STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude their six-game road trip against the Orioles (1-2) and Tigers (1-1, one to play) today in Detroit...following tomorrow's off day, will begin a six-game homestand against the Padres (3G) and Mets (3G) on Friday night...have won two of their last three games after losing seven of their previous nine contests (Aug. 14-22), which came on the heels of a season-high-tying nine-game winning streak (Aug. 3-12)...are tied with the Padres for MLB's second-best record since July 20 at 22-12 (.647), trailing the Red Sox (23-11/.676)...have the hardest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .513...have held a 3.5-game lead in the AL East for the last two days...have spent 100 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 60 consecutive days in first place (June 27–pres.)...only the Dodgers (147), Braves (145), and Brewers (115) have spent more time leading their divisions...have held the AL's best record for 99 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

- With last night's 4-1 setback, the Rays suffered a season series loss to the Tigers...they have not defeated Detroit in a season set since 2023, going 0-2-1 in the last three seasons since winning five of six from 2017-22 (clubs did not meet in 2020).
- The Rays scored first for the fourth straight game and have plated the opening run in 24 of their last 37 games (July 17 [G2]–pres.)...they have held a lead in each of their last three losses, tied for their second-longest streak this season (also: July 17 [G2]–19) behind March 26–April 3 (5G).
- Rays pitchers have yielded nine runs in the last four games (1.80 ERA/35.0IP, 7ER) on the heels of a season-high streak of six straight games permitting five runs or more (Aug. 16-21), which was their longest since May 19-25, 2024 (also 6G)...opponents are slashing .178/.195/.310 (23-for-129) in that span with 33 strikeouts against two walks, and Rays pitchers have produced a 0.71 WHIP.
- The Rays have issued 0 BB in two of their last three games, with their 15 such games this season pacing MLB...they have recorded one or zero walks in five straight games, tied for the third-longest streak in team history, and their three walks in that span are tied for the fewest in club history over any five-game span (6x, last: May 26-30, 2025)...their longest streak of games with 1 or 0 BB is seven straight contests (2x, last: June 26–July 3, 2026).
- The club is an AL-best 61-14 (.813) when scoring four runs or more, fifth in the majors...the Rays have won a season-high-tying 11 straight road games when reaching the mark (July 20–pres.; also: April 4–May 22)...their last longer streak was a 13-game stretch in 2024 (June 20–Sept. 7).
- Rays baserunners have been caught stealing on each of their last six attempts, tied for the longest streak in franchise history (also: Aug. 28–Sept. 7, 2002)...they have been caught stealing in five straight games, tied for the third-longest streak in team history and two games shy of the franchise record (7G from May 22-28, 2001).

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:

- Halt a three-game losing streak in rubber matches, earning their first such win since June 21 vs. WSH and first on the road since May 10 at BOS.
- Snap a season-high three-series skid and secure their first series victory since Aug. 10-12 at ATH.
- Improve to 11-6-3 over their last 19 sets (June 19–pres.).
- Earn their fifth series victory in their last six road series (July 20–pres.)...go 15-4 (or better) in a span of 19 road games for the first time since July 23–Sept. 7, 2021 (15-4).
- Earn their first series win over the Tigers since June 20-22, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field after losing their previous two...record their first series win at Comerica Park since Aug. 4-6, 2023.

BIRTHDAY WISHES—Rays reliever **Tyler Wells** celebrates his 32nd birthday today...**Nick Martinez** (Aug. 5 at COL) is the only Ray to pitch on his birthday this season...the last Tampa Bay reliever to do so was **Mason Montgomery** on June 17, 2025 vs. BAL.

THE CHAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND—Since breaking out of a 3-for-44 skid (May 30–June 17), **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 45 of his last 55 games (June 19–pres.), pacing the majors in average (.367), hits (77), multi-hit games (25, 1st with **PIT Nick Gonzales**), and steals (21) over that timeframe—**CLE Steven Kwan** (.347) is the only other player batting .325 or better in that span...the .367 average is the best any Ray across a 55-game span within a single season (min. 150AB) since **Carl Crawford** (.371) from July 15–Sept. 16, 2007...on the year, Simpson leads the AL with 45 multi-hit games, ahead of **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (44G)—he could join **Diaz** (2025, 11st) as the only Rays to pace the AL in the category...Simpson leads the majors in infied hits (53) and bunt hits (14) and is tied for the AL lead in triples (6) and stolen bases (35)...he owns the majors' second-lowest strikeout rate (8.4%) and third-lowest whiff rate (10.2%).

- Simpson (.308) is 15 points behind Alvarez (.323) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he has previously won an NCAA Division I batting title at Georgia Tech in 2022 (.433) and a Minor League Baseball batting crown in 2024 (.355)...Simpson and Diaz (.303) are on pace to become the third pair of qualified Rays teammates to both bat .300 or better—they would join **Jason Bartlett** (.320)/**Carl Crawford** (.305) in 2009 and Crawford (.315)/**B.J. Upton** (.300) in 2007.
- With 79 SB, Simpson is one steal shy of becoming the 30th player in the modern era (since 1900) to swipe 80 SB across their first two major league seasons...he would join **CIN Ely De La Cruz** (2023-24, 102SB) and **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (2001-02, 87SB) as the only players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to turn the trick.

