# Star Power

William Contreras (catcher) and Christian Yelich (outfield) will be in the National League starting lineup at the 2024 All-Star Game.....this is the eighth time in franchise history and first time since 2014 that the team has had multiple All-Star starters..... Carlos Gómez (LF), Jonathan Lucroy (C) and **Aramis Ramírez** (3B) started in the 2014 Midsummer Classic.

# LA Dodger

Dallas Keuchel is facing the Dodgers in the regular season for the first time in his career, one of two teams he has never faced (also Atlanta) Keuchel did pitch against the Dodgers in the 2017 World Series (Game 1 and 5).

# He's Going Streaking!

Jackson Chourio is on a 12-game hitting streak, batting .400 (16-for-40) with 2 HR and 9 RBI while producing a .442 OBP/.625 SLG/1.067 OPS. he has tied William Contreras for the longest hitting streak on the team this season and has recorded the longest hitting streak by a Brewers rookie since **Keston Hiura** (15g in 2019).

# Power & Speed

The Brewers hit their 90th and 91st home runs of the season yesterday to go along with 121 stolen bases..... the Brewers and Phillies (106hr/91sb) are the only teams in the majors with at least 90 HR and 90 SB this season.

THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME: Is the seventh game (2-4) of a 7-game road trip to Colorado (2-2) and Los Angeles-NL (0-2).....following this trip and an off day tomorrow, the team returns to American Family Field for a 6-game homestand against Pittsburgh (3g) and Washington (3g) leading into the All-Star break

AT HOME: The Brewers are 27-13 at home, going 10-2-1 in series play.....the team has gone 22-6 in its last 28 home games after a 5-7 start.....the Brewers had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 5/29-6/10.....the team has won its last nine home their last home series loss came from 4/26-4/28 against the Yankees (1-2).

**<u>ON THE ROAD</u>**: The Brewers are 25-25 on the road, going 7-7-2 in series play, including this series.....the team has gone 12-21 in its last 33 road games after a 13-4 start.....the team had a season-high 4-game road winning streak from 4/9-4/13

MANAGER: Pat Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23. replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.....Murphy spent the previous eight seasons (2016-23) as bench coach.....his only Major League managerial experience previously came in 2015 as interim manager of the Padres, replacing **Bud Black** in June (42-54).....he enjoyed a 25-year college head coaching career primarily at the University of Notre Dame (1988-94) and Arizona State University (1995-2009).....Murphy went 1,000-457-4 as a college coach and was on pace to be the winningest coach in NCAA history before he transitioned into the professional ranks

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (4th season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Connor Dawson (3rd season), assistant pitching coach Jim Henderson (3rd season/1st in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (6th season), third base coach Jason Lane (9th season/4th in current role), run prevention coordinator **Walker McKinven** (5th season/1st in current role) and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons (3rd season) all returned from the 2023 staff..... Rickie Weeks (associate manager), Daniel de Mondesert (assistant coach) and Charlie Greene (bullpen coach) are in their first seasons on the coaching staff, all Major League coaches for the first time.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 21 replay challenges this season, going 13-8....their last challenge (won) came on 7/3 at Colorado as a safe call at first base involving Michael Toglia was overturned (pickoff).

# TODAY'S STARTER: #60 - LHP DALLAS KEUCHEL (2gs, 0-0, 6.75)

**KEUCHEL AT A GLANCE:** Dallas Keuchel, 36, will be making his third start of the seasson.....Keuchel last started on Tuesday at Colorado and received no decision in the Brewers' 4-3 win (5.1ip, 4h, 2r, 2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 78 pitches).....he made his Brewers debut on 6/26 vs. Texas and received no decision in the Brewers' 6-5, 10-inning win (4ip, 8h, 5r, 5er, 1bb, 4k, 2hr, 71 pitches).....he was acquired by Milwaukee from Seattle on June 25 in exchange for cash....signed to a Minor League contract with the Mariners on April 5, he went 7-4 with a 3.93 ERA in 13 starts at Triple-A Tacoma (71ip, 64h, 36r, 31er, 22bb, 45k, 10hr) before he was dealt to Milwaukee.....name is pronounced "KAl-kuhl."

LAST SEASON: Keuchel went 2-1 with a 5.97 ERA in 10 games/6 starts with Minnesota....he went 1-1 with a 6.39 ERA as a starter (25.1ip, 18er) and 1-0 with a 5.11 ERA in relief (12.1ip, 7er).....he had 1 quality start.....the team went 4-2 in his starts.....opponents batted .298 (45-for-151, 3hr).....he also made 6 starts at Triple-A St. Paul, going 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA.....signed with Minnesota as a free agent on June 22.

CAREER: Has gone 103-92 with a 4.04 ERA in 280 games/265 starts (1635ip, 734er)....is in his 13th Major League season pitching for Houston (2012-18), Atlanta (2019), Chicago-AL (2020-22), Arizona (2022), Texas (2022), Minnesota (2023) and Milwaukee (2024).....won the 2015 American League Cy Young Award (33gs, 20-8, 2.48era) while finishing fifth in Most Valuable Player voting that season....was an All-Star in 2015 and 2017.....is a five-time Gold Glove Award winner (2014-16, 2018, 2021).....was a member of the 2017 World Series-champion Astros as he started Game 1 and Game 5 of the World Series against the Dodgers.....Keuchel was selected by Houston in the seventh round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Arkansas.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: IS 0-4 with a 10.80 ERA in 5 starts [21.2ip, 26er]....is 0-0 with an 11.25 ERA in 1 start this season [4ip, 5er].

**CAREER ON THE ROAD:** Is 48-55 with a 4.76 ERA in 138 games/133 starts (785.1ip, 415er).....is 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA in 1 start this season (5.1ip, 2er).

CAREER vs. DODGERS: Keuchel has never pitched against Los Angeles in the regular season, one of just two teams he has never faced (also Atlanta).....he did, however, make 2 starts against the Dodgers with the Astros in the 2017 World Series, starting Game 1 (L) and Game 5 (ND): 10.1ip, 11h, 7r, 6er, 3bb, 7k, 2hr.
