METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Marlins, 5-4...The Mets have dropped back-to-back games after winning five in a row...New York is in a stretch of 13 straight games to start the second-half...The Mets begin the second-half with a four game set in Miami (0-1) followed by a two-game series in The Bronx...The Mets return to Citi Field on Thursday, July 25 for a seven-game homestand against the Braves (four games) and the Twins (three games).

VENEZUELAN HERITAGE CELEBRATION: The Marlins are celebrating Venezuelan Heritage today at loanDepot park...The Mets feature three players from Venezuela on the team, Catchers Francisco Alvarez and Luis Torrens, RHP José Buttó as well as Manager Carlos Mendoza.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil is on a four-game hitting streak...He is batting .400 (6-15) in that span with three runs, two doubles, two home runs, six RBI with a walk and a 1.371 OPS...He recorded his second career multi-home run game last night... He has recorded 221 career multi-hit games...That is 15th in Mets history...Carlos Beltrán is next with 223 followed by Buddy Harrelson with 231...McNeil's 789 hits are 17th in franchise history...Kevin McReynolds is next with 791, followed by Lee Mazilli with 796.

DINGERS! The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 123 home runs this season...The Mets have five players who have hit 10 or more home runs this year (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, J.D. Martinez, Brandon Nimmo and Mark Vientos)...Only the Padres and Orioles have more with seven players...Last year, the Mets featured eight players with 10 or more home runs, tied for the third-most in franchise history.

20/20 VISION: Francisco Lindor currently sits at 26 doubles, 17 home runs and 19 steals this season...Last year he became the ninth player in franchise history to record 20+ doubles, 20+ homers and 20+ steals in a single season...He is looking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple 20/20/20 seasons joining Howard Johnson (x5, 1987-91), Darryl Strawberry (x4, 1984, 1986-88), Carlos Beltrán (x2, 2007-08) and David Wright (x2, 2006-07).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets have played 44 games on the road entering today...That is tied with the Phillies for the second-fewest in the majors...Only the Rays (43) have played fewer...They are 23-21 away from Citi Field in 2024...Their .523 winning percentage is the seventh in The Show and third in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have hit .267/.398/.442 on the road this year...They rank second in the majors in average, OBP and SLG.

WAY, AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: Brandon Nimmo is batting .294/.413/.569 with 35 runs, 10 doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 31 RBI and 24 walks in 40 games on the road this season...This compares to a .211/.318/.358 slashline with 24 runs, eight doubles, one triple, 32 RBI and 26 walks in 51 games at home in 2024.

JUST THE TWO OF US: Brandon Nimmo moved to the two spot for the first time on June 13 vs. Miami...He has appeared in 29 games in the two-hole and the Mets are 19-10 in that span...Nimmo is batting .310 (35-113) with 27 runs, seven doubles, nine home runs, 31 RBI, 16 walks, three steals with a .405 OBP, a .611 SLG and a 1.015 OPS when batting second this season...He has safely reached base in 27 of his last 28 games, posting a .409 OBP in that span...He has collected 63 RBI in 91 games this year...He recorded a career-high 68 RBI in 152 games last season.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Entering June, Nimmo was batting .214/.350/.378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 37 games since then, he is batting .293/.377/.551 with 30 runs, nine doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 34 RBI, 17 walks, four steals with a .928 OPS...He has brought his OPS up from .728 on May 31 to .813 entering today.

JULY! JULY! JULY! The Mets are 9-6 this month...Their .600 winning percentage this month is the third-best in the National League...They have posted a 4.77 ERA, while batting .249/.321/.448 this month...This compares to 16-8 record with a 4.17 ERA and a .280/.356/.504 slashline in June.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 57-51 since loanDepot park opened up in 2012.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 16-13 against the National League East this season...They have posted a 4.32 ERA, while batting .258/.323/.425...The Mets have won 12 of their last 17 games against the division...The Mets went 25-27 against the NL East in 2023.

