













Pennant in franchise history and are in the Postseason for the seventh time in franchise history: 1999, 2001, 2002, 2007, 2011, 2017 and 2023.

- ♦ It is the D-backs' first World Series appearance in 22 years, since 2001 (Oct. 27-Nov. 4), when they faced the Yankees (won in 7 games).
- ♦ In 53 Postseason games as a franchise, the D-backs are 27-26 (.509), 16-9 @ home, 11-17 on the road.

CARROLL COMES IN HOT: With his 2-run triple in the third inning in Game 1 of the World Series, Corbin Carroll became the first D-back ever to record a triple in the Postseason and, at 23-067 days old, became the youngest D-back to record a hit in the World Series, surpassing teammate Alek Thomas (23-082) who reached on an infield single 2 batters earlier in the same inning.

- ◆ Per the FOX broadcast, Carroll became the second-youngest rookie to bat first overall in World Series Game 1, behind Freddie Lindstrom (age 18) in 1924.
- ◆ Carroll also became the first player with a triple and 2 RBI in his first career World Series game since Curt Flood/STL (1964) and eighth player in MLB history with a triple and 2 RBI in his first career World Series game (also: Flood; Vic Wertz (1954 with CLE); Bill Nicholson (1945 with CHI); Marty Marion (1942 with STL); Dutch Ruether (1919 with CIN); George Whitted (1914 with BSN); and Wally Schang (1913 with PHA).

TEAM EFFORT: The D-backs became the first team since 2005 and ninth team in MLB Postseason history to record 1+ doubles, 1+ triples, 1+ home runs, 1+ stolen bases and 1+ sacrifice hits in a single World Series game:

◆ Per the FOX broadcast, the D-backs also became the first team in MLB World Series history to record a triple, stolen base and sacrifice bunt in an inning (Top 3).

PHAM JOINS THE CLUB: With his solo homer in the fourth inning in Game 1 of the World Series, Tommy Pham became the seventh player in franchise history to homer in a World Series (last: Rod Barajas in Game 5 of 2001 WS)...the previous 6:

ANOTHER YOUNG FEAT: With his stolen base in the sixth inning, Alek Thomas (23 years and 182 days) became the youngest player in franchise history to steal a base in the World Series...was also the sixth stolen base in a World Series in franchise history.

EMBRACE THE CHAOS: The D-backs won their second NL 2008 TO 2023: Per @OptaStats, Evan Longoria notched his first World Series hit in 5,748 days (first since October 27, 2008), the longest span of days between World Series hits in MLB history, surpassing the previous record of 5,117 by Tony Gwynn (10/13/1984 -10/17/1998).

> YOUNG 'BACKS: Alek Thomas (23-182) became the youngest D-back to start in center field in a World Series game and was the youngest MLB player to start in center field in a World Series game since 2019 (Victor Robles/WSH - 22-156).

> ◆ Gabriel Moreno became the third catcher 23-yearsold or younger to bat third in the World Series and the youngest D-back catcher (23-255) to start a World Series game...other 2 catcher age 23 or younger: Buster Posey, 2010 (23-214) and Yogi Berra, 1947 (22-141).

> **EXTRAS:** Last night marked the first time this Postseason where a game went to extra innings and the first time in MLB history that Game 1 of the World Series went to extra-innings in back-to-back years (also: 2022 World Series Game 1 between Astros and Phillies, 10 innings).

♦ It was the first time a game went to the 11th inning since the 2018 World Series, when the Red Sox and Dodgers went 18 innings.

