**ROSTER MOVES:** RHP Taijuan Walker has placed on the 10-Day IL with Right Shoulder Bursitis...RHP Edwin Diaz has been activated from the bereavement list...RHP Yennys Diaz, who was designated for assignment on April 7, has cleared waivers and been outrighted to Triple-A Syracuse.

**METSSELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Phillies, 5-4, last night...New York has dropped two straight after winning each of the first three games...The Mets continue their first road trip of the year, a two-city, seven-game series against Washington (3-1) and Philadelphia (0-1)...The Mets return to New York for their home opener on Friday, April 15 against the Arizona Diamondbacks.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY:** Tomás Nido celebrates his 28th birthday today...Nido was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft out of Orangewood Christian High School in Maitland, FL...He has posted a .208/.245/.321 slash line with 10 home runs and 45 RBI in 156 career games.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, THERE IS SUCH THING!:** Overall, 16 players have homered on their birthday in franchise history...Jeff McNeil, Mike Piazza and Jim Hickman are tied for the franchise record, having homered on their birthday twice in their career...Jeff McNeil was the last player to homer on his birthday, doing so on April 8 at Washington.

**TYLOR THE CREATOR:** Tylor Megill is set to make his second start of the year tonight in Philadelphia...He earned his first win of the season tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with three hits and struck out six on Opening Day, April 7 in Washington...Megill recorded his 100th career strikeout in the victory...Overall in 19 career starts, Megill is 5-6 with a 4.28 ERA (45 earned runs/94.2 innings) with 27 walks and 105 strikeouts...In nine starts on the road, he has gone 2-4 with a 3.86 ERA (20 earned runs/46.2 innings) with 11 walks and 47 strikeouts...He is set to make his second career start against the Phils...Megill took the loss on August 7 last season, allowing four runs in 4.2 innings with a walk and five strikeouts.

**INVADER NIM:** Brandon Nimmo is 6-18 (.333) with four runs, a double, a triple and a walk in four games this year...Nimmo batted .292/.401/.437 with 51 runs, 17 doubles, three triples, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 54 walks, five steals with an .838 OPS in 92 games last year...His career .392 career on-base percentage ranks second in team history, behind only John Olerud's .425 mark (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

**SEE YOU SOON, SEAVER:** The countdown is on until the unveiling of the Tom Seaver statue...The statue will be unveiled in a special pre-game ceremony to the right of the Home Run Apple in front of Citi Field on April 15, the Mets' home opener...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He led the NL in wins three times, ERA three times and strikeouts five times...Seaver was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1992...He spent 12 years with the Mets and went 198-124 with a 2.57 ERA and 2,541 strikeouts and is the Mets' all-time leader in wins, strikeouts, shutouts (44), ERA, complete games (171) and starts (395)...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975, as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

**STARTING OFF:** The Mets starting staff has gone 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA (four earned runs/24.2 innings) with two walks and 29 strikeouts...The club's starters have held opponents to a .139 batting average through the team's first five games...The team ranks fourth in the majors and third in the NL with a 1.46 starter's ERA and leads all of MLB with 29 punchouts...Their 24.2 innings pitched from starting pitchers is second in the majors.

**MOVING ON UP:** Pete Alonso currently ranks 14th in Mets history with 107 career homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR leaderboard: Jose Reyes (108), Ed Kranepool (118), Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

**PHILS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are seeking their 500th win against the Phillies in franchise history...The team's 499 wins are its most against any single opponent.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** In 26 career games in Philly, Starling Marte has hit .392 (40-102) with 18 runs, 12 doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI and six walks with a .441 OBP and a .627 SLG...He is a .398 (80-201) career average vs. the Phillies...That is the fifth-highest average all-time for any player against any one opponent (min. 175 at-bats)...Has hit safely in 42 of his 51 games played against the Phils.

**TAKE IT TO THE BANK:** Luis Guillorme is 8-20 (.400) with two runs, a double, three RBI and four walks in 14 games at Citizens Bank Park...Jeff McNeil has hit .333 (34-102) at the ballpark with eight doubles, a triple, a home run, six RBI and nine walks...Dominic Smith has hit to a .308 (32-104) mark with 13 runs, seven doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 15 RBI there...His seven home runs are his highest total for any opponent's ballpark.

**CANHA GET AN AMEN?:** Mark Canha is batting .571 (8-14) with two runs, three RBI, three walks and a 1.218 OPS in three games this season...He is third in the majors in batting average as well as in OBP (.647) and is fourth in times on base at 11...Canha has posted a .381 OBP since 2019...That ranks sixth in the major leagues during that span.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** The Mets are second in the Senior Circuit and are fifth in the majors with a .277 batting average...They are tied for the MLB lead with a .375 OBP...They also lead the majors in hits (48) and are third in the majors in doubles (8).

**EL JEFF-E:** Jeff McNeil has safely hit in each of his first four games of the year...He is batting .438 (7-16) with two runs, a home run, three RBI, two walks with a .500 OBP and a 1.125 OPS...His seven hits are tied for the second-most in the majors...He has collected multiple hits in two of his first four games this season.

