TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin the second leg of the 9-game road trip with the first of 3 games against the Houston Astros...Seattle yesterday wrapped up a 3-game set against the New York Yankees (1-2) and will also travel to Milwaukee to face the Brewers (3 G, 8/18-8/20) on the road trip...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** and **Dave Valle** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's series finale against the Yankees by a 1-0 final score, snapping a 6-game losing streak.

- Quality Assurance** - The Mariners starting pitching staff has recorded 55 quality starts this season, the most in the American League and 2nd-most in MLB behind only the Dodgers (65 G)...today's starter **George Kirby** leads Mariners starters and ranks T-6th in the American League with 13 quality starts.
- No Walk Zone** - The Mariners pitching staff has the lowest walk rate (6.8%) and fewest walks-per-9 innings rate (2.56) in the Majors this season, narrowly ranking 2nd in fewest walks overall (306 BB) to the Rays (305 BB)...Seattle also leads MLB in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.39).
- Mambo Italiano** - Outfielder **Dominic Canzone** is 1 home run away from his first career 20-homer campaign...coming into the year, he recorded 25 career homers across 3 seasons (2023-25).

ONE-RUN WONDER...**Weston Wilson** yesterday drove in the game-winning run on a 2-out, solo home run in the 2nd inning...it marked just the 21st time in franchise history that Seattle has won a 1-0 ballgame on a solo home run...was also only the 6th-such game on the road and first since April 29, 2021 at Houston...overall this season, the Mariners have recorded 51 go-ahead or game-winning home runs, the 5th-most in MLB and 2nd-most in the American League behind only the Yankees (70 HR)...since the start of 2025, Seattle has hit 132 go-ahead or game-winning homers, ranking 3rd in MLB behind the Dodgers (133 HR) and Yankees (162 HR).

CLOSING IN ON 100...closer **Andrés Muñoz** yesterday picked up his 21st save of the season and the 99th of his career...with his next save, 'Munty' will become the 40th pitcher in MLB history to record 100 saves by age 27-or-younger...98 of his 99 saves have come with the Mariners (1 with San Diego), 2 saves shy of becoming the fourth pitcher in Seattle history with 100+ saves, joining Sasaki (129 SV), Edwin Díaz (109) and J.J. Putz (101)...Muñoz has recorded three consecutive 20+ save campaigns, joining Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) as the only Mariners with three consecutive 20+ save seasons.

JULIO BEING JULIO...**Julio Rodríguez** has reached base safely in his last 12-consecutive games (7/31-c), batting .310 (13x42) with 4 runs, 3 home runs, 6 RBI, 2 stolen bases and 9 walks, reaching base at a .431 clip and slugging .524 (.955 OPS)...with his next home run, Julio would achieve his 5th-consecutive 20+ home run season to begin his career, becoming just the 20th player in MLB history to record 20+ homers in each of their first 5 seasons...Julio would become just the 11th player to do that and accomplish it by the age of 25-or-younger, joining Joe DiMaggio, Eddie Mathews, Frank Robinson, Orlando Cepeda, Tony Conigliaro, Eddie Murray, Darryl Strawberry, Albert Pujols, Jay Bruce and Giancarlo Stanton...each of the first 4, and 5 of the first 6, names listed are National Baseball Hall of Famers.

JOSHIN' AROUND...over his last 23 games since the All-Star Break (7/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .313 (26x83) with 9 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 7 RBI, 9 walks, 5 stolen bases, a .387 OBP and slugging .446 for an .833 OPS...he has reached base safely in 22 of those 23 games and in 29 of his last 31 games (7/4-c).

RANDY (YOU'RE A FINE GUY)...**Randy Arozarena** has been solid offensively all season long, batting .276 (116x420) with 76 runs, 24 doubles, 1 triple, 16 homers, 52 RBI, 47 walks and 20 stolen bases in 114 games...since his breakout season in 2021, Randy has hit 126 home runs and stolen 145 bases, becoming one of 6 players in the Majors to record 125+ homers and 125+ stolen bases during that span along with Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD (259 HR, 143 SB), José Ramírez-CLE (168 HR, 189 SB), **Julio Rodríguez** (131 HR, 131 SB), Trea Turner-3Tms (128 HR, 161 SB) and Fernando Tatis Jr.-SD (125 HR, 125 SB).

ICE COLE...in 25 games since the All-Star Break, **Cole Young** is batting .295 (28x95) with 10 runs, 1 double, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and 6 walks, reaching base at a .343 clip and slugging .442 for a .785 OPS over 102 plate appearances...Young ranks as the best second baseman in the American League this season by *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement (3.9).

WELCOME TO WALTER'S WORLD...in yesterday's series finale against the Yankees, **Logan Gilbert** tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just 4 hits and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts...Logan has been outstanding this season, posting a 3.28 ERA (53 ER, 145.1 IP) with 33 walks compared to 152 strikeouts...among qualified starters in MLB, he ranks 5th in innings pitched, T-5th in WHIP (0.99), T-10th in opponent batting average (.208), 9th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.61) and T-11th in strikeouts.

RICK RIZZS TO BE INDUCTED TO MARINERS HOF IN '27...the Mariners announced on Saturday that legendary broadcaster **Rick Rizzs** will be the 12th inductee into the Mariners Hall of Fame during the 2027 season...Rizzs is in his 41st and final season as a Mariners broadcaster, as he previously announced his plans to retire following the season...Rizzs will join his friend and long-time broadcast partner Dave Niehaus as the only non-uniformed members of the Mariners Hall of Fame.

