THE CHIPPER JONES TRAIL: The St. Louis Cardinals continue a seven-game road trip through New York (0-4) and Atlanta (Apr. 21-23) through the Easter holiday weekend, arguably two cities Braves' Hall of Famer **Chipper Jones** loved to play. The Cardinals arrived at their Atlanta hotel at 9:00 p.m. Eastern Time last night. Tonight, the Cardinals play the first of a three-game series against the Atlanta Braves. St. Louis won the season series in 2024, taking 2-of-3 in Atlanta and St. Louis.

SOMETHING ABOUT THE SOUTH: The Cardinals have won their last two series at Truist Park and have a 12-11 record in the regular season. St. Louis was also 2-1 at the ballpark during the 2019 National League Division Series.

NOT THE WORST THING: The Cardinals were swept on the road for the second time this season. First in a three-game series at Boston (Apr. 4-6) and on this road trip at New York (Apr. 17-20) in a four-game series. St. Louis is 1-9 on the road with only the Rays (0-3, .000) and Rockies (1-11, .091) posting a lower winning percentage while barnstorming. The last time the Cardinals started the season 1-9 on the road was 1985. That season, St. Louis dropped series to New York (0-2), Pittsburgh (1-2), Montreal (0-4) and the first game at Los Angeles (0-1). That squad eventually rallied, took over first place on June 21 and won the National League East with a 101-61 record and the pennant.

WINN BREAKS IT IN: Injured shortstop **Masyn Winn** played in his third injury rehabilitation assignment game with Memphis (AAA) yesterday afternoon and was 0-for-3 with two walks while playing shortstop. Winn was placed on the 10-day Injured List with lower back spasms on April 12. St. Louis is 3-5 in his absence and he would be eligible to return to the active roster tomorrow. Cardinals who have played shortstop (**Brendan Donovan** & **Thomas Saggese**) have batted .400 (14-35) with seven doubles and five RBI in Winn's absence. Winn is 2-11 with 2 HR and three walks on his rehab assignment.

START ME UP: **Lars Nootbaar** drew a lead-off walk to begin yesterday's game marking the 7th time this season he has “broken up a perfect game” as the first batter. Nootbaar's seven games with lead-off walks in March-April are the most in Major League Baseball this season and rank T-2nd all-time. With two more in the Cardinals final nine games in April, Nootbaar would set the MLB record for the early combined months, surpassing **Davey Lopes** (1975). Nootbaar ranks 5th in MLB with a .396 on-base percentage while batting in the No. 1 position this season (Yastrzemski .458; Tatis, Jr. .436; Goldschmidt .432; Malloy .405).

DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT: **Brendan Donovan** continues his hot start leading the National League with 31 hits and second in batting with a .356 mark. Donovan ran off a career-high 14-game hit streak (Apr. 4-18), the 2nd-longest streak in MLB this season (**Jacob Wilson**, ATH, 15). Donovan's 31 hits in March/April is nine behind **Paul DeJong's** 40 for the franchise record set in 2019. (see chart left)

DJ BISCUITS: Southern native **Alec Burleson** (Charlotte, N.C.) enters today's game with an RBI in seven straight games vs. the Braves dating back to Sept. 6, 2023. The seven-game streak is the longest active in MLB and the 2nd-longest by a Cardinals player vs. the Braves only to **Matt Holliday** (2013-14). **Rafael Devers** and **Craig Reynolds** hold the all-time record with an RBI in 11 straight games vs. the Braves.

CARAY ON, MY WAYWARD SON: Cardinals legacy television broadcaster **Chip Caray**, who spent 20 years with the Braves broadcast team (1991-92, 2005-22), returns to the Peach State again today. Since joining the Cardinals broadcast team, the 'Birds have won 3 of the 4 series against the Braves, including both their series in Atlanta.