LET'S GO FISHING: J.D. Martinez, a native of Miami, is a .304 (14-46) hitter with four runs, four doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI and nine walks in 12 career games at loanDepot park...Francisco Lindor has hit .287/.386/.435 with 17 runs, seven doubles, three home runs, 15 RBI and 14 walks in 28 games at the yard...Brandon Nimmo has hit .283/.383/.507 with nine doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 27 RBI and 24 walks in 46 games in Miami...Pete Alonso has recorded 19 extra-base hits (12 home runs) with 24 RBI in 39 career games at the home of the Marlins.

RECORD SCRATCH: The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500...The team is 9-6 in this stretch...The Mets are 31-22 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 53 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .299/.385/.523 with 39 runs, 18 doubles, 10 home runs, 32 RBI, 24 walks, 13 steals with a .908 OPS...Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and second in the NL with a 4.2 fWAR this season...He has posted a 3.7 fWAR since May 1...That is fifth-best in the majors in that span...In 67 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .279/.355/.495 with 12 home runs and 41 RBI...The Mets are 29-23 when Lindor bats first this season.

SEVERINO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his sixth win of the season, throwing 6.1 innings on July 10 in the Mets 6-2 win against the Nationals...Allowed two runs on four hits, with three walks and four strikeouts.

HOME, SWEET HOME: Severino has gone 3-1 with a 2.47 ERA (13 ER/47.1 IP) with 19 walks and 35 strikeouts in eight starts at home this year...His 2.47 ERA is 18th in the majors and ninth in the National League...During his eight seasons with the Yankees, he held a 30-16 record with a 3.62 ERA (144 ER/358.0 IP) and 1.13 WHIP with 399 strikeouts against 100 walks while pitching at home.

NO WAY: Luis Severino carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning on April 29 against the Cubs...Threw 8.0 innings, allowing one run on one hit with two walks and five strikeouts...The outing was tied for the longest no-hit bid of his career...Threw 7.0 hitless innings on October 3, 2022 at Texas with the Yankees...Courtesy of Elias...Marked his longest start since June 16, 2018 vs. Tampa Bay (Also: 8.0 IP)...Became the first Mets pitcher to throw at least 8.0 innings and allow one or zero hits since Marcus Stroman accomplished the feat on July 21, 2021 at Cincinnati...Ranks fourth in the NL among qualifiers in ERA with a 2.31 (9 ER/35.0 IP) mark.

METS DEBUT: In his Mets debut on March 30, Severino became the 25th pitcher to start a game for both the Yankees and Mets (last: Bartolo Colon, 2011 with the Yankees and 2014 with the Mets)...He threw 5.0 innings, allowing 12 hits with six runs (three earned) and six strikeouts.

STRIKE THAT: Severino has recorded 865 career strikeouts...That ranks second among active Dominican pitchers...Only Luis Castillo (1,267) has recorded more.

2023 RECAP: Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1 IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1 IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games. Is a two-time AL All-Star (2017-18)...In 2017, ranked in the top ten in the AL in strikeouts (fourth, 230), innings pitched (ninth, 193.1), and wins (ninth, 14)...In 2018, finished in the top-10 in AL Cy Young balloting as he ranked eighth in the AL with 220 strikeouts and was third in the league with 19 wins...He was also the fastest Yankee to record 500 career strikeouts, accomplishing the feat in the 85th game of his career.

STRONG START IN SPRING: In his first Spring Training with the Mets, Severino recorded a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0) and allowed just one walk with 12 strikeouts over four starts.

HIGH VELOCITY: In 2023, his fastball velocity (96.4 mph) ranked in the 88th percentile in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRISTIAN SCOTT (0-2, 4.36)

LAST START: Took the bump on July 13 vs. Colorado at Citi Field... Allowed three runs on seven hits with one walk and struck out five over 4.1 innings...The Mets earned a 7-3 win in the game.

SINCE YOU'VE BEEN BACK: Has made three starts since he has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...Has posted a 5.17 ERA (9 ER/5.2 IP) in that span with four home runs, four walks and 10 strikeouts.

- Has 26 home runs in 84 career games against Miami, tied with David Wright for the most in franchise history...Are the third-most against any single opponent since 2019 behind Aaron Judge's 29 homers against Baltimore and his 27 homers against Washington.
