)...was an area scout from 2010-17...played 12 seasons in the Minors for the Orioles (1994-2000), Cubs (2001), Angels (2002), Royals (2004) and Expos/Nationals (2004-05) before reaching the Major Leagues with the Nationals in 2005...also played 5 seasons in Japan with Chiba Lotte (2003) and Rakuten (2006-09).
- Hedman is in his third season as the team's run production coordinator where he assists the Major League coaching staff with advance scouting process for hitters...was a professional scout in 2018...worked in the Nationals' front office and as an assistant coach for Vanderbilt's 2014 National Championship team...played 4 seasons in the Red Sox organization (2009-12).

**INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT:** Arizona is 20-14 in its last 34 games vs. AL opponents and is 25-19 (.568) since 2019.

- ◆ The D-backs' .568 interleague winning pct. since 2019 is sixth in the Majors behind the Rays (.700; 35-15), Padres (.653, 32-17), Dodgers (.635; 33-19), Nationals (.580, 29-21) and Cubs (.578, 26-19).

**ON TOP SINCE MAY 25:** **Pavin Smith** leads the Majors with a .429 average since May 25 followed by Starling Marte/MIA/.419 then **Ketel Marte**/.375 and Charlie Blackmon/COL/.375... **Josh Reddick** (.362) is seventh and **Nick Ahmed** (.313) is tied for 19th.

- Agreed to terms on a 2-year contract through 2020 (club options 2021, '22) on Dec. 4, 2018.
- Played 5 seasons in the Rays' system (2010-14) then 4 seasons (2015-18) with the SK Wyverns in the KBO League.
- Rays' eighth-round pick in the 2010 draft.

**WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:** Is looking for his first win since April 27 (0-4, 4.10 ERA since).

- With a win today, he will equal his total from 2020 (3).

**LAST START:** Did not factor in the decision on June 5 @ Brewers (5 R-4 ER/6.0 IP).

**VS. ANGELS:** Will be making his first career appearance.

**STRIKEOUT STATS:** Boasts 28 strikeouts and only 3 walks in his last 4 starts.

- Became 1 of 6 D-back pitchers with 12+ strikeouts and no walks in a game on May 26 vs. Giants (last: Patrick Corbin in 2018) and 1 of 4 overall to do so as an opponent @ Dodger Stadium (also: Curt Schilling/ARI, Ray Sadecki/SF and Robbie Ray/ARI).

**MISSING BARRELS:** Has lowered his barrel pct. down from 11.1 in 2020 to 6.9 in 2021.

- Barrel = comparable hit types (exit velo. + launch angle) that have lead to a min. .500 BA/1.500 SLG

**2020 REVIEW:** Limited to 5 starts before undergoing season-ending right shoulder thoracic outlet surgery on Aug. 25.

- At the time of his injury, was 3-2 with a 2.59 ERA (9 ER in 31.1 IP) and ranked among NL leaders in fewest walks per 9.0 (2nd, 1.44), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6th, 5.80), wins (T-5th, 3), ERA (10th, 2.59) and WHIP (10th, 0.99).
