AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game set at Boston (1-0 thus far)...will also face the Astros (Fri.-Sun.) and Rangers (4/27-29) in three game series.

- ▶ **Have won a season-high-tying four straight games since 4/17 (also 4G from 3/31-4/4)...have won five of their last six games (since 4/15) and six of their last eight games (since 4/13).**
- ▶ Have won or split five of their seven completed series this season (4-2-1).
- ▶ The Yankees' +32 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their fourth straight game with a 4-0 victory against the Red Sox on Tuesday at Fenway Park...**RHP Luis Gil** (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 3BB, 2K, 1HP) earned his first win of the year after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI) drove in three of the Yankees' four runs, hitting his third HR of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the second inning and a two-run double in the sixth inning...**LF Randal Grichuk** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the eighth inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 1R, 2BB) reached base three times...**CF/LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 1R, 1BB) and **2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (2-for-4) each reached base twice...**LHP Brent Headrick** (0.2IP, 1H, 1K), **LHP Tim Hill** (1.0IP) and **RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 1H, 1K) combined to toss 2.2 scoreless innings of relief.

BLANK SPACE: Yankees pitchers recorded their second straight shutout and their Major League-leading fifth of the season on Tuesday at Boston (also 3/25 at San Francisco, 3/27 at San Francisco, 3/31 at Seattle and Sunday at Kansas City)...marked the second time this season the Yankees have recorded a shutout in back-to-back games (also first two games of the season from 3/25-27)...with a shutout tonight, would mark only the seventh time in franchise history the Yankees have recorded a shutout in at least three straight games (last: 3G from 6/6-8/62).

- ▶ **Marks only the fifth time in franchise history the Yankees have recorded at least five shutouts in their first 23 games of a season** (also six in 1958 and five in 1910, 1932 and 1955).
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** rank second in the Majors in BB/9.0IP (2.77, second in AL) and K/BB (3.25, second in AL), third in ERA (3.25, first in AL), opponents' OBP (.291, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.632, first in AL), fourth in WHIP (1.15, first in AL) and opponents' SLG (.341, first in AL), and seventh in HR/9.0IP (0.79, fourth in AL) and opponents' BA (.225, second in AL).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF **Cody Bellinger** reached base twice and extended his season-high hitting streak to nine games on Tuesday at Boston...has hit .353/.450/.588 (12-for-34) with 7R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 6BB and 1SB over his hitting streak (since 4/11).

- ▶ As a Yankee (since 2025), has hit .339/.400/.576 (60-for-177) with 11 doubles, 2 triples, 9HR, 21BB and 1HP vs. left-handed pitching.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit 19HR over their last eight games (since 4/13) after hitting only 14HR over their first 15 games from 3/25-4/12.

- ▶ **Yankees batters** lead the Majors in PA/BB (7.69), rank second in walks (113, second in AL) and stolen bases (27, first in AL), third in home runs (33, second in AL), fourth in SLG (.411, second in AL) and pitches per PA (4.03, third in AL), tied for fifth in XBH (71, second in AL), sixth in OPS (.737, second in AL), and tied for ninth in runs scored (114, fourth in AL).

FOUR SCORE: Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in each of their last six games (since 4/15) and nine of their last 10 games (since 4/11)...the Yankees are 12-4 this season when scoring at least 4R.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Yankees batters are 12-3 this season when scoring first.

ON A ROLL: OF **Randal Grichuk** recorded his first multi-hit game of the season and hit an RBI double in the eighth inning on Tuesday at Boston...has hit .364/.333/.636 (4-for-11) with 2R, 3 doubles, 2RBI and 1SF over his last four games (since 4/14).

- ▶ Has batted .290/.340/.529 (187-for-645) with 48 doubles, 5 triples, 32HR, 47BB and 3HP vs. left-handed pitching since 2022.

GOOD AS GOLD: As a Yankee (since 2025), **INF Paul Goldschmidt** has batted .319/.406/.546 (52-for-163) with 16 doubles, 7HR, 21BB and 3HP vs. left-handed pitching...over that span, ranks seventh among Major League batters in OBP.

KING OF THE GIL: RHP **Luis Gil** earned his first win of the season on Tuesday at Boston after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 3BB, 2K, 1HP)...matched the longest scoreless start of his career (also 5/1/24 at Baltimore and 5/23/24 vs. Seattle).