NO HICK-UPS—**Liam Hicks'** .995 OPS through his first 17 games with Tampa Bay is the second best by any Ray over such a span since 2008 (min. 50PA), trailing **Eric Sogard** (1.022) in 2019...**Carlos Peña** recorded a 1.007 OPS through 17 games to commence his second stint with the club in 2012 (also: 2007-10)...Hicks is the first player to record a .995 OPS or better, 10 BB or more, and 5 SO or fewer through his first 17 games with a franchise since Sogard with the Brewers in 2017 (1.206 OPS, 13 BB, 2 SO)...he's the fourth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to turn the trick, also joining LAD **Gary Sheffield** in 1998 (1.033 OPS, 14 BB, 2 SO) and SD **Roberto Petagine** in 1995 (1.347 OPS, 14 BB, 5 SO), and is the first AL player to do so since **CLE Randy Mulligan** in 1993 (1.193 OPS, 12BB, 3SO).

- Since his Aug. 4 Rays debut, Hicks' .995 OPS ranks second among MLB catchers (min. 50PA) to **PIT Rafael Flores Jr.** (1.005)...he also ranks second in on-base pct. (.438) behind TOR **Alejandro Kirk** (.446) and is third in slugging pct. (.558)...his 2.0 walk-to-strikeout ratio in that span ranks fourth among all major league hitters.
- Dating back to Hicks' debut (Aug. 4), Rays clean-up hitters lead the majors in OPS (1.001) and on-base pct. (.409)...entering that span, they ranked 11th and 13th, respectively, in those categories (.756 OPS, .324 OBP).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** converted his 27th consecutive save opportunity on Monday, at DET, extending the longest streak in franchise history...it marks the majors' second-longest streak this season behind SD **Mason Miller's** 28-save run (March 28–July 29) and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since **CLE Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20–Sept. 25, 2024...his MLB-leading 38 saves are seventh most in a season in team history, including the most since **Alex Colomé** had 47 in 2017...Baker is on pace for 47 saves, which would tie Colomé for second most by a Ray behind **Fernando Rodney** (48) in 2012...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point after the calendar flips to August, joining Colomé (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernández** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform...with six games to play, Baker is two saves shy of tying Colomé (40) in 2017 for the most in club history before the end of August.

TAKE THIS SHOW ON THE ROAD—Dating back to July 20, the Rays are an MLB-best 14-4 over their last 18 road contests, tied for the fifth best mark in the majors over an 18-game road span this season...they have done this despite going 8-8 across 16 home games in that span, including losses in six of their last eight contests at Tropicana Field...they pace the AL in road average (.279), are tied for first in home runs (25), and rank second in slugging pct. (.444) and OPS (.784) over that timeframe—this, compared to their .256 average, .379 slugging pct., .680 OPS, and 13 HR at home across that span...on the mound, Rays pitchers have worked to a 2.96 ERA (161.0IP, 53ER) on the road since July 20 (2nd in MLB; NYY, 2.17) compared to a 4.16 (145.0IP, 67ER) mark at home (22nd in MLB).

- Before their 14-4 run, the Rays dropped 17 of their previous 23 road games (6-17, May 24–July 19) en route to a 21-27 mark away from home, 21st in the majors, and were an MLB-best 35-15 at home.

FRIARS IN FLORIDA—The Rays begin a three-game series against the Padres on Friday night at Tropicana Field...the Rays swept the Padres in their three-game set at Petco Park last season (April 25-27), outscoring them 9-3 on the heels of dropping two straight series (2-4) from 2023-24...the Rays have won 14 of their last 19 games vs. San Diego dating back to 2010 and are 10-8 all-time when facing the club at Tropicana Field, including wins in eight of their last 10.

TODAY'S START—**Freddy Peralta** is slated to make his fifth start as a Ray and fourth on the road tonight, his 27th start of the season and the 189th (238th outing) of his career...was acquired from the Mets on Aug. 2 in exchange for minor leaguers **RHP Gary Gill Hill**, **INF Émilien Pitre**, and **OF Aidan Smith**... was traded to the Mets from the Brewers on Jan. 21, 2026 and pitched to a 4.99 ERA (113.2IP, 63ER) with 113 strikeouts across 22 starts.

- ✦ His career .206 (294-for-1,427) opp. average following the All-Star break ranks second among active MLB starters (min. 1,300AB) behind LAD **Blake Snell** (.190/384-for-2018).
- ✦ Since 2023, Peralta's 743 strikeouts are the fourth most in the majors, trailing TOR **Dylan Cease** (862), PHI **Zack Wheeler** (779), and SEA **Logan Gilbert** (744)...his 121 starts in that span are tied with CHC **Kevin Gausman** for third most in the majors behind SF **Logan Webb** (123) and Cease (122).
- ✦ Is seeking his first win as a Ray, going 0-2 with a 7.17 ERA (21.1IP, 17ER) since being traded to the club on Aug. 2...seven of the 17 runs came in his Tampa Bay debut on Aug. 4 at COL.

