ORIOLES NOTES

- With today’s loss, the Orioles have lost or tied six consecutive series against the Nationals...Fell to 18-13 when hitting multiple home runs.
- **Kyle Bradish** suffered the loss after working 4.0+ innings, permitting four runs (3 ER) on one hit and five walks with two strikeouts...The five walks matched a career high (4x, last: 8/6/23 vs. NYM)...Prior to today’s start, Bradish was 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA (1 ER/19.0 IP) in three career starts against Washington...Threw 85 pitches, 40 strikes.
- **Pete Alonso** hit his 29th career home run against Washington, his second most against any opponent in his career behind Miami (33)...The long ball snapped a career-high 19-game homerless drought opposite the Nationals.
- **Jackson Holliday** recorded his first home run off a left-handed pitcher since September 3, 2025 at San Diego off Nestor Cortes.
- **Taylor Ward** has reached base safely in each of his first 18 career games against the Nationals, the second-longest active career-opening on-base streak against Washington in MLB behind CIN's Elly De La Cruz (22 G).

NATIONALS NOTES

- The Nationals have won consecutive games for the first time since winning four straight from June 13-16...Improved to 8-4 in rubber games... Moved to 10-26 when the opponent scores first...Are now 10-3-1 in their last 14 series...Have won all four series against Baltimore since the start of 2025.
- **Zack Littell** improved to 6-2 in his last nine starts after allowing two runs on three hits (1 HR) and two walks with three strikeouts in 5.0 innings...Has allowed two earned runs or less in nine of his last 11 games (7 GS)...Surrendered his 22nd home run of the season in the first inning, tied with ATH’s Jeffrey Springs for the most in the majors...Has allowed a homer in four straight games (7 total HR), tying a season high (also 4/12-28)...Issued multiple walks for the ninth time this season, tying his most in a single season set last year between Tampa Bay and Cincinnati.
- **Luis García Jr.** drove in five runs, tying the second most of his career with October 1 (G1), 2022 vs. Philadelphia, behind a six-RBI effort earlier this season on June 5 at Arizona...Has driven in a run in four straight starts (8 total RBI) and in five of his last six games (9 total RBI) since June 22...Tallied his third multi-homer game of the season (6/5 at AZ & 5/12 at CIN) and sixth of his career...He’s homered in five of his last six games and in six of his last nine games...His 11 home runs since the beginning of June trail only COL’s Hunter Goodman (12)...Is the first National with double digit homers in a month since Kyle Schwarber hit a team-record 16 in June 2021 and the seventh Nats batter (since 2005) to do so, joining Ryan Zimmerman and Bryce Harper (both 3x), Juan Soto and Alfonso Soriano (both 2x), and Adam Dunn and Schwarber (both 1x)...Has recorded back-to-back games of 3+ hits for the fourth time in his career (last: 8/2-3/24)...He’s never done so in three consecutive games.
