METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Rays, 7-5, last night...The victory snapped a six-game winning streak...The Mets have still won seven of their last nine, 11 of their last 14 and 15 of their last 19...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (3-1) against the Nationals (3-0) and Rays (0-1)...Following this series the Mets are off on Monday before hitting the road for a six-game trip to Atlanta (three games) and Philadelphia (three games).

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Juan Soto is three hits away from 1,000 for his career...Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 45-25 record this season...That is the best record in the National League...Only the Tigers have more wins in the majors...Their record through 70 games is tied for the second-best start in franchise history with the 1988 and 2022 teams...Only the 1986 team had a better season-opening record (49-21).

ODDS + ENDS: The Mets are 10-1 in home series this season and 14-6-2 in series on the year...Yesterday was just the fifth time this season the Mets have allowed seven or more runs in a game, the fewest such games in MLB...They are 28-7 when scoring five or more runs in a game...It was the second time in 12 home series this season New York has dropped the opening game (also: 5/23 vs. LAD).

IN THE CITY: The Mets are 27-8 through their first 35 home games this season, which marks their best start at home in franchise history...Their 2.64 ERA at home is the best in the NL...Their .771 home winning percentage is the best in the majors...The Mets have won six of their last seven and 10 of their last 12 at Citi Field.

DOUBLE DARE: Pete Alonso recorded his 22nd double of the season last night, which is tied with Lawrence Butler and Bobby Witt Jr. for the most in the majors...Is tied with David Wright (2009) and Todd Zeile (2000) for the second-most by a Met through the first 70 games of a season...Only Wright (2012) had more with 23 doubles...His 40 extra-base hits this season are tied for the second-most in the majors and the most ever by a Met through the first 70 games of a season...Joins Corbin Carroll (40 XBH in 2025) for the most extra-base hits by a National League player in their team's first 70 games since Josh Bell had 48 extra-base hits in Pittsburgh's first 70 games of the 2019 season...Was his 415th career extra-base hit, tied with Mike Piazza for fifth in franchise history.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has safely reached base in 21 straight games...The 21-game on-base streak is now the second-longest streak of his career...His career-best is a 36 games streak (8/2-9/9/19)...He is batting .305 (25-82) in that span with six doubles, eight homers, 26 RBI, seven walks, a .389 OBP and a .671 SLG in that span...Alonso has collected 63 RBI in 70 games this season...That is the most in the major leagues...He recorded 88 RBI in 162 contests last year.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets starting staff has allowed only more than four earned runs in one game this year when RHP Blade Tidwell made his major league debut and surrendered six earned runs over 3.2 innings of work...They have gone 36 consecutive games without allowing more than four earned runs, the second-longest active streak in the majors...Overall, the Mets starting staff has posted a 2.78 ERA, the best in the majors.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 47 times this year, which is the most in the majors...New York was hit 92 times last season, the third-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 95 pitches in his career...Brandon Nimmo is second with 82, followed by Jeff McNeil at 78 HBP.

RAYS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 5-8 against the Rays at Citi Field...New York is 3-12 in their last 15 games against the Rays dating back to July 7, 2018.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets opened their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 11-11 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague Play last year...Overall, New York owns a 289-287 record in Interleague play...The Mets are 4-8 in their last 12 games against Interleague opponents...They went 7-3 in their first 10 Interleague games of the season.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in each of his last 15 games...He is batting .346 (18-52) with 17 runs, four doubles, five homers, 11 RBI, 16 walks with a .507 OBP and a .712 SLG in that span...Soto has recorded a major league-leading 57 walks...His 57 walks through the team's first 70 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024)...The lefty is a perfect 8-8 in stolen base attempts this season...Has surpassed his total from last season (157 games).

MARTE PARTY: Over his last 16 games dating back to May 23, Starling Marte is batting .349/.440/.535 (15-43)...He has reached base in 20 of his last 25 games...He has also reached base in each of his last 12 starts and in 17 of his last 18 starts.