THE 119TH WORLD SERIES:

- ♦ The 119th World Series features just the third all-Wild Card matchup between the Rangers (#5-seed) and D-backs (#6-seed)...the other 2 all-Wild Card World Series matchups: 2014 Giants vs. Royals and 2002 Giants vs. Angels.
- ♦ It is the first World Series played in 2 different climate-controlled parks (Globe Life Field and Chase

BATTLE OF THE WEST: This marks the ninth World Series matchup of teams from the AL West and the NL West divisions, and just the fourth under the current 6-divi-

◆ The previous 8: 2017, Astros defeated Dodgers in 7 games; 2010, Giants defeated Rangers in 5 games; 2002, Angels defeated Giants in 7 games; 1990, Reds defeated Athletics in 4 games; 1989, Athletics defeated Giants in 4 games; 1988, Dodgers defeated Athletics in 5 games; 1974, Athletics defeated Dodgers in 5 games; and 1972, Athletics defeated Reds in 7 games.

ANOTHER EXPANSION SERIES: The 2023 World Series marks the third Fall Classic to feature a pair of expansion teams with the Rangers (1972) and the D-backs (1998).

♦ The previous 2: 2015, Royals and Mets; 2019, Nationals and Astros.

A NEW PAIR: The D-backs-Rangers World Series matchup is the 10th consecutive season with a first-time World Series matchup.

- ♦ Previous 9: Astros vs. Phillies in 2022; Braves vs. Astros in 2021; Dodgers vs. Rays in 2020; Nationals vs. Astros in 2019; Red Sox vs. Dodgers in 2018; Astros vs. Dodgers in 2017; Cubs vs. Indians in 2016; Royals vs. Mets in 2015; and Giants vs. Royals in 2014.
- ♦ 11 of the last 12 World Series have featured first-time matchups (also: Giants vs. Tigers in 2012).

TOUCHING ALL BASES WORLD SERIES @ CHASE FIELD SOLD OUT: D-backs' 2023 World Series Games 3, 4 and 5 at Chase Field against the Rangers have officially SOLD OUT...the D-backs have sold out

their first 4 Postseason games (3 NLCS and 1

NLDS), totaling over 190,000 fans.

SNAKES ON THE ROAD: The D-backs are 9-4 in their 13 games this Postseason...6 of those wins have come on the road.

♦ Their 6 road wins this Postseason are tied for fifth most by a team in a single Postseason...the only teams with more are the 2023 Rangers (8), 2019 Nationals (8), 1996 Yankees (8) and 2018 Red Sox (7).

WALK IT OUT: Christian Walker's 12 walks this Postseason are the most by any D-back in franchise history in a single Postseason (previous: 9 by Reggie Sanders in 2001).

HELLO, BASEBALL GODS?: Interesting alignments of 2001 and 2023 seasons (inspired by @chriismiddleton):

- ♦ Zac Gallen, while playing catch in Oakland this season, unknowingly hit a bird...so did Randy Johnson in Spring Training 2001.
- ◆ All dates of the World Series games in 2023 are the same as the dates in the 2001 World Series
- ♦ The 2023 All-Star Game was held Seattle...the last time it was in Seattle was 2001.
- ♦ George W. Bush is scheduled to throw the first pitch before tonight's 2023 World Series game...he also threw out a first pitch in Game 3 of the 2001 World Series in New York with D-backs vs. Yankees.

SNAKES ALIVE: The D-backs' 4 games this Postseason with 4+ stolen bases are the most in MLB Postseason history, ahead of the 2008 Rays and 1907 Cubs.

- ♦ The D-backs are also the first team in MLB Postseason history to steal 4 bases over 3 consecutive games (World Series Game 1 and NLCS Games 6 and 7)...only 2 other teams had streaks of 2: 1989 Athletics and 1907 Cubs (2 occasions).
- ♦ The franchise record for stolen bases in a Postseason game is 4 (4x, World Series Game 1, NLCS Games 6 and 7 and NLDS Game 2)...there are only 15 instances in MLB Postseason history where a team had 5+ stolen bases in a game.
- ♦ The D-backs are 6-1 this Postseason when they record 1+ stolen bases in a game.

MARTE CONTINUES HISTORY: Ketel Marte has hit safely in each of his first 17 career Postseason games (.360 AVG/1.017 OPS; 27-for 75, 12 XBH), the longest streak in MLB Postseason history to begin a Postseason career ahead of Marquis Grissom (15 games - 1995-96).