ATLANTA CONNECTIONS

Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray** previously was the play-by-play voice of the Braves for 20 seasons on Bally Sports South and Bally Sports Southeast (2010-22), TBS and Peachtree TV (2005-2009) and on TBS and the Atlanta Braves Radio Network (1991-1992)....his father, **Skip Caray**, was part of Braves broadcasts from 1978-2008.

Jordan Walker was born in Stone Mountain, Ga.... Graduated from Decatur (Ga.) High School, where he was a 2019 and 2020 Gatorade High School Player of the Year.

Victor Scott II was born in Atlanta....graduated from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga....resides in Powder Springs Ga....grew up a fan of the Atlanta Braves.

Rodderly Muñoz is the middle child if triplets. His older brother, **Roldy Muñoz**, pitches for Columbus (AA) in the Atlanta Braves organization.... Rodderly was originally signed by Atlanta as an International Free Agent (June 11, 2018).

JoJo Romero (Aug. 21, 2020 at Truist) and **Jon Jay** (April 26, 2010 at Busch III) made their MLB debut vs. the Braves.

Kyle Leahy's uncle, **Thomas Leahy**, pitched in the Braves minor league organization (1991-93).

Brian Snitker was born in Decatur, Ill....graduated from Macon (Ill.) High School....managed **Adam Wainwright** on the 2003 Greenville Braves.

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for & managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Braves (1966-68 & 1982-84)...traded to St. Louis from Atlanta for **Orlando Cepeda** (Mar. 17, 1969).

Braves pitching coach **Rick Kranitz** was originally selected by the Cardinals in the 3rd round of the 1977 MLB January Draft, but did not sign.

Austin Riley made his MLB debut vs. the Cardinals (May 19, 2019 at Truist Park)...homered off Michael Wacha that night for his first MLB hit.

Pierce Johnson pitched three seasons (2010-12) at Missouri State University...set the school's single-season record with 119 strikeouts in 2012.

Hall of Fame catcher **Ted Simmons** played his final three seasons with Atlanta (1986-88).

Marcell Ozuna played two seasons with St. Louis (2018-19)...originally became a Cardinal via trade with Miami for **Sandy Alcantara**, **Daniel Castano**, **Zac Gallen**, & **Magneuris Sierra** (Dec. 14, 2017)...as compensation for Ozuna signing with Atlanta. St. Louis selected **Alec Burleson** in the 2nd round of the 2020 MLB draft.

Braves Bench Coach **Walt Weiss** managed **Nolan Arenado** for four seasons in Colorado (2013-16).

Stubby Clapp played the 2003 season for the Richmond Braves (AAA-Braves).

FanDuel Sports reporter **Hannah Yates** is a native of Oakville, Mo....graduated from the Univ. of Missouri...previously worked at KFNS and KSDK TV.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Has entered his 8th season in Major League Baseball and his 1st to begin a season with the Cardinals. Has previously pitched for the Nationals (2017-22) and White Sox (2024).
- Was acquired by the St. Louis Cardinals with OF Tommy Pham in a three-team/nine-player trade from the Chicago White Sox which included the Los Angeles Dodgers on July 29, 2024.
- Making his 5th start of the season (3rd on the road) with earlier starts against the Twins (3/29), Red Sox (4/4), Pirates (4/9) & Astros (4/15).
- Is working on 6 days rest tonight; is 9-13 career with a 4.69 ERA (178.1 IP/93 ER) in 36 career starts on 6 or more days of rest.
- Has received zero run support in his past two starts with the Cardinals losing by 2-1 & 2-0 scores; owns the majors 10th-best qualifying ERA (0.75) dating to his 4/9 start, but is only pitcher in that grouping who did not receive credit for a win.**
- Leads the team with 11 walks in his 21.1 IP for an NL-high walks/9 IP (4.71) mark; has walked 3+ batters in each of this last three starts.
- Is 1-4 with a 4.98 ERA in 8 road starts since joining the Cardinals last year, with his lone road win coming on 9/25/24 at COL; has recorded only 1 win in his last 9 road starts.
- Is 2-3 with 2.76 ERA in 8 career starts at Busch Stadium, including a 2-3 mark with 1.89 ERA (33.1 IP/7 ER) in his 6 starts as a Cardinal at Busch Stadium with no HR's allowed.