LAST TIME OUT—Was dealt his second straight loss on Aug. 21 at BAL after allowing 5 ER over 7.0 innings in a 5-3 loss at Camden Yards (L, 7.0IP, 7H, 5R, 2HR, BB, HBP, 6SO)...yielded his first run in the opening frame after a double-single-walk sequence...then allowed a solo home run to **Dylan Beavers** to lead off the 2nd inning...after allowing a single two batters later, he retired each of his next seven batters before giving up three runs in the 5th on two hits, including a two-run homer from **Pete Alonso**, and a sacrifice fly...set down seven of his last eight to get through the 7th.

- ✦ Matched a season high with 7.0 innings pitched, joining his outing on May 23 at MIA (L, 7.0IP, 8H, 4ER, 2HR, 2BB, 9SO)...he took the loss in both outings this season, but is 9-5 in his career when working 7.0 innings or more.
- ✦ Has walked a batter in 25 straight starts since April 1 and in 25 of his 26 starts this season.

DETROIT ROCK CITY—The veteran right-hander will make his fifth career appearance/start against the Tigers...in those four previous outings, Peralta is 2-0 with a 2.95 ERA (21.1IP, 7ER), 27 strikeouts, and a .228 (18-for-79) opp. average...his teams are 3-1 against the Tigers, with his last outing coming in a 10-2 victory on May 12 vs. DET (w/NYM) at Citi Field (W, 6.0IP, 7H, 2R, HR, BB, 7SO)...has pitched to a 2.89 ERA (9.1IP, 3ER) while holding opponents to a .182 (6-for-33) opp. average in two career outings at Comerica Park.

- ✦ In 23 career appearances (16 starts) against AL Central foes, he has fashioned an 8-2 record with a 2.42 ERA (104.0IP, 28ER) and 127 strikeouts...nine of those 16 starts have been quality (last: May 12, 2026 vs. DET) and he is 8-1 in those starts.
- ✦ Has gone 18-14 with a 3.67 ERA (264.2IP, 108ER), 317 SO, and a .205 (197-for-961) opp. AVG in 56 career appearances (45 starts) against AL opponents... the .205 opp. AVG is the sixth lowest among active MLB starters (min. 900AB) when facing the AL.

BACK ON THE ROAD—In 12 road starts in 2026, Peralta is 2-6 with a 6.79 ERA (62.1IP, 47ER) and 58 strikeouts...has logged a .301 (77-for-256) opp. average and a 1.56 WHIP in those starts, with his teams going 5-7.

- ✦ Across 111 career road appearances (90 starts), he is 32-28 with a 4.38 ERA (494.2IP, 241ER), 587 strikeouts, and a .230 (429-for-1,866) opp. average...his teams are 55-56 lifetime in his road appearances.
- ✦ As a starter, he's gone 29-28 with a 4.29 ERA (459.2IP, 219ER), 535 strikeouts, and a .227 (392-for-1728) opp. average...his teams are 45-45 in such outings.

END OF AUGUST—In 47 career appearances (33 starts) in August, Peralta is 17-6 with a 3.75 ERA (196.2IP, 82ER), 225 strikeouts, and a .203 (143-for-706) opp. average...since 2018, he ranks highly among MLB arms (min. 150.0IP in Aug.) in August opp. average (3rd), winning pct. (9th, .739), opp. slugging pct. (10th, .346), and strikeoutsopp 9.0 IP (10th, 10.30).

- ✦ The 17 wins are his most in any month in his career, ahead of his 13 in both May and June.

LEFT FOOT CREEP—Since his debut in 2018, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .212 (432-for-2038) batting average, the third-best mark in the majors during that span (min. 2,000BF) behind NYY **Gerrit Cole** (.190) and DET **Justin Verlander** (.198)...in 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 (43-274) batting average, the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher (min. 300 LHB faced) in the expansion era (since 1961)...in 2025 with the Brewers, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

SUCKER FOR STRIKEOUTS—Peralta is on pace to record his first season tallying fewer than 200 strikeouts since 2022 (86)...he is one of two active pitchers to strike out 200 batters or more in three straight seasons alongside **Dylan Cease** (2021-2026)...Peralta's three career seasons of 200 strikeouts or more are tied with **Mario Soto** for third most by a Dominican-born pitcher behind **Pedro Martínez** (9) and **Juan Marichal** (6).

- ✦ Since making his MLB debut in 2018, his 10.82 strikeouts per 9.0 innings rank seventh in the majors (min. 750.0IP) behind ATL **Chris Sale** (12.00), LAD **Blake Snell** (11.70), TEX **Jacob deGrom** (11.64), NYY **Gerrit Cole** (11.51), Cease (11.18), and TOR **Max Scherzer** (11.10).
- ✦ Struck out a season-high nine batters on May 23 at MIA (w/ NYM), his most in a start since setting down 10 batters on Sept. 16, 2025 vs. LAA (w/ MIL).