- ◆ **Marte**'s 17-game Postseason hitting streak overall is tied for the longest in MLB Postseason history with Manny Ramírez (17 games), Derek Jeter (17 games) and Hank Bauer (17 games).
- ◆ Marte's 20 hits this Postseason are the most in a single Postseason in franchise history, ahead of Steve Finley (19 in 2001) while his 34 total bases are the most by any D-back in a single Postseason (previous: 27 by Luis Gonzalez in 2001).

HEAD-TO-HEAD WITH TEXAS: The D-backs won 3 of their 4 matchups vs. Rangers this season (1-1 on road, 2-0 @ home)...over the 4 games, Arizona averaged 8 hits, 1 homer, 6 runs and 4 walks.

♦ In their 2 regular-season road games @ Globe Life Field, the D-backs collected 19 hits, including 6 home runs, and 11 walks.

WORLD SERIES EXPERIENCE: Evan Longoria (2008 Rays) and Ryan Thompson (2020 Rays) are the only D-backs' players with World Series experience entering this series.

- ♦ Longoria, 38, started in 5 games with the Rays in the 2008 World Series vs. Phillies...he is the fourth player and first non-pitcher to appear in the World Series 15+ years after his prior appearance, joining Dennis Martinez/1995 CLE (16 years since 1979 BAL), Jim Kaat/1982 STL (17 years since 1965 MIN) and Babe Adams/1925 PIT (16 years since 1909 PIT) [Sarah Langs].
- ♦ Thompson, 31, made 3 appearances (0 ER in 2.2 IP, 0 H, 1 BB, 3 K) with the Rays in the 2020 World Series @ Globe Life Field vs. Dodgers.

STAFF WHO HAVE BEEN HERE BEFORE:

- ◆ D-backs' first base coach **Dave McKay** served as first base coach on 3 World Series championship clubs: 1989 A's and 2006 and 2011 Cardinals.
- ◆ D-backs' pitching coach **Brent Strom** made the Postseason in 6 of his 8 years in Houston, appearing in 3 World Series and winning the 2017 title.

BANI'S RETURN TO TEXAS: D-backs' Bench Coach **Jeff Banister** managed the Rangers from 2015-18, going 325-313 (.509).

- ♦ Won 2 AL West division titles (2015-16).
- ♦ Was named the 2015 AL Manager of the Year after going 88-74 (.543)...was the first AL manager to win the award with no previous Major League managerial experience.

DINGER POST-SZN: The D-backs' 7 players who have hit 2+ home runs (**Corbin Carroll, Alek Thomas, Gabriel Moreno, Ketel Marte, Geraldo Perdomo, Lourdes Gurriel Jr. and Tommy Pham**) are the most this Postseason...the 7 players rank tied for fourth in MLB Postseason history (also: 2009 Phillies and 2002 Giants), behind the 2020 Dodgers (9 players), 2020 Rays (8 players) and 2021 Braves (8 players).

♦ The D-backs, Rangers and Phillies mark the only teams to have 8 different players hit a home run this Postseason.

MORE MORENO HISTORY: Gabriel Moreno is the first D-back catcher in franchise history to record 2+ caught stealings in a single Postseason.

- ♦ At 23 years and 245 days, Moreno became the youngest D-backs' catcher to record a caught stealing in a Postseason (Oct. 17 @ Phillies, Bot 1, B. Harper CS 2B) and
- ♦ MLB Catchers to record a caught stealing in a Postseason over the past 40 years under the age of 24 (going by age at first career recorded caught stealing in a Postseason) [source: Elias Sports Bureau]:

4 FOR ALEK: Alek Thomas is the first D-back in franchise history to hit 4+ homers in a single Postseason, ahead of **Gabriel Moreno** (3 in 2023), Chris Young (3 in 2011) and Luis Gonzalez (3 in 2001)...it is also the first time in franchise history where teammates each collected 3+ homers in a single Postseason.