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF **Giancarlo Stanton** drove in three of the Yankees' four runs on Tuesday at Boston, hitting his third HR of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the second inning and a two-run double in the sixth inning...has hit 2HR over his last four games (since 4/16).

- ▶ **In 40 career games at Fenway Park, has hit .316/.386/.546 (48-for-152) with 22R, 9 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR, 27RBI, 16BB, 2HP, 1SF and 2SB.**
- ▶ Has hit .326/.400/.535 (14-for-43) with 7R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 6BB and 1SF over his last 13G against the Red Sox (since 6/14/24).

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP **Max Fried** will make his sixth start of the season tonight at Fenway Park...in five starts this season, has gone 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (33.1IP, 11ER)...has held opponents to a .165/.230/.226 (19-for-115) slash line this year...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in four of his five starts.

- ▶ Has made five career starts vs. the Red Sox, going 3-1 with a 2.37 ERA (30.1IP, 8ER) and 40K...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his five starts...has posted an 11.87 K/9.0IP ratio (40K/30.1IP).
- ▶ Has gone 3-1 with a 2.96 ERA (24.1IP, 8ER) and 33K in four career starts at Fenway Park.
- ▶ **In 47 career starts vs. the American League, has gone 29-7 with a 2.28 ERA (296.0IP, 75ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 35 of those 47 starts, including 21 of his last 29 starts (since 6/17/24), going 18-4 with a 2.24 ERA (185.0IP, 46ER) in that span.**
- ▶ In 26 career starts against the AL East, has gone 17-4 with a 2.31 ERA (167.2IP, 43ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 19 of his 26 starts...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 22 of his 26 career starts against the AL East...as a Yankee, has gone 7-2 with a 2.44 ERA (85.0IP, 23ER) in 13 starts against AL East opponents.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.84 ERA (130.0IP, 41ER) and 135K in 23 starts this season...have not allowed a run in their last 13.2 innings (since 4/19)...have not allowed an ER in three of their last four starts (since 4/17).

- ▶ **Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 20 of their 23 starts,** matching their third-most through their first 23 games of a season since ER became an official stat in 1913, trailing only their 22 starts in 2022 and 21 starts in 1919 (also had 20 in 1966, '72, '73 and 2024).
- ▶ **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.84), opponents' BA (.202), opponents' OBP (.260), opponents' OPS (.580) and WHIP (0.99),** second in K/BB (4.09, second in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.28, second in AL) and opponents' SLG (.319, first in AL) and, tied for third in strikeouts (135, tied for third in AL).

ALL RISE: OF **Aaron Judge** reached base three times on Tuesday at Boston...has reached base in 16 of his last 17 games (since 4/3), batting .279/.405/.672 (17-for-61) with 17R, 3 doubles, 7HR, 13RBI, 12BB, 1HP and 4SB over that span.

- ▶ **Is tied for second in the Majors with 9HR this year, trailing only Yordan Alvarez (11HR)**...six of his 9HR this season have given the Yankees the lead...five of his 9HR this year have come in the first inning, including each of his last three home runs, four of his last five and five of his last seven...his five first-inning home runs are more than 22 Major League teams.
- ▶ Has batted .311/.437/.680 (32-for-103) with 27R, 5 doubles, 11HR, 27RBI, 23BB/21BB and 35B over his last 28 games vs. the Red Sox (since 9/14/23-G2)...has 9HR over his last 21 games vs. Boston (since 7/26/24).
- ▶ Over his last 14 games at Fenway Park (since 9/14/23-G2), has batted .340/.500/.800 (17-for-50) with 16R, 2 doubles, 7HR, 16RBI and 16BB/21BB.

DYNAMIC DUO: OF **Aaron Judge** (9HR) and C/INF **Ben Rice** (8HR) are only the fourth pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history to each hit at least 8HR in the club's first 23 games of a season...Judge (8HR) and Anthony Rizzo (9HR) accomplished the feat in 2022, Judge (9HR) and Luke Voit (8HR) did so in 2020, and Yogi Berra (10HR) and Mickey Mantle (11HR) also accomplished the feat in 1956.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF **Ben Rice** has reached base safely in 19 of his 22 games this season, batting .319/.461/.754 (22-for-69) with 21R, 6 doubles, 8HR, 18RBI, 18BB/11BB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB.