50 GREATEST MARINERS PLAYERS...the Mariners revealed the 50 Greatest Mariners Players in franchise history on Saturday, selected based on a combination of fan vote, and input from Mariners alumni, Mariners baseball operations and longtime Mariners front office and Seattle media...visit [Mariners.com/Top50](https://www.mariners.com/Top50) to view the full list.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners secured the 1-0 win against the Yankees in yesterday's series finale in New York, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...yesterday's win marked only the 8th time in the history of the Yankees current stadium (Yankee Stadium III) that an opposing team has won 1-0?...of those 8 such games, the Mariners have accounted for two of them, also securing a 1-0 win on Aug. 4, 2012 when Félix Hernández threw a complete game shutout...also joining the Mariners are the Athletics (4/9/26), Red Sox (8/22/25), Angels (6/16/25), Royals (9/5/14), Rays (7/27/13) and Guardians (6/13/11).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 14

- 1981** - Jeff Burroughs hits three home runs in a 13-3 win over the Twins, giving Seattle a split of a doubleheader.
- 1985** - In the first game of their second double header in 3 days, Mike Moore allowed only 2 runs in a club-record 11-inning pitching performance. Moore fanned 12 batters, but received no-decision as the California Angels dealt the Mariners a 3-1 loss in 12 innings. The Mariners took the nightcap, 6-1, to earn a split.
- 1991** - Randy Johnson takes a no-hitter into the ninth vs. Oakland but Mike Gallego singles. Johnson settles for a one-hit shutout in a 4-0 win.

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 23rd start of the season and 2nd against the Yankees...will be the 135th start of his career and his 4th career start against the Yankees.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

HOUSTON. WE HAVE A PROBLEM... Kirby will be making his 12th career start against the Astros...his 12 starts after tonight will be tied for the 2nd most games he has played against any opponent in his career, tied with the Angels and trailing the Rangers (13 G)...owns a career 2.14 ERA (15 ER, 63.0 IP), 61 strikeouts, 8 walks, and a 1.05 WHIP over his 11 starts against the Astros...Kirby leads active starting pitchers (min. 30.0 IP) in career ERA (2.14), K/BB (7.63) and BB/9 (1.14) against Houston while ranking 10th in WHIP (1.05)...among all-time MLB pitchers (min. 60.0 IP), his 2.14 ERA against the Astros is T-17th lowest while his K/BB ranks 2nd-best.

MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME...is making his 10th road start of the season and the 68th road start of his career...among with 50+ career road starts, his 6.02 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road **leads MLB all-time**, ahead of Tarik Skubal's 5.73 K/BB...ranks 11th in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) in K/BB (4.6), just trailing **Logan Gilbert** (4.83) on the road this season...his 1.34 walks-per-nine innings on the road is tied for 2nd best all-time (min. 50 GS), trailing Hall of Famer Cy Young (1.09) and matching Deacon Phillippe (1.34)...ranks 8th in BB/9 (1.71) on the road in MLB in 2026 (min. 50.0 IP).

FURIOUS GEORGE...in his first start of August on Aug. 8 vs. MIN, recorded his first 7.0-inning scoreless outing since Sept. 12, 2025 and the 10th of his career...followed the start with 5.0 innings of 1-run ball (1 ER) on Aug. 8 vs. TB for his 7th outing of the season with 5.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer runs...his 51 such games over his career are 12th most in MLB since 2023 while his 27 career starts of 3-or-fewer runs allowed over 7.0+ IP are T-14th most since 2022, matching **Logan Gilbert**...he is 1-of-11 pitchers this season with 5+ games of 7.0+ IP, 3-or-fewer runs and 1-or-fewer walks, including his Aug. 8 start...Kirby's 26 such starts since 2023 are T-6th most in MLB across that span.

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown 13 quality starts this season (last: 8/2 vs. MIN), tied for 6th-most in the AL...his 76 career quality starts are tied for 5th-most in MLB since 2022...has thrown 39 career quality starts without any walks allowed (4x this season, last: 7/8 at MIA), most in MLB since 2022, ranking ahead of Zack Wheeler-PHI (29 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 18 career road games (last: 7/8 at MIA), 2nd most in MLB since 2022, trailing just Tarik Skubla-DET/LAD (20)...his 18 such games on the road are also most in Mariners history after surpassing Jamie Moyer's 17 such games in his July 8 start at MIA.

- **Hold Me Closer** - Earned his 23rd hold of the season after tossing a scoreless 7th inning of relief on 8/13 at NYY, helping preserve the 1-0 shutout...his 23 holds are T-4th in MLB.
- **Reliable Arm** - Has only allowed an earned run in 14 of 57 appearances this season...has allowed 2+ ER only four times.
- **Steady Eddy** - Made 8-consecutive relief appearances without allowing an earned run (3/30-4/18)...tossed 7.2 innings over those appearances.
- **Super Stretch** - Held a 0.77 ERA (1 ER, 11.2 IP) with 2 walks and 8 strikeouts over 12 appearances during April.
- **El Campeón** - Won the 2026 World Baseball Classic with Team Venezuela, which included a pitching appearance in the Championship Game against Team USA on March 17.

- **Welcome Back!** - Recalled from Triple-A Tacoma on Aug. 7...made his first appearance back with the team on Aug. 9 vs. TB, tossing 1.0 perfect inning for his 7th perfect outing over 1.0+ IP this season.
- **Can't Touch This** - Has not allowed a hit in 12 of his 21 major league appearances this season.
- **Solid to Start** - Posted a 1.86 (4 ER, 19.1 IP) with a 1.03 WHIP in 17 appearances with Seattle during the first half...held opponents to a .156 batting average (10x64).