**OUCH:** The Mets have been hit five times this year, which is second in the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 312 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 40 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 55 HBP in the last four seasons.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are now 3-2 against the NL East this season...Last year, the team went 39-37 against the NL East...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are 3-2 on the road this year...The team finished the 2021 season going 30-51 (.370) with a 4.39 ERA, 224 walks and 686 strikeouts on the road...The team's 30 wins were tied for 23rd in the majors...Outside of 2020, the team's 30 road wins were the fewest for the franchise since they went 29-52 in 2009...Despite this, the Mets' 686 road strikeouts were a franchise record, edging the 2019 Mets by one punchout.

**NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES:** The 2022 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster, including: RHP Chris Bassitt (trade), OF Mark Canha (free agent), INF Eduardo Escobar (free agent), OF Travis Jankowski (free agent), OF Starling Marte (free agent), RHP Adam Ottavino (free agent), LHP Joely Rodríguez (trade), RHP Max Scherzer (free agent) and LHP Chasen Shreve (free agent).

**THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS:** Buck Showalter became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,554.

**HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ:** Earlier this year, the Mets announced that the team will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history... Hernandez will become the fourth player to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31) and Jerry Koosman (#36). In addition, the Mets have retired #14 for Manager Gil Hodges, #37 for Manager Casey Stengel and #42 across baseball for Jackie Robinson.

### MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

**OPENOR:** Megill became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history on April 7 at Washington when he earned his first career Opening Day start...Entering the game, his 89.2 career innings pitched were the fewest of any Mets Opening Day starter in franchise history...Earned the win tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with three hits and six strikeouts...Marked the fourth straight scoreless Opening Day start by a Mets pitcher (Jacob deGrom, 2019-2021) and the fifth in six seasons (also Noah Syndergaard, 2017)...Was the fourth start of his career without issuing a free pass...Became the third starter in club history who did not allow a run or a walk on Opening Day (Tom Seaver in 1972, Noah Syndergaard in 2017).

**NO RUNS, NO PROBLEM:** Megill has not allowed a run in two straight starts, tossing 5.0 shutout frames in his 2021 season finale, October 1, 2021 at Atlanta, and again in his 2022 debut...He earned the win in both appearances, marking the first time he has won consecutive outings in his career...His scoreless streak currently sits at 11.0 innings going back to his September 24, 2021 start at Milwaukee...It is the second-longest scoreless streak of his career, behind 17.2 scoreless innings from July 10-28, 2021...This is the second time Megill has produced back-to-back scoreless starts (also, 6.0 IP on both July 17 at Pittsburgh and July 23 vs. Toronto last season).

**100 KLUB:** Megill punched out César Hernández looking, his first batter faced, on April 7 at Washington for the 100th strikeout of his career...He is the seventh Mets hurler who began his career with New York to record 100 or more strikeouts in his first 19 career starts with the club...He is the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz in 2016.

**VS. PHILADELPHIA:** Took the loss in his lone career start against the Phillies, allowing four runs on five hits (two home runs) and a walk with five strikeouts through 4.2 innings on August 7, 2021 at Philadelphia...In that start, allowed just one hit through 4.0 IP before surrendering all four runs in the fifth inning...Is 3-3 with a 3.97 ERA (20 earned runs/45.1 innings) in nine career starts against the NL East.

**2021 RECAP:** Had his contract selected on June 23 and remained with the Mets for the rest of the season...Went 4-6 in 18 starts with a 4.52 ERA (45 earned runs/89.2 innings), 27 walks and 99 strikeouts...Among pitchers to make their first 18 career starts with the Mets, his 99 punchouts rank seventh...Posted a major league-leading 1.04 ERA in July (min. 25.0 IP), one of three pitchers in Mets history to post an ERA of 1.04 or lower in the month of July...Held right-handed batters to a .200 average, the 10th-best mark in the National League (min. 175 batters faced)...His .244 opponents' OBP against righties ranked fourth in the NL.

**WELCOME TO THE SHOW:** Megill made his major league debut when he earned the start on June 23, 2021 vs. Atlanta...He allowed two runs on three hits (one home run) and two walks with four strikeouts through 4.1 innings...He recorded his first big league punchout when William Contreras struck out on a foul tip in the second frame...Megill earned his first major league win on July 23, 2021 vs. Toronto after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his sixth big league start and his second straight quality start.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut last season...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (1-0, 4.50)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched at Nationals Park as a member of the visiting team for the first time in his career on April 8...Earned his first quality start of the year in the win, allowing three runs on three hits (one home run) and a walk with six strikeouts through 6.0 innings.

**IT'S ALWAYS SUNNY IN PHILADELPHIA:** Scherzer's 2.50 ERA (44 earned runs/158.2 innings) through 25 career starts against the Phillies is his best against any National League East opponent...It is his fifth-best career ERA against any opponent he has faced (min. 10 starts) behind Toronto (2.48), Chicago-AL (2.43), Tampa Bay (2.41) and Arizona (2.38).