POWER OF YOUTH: The D-backs' 11 home runs hit by players age 23 or younger are tied for the most in a single Postseason with the 2015 Cubs [courtesy: Sarah Langs].

- ♦ With **Geraldo Perdomo, Corbin Carroll, Gabriel Moreno** and **Alek Thomas**, the D-backs are the third team in Postseason history with 4 players age 23 or younger with a home run in a single Postseason, joining: 2020 Braves (Riley, Pache, Albies, Acuña Jr) and 2015 Cubs (Bryant, Schwarber, Soler, Báez).
- ◆ Corbin Carroll (age 23-047), Alek Thomas (age 23-162), Gabriel Moreno (23-235) and Geraldo Perdomo (23-354) became the first, second, third and fourth-youngest D-backs players, respectively, in franchise history to hit multiple home runs in a Postseason.
- ◆ **Corbin Carroll** also became the third D-backs' rookie to hit multiple home runs in a Postseason run, joining Mark Reynolds (2007) and Paul Goldschmidt (2011).
- ◆ **Gabriel Moreno** is the first catcher at age 23 or younger to collect 3+ homers in a Postseason.

STEADY BULLPEN: D-backs' relievers, in their last 36 games since Sept. 5, have a 2.41 ERA (42 ER in 157.0 IP), .204 OPP AVG, 8.14 K/9.0 IP and 0.92 HR/9.0 IP.

♦ D-backs' relievers have allowed 1 or no runs in 13 of their last 19 games.

POSTSEASON ANSWER-BACKS: The D-backs' 5 comeback wins are the most | MARTE NAMED NLCS MVP: Ketel Marte was named the NLCS MVP after this Postseason, ahead of the Rangers (3), Phillies (2), Astros (2) and Braves (1)...Arizona's 5 comeback wins this Postseason are also the most in franchise history (previous:4 in 2001).

- ◆ The D-backs became the first team to win consecutive Postseason games (NLCS Games 3 and 4) when trailing in the 7th inning or later in each since the 2015 Royals in the World Series (Games 4-5)...it was the 15th time a team has had such a streak in a Postseason...no team has done so in 3 straight games (source: @SlangsOnSports).
- ♦ NLCS Game 4 marked the second time this Postseason (and in franchise history in the Postseason) where Arizona rallied back from a 3-run deficit (also: Wild Card Game 1 @ Brewers).
- ♦ The D-backs became the fourth team in Postseason history to have multi-run comeback wins in each of their first 2 games of the Postseason (Wild Card @ Brewers), joining the 1956 Dodgers, 2008 Rays and 2009 Yankees...Evan Longoria was a part of 2 of the teams (2008 Rays and 2023 Diamondbacks).
- ☐ In Game 1 @ Brewers, the D-backs collected their first-ever Postseason win after trailing 3+ runs in a game...prior to the game, the D-backs were 0-14 in Postseason games when trailing 3+ runs.
- ☐ In Game 2 @ Brewers, the D-backs overcame a 2-run deficit after plating 1 run in the fifth and 4 in the sixth.

IN CLINCH SCENARIOS: The D-backs are 8-2 all-time in potential clinch situations, including being 4-0 in 4 clinch opportunities at home [Oct. 11, 2023 vs. Dodgers (W, 4-2) in NLDS; Oct. 4, 2017 vs. Rockies (W, 11-8) in Wild Card to advance to NLDS; Nov. 4, 2001 vs. Yankees (Game 7 - W, 3-2) to win World Series; Oct. 14, 2001 vs. Cardinals (W, 2-1) to advance to NLCS].

WORTHY OF GOLD: Christian Walker (1B), Alek Thomas (CF) and Gabriel Moreno (C) were announced as 2023 Rawlings Gold Glove Award finalists (Top 3 at each position).