LUCKY LINDOR: The Mets have won the last 27 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...Carl Furillo (29, 1951-53) holds the record...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 86.6 (58-67) stolen base percentage this season which is the best in the majors...The Mets are one of seven teams in the majors to have four players with eight or more stolen bases this season (Lindor, Soto, Acuña, Taylor)...Mets catchers have caught 38.8% potential base stealers this year, the second-best mark in the majors.

HAPPY JEFF: Over Jeff McNeil's last 21 games dating back to May 18, he has a .296/.386/.592 (21-71) slash line with five home runs, four doubles, one triple and 15 RBI...He has four home runs in his last six games...He has reached base safely in his last 16 games dating back to May 25, tied for the third-longest such streak of his career...In addition, he has hit safely in 13 of his last 14 games including each of his last seven.

PLAYOFF PONIES: With a 6-5 extra-inning win over Richmond last night, the Binghamton Rumble Ponies won the first half Northeast Division title and clinched a spot in the 2025 Eastern League Playoffs...Binghamton has clinched a spot in the postseason for the second time in their last three seasons and for the 13th time in franchise history...They improve to 41-19 on the season thus far and have gone 23-4 over their last 27 games.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 13th start of the season on June 8 at Colorado, earning his fifth win of the season after allowing just two earned runs over 5.0 IP (3 H, 3 BB, 5 K, HP)...Did not allow a hit to his first 14 batters faced and was scoreless through his first 4.1 innings...Has allowed four hits or less in a career-high five straight starts (since May 16 at NYY)...Received a season-high eight runs of support in his outing.

2025: In 13 starts this season, is 5-4 with a 3.76 ERA (27 ER/64.2 IP), 31 walks and 84 strikeouts...Has recorded at least six strikeouts in seven of his last nine starts (since April 21), posting a 12.71 K/9.0 IP ratio in those games...Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in nine of his 13 starts, and one or zero runs in five...Has held batters to a .218 average (53-243)...Has tossed 5.0+ innings in nine of 13 starts this season...Has received more than three runs in support in just five of his outings...The Mets are 3-1 over his last four starts after going 0-4 in his previous four starts and 3-4 in his first seven starts this season...Among major league pitchers (min. 60.0 IP), he is third in K/9.0 IP (11.69, third in NL)...Among NL pitchers with the same qualification, he ranks sixth in opponents' SLG (.325), fifth in swing and miss percentage (30.5), 10th HR/9.0 IP (0.70) and is tied for 11th in strikeouts (84).

TYLOR MADE: Dating back to September 9, 2024, Megill has recorded a 3.23 ERA (31 ER/86.1 IP) with 39 walks and 111 strikeouts in 17 starts...He has held opposing batters to a .211 average (68-323) and has posted a 11.57 K/9.0 IP ratio...Also has posted a 0.73 HR/9.0 IP ratio (7 HR/86.1 IP)...In that span, he ranks third in K/9.0 IP (11.57, third in NL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.316, third in NL), tied for 11th in strikeouts (111, tied for seventh in NL) among Major League pitchers (min. 80.0 IP).

HOMECOMING: Has gone 3-2 with a 2.16 ERA (6 ER/25.0 IP), a .213 opponents' BA (20-94) and a 12.24 K/9.0 IP ratio (34 K/25.0 IP) in five starts at Citi Field this season...Did not allow an earned run in each of his first three starts at home this season (14.2 IP)...His three starts to open the season at home without an ER were tied with Glendon Rusch (3GS in 2001) and Craig Swan (3GS in 1978) for the longest such streak in franchise history...Also, his three consecutive starts without allowing an earned run at home was tied for the second-longest such streak by a Met in a single season, trailing only Jerry Koosman's four starts from 8/19-9/3(G1)/73...He was just the 13th Mets starter to accomplish the feat and the first to do so since Jacob deGrom's 3GS from 6/11-21(G1)/21...He has gone 16-11 with a 3.61 ERA (87 ER/217.0 IP), 90 walks and 231 strikeouts in 44 games (41 starts) at Citi Field.

