METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Reds, 3-2, yesterday in Cincinnati... The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games (1-2) and in 16 games in 17 days (1-2)... The Mets are at the end of their penultimate road trip of the season, a 10-game trip (3-3) against Detroit (2-1), Cincinnati (1-2) and Philadelphia (four games)...On Thursday, the Mets return home for their final homestand of the regular season, a 10-day, nine-game stand against the Rangers (three games), Padres (three games) and Nationals (three games).

CONNECT FOUR: According to @OptaStats, Nolan McLean is the second MLB pitcher to go 4-0 with a sub-1.50 ERA and 25+ strikeouts over his first four career starts (since ERA became official in both leagues in 1913)...The other was Fernando Valenzuela in 1981...His 28 strikeouts through his first four career starts are the most in franchise history...Tylor Megill, Matt Harvey, Doc Gooden, Dick Selma previously held the record with 26 strikeouts...He has won each of his first four career starts...That marks the first time in franchise history a pitcher has accomplished that feat.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 31-40 on the road this season...Their .437 winning percentage is 23rd in the majors...This compares to a 45-27 mark at home...Their .625 home winning percentage is sixth in The Show.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has recorded a career-high 16 home runs this season...In 41 games following the All-Star break, the Texan has hit .293/.358/.481 with four doubles, seven home runs, 14 RBI and four steals...This compares to a .226/.282/.403 mark with nine homers and 30 RBI in 75 games prior to the break.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen 129 bases this season, which ranks fifth in the majors and third in the National League...The team's 88.4 stolen base percentage is the best in The Show and the highest in franchise history...The team's 129 steals is their most since they stole 130 in 2011.

RUN FOR YOUR LIFE: Francisco Lindor has recorded 99 runs this season...That is the fourth-most in the majors behind Shohei Ohtani (127), Aaron Judge (114) and Juan Soto (109)...With one more run, it will mark his third season in New York scoring 100 or more runs...He will be the second Mets player to accomplish that feat...José Reyes recorded four seasons with 100+ runs...It would mark Lindor's fifth season overall with 100+ runs.

AND I WOULD WALK 100 MILES: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League leading 117 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .469 (15-32) with 12 runs, one double, one triple, six home runs, 14 RBI, six steals and nine walks in that span...His nine-game streak is the fourth-longest of his career... He has safely reached base in 16 straight games...He is batting .386 (22-57) in that span with 19 runs, one double, one triple, seven homers, 21 RBI, 19 walks, nine steals, a .545 OBP and an .807 SLG...He has safely reached base in 33 of his last 34 games, batting .306/.456/.645 in that span with 34 runs, one double, one triple, 13 homers, 31 RBI, 33 walks, 14 steals and a 1.101 OPS.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth consecutive win after allowing two earned runs over 6.0 innings on September 2 at Detroit...He recorded seven strikeouts, and he has recorded at least six in all four of his starts...Has allowed two or fewer earned runs and four or fewer hits in all four of his starts.

ONE OF A KIND: He is the first pitcher in Major League history to record a win in each of his first four starts, complete at least 5.0 innings, and strike out six or more batters in each of his first four career starts...Has recorded a franchise record 28 strikeouts through his first four appearances, which topped the previous high of 26 held by Dwight Gooden, Matt Harvey, Tylor Megill, and Dick Selma...He is one of seven players in Major League history to record at least 28 strikeouts and allow four or fewer earned runs through their first four career starts...He joins Logan Henderson (MIL) as the only two players who have accomplished the feat this season.

VS. PHILADELPHIA/NL EAST: Made his third career start against Philadelphia on August 27 and he tossed 8.0 scoreless innings while striking out six...It was the longest of his first four starts and he threw a career-high 95 pitches...He became the second Mets starter to complete at least 8.0 innings this season (also: David Peterson)...Two of his four starts have come against divisional opponents and he has a 1.20 ERA (2 ER/15.0 IP) with 13 strikeouts over those contests.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League Debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Becomes the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh)...He became the fourth starter in the majors this season to record eight or more strikeouts in their Major League debut (also: Mick Abel 9, Logan Henderson 9, and Chase Burns).

SPIN THAT THING: Through his first four starts he has thrown his sweeper 28.1% of the time and his curveball 16.8% of the time...His curveball averages a league-leading 3,267 RM which is the most anyone generates on a curveball and any pitch this season...He has generated a 21.1 whiff rate on his sweeper and a 40.7% whiff rate on his curveball...12 of his strikeouts this season have come via the curveball/sweeper and in at-bats ending with either of those pitches opposing batters are hitting .200 (6-30)...In the minors, he threw his sweeper 28.4% of the time and recorded 51 swings and misses with the pitch...Opposing hitters only hit .186 (17-91) in at-bats ending with his sweeper.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: He became the sixth player (fifth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Mets this season, joining Hayden Senger, Alex Carrillo, Justin Hagenman, Jonathan Pintaro and Blade Tidwell...He is also the 43rd pitcher the Mets have used this season which is a franchise record topping the previous high of 42 in 2021.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: The Mets number three prospect and the number 37 prospect in baseball according to MLBPipeline.com, appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguer players...He has only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 HR...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

LET ME GET A WHIFF: In the minors he had a 12.5% whiff percentage this year...Of his 1,363 pitches, he has generated whiffs at least 20 times with four different pitches in his arsenal...Sweeper (51 pitches), Curveball (30 pitches), sinker (29 pitches), and 4-seam fastball (28 pitches).

CAREER: Overall, in three minor league seasons he has posted a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and has recorded 245 strikeouts, good for a K/9 of 9.72In three seasons at Oklahoma State he finished with a 4.55 ERA (29 ER/57.1 IP) and recorded 76 strikeouts good for a K/9 of 11.93.