- ♦ Walker looks to make it back-to-back Gold Gloves after he led all first basemen this season with +12 Outs Above Average.
- ◆ Thomas looks to secure his first career Gold Glove in his second season with Arizona.
- ◆ Moreno is seeking his first career Gold Glove after recording an MLBbest +9 caught stealings above average in his first full MLB season.
- $oldsymbol{\Box}$ To determine the winners at the 9 standard positions, the 30 MLB managers and up to six coaches from each team vote from a pool of players in their league, excluding players from their own team...these votes comprise 75% of the selection total, with the SABR Defensive Index counting for the other 25%.

MORENO AND WALKER NAB FIELDING BIBLE AWARDS: Gabriel Moreno (C) and Christian Walker (1B) each won a 2023 Fielding Bible Award at their position.

- ◆ Moreno led the Majors in stolen base runs saved (7 Runs Saved) and was second in pitch blocking runs saved (5) while the D-backs' team ERA when he caught was 3.94 versus 5.25 when he did not...he joins Jeff Mathis (2018) as D-backs' catchers to win the award.
- ♦ Walker won for a second straight season, joining Matt Olson and Albert Pujols as the only players to win the award in back-to-back years...Walker and Paul Goldschmidt (2013, '15, '17) are the only D-backs players to win the Award at first base...Walker ranked second among first basemen in defensive runs saved with 9 and cut back on his defensive misplays & errors from 19 in 2022 to 11 in 2023.

NLCS NOTES (VS. PHILLIES)

NLCS RECAP: After going down 2-0 to the Phillies with losses of 5-3 and 10-0 @ Citizens Bank Park, the D-backs pleased the home crowd with a 2-1 win in Game 3 @ Chase Field thanks to a walk-off single by **Ketel** Marte while in Game 4, they extinguished a 5-2 deficit in the seventh inning when Alek Thomas sent a game-tying pinch-hit home run into the pool followed by a go-ahead single from Gabriel Moreno. After the Phillies won Game 5, 6-1, the series went back to Philadelphia where the D-backs won 2 consecutive potential road elimination games and clinched their first NL pennant in 22 years.

NLCS GAME 7: The D-backs won NLCS Game 7 in comeback fashion over the Phillies @ Citizens Bank Park by a final score of 4-2.

- ◆ Corbin Carroll became the first player in MLB history with 3+ hits and 2+ stolen bases in a Game 7 (@OptaStats) and the second youngest (23 years old) in MLB history in any playoff game, behind Ty Cobb in 1908 (21 years old) [@ESPNStatsInfo].
- ◆ **Corbin Carroll**, in the third inning, registered the fastest stolen base of this Postseason with a 30.2 ft/sec sprint speed.
- ◆ Carroll's 3 hits in the game tied the record for most hits by a rookie in a winner-take-all postseason game (also: 2020 NLWC (GM 3) Jake Cronenworth, 2007 ALCS (GM 7) Dustin Pedroia, 2014 NLWCG Joe Panik, 2001 ALDS (GM 5) Ichiro Suzuki and 1999 ALDS (GM 5) Brian Daubach.
- ◆ Carroll's 2 stolen bases in a winner-take-all game rank tied for second in Postseason history (also: 10 others), behind Lou Brock/STL (3 - World Series Game 7 @ BOS).
- ♦ Brandon Pfaadt allowed 2 runs on 4 hits through 4.0 innings while relievers Joe Mantiply, Ryan Thompson, Andrew Saalfrank, Kevin Ginkel and Paul Sewald combined for 5.0 scoreless, 1-hit frames.

- ♦ Marte became the second player in D-backs history to win the award (previous: Craig Counsell in the 2001 NLCS).
- ♦ Marte became the sixth Dominican-born player to win MVP of an LCS (AL or NL), joining David Ortiz/2004 Red Sox, Albert Pujols/2004 Cardinals, Placido Polanco/2006 Tigers, Nelson Cruz/2010 Rangers and Jeremy Peña/2022 Astros.

- ♦ Arizona is now 4-1 in winner-take-all Postseason games all-time.

