ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game the Mets have announced the following roster moves: RHP Robert Gsellman was reinstated from the IL...LHP Daniel Zamora was optioned to the team's Alternate Training Site...INF Luis Carpio has been added to the team's 60-man player pool and OF Ryan Cordell has been outrighted to the team's Alternate Training Site...Gsellman went 2-3 with a 4.66 ERA (33 earned runs/63.2 innings) with 23 walks and 60 strikeouts in 52 appearances for the Mets last year...Yesterday, the team optioned catcher Ali Sánchez to the team's Alternate Training Site.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets return home tonight for the start of a seven game homestand against Miami (three games) and Washington (four games)...New York defeated the Nationals, 3-1, on Thursday to finish their second road trip of the year...New York went 2-4 on the trip...The team has now won two of their last three games.

1010 WINS!: J.D. Davis is on a 10-game hitting streak, which matches his career-best for the second-time...He also accomplished that feat from August 5-16 last year...He is batting .353 (12-34) with five runs, a double, two home runs, six RBI, five walks, a .450 OBP and a .559 SLG in that span...It is tied for the third longest active streak in the majors...Davis ranked 10th in the NL with a 136 wRC+ (weighted runs created plus) and was 17th in the NL with a .373 wOBA (weighted on-base average) last season.

KEEP FISHING: Michael Wacha owns a three-game winning streak and has never lost vs. the Marlins...He has made four career starts against the Fish and is 3-0 with a 3.32 ERA (eight earned runs/21.2 innings) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...He had his best start against the club in his most recent outing vs. the club on June 10 of last season, when he held the Marlins scoreless for 6.0 innings, allowing just five hits and two walks with four strikeouts.

MY OH MIA: The Mets went 8-2 at home against the Marlins last year, including winning six straight from May 10-August 7...The team owned a 2.64 ERA (27 earned runs/92.0 innings) with 21 walks and 98 strikeouts...The team posted a .274/.369/.500 slash line at home against the Marlins...Overall, New York has won 13 of their last 16 against the Marlins at Citi Field dating back to September 12, 2018.

NICE TO MEJÍA: Humberto Mejía is the third Marlins starter and seventh starting pitcher overall in the last three seasons to make his major league debut vs. the Mets...The White Sox are the only other team in the majors to face as many starters making their debut since the start of 2018.

HOME, NOT SO SWEET, HOME: The Mets are batting .246/.326/.347 in five games at home with three home runs...This compares to a .270/.364/.401 slashline with nine home runs in eight games on the road...The team has scored 12 runs at home compared to 39 on the road...The team is 1-4 at home this year with a 5.28 ERA (27 earned runs/46.0 innings) compared to 4-4 with a 4.63 ERA (35 earned runs/68.0 innings) on the road.

BAKER'S DOZEN: Michael Conforto has safely reached base in all 13 games this season...He is batting .318 (15-48) with six runs, two doubles, two home runs, seven walks, two steals, six RBI and a .411 OBP...He enters the day tied for sixth in the NL with 15 hits, is 11th in OBP and 14th in average...Conforto has hit 111 home runs in his career which is 12th on the Mets all-time list...Ed Kranepool is 11th with 118 followed by Edgardo Alfonzo who is 10th with 120.

28 GAMES LATER: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in all 13 games this season...Nimmo has reached base safely in each of his last 28 games dating back to last season, tied for the longest active streak in the majors (Alex Bregman)...He owns a .424 OBP and a .765 OPS this year...The 28-game on-base streak is tied for the longest in his career...Nimmo safely reached base in 28 straight games from August 11-September 21, 2018...He is second in the NL with 12 walks and is tied for third with 11 runs.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets went 2-11 with runners in scoring position on Wednesday night in Washington...New York went 14-64 with RISP during the six-game road trip...Overall, the team is batting .218 (27-124) with runners in scoring position this season...That puts them 26th in the majors and 14th in the National League.

THE FIRST PITCH IS THE DEEPEST: The Mets as a team are hitting .397/.408/.618 on the first pitch...Their 27 hits on the first pitch lead the majors...Michael Conforto is tied for second in the majors with five such hits...Jeff McNeil is tied for sixth in the majors with four first-pitch hits.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets face the Marlins for the first time this year...New York has won 13 of its last 16 games at Citi Field against the Fish.

LEFT OVERS: The Mets left nine on base on Wednesday in Washington...The team entered the day with the major league-lead with 116 runners left on base...The team left 58 runners on base during their last road trip.

