CINCINNATI REDS (37-42) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (41-40)

June 26, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #82/Home #43

LHP Andrew Abbott (5-4, 3.83 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (6-7, 2.86 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first three games on this six-game homestand vs. Seattle (Tuesday-Thursday) and Cincinnati (Friday-Sunday) after earning wins on Wednesday (11-1) and Thursday (5-1) vs. the Mariners...Will embark on a seven-game road trip to Philadelphia (June 29-July 2) and Washington (July 3-5) after this homestand...Have scored the third-most runs (409) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (438) and Los Angeles-NL (423)...Have struck out the fourth most batters (740) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (772), Milwaukee (769) and New York-NL (741)...Have the third-best batting average (.257) in Major League Baseball, behind Los Angeles-NL (.262) and Tampa Bay (.258)...Are above .500 at the halfway point of the year for the first time since being 47-34 (.580) in the 2015 season.

SEEING RED: Pittsburgh has won five of its first six games against Cincinnati this season (the team won two of three games from March 30-April 1 at Great American Ball Park and swept a three-game series from May 1-3 at PNC Park)...The Pirates have also won three straight series against the Reds (they won two of three games last season from September 23-25 at Great American Ball Park)...Pittsburgh has won four straight series against Cincinnati just twice since the National League Central formed in 1994, coming from June 15-September 30, 2018 and September 22, 2023-August 25, 2024...The Pirates have also gone 48-22 (.686) over their last 70 games against the Reds at PNC Park, dating back to September 1, 2017 (they have won or split 17 of the 21 series during that span)...Pittsburgh's current five-game winning streak against Cincinnati (since March 31) is its longest such streak against the Redlegs (within a single season) since winning seven consecutive contests from September 12-28, 2022.

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe had a solo home run (first inning) and a run-scoring single (eighth inning) in Thursday's 5-1 win vs. Seattle and has now hit safely in a season-high nine straight games (since June 15 at the Athletics)...He has gone 12-for-39 (.308) with three doubles, two home runs, five RBI, two walks, an .871 OPS and seven runs scored during the streak...Lowe's 18 home runs as a second baseman this season (his home run in Thursday's victory came as the designated hitter) are tied with George Grantham (1930) for the third-most by a Pirate in a single season, behind only Neil Walker (23, 2014) and Bill Mazeroski (19, 1958)...His 39 extra-base hits so far in 2026 are tied with five other players for the third-most in all of Major League Baseball.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds had a single (third inning) and a walk (eighth inning) on Thursday vs. Seattle and has now reached base safely in 30 straight games (since May 23 at Toronto)...It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and is tied with Chicago (NL)'s Ian Happ (April 5-May 9) for the second-longest such streak in Major League Baseball this season, behind only the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (48 games, April 3-May 25)...Reynolds is 40-for-108 (.370) with 11 doubles, seven home runs, 20 RBI, 18 walks, two stolen bases, a 1.132 OPS and 24 runs scored during the streak...He has also hit safely in 15 consecutive contests (since June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL), going 23-for-57 (.404) with six doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, a 1.241 OPS and 12 runs scored during the streak...It is the third-longest hitting streak of Reynolds' career (he had a 25-game hitting streak from June 1-29, 2024, as well as a 17-game hitting streak from May 23-June 9, 2019).

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE: The Pirates are 13-10 (.565) against the National League Central this season...Pittsburgh has won or split six of its first seven series against the division, with its only series loss coming in a four-game sweep from April 27-30 vs. St. Louis...The Pirates have finished a season with a .500 or better record vs. the division three times since the division formed in 1994, coming in 1997 (24-24, .500), 2013 (45-31, .592) & 2018 (43-33, .566).

HAMMERIN' HANK: Henry Davis hit a two-run home run in the third inning, while also doubling, stealing a base and scoring a run in the eighth inning on Thursday vs. Seattle...He was the fifth Pirate since 2021 to have a double, a home run, two RBI, a steal and two runs in a game, joining Bryan Reynolds (September 5, 2021 at Chicago-NL), Jake Marisnick (July 11, 2022 at Miami), Andrew McCutchen (April 8, 2023 vs. Chicago-AL) and Endy Rodriguez (June 2 at Houston)...Davis has four homers in 16 games since May 21 at St. Louis.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 26, 2016: Chad Kuhl earned the win while making his Major League debut on ESPN's Sunday Night Baseball after striking out five batters over 5.0 innings in the Pirates' 4-3 win over the Dodgers at PNC Park. Pittsburgh scored each of its four runs during the second inning, highlighted by a bases-clearing double from David Freese that brought home Chris Stewart, Sean Rodríguez and Adam Frazier.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Skenes lost a 2-1 decision after allowing two runs and striking out eight batters over 6.0 innings of work on June 20 at Colorado...He has thrown at least 100 pitches in five straight starts (since May 28 vs. Chicago-NL), making him the first Pirate to do that since Gerrit Cole (seven straight starts) from August 5-September 6, 2017... Skenes also joined Oliver Pérez (August 19-September 9 [G1], 2004) as the only Pirates pitchers (since pitch tracking began in 1988) to throw at least 100 pitches and record at least seven strikeouts in five straight starts...The last Major League pitcher to do that in six straight starts was Atlanta's Spencer Strider from August 20-September 18, 2022.

AGAINST THE REDS: Skenes has gone 5-0 with a 0.53 ERA (34.0ip/2er) and 45 strikeouts (four walks issued) in six career starts against Cincinnati...The only runs he allowed came in the first inning on June 17, 2024 at PNC Park (first start vs. the Reds) and in the fourth inning on April 1 at Great American Ball Park...Skenes' 0.53 career ERA against Cincinnati is the third-lowest by a Major League pitcher against a single opponent (minimum six starts) in the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind only Hisashi Iwakuma vs. Minnesota (2012-15, 0.21) and Bud Norris vs. Los Angeles-AL (2013-14, 0.43)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, his 31.0-inning scoreless streak against the Reds was the fourth-longest by a Pirates pitcher against a single opponent in the Expansion Era (since 1961), trailing only Vernon Law (1965-66) against New York (40.0ip), Bob Veale (1965-66) against New York (33.0ip) & Law (1964-65) against Houston (31.2ip).

K COLLECTOR: Skenes has 493 strikeouts through his first 71 Major League starts...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he would become the fastest Pirates pitcher (by starts) since at least 1893 to reach the 500-strikeout mark, surpassing Bob Veale (77 starts, 1962-65).

ON THE HOME FRONT: Skenes is 3-4 with a 2.61 ERA (51.2ip/15er) in nine starts at home this season...His 2.22 career ERA (214.2ip/53er) at PNC Park, which opened in 2001, is the lowest in stadium history among those with at least 200.0 innings pitched.

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 2.16 ERA (408.2ip/98er) through 71 Major League starts ranks second among all Major League pitchers through their first 71 starts during the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind only New York (NL)'s Dwight Gooden (1.94, 1984-86).

DON'T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis García in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)'s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)'s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego's Mat Latos (2010).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes won the National League Cy Young Award in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) & Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates to win the award.