TEAMS TO WIN BEST-OF-7 AFTER LOSING FIRST 2 ROAD GAMES: With their NLCS win, the D-backs became the seventh team in MLB Postseason history to lose both Games 1 and 2 on the road in a best-of-7 series and come back to win the series, joining the:

BACK 2 BACK: In Game 6 of the NLCS @ Phillies, **Tommy Pham** and **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** hit became the fifth duo in franchise history to slug back-to-back home runs (2nd inning) in the Postseason and third pair during this Postseason.

◆ The D-backs 3 back-to-back homer occasions this Postseason are second most in a single MLB Postseason, behind the Red Sox (4 occasions in 2007)...their 5 overall in the Postseason rank tied for fourth all-time (also: Phillies and Dodgers), behind the Yankees (12), Red Sox (9) and Astros (6).

FLEX ON 'EM, ALEK: In Game 5, **Alek Thomas** homered in a second straight game (solo off Wheeler in Bot 7) to mark the second time this Postseason where he's homered in consecutive games (also: NLWC Game 2 @ Brewers and NLDS Game 1 @ Dodgers).

◆ Thomas is the first player in franchise history to homer in consecutive games twice in the Postseason and it was the fifth instance of consecutive homers in the Postseason by a D-back...no D-back player has ever done it over 3 consecutive games.

PINCH-HIT POWER: In Game 4, **Alek Thomas** became the fourth D-back in franchise history to hit a pinch-hit homer in a Postseason game (also: Turner Ward in Game 3 of the 1999 NLDS @ NYM, Erubiel Durazo in Game 5 of the 2001 NLCS @ Atlanta) and Brandon Drury in Game 2 of the 2017 NLDS @ Los Angeles-NL).

- ♦ Thomas became the ninth player in MLB history with a game-tying, pinch-hit HR in the 8th inning or later of a playoff game and, at 23 years old, he's the youngest player to do it (source: ESPN Stats & Info).
- ◆ Thomas (23 years-175 days) became the fourth-youngest player ever in Postseason history to hit a pinch-hit homer, behind Gavin Lux in 2019 NLDS-GM 1 (21-314), Oscar Taveras in 2014 NLCS-GM 2 (22-115) and Yogi Berra in 1947 World Series-GM 3 (22-143) [Sarah Langs].

PARADE OF ARMS: In Game 4, Arizona and Philadelphia combined to use 16 pitchers, which tied for the fourth-most in a 9-inning Postseason game (also: Game 1 of the 2021 ALCS between Boston and Houston) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

- ♦ There have been 3 total 9-inning Postseason games where the 2 teams have combined to use 17 pitchers: Game 3 of the 2020 AL Wild Card Series between Oakland and the White Sox, Game 2 of the 2020 NL Wild Card Series between St. Louis and San Diego and Game 3 of the 2020 NLDS between San Diego and Los Angeles-NL.
- ♦ The 8 pitchers used in Game 4 by the D-backs were the most they've used in any Postseason game in franchise history.

WHAT A TIME FOR BASEBALL: October 20 was the first day in Postseason history where multiple teams won when trailing by 2+ in the 8th inning or later (source: @SlangsOnSports).

This is the first year in Postseason history in which one LCS had the road team win the first 4 games and the other LCS had the home team win the first 4 games of the respective series.

MARTE WALKS US OFF IN GAME 3: Ketel Marte collected his first career Postseason walkoff hit with his line drive single in Game 3 vs. Phillies in the bottom of the ninth.

♦ It marked his third career walkoff hit overall (previous 2: May 9 vs. Braves - single in Bot 10; July 2, 2017 vs. Rockies - single in Bot 9).

HISTORY REPEATING?: Game 3's walkoff hit by **Ketel Marte** marked the first by a D-back in the Postseason since **Luis Gonzalez**'s historical 2001 World Series Game 7 walkoff single over the Yankees and third ever in franchise history (also: **Tony Womack**'s single in Game 5 of 2001 NLDS vs. Cardinals).