NO OFFENSE, BUT...: The Mets are fourth in the major leagues and second in the National League with 117 hits this season...The Mets are third in MLB and second in the NL with a .261 batting average and lead the majors with a .350 OBP...The Mets have recorded six games where they racked up 10 or more hits this season, which is tied for the major-league lead...In 2019, the Mets recorded 69 such games, the fifth-most in the majors and the second-most in the National League...Colorado recorded 77 such games.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets pitching staff has struck out 118, which is seventh in the majors and fourth in the NL...The Mets have recorded five games with 10 or more strikeouts this season.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: Andrés Giménez is hitting .320 (8-25) with two runs, a triple, an RBI, a walk and two steals in 12 games...He has reached base in all five starts this season, batting .368 (7-19) with a run, a triple, an RBI, a walk and a steal...Giménez entered the season as the third-best Mets prospect and the No. 84 overall prospect in the majors, per *MLB Pipeline*...After spending the 2019 season with Binghamton (AA), the Venezuelan shortstop led the Arizona Fall League with a .371 (26-70) average and .999 OPS.

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Giménez is all over the MLB rookie leaderboard...He is second in steals (2), tied for third in hits (8) and 10th in average (.320).

THE PEN IS MAYBE MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has not allowed a run in the last three games, a span of 10.0 innings...Overall, the team ranks 24th in the majors and 10th in the NL with a 5.33 (29 earned runs/49.0 innings) bullpen ERA after 13 games...Last year, the Mets pen ranked 26th in the majors with a 4.99 ERA...The pen's 4.99 ERA was the highest in franchise history...Mets relievers are tied for sixth in the majors with three losses this season and are tied for fourth in the majors with three blown saves.

IN NEW YORK YOU CAN BE A NEW MAN: Billy Hamilton stole his 300th career base on Wednesday...He ranks third among active players in career stolen bases...His 81.3 percent stolen base success rate ranks fifth among active players with at least 200 stolen base attempts...Since 2013, Hamilton ranks fourth among all centerfielders with 72 defensive runs saved and ranks second among all active centerfielders with 55 outfield assists and a .995 fielding percentage.

HE'S HEATING UP: Over his last six starts, Jeff McNeil is batting .458 (11-24) with two runs, two doubles, four walks, four RBI and a 1.093 OPS...This compares to his first three starts where he went 1-10...McNeil has recorded four multi-hit games this season, tied for the seventh-most in the NL...McNeil collected 53 multi-hit games last year, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NL.

SIXTY-GAME SPRINT: Over the final 60 games of the 2019 season, the Mets' 39-21 mark tied for the second-best in the majors and co-led the NL...Only one team, the Astros (42-18), had a better record in the season's last 60 games...The Rays, Twins, Dodgers and A's all also ended last year on a 39-21 run...See the chart below for the Mets' best 60-game starts to a season:

LAST START: Wacha took his first loss of the season after allowing five runs, earned, on seven hits in 4.0 innings at Atlanta on August 1...He walked two and fanned five...The Mets lost, 7-1.

2019 RECAP: Wacha went 6-7 with a 4.76 ERA across 29 games (24 starts) in his last season with the Cardinals...In 126.2 innings, he walked 55 batters and fanned 104...In his last nine starts, he posted a 2.89 ERA (12 earned runs/37.1 innings).

VS. MIAMI: Wacha owns a three-game winning streak and has never lost vs. the Marlins...He has made four career starts against the Fish and is 3-0 with a 3.32 ERA (eight earned runs/21.2 innings) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...He had his best start against the club in his most recent outing vs. the club on June 10 of last season, when he held the Marlins scoreless for 6.0 innings, allowing just five hits and two walks with four strikeouts.

FINISHED STRONG: In his last nine starts of the 2019 season, he posted a 2.89 ERA (12 earned runs/37.1 innings)...That 2.89 ERA ranked 14th in the NL from August 15 through the end of the season (min. 35.0 innings).

WINNING AT A HIGH RATE: Wacha's career record sits at 60-40, 20 games above the .500 mark, good for a winning percentage of .600...He is one of just 12 NL pitchers with a winning percentage above .600 since 2013 (min. 70 decisions).

NO FLY ZONE: Wacha was one of just two starting pitchers with to post a HR/9 ratio under 1.00 every season from 2013-2018, joined by Gio González...However, Wacha suffered from an abnormally high home run rate of 1.85 HR/9 last season, nearly double his career rate of 1.01 HR/9.

ATHLETIC GENES: Wacha comes from a family of athletes...His brother, Lucas, played linebacker at the University of Wyoming...His sister, Brette, played basketball at Southern Arkansas University...His uncle, Dusty Rogers, played professional baseball in the Cincinnati Reds organization from 1984-1988.

- During the shutdown, honored those who went "above and beyond their call of duty" through his newly-launched Homers for Heroes foundation...The foundation will honor a hero after each of the Mets' 60 games this season...The hero will receive a care package, which will include game-used memorabilia from Alonso.