ACROSS LEAGUE LINES: Will be making his second career start against the Rays today...His only outing vs. Tampa Bay came on 5/18/23 where he allowed two earned runs over 6.0 innings (W, 4 H, BB, 4 K, HR)...Has made six starts against Interleague opponents this season, going 3-2 with a 3.18 ERA (10 ER/28.1 IP), 14 walks and 33 strikeouts...Since the start of last season, the right-hander has allowed just two home runs to a total of 241 American League batters over 56.0 innings, posting a 0.32 HR/9.0IP ratio which is the third-lowest in the majors over that span (min. 200 BF)...Has made 10 starts against AL East opponents in his career, going 4-2 with a 3.14 ERA (18 ER/51.2 IP), 20 walks and 57 strikeouts...In 23 career outings (21 starts) in Interleague games, Megill has gone 8-4 with a 3.44 ERA (41 ER/107.1 IP), 44 walks and 115 strikeouts.

PITCH ARSENAL: Megill has used his slider 24.5% of the time and has posted a 46.9 whiff rate with the pitch, striking out 25 batters...Though he has only used his changeup 7.0% of the time this season, Megill has recorded a 37.0 whiff rate with his off-speed pitch...He has held batters to a .176 average (3-17) when throwing his changeup...In 2024, Megill used his slider just 11.0% of the time and recorded a 29.1 whiff rate...He used his changeup only 1.5% of the time last season and recorded a 11.1 whiff rate on that pitch.

2024 RECAP: Over 16 games (15 starts) in 2024, Megill went 4-5 with a 4.04 ERA (35 ER/78.0 IP), adding 32 walks against 91 strikeouts...The right-hander allowed three runs or less in 11 of his 15 starts, including each of his last six starts of the season (August 30 - September 30)...He recorded at least six strikeouts in nine starts, tied for his most such starts in a single season (also: 2021)...Among National League pitchers, his 10.50 K/9.0IP ratio was tied for the ninth-best (min. 75.0 IP)...Megill pitched in the Postseason for the first time in his career, making appearances in Game 2 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia (1 ER/1.1 IP) and in Game 3 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL (4 ER/3.0 IP).

CAREER NOTES: Made his third career Opening Day roster (also: 2022, '24)...Over parts of four Major League seasons with the Mets, Megill has combined to go 26-25 with a 4.43 ERA (200 ER/406.0 IP), 161 walks and 430 strikeouts over 87 games (80 starts)...In 2024, he established career bests in ERA (4.04), K/9.0IP (10.50), HR/9.0IP (0.92) and FIP (3.62)...Was originally drafted by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Arizona.

- Entered with one out in the seventh inning on June 12 vs. Washington and stranded his only inherited baserunner...He then threw a scoreless eighth inning (1.2 IP)...Was his ninth scoreless relief appearance of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the most such outings among Major League relievers.
- Has gone 3-1 with one save, eight holds and a 1.64 ERA (7 ER/38.1 IP) through 29 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .180 average (23-128)...21 of his 29 outings this season have been scoreless...With runners on base, has held batters to a .125 average (7-56)...He is one of 16 Mets pitchers to record as low of an ERA through their first 29 games of a season.
- Has recorded a 1.78 ERA (7 ER/35.1 IP) in 27 games as a reliever this season...Among qualified NL relievers this season, is 11th in ERA, tied for ninth in wins and 10th in WHIP (0.91).
- He has a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) over 13 appearances at home this season and has held batters to a .190 batting average (11-58) at Citi Field.
- Has stranded 18 of 20 inherited runners this season and his inherited runners scored percentage (10.5%) is the best mark in the majors (min. 20 IR).
- Allowed one run and two hits in the seventh inning on June 6 at Colorado (1.0 IP, 2 H, ER)...Was the first time he's allowed an earned run in back-to-back appearances this season.
- Surrendered a solo home run to Max Muncy in the ninth inning on June 3 at Los Angeles-NL (1.0 IP, H, ER, 3 K) and blew his third save of the season...He struck out three Dodgers and it was fourth time this season he struck out three or more in an outing.