HARD PFAADT: After his Game 3 start vs. Phillies, **Brandon Pfaadt** became the first pitcher in MLB history to allow 0 runs and 0 walks in consecutive postseason starts (source: @ESPNStatsInfo).

MOST STRIKEOUTS IN POSTSEASON WITHOUT A WALK: In Game 3 vs. Phillies, **Brandon Pfaadt** became the second pitcher in franchise history to strike out 9+ batters without a walk in a Postseason game (also: Curt Schilling, 2001 World Series Game 7).

♦ Pfaadt also became the fourth Rookie pitcher in MLB Postseason history to record 8+ strikeouts without a walk:

K MACHINE: In Game 3 vs. Phillies, at age 25-004 days, **Brandon Pfaadt** became the youngest starting pitcher in franchise history to record 9+ strikeouts in a Postseason start and was the first to do it since Brandon Webb (9 K, Oct. 3, 2007, NLDS GM 1)...he is the fourth pitcher in franchise history (11th time) to meet the 9+-strikeout feat, joining Webb (once), Curt Schilling (5x) and Randy Johnson (4x)...his 9 strikeouts also marked a career best (regular or Postseason) [previous high: 8. 3x - last: Sept. 27 @ White Sox).

◆ Pfaadt became the second pitcher in franchise history with 6+ strikeouts through 3 innings in a Postseason start (also: Randy Johnson, 2x) while his 7 strikeouts thru the first 4.0 innings tied for the most in a Postseason game in franchise history, joining Doug Davis (2007 NLDS -GM 2) and Randy Johnson (2001 WS -GM 2) [source: @SlangsOnSports].

♦ His previous was 8 (3x - last: Sept. 27 @ White Sox) and tied for seventh-most by a rookie in a Postseason game, behind Livan Hernández (15, Game 5 of the 1997 NLCS), Mike Boddicker (14, Game 2 of the 1983 ALCS), John Candelaria (14, Game 3 of the 1975 NLCS), Don Newcombe (11, Game 1 of the 1949 World Series), Tim Belcher (10, Game 2 of the 1988 NLCS), Dave Righetti (10, Game 2 of the 1981 ALDS) (source: Sarah Langs).

SLOWING THE ROLL: In Game 3 vs. Phillies, D-backs pitching allowed just 3 hits, the fewest given up to the Phillies this Postseason (previous low: 6, Game 1 of NLDS vs. Braves).

♦ It was the sixth time in franchise history where D-backs' pitching has allowed 3 or fewer hits in a Postseason game:

FIRST TIME IT HAPPENED IN THE POSTSEASON: The D-backs shutout loss in Game 2 of the NLCS marked the first time in franchise history they were shut out in the Postseason, after 46 consecutive games...the 46-game streak without being blanked was the second-longest active streak in the Majors, behind Minnesota's current 67-game streak.

A LONGO TIME AGO: This Postseason, **Evan Longoria** appeared in his first Championship Series game since 2008 (with Tampa Bay)...he is the fourth player (and first non-pitcher) to appear in a LCS 15+ years after his prior appearance, joining Bartolo Colón/NYM in 2015 (17 years after his 1998 appearance with Cleveland), Chuck Finley/STL in 2002 (16 years after his 1986 appearance with the California Angels) and Dennis Martínez/CLE in 1995 (16 years after his 1979 appearance with Baltimore) (source: Sarah Langs/MLB).

D-BACKS POSTSEASON HOMER STREAK HALTED: Arizona's Postseason homer streak ended at 17 consecutive Postseason games on Oct. 16 and dated back to the 2007 NLCS Game 3 @ Rockies, which marked the second-longest streak in MLB Postseason history, behind the Yankees (23 games from 2019-22):

- Torey Lovullo finished his 8-year big-league career with the 1999 Phillies, skippered by Terry Francona.
- ◆ Zac Gallen grew up in Somerdale, N.J., roughly 10 miles east of Citizens Bank Park.