- ▶ **Leads the Majors in OBP (.461), SLG (.754) and OPS (1.214),** is tied for third in XBH (14, second in AL), tied for fourth in runs scored (21, second in AL) and HR (eight, tied for fourth in AL), fifth in PA/BB (4.94, fourth in AL), tied for seventh in walks (18, tied for sixth in AL) and ninth in pitches per plate appearance (4.39, fifth in AL)...is also tied for fourth in the AL in RBI (18) and ranks sixth in BA (.319).

GOT YOUR NUMBER: INF **Jazz Chisholm Jr.** has hit .333 (6-for-18) with 1 double in his career against Boston's LHP Ranger Suarez.

HIP HIP JOSÉ: INF/OF **José Caballero** is batting .324/.359/.486 (12-for-37) with 6R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI, 2BB and 4SB over his last 10 games (since 4/11).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 22, 2010: At the Oakland Coliseum, the A's Kurt Suzuki hits into a 5-4-3 triple play (Rodriguez-Canó-N. Johnson), marking the Yankees' first triple play since 1968.

April 22, 2001: With two outs in the bottom of the 10th inning, David Justice hits a solo HR off Derek Lowe to give the Yankees a 4-3 "walk-off" win vs. Boston.

April 22, 1956: Don Larsen earns a no-decision (4.2IP, 4ER) but hits a grand slam in the Yankees' 13-6 win over the Red Sox.

April 22, 1903: The Highlanders play their first-ever game, a 3-1 loss at Washington-AL. The team will go on to finish with a 72-62-2 record, good for fourth place in the eight-team American League.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 23, 2000: In a 10-7 Yankees win at Toronto, Jorge Posada and Bernie Williams become the first pair of teammates in Major League history to each hit home runs from both sides of the plate in the same game.

April 23, 1903: The Highlanders record the first win in franchise history, a 7-2 victory at Washington-AL. Harry Howell is the winning pitcher.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (2-1, 2.97 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his sixth start of the season tonight at Boston...the 32-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...took his first loss of the season on Thursday vs. Los Angeles-AL in the Yankees' 11-4 defeat (5.1IP, 3H, 5R/ER, 3BB, 3K, 1HR)...in five starts this season, has gone 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (33.1IP, 11ER)...went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...over 10 Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025-26), has gone 94-42 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 3.03 ERA (1,113.0IP, 966H, 416R/375ER, 305BB, 1,075K, 91HR) in 205 career games (188 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 700.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.83), winning percentage (.708) and pickoffs (27), is tied for first in wins (75) and shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.65), opponents' SLG (.327) and opponents' OPS (.607), third in groundball percentage (53.7%) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.15), sixth in opponents' OBP (.280) and WHIP (1.08), and tied for sixth in complete games (five)...his 92 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24-25) and four-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22, '25) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times in his career (second in 2022, fourth in 2025 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST TIME OUT: Took his first loss of the season on Thursday vs. Los Angeles-AL in the Yankees' 11-4 defeat (5.1IP, 3H, 5R/ER, 3BB, 3K, 1HR)...surrendered a solo HR to Oswald Peraza in the first inning, marking his first home run allowed this year...his 5R allowed marked his most runs in a regular season start since 8/16/25 at St. Louis (7R/ER)...marked only the third time in his Yankees tenure he allowed at least 5ER (7R/ER on 8/16/25 at St. Louis and 6R/ER on 5/30/25 at Los Angeles-NL)...exited with the game tied 3-3 and two men on...Fernando Cruz came on in relief and allowed both runners to score.

- ✦ Had his career-high-tying nine-game winning streak snapped (8/16/25-3/31/26)...was only the fourth Yankee in the last 11 years (since 2016) to record as long of a winning streak, joining James Paxton (10-game winning streak in 2019), Luis Gil (nine-game winning streak in 2024) and Jameson Taillon (nine-game winning streak in 2022)...was his first loss since 8/10/25 vs. Houston.
- ✦ Also had his 12-start undefeated streak snapped (8/16/25-4/11/26)...was his longest since a 13-start undefeated streak from 9/21/24-5/24/25...was the longest by a Yankee since Gerrit Cole's 13-start undefeated streak from 3/30-6/3/23.

2026: In five starts this season, has gone 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (33.1IP, 11ER)...has held opponents to a .165/.230/.226 (19-for-115) slash line this year...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in four of his five starts...has tossed two scoreless starts.

