CINCINNATI REDS (38-42) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (41-41)

June 27, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 4:05 EDT - Game #83/Home #44

RHP Chase Burns (9-1, 2.00 ERA) vs. RHP Jared Jones (1-1, 5.75 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have split the first four games of this six-game homestand vs. Seattle (2-1, Tuesday-Thursday) and Cincinnati (0-1, Friday-Sunday), including a 6-4 loss on Friday at PNC Park...Will embark on a seven-game road trip to Philadelphia (June 29-July 2) and Washington (July 3-5) after this homestand...Have not been shut out in 35 straight games (began on May 19 at St. Louis), their longest such streak since a 36-game streak from May 29 (G2)-July 9, 2024...Have scored 413 runs, which are tied with Milwaukee for the third-most in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (439) and Los Angeles-NL (424)...Have struck out the third-most batters (753) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (779) and Milwaukee (777)...Have the third-best batting average (.257) in MLB, behind Los Angeles-NL (.261) and Tampa Bay (.258).

SEEING RED: Pittsburgh has won five of its first seven games vs. Cincinnati this season (won two of three games from March 30-April 1 at Great American Ball Park and swept a three-game series from May 1-3 at PNC Park)...The Pirates have also won three straight series vs. the Reds (won two of three games last season from September 23-25 at Great American Ball Park)...Pittsburgh has won four straight series vs. Cincinnati just twice since the National League Central formed in 1994, coming from June 15-September 30, 2018 and September 22, 2023-August 25, 2024...The Pirates have also gone 48-23 (.676) over their last 71 games vs. the Reds at PNC Park, dating back to September 1, 2017 (they have won or split 17 of the 21 series during that span).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Konnor Griffin connected for the first leadoff home run of his Major League career with his leadoff blast off Andrew Abbott on Friday vs. Cincinnati...The Pirates' 54 first-inning runs this season rank fourth in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (63), Houston (60) and Milwaukee (55)...Their six leadoff home runs are the second-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Los Angeles-NL (seven), Minnesota (seven) and Seattle (seven)...Pittsburgh's 20 first-inning home runs so far this season are the third-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Los Angeles-AL (21) and New York-AL (21).

HOME(R) HAPPY: Konnor Griffin (first inning), Marcell Ozuna (sixth inning) and Esmerlyn Valdez (sixth inning) each hit solo home runs on Friday vs. Cincinnati...It was Pittsburgh's first game with at least three solo home runs since hitting four solo blasts (Rowdy Tellez, Jack Suwinski, Yasmani Grandal and Michael A. Taylor) in a 14-2 win on July 5, 2024 vs. New York (NL)...The Pirates have hit at least one home run in 14 of their last 17 home games (since May 25 vs. Chicago-NL), including multiple home runs in 11 of those 17 games...Pittsburgh has hit 54 home runs at home this year after hitting an MLB-low 49 homers at home in 2025.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds had an infield single in the third inning on Friday vs. Cincinnati and has now reached base safely in 31 straight games (since May 23 at Toronto)...It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and the second-longest such streak in Major League Baseball this season, behind only the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (48 games, April 3-May 25)... Reynolds is 41-for-113 (.363) with 11 doubles, seven home runs, 20 RBI, 18 walks, two stolen bases, a 1.101 OPS and 24 runs scored during the streak...He has also hit safely in 16 straight games (since June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL), going 24-for-62 (.387) with six doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, a 1.175 OPS and 12 runs scored during that streak...It is the third-longest hitting streak of his career, behind a 25-game hitting streak from June 1-29, 2024 & a 17-game hitting streak from May 23-June 9, 2019.

POKED THE BEAR: Marcell Ozuna reached base safely three times in four plate appearances after going 2-for-3 with a solo home run and a walk on Friday vs. Cincinnati...He has gone 12-for-39 (.308) with two home runs, six RBI and an .819 OPS across his last 11 contests (since May 26 vs. Chicago-NL).

JAKE RAKES: Jake Mangum went 2-for-4 on Friday vs. Cincinnati...He is 25-for-72 (.347) with five doubles, five RBI and six stolen bases in 21 games this month (he has hit safely in 16 of his 19 games with a plate appearance)...His June average ranks seventh in Major League Baseball (minimum 70 at-bats), behind Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong (.396), Tampa Bay's Yandy Diaz (.391), San Francisco's Jung Hoo Lee (.381), Detroit's Dillon Dingler (.356), Houston's Yordan Alvarez (.349) & Miami's Otto Lopez (.348).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 27, 2007: Xavier Nady and Ryan Doumit hit back-to-back, two-out home runs off Kevin Gregg in the 10th inning, leading Pittsburgh to a 7-5 win over Florida at Dolphin Stadium. It was Nady's second home run of the game, giving him his third career multi-home run performance. Shawn Chacon earned the win with 1.2 scoreless innings of relief, while Matt Capps secured his seventh save of the year.

LAST TIME OUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing one run over his 3.0 innings in Pittsburgh's 8-6 win on June 21 at Colorado...He was removed from the game after he was struck by a batted ball from TJ Rumfield during the last play of the third inning.

AGAINST THE REDS: Jones lost a 7-1 decision after allowing six runs over 5.0 innings in his only career start vs. Cincinnati (September 21, 2024 at Great American Ball Park).

RIGHT ON: Jones has held right-handed hitters to a .152 batting average against (5-for-33) and a .404 OPS...The only righthander with an extra-base hit against him this season was the A's Henry Bolte, who recorded a second-inning double on June 15.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Jones won a 5-1 decision after allowing four hits and two walks (he had four strikeouts) in 5.0 scoreless innings on June 4 at Houston...It was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2024 vs. Washington (it was a total of 634 days).

WE WENT TO JARED: The Pirates have won eight of Jones' last 10 starts, dating back to September 2, 2024 at Chicago (NL)...The team's only two losses in that stretch came on September 21, 2024 at Cincinnati, when he allowed six runs in 5.0 innings (lost, 7-1) and on June 15 at the A's, when he allowed five runs over 4.0 innings (lost, 11-2).

2026 DEBUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh's 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

MAKING A COMEBACK: Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

ON THE MEND: Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakeland), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

2024 IN REVIEW: Jones went 6-8 with a 4.14 ERA (121.2ip/56er) and 132 strikeouts in 22 starts during his rookie season (2024)...His 132 strikeouts ranked sixth among all Major League rookies (his teammate, Paul Skenes, ranked fourth with 170 strikeouts).

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Jones' 98 strikeouts prior to the 2024 All-Star break were the most by any Pirates rookie prior to the break, surpassing Cy Blanton (79) in 1935...He led the South Atlantic League in strikeouts (142) while he was w/High-A Greensboro (2022).

HISTORIC OUTING: Jones allowed just one baserunner (it was a fifth-inning double to Elias Díaz) while striking out 10 batters over 7.0 scoreless innings on May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado...He became the first and only Pittsburgh pitcher to have an outing of at least 7.0 scoreless innings, one/zero hits allowed, zero walks surrendered and 10 strikeouts.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Jones struck out at least seven batters in each of his first five Major League starts (March 30-April 22, 2024)...He joined Pittsburgh's Jose DeLeon (July 23-August 10, 1983), Washington's Stephen Strasburg (June 8-28, 2010) and New York (AL)'s Masahiro Tanaka (April 4-27, 2014) as the only pitchers to accomplish that.