WALKER-HARPER HISTORY: Christian Walker won the 2009 International Power Showcase High School Home Run Derby at Tropicana Field in Tampa, Fla., beating 16-year-old Bryce Harper.

♦ Walker was a stand-out high school at Kennedy-Kenrick in Norristown, Pa., where he hit .588 his senior season, was named to 2009 Philadelphia Inquirer All-S.E. Pennsylvania team and was rated No. 1 best high school player in the state of Pennsylvania.

ARIZONA HISTORY IN PHILLY:

♦ On June 10, 2019, Arizona set a club record with 8 home runs @ Citizens Bank Park...the D-backs also tied the franchise high with 6 different players homering (Alex Avila, Jarrod Dyson, Eduardo Escobar, Ketel Marte, David Peralta, Ildemaro Vargas) [also: June 20, 2012 vs. Mariners]...the 13 combined home runs between the D-backs and Phillies on the day set a Major League record in a single game.

- **5 CONSECUTIVE POSTSEASON WINS TO START:** Through the NLDS, Arizona boasted 5 consecutive Postseason wins, which tied for the most in franchise history (also: 5 straight from Oct. 19-28, 2001)...it was the first time in franchise history where they have won 5 straight games to begin a Postseason.
- ♦ The D-backs joined the Rangers as the only teams to each win 4+ straight road games this Postseason, which marked the second time where 2 teams have done it in the same Postseason, joining the Royals (5) and Giants (4) in 2014, who met in the World Series.

- ◆ Earned their second National League Division Series sweep in franchise history (def. Cubs 3-0 in 2007 NLDS).

CORBIN ALWAYS IMPRESSING: Corbin Carroll became the first MLB player – rookie or otherwise – to record 6+ hits and 2+ homers in his first 3 career Postseason games since Stephen Drew/AZ in 2007.

ALEK'S 14-PITCH BATTLE: The 14-pitch at-bat by **Alek Thomas** in the top of the seventh in Game 1 of the NLDS on Oct. 7 marked the most pitches in a plate appearance ending in a home run in the Postseason since pitch counts have been tracked (begun in 1988) [source: Sarah Langs].

MIGHTY MERRILL: With his 6.1 scoreless innings in Game 1 of the NLDS on Oct. 7, Merrill Kelly became the fourth D-backs starting pitcher (fifth time) to not allow a run in a Postseason start (also: 2001, 4x - Miguel Batista on Nov. 1 @ Yankees in WS, Randy Johnson on Oct. 16 vs. Braves in NLCS and on Oct. 28 vs. Yankees in WS, Curt Schilling on Oct. 9 vs. Cardinals in NLDS).

WILD CARD SERIES RECAP: The D-backs swept the Brewers 2-0 in the 2023 NL Wild Card Series to clinch their first NLDS berth since 2017...it was the first time Arizona won consecutive Postseason games since Oct. 4-5, 2011 vs. Brewers.

- ♦ In Game 1, the D-backs came back from a 3-run deficit, highlighted by a trio of homers (Corbin Carroll, Ketel Marte, Gabriel Moreno) and used a franchise Postseason-high 7 pitchers, including 6 relievers who combined for 6.1 scoreless frames, to lead to a 6-3 victory.
 - ☐ Corbin Carroll and Ketel Marte hit back-to-back home runs in the third inning to become the third pair of D-backs to go back-to-back in a Postseason game (last: Oct. 6, 2017 @ Dodgers Ketel Marte and Jeff Mathis).

CARROLL NAMED HANK AARON AWARD FINALIST: Corbin Carroll was announced by MLB as a 2023 Hank Aaron Award Finalist, an honor that recognizes the most outstanding regular season offensive performer in each League...the only D-back to win the award was Paul Goldschmidt (2013).

♦ A committee of MLB.com journalists reviewed the top offensive statistics, accomplishments, and performances of the regular season to determine the 9 finalists for each league.