- ✦ Has tossed at least 6.0IP in four of his five starts...was only the second Yankees starting pitcher in the last 12 seasons (since 2015) to toss at least 6.0 innings in each of his first four starts of the season, joining Gerrit Cole (first four starts in 2023).
- ✦ **Posted a season-opening 13.1 scoreless inning streak from 3/25-31...was tied for the third-longest by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years** (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021 and Cam Schlitler's 13.2 scoreless inning streak to begin this season (Nestor Cortes also had a 13.1 scoreless inning streak in 2022).
- ✦ **Was only the seventh pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two appearances of a season**, joining Ray Caldwell (first 3G in 1914), Mel Stottlemyre (first 2G in 1967), Bob Turley (first 2G in 1958), Allie Reynolds (first 2G in 1947), Bob Shawkey (first 2G in 1922) and Slow Joe Doyle (first 2G in 1906)...was the 10th pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two starts of a season (also George Mogridge's first three starts in 1916, Freddy Garcia's first two starts in 2011 and Lew Brockett's first two starts in 1909).
- ✦ Made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee in the club's 7-0 win on 3/25 at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...**was the first Yankees Opening Day starter to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings since David Cone in 1996** (also 0R in 7.0IP)...**was only the fifth Yankees starter in the Divisional Era (since 1969) to do so**, joining Cone, Rick Rhoden (SHO in 1988), Ron Guidry (0R in 9.0IP in 1980) and Catfish Hunter (0R in 7.0IP in 1977)...**was only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to toss more than 6.0 scoreless innings and allow 2H-or-fewer on Opening Day**, joining David Cone (2H and 0R in 7.0IP in 1996), Ron Guidry (2H and 0R in 9.0IP in 1980) and Mel Stottlemyre (2H in SHO in 1967)...retired his final 8BF, 15 of his last 16BF and 18 of his final 20BF.
- ✦ Earned his second win of the season on 3/31 at Seattle after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1BB, 6K, 1HP)...did not allow a hit to his first 12BF (1BB).
- ✦ Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 7-6 loss on 4/5 vs. Miami (6.2IP, 5H, 3R/ER, 3BB, 4K, 0HR)...his no-decision snapped his eight-start streak of consecutive wins...was the longest streak of his career and the longest by a Yankee since James Paxton won 10 consecutive starts from 8/2-9/21/19.
- ✦ Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 5-4 extra-inning loss on 4/11 at Tampa Bay (8.0IP, 6H, 3R/ER, 0BB, 6K, 0HR)...marked his longest start as a Yankee (previous: 7.2IP on 4/20/25 at Tampa Bay)...also marked the eighth time in his career he tossed at least 8.0 innings in a start (first since his 8.2IP on 9/27/24 vs. Kansas City with Atlanta).

ON A ROLL: Has gone 8-1 with a 2.15 ERA (79.2IP, 19ER) over his last 12 starts (since 8/22/25).

VS. BOSTON: Has made five career starts vs. the Red Sox, going 3-1 with a 2.37 ERA (30.1IP, 8ER) and 40K...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his five starts...has posted a 11.87 K/9.0IP ratio (40K/30.1IP).

- ✦ Last faced the Red Sox in 2025 AL Wild Card Game 1 and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 3-1 loss at Yankee Stadium (6.1IP, 4H, 0R, 3BB, 6K).
- ✦ Faced Boston three times last year during the regular season, going 1-1 with a 1.96 ERA (18.1IP, 4ER) and 22K...pitched against the Red Sox on 9/13 at Fenway Park and earned the win after allowing only 2R/ER over 5.1IP (9H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR)...allowed a solo HR to Alex Bregman in the fifth inning and an RBI single to Connor Wong in the sixth inning...faced Boston on 8/22 at Yankee Stadium and tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision (4H, 3BB, 7K, 1WP)...faced the Red Sox on 6/15 at Fenway Park and took the loss in the Yankees' 2-0 defeat despite allowing only 2R/ER over 7.0IP (6H, 2BB, 9K, 1HR).
- ✦ Set a career high with 13K on 6/4/24 at Boston (W, 7.0IP, 4H, 3R/2ER, 1BB, 1HR, 1HP).
- ✦ Has gone 3-1 with a 2.96 ERA (24.1IP, 8ER) and 33K in four career starts at Fenway Park.