LAST TIME OUT: Followed up his 6.0 no-hit inning effort on 4/9 at PIT with 6.0 solid innings (season-high 96 pitches) last Tue. (4/15) in his Jackie Robinson Day start vs. HOU; allowed just one run, and was saddled with the 2-0 defeat in a match-up with the Astros Hunter Brown.

2025/CAREER NOTES:

- His 6.0 no-hit innings on 4/9 at PIT represented the deepest that he had carried a no-no at the MLB level (previous best was 3.0 IP - last on 6/18/21 vs. NYM).
- Exited his 4/4 start vs. BOS after 3.0 innings in the Red Sox home opener at Fenway Park in a 13-9 loss allowing six runs on five hits. Was his most runs allowed as a member of the Cardinals in 12 starts. Previous high was five runs at CHI in his first start with St. Louis in 2024.
- Started the Cardinals 2nd game of season (3/29 vs. MIN) and allowed just one run on two hits in his 6.0 IP (73 pitches), earning the 5-1 win.
- Went 2-5 with a 3.72 ERA in his 10 starts with the Cardinals last season and had a 7-4 mark with 3.11 ERA in 21 starts for the White Sox.
- The White Sox were 27-81 at the time he was traded; 7 of those 27 wins (26 pct.) belonged to Fedde.
- Posted a 1.94 ERA in 13 home starts in 2024** between Guaranteed Rate Field (CWS) and Busch Stadium (STL). **Ranked 2nd in MLB behind only Reynaldo Lopez (1.78) of Atlanta.**
- Had four scoreless starts of 5.0 for the White Sox at home. Posted an 0.95 ERA over his first six starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, lowest by a White Sox pitcher in his first six home starts since Tommy John recorded a 0.76 ERA in 1967.
- Played one season for NC Dinos of the KBO League in 2023 where he led the league in wins (20), ERA (2.00), strikeouts (209) and WHIP (0.95) over 30 starts covering 180.1 innings pitched.
- Earned the 2023 Choi Dong-won Award, annually awarded to the best pitcher in the KBO League.
- Was a member of the 2019 Washington Nationals World Championship squad, making 12 starts and 21 appearances during the regular season. Did not make the postseason roster but traveled with the team on the Taxi Squad.
- Played high school baseball at Las Vegas High School where he was teammates with Bryce Harper. Compiled a 14-8 record over his three-year varsity career.
- Was a two-sport athlete, starring as an All-State honoree in soccer. Helped LVHS to the 2009 Nevada High School State Championship, defeating Bishop Gorman 4-3 in a shootout.
- Played college baseball at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. Was 8-2 with a 1.76 ERA (76.2 IP) over 11 starts with 82 strikeouts during his junior season in 2014.
- Drafted by the Washington Nationals in the first round (18th overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft out of UNLV.

FEDDE vs. ATLANTA:

- Making his 11th career appearance/10th start against the Braves, but his 1st since 2022 while pitching for Washington.
- 0-6 career against the Braves with an 11.03 ERA, failing to post a quality start among his 9 previous starts.
- His 6 career losses vs. Atlanta are surpassed only by his 7 career defeats vs. Philadelphia.
- In his 4 career starts at Atlanta's Truist Park, has allowed 9 HR's in 17.1 IP, including a trio of games in which he allowed 3 HR's in each.
- Is 8-20 with a 5.98 ERA in 52 career games (45 starts) vs. N.L. East clubs, but in his lone outing vs. an NL East club since returning to MLB in 2024 from the KBO, he has one win vs. the NL East in a 4-0 besting of Washington on 5/14/24 while pitching for the White Sox (7.0 IP/0 Runs).
