METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets are returning home after a 4-3 road trip against the Phillies (2-1) and the Cardinals (2-2)...The Mets are back to .500 and are looking to own a winning record for the first time since they were 9-8 on April 25...The team has won two straight after dropping two straight...The Mets begin a five-game, six-day homestand against the Diamondbacks (three games) and Orioles (two games).

YOU'LL LOVE DAVID'S REVIVAL: Since allowing a career-high six earned runs in his first start of the year, David Peterson has a 3.10 ERA (seven earned runs/20.1 innings) in his last four starts, recording a 10.62 K/9 ratio in that span while walking only 2.66 batters per nine...He's held his opponents to a .205/.266/.356 slashline in that span.

THE LEFTOVERS: The Mets left a season-high 17 players on base yesterday...It was their highest total ever in a nine-inning game and their most since they matched a franchise record of 25 LOB on July 29, 2015 also at St. Louis (18 innings)...The team also left 25 on base on September 11, 1974 against St. Louis (25 innings)...The Mets have stranded 205 on base this season, which is tied for 12th in the majors and tied for sixth in the National League.

WALK PARTY: All eight of New York's starting position players drew at least one walk yesterday as the team totaled 11 bases on balls in its 4-1 win at St. Louis...It was the seventh time in club history that all eight starting position players walked at least once in the same game (last done April 9, 2008 vs. Philadelphia).

I'LL JUST WALK HOME: The Mets had three bases-loaded walks yesterday, tied for the most by one team in a game this year (San Francisco had three vs. Colorado on April 28)...New York has five bases-loaded walks this week (also had one each on May 2 and May 3)...The team's 37 bases-loaded walks since 2018 rank fifth in the majors and third in the NL...Those walks have contributed to a .350 OBP with the bases loaded over the last four seasons, second-best in the majors behind only Colorado (.378).

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets own a .328 OBP this season, which ranks fourth in the majors and second in the National League...Michael Conforto ranks 16th in the NL with a .371 OBP, while Alonso is 18th with a .370 mark.

WE NEED TO TALK ABOUT KEVIN: Kevin Pillar is batting .450 (9-20) with four runs, a double, two home runs, a walk and five RBI over his last five games...He had collected eight hits in his previous 16 games, going .222 (8-36).

MISS INDEPENDENT: The Mets own a 2.81 FIP, according to Fangraphs, the lowest mark in the majors...FIP is defined as fielding independent pitching, which focuses on what pitcher can control, strikeouts, walks, hit batters and home runs...Jacob deGrom leads the majors with a 0.82 FIP this season...Taijuan Walker is 16th with a 2.84 FIP.

SLIPPERY PETE: Pete Alonso has reached base safely in each of his last eight games, batting .345 (10-29) with six runs, four doubles, five RBI, four walks and a .441 OBP in that span...He has safely hit in 14 of his last 18 games, batting .313 (20-64) with 12 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, eight walks, a .405 OBP and a .968 OPS since April 17...This compares to a .207 (6-29) batting average over his first eight games...Alonso has 74 home runs since he entered the league in 2019...That is the highest total in the majors in that span...Alonso already ranks 27th on the Mets all-time list...He trails Rusty Staub who is 26th with 75.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: The Mets have scored 30 runs over their last six games...The team had scored a total of 16 runs over their previous seven games...Over the last six games, the Mets are batting .260 (52-200) with 14 extra-base hits, 28 walks and .359 OBP...The team is 18-60 (.300) with runners in scoring position in that span...The team had gone 7-48 (.146) with RISP in their previous seven games.

I LIKE MIKE: Over his 18 games, Michael Conforto is batting .279 (17-61) with eight runs, five doubles, two home runs, six RBI, 12 walks, a .397 OBP and an .856 OPS...This compares to a .120/.313/.160 slash line over his first seven games of the year...Conforto 120 career homers, tied with Edgardo Alfonzo for 10th on the Mets all-time list...Kevin McReynolds is ninth with 122.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets are 11-2 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 2-11 when scoring three or fewer runs...Overall the team has scored 88 runs this year, the fewest in the majors...New York is averaging 3.38 runs per game, the second-fewest in the majors and the lowest in the National League.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.08 ERA (seven earned runs/30.1 innings) with seven walks and 33 strikeouts over their last nine games...Overall, the Mets bullpen owns a 3.45 ERA (30 earned runs/78.1 innings), ranking eighth in the majors and third in the Senior Circuit.

DIAMONDBACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets face Arizona for the first time since 2019...The Mets have won seven of their last nine games against the Diamondbacks...The Mets has won seven straight against the Snakes at Citi Field dating back to 2018.

IT'S GONNA BE MAY: After allowing two runs in his first appearance of the season on April 5 in Philadelphia, Trevor May has made 11 appearances, allowing only an unearned run on seven hits with a walk and 15 strikeouts...Right-handed hitters are 5-27 against him with zero extra-base hits.

TOTAL DOMINATION: Since the start of 2019, Smith has played 164 games and owns a .286/.346/.525 slash line with 68 runs, 35 doubles, a triple, 23 home runs, 77 RBI, 36 walks and an .871 OPS...Over his last seven games, Smith is 8-26 with three runs, two doubles, three RBI, two walks and a .357 OBP.

EARNED BABY, EARNED: The Mets have allowed 22 unearned runs this season, which is the most in the majors...The Mets have played 26 games, the fewest in MLB...On the other hand, the Mets have allowed only 74 earned runs allowed, also the fewest in the majors.

QUALITY EATS: Through 26 complete games this season, the Mets have made 13 quality starts...The Mets hurled 17 quality starts in 2020, going 9-8 in those games...Mets starters are 8-11 and own a 2.88 ERA (44 earned runs/137.1 innings) with 38 walks and 162 strikeouts in 2021...The team's 2.88 starters' ERA is fourth in the majors and third in the Senior Circuit.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have struck out 253 in 215.1 innings this season which equates to a 10.56 strikeout per nine ratio...The team's 10.56 mark is the third-best in the majors and second in the NL...The team has walked only 64 this season, giving them a 2.67 walks per nine inning ratio, the third-best in the majors and the best in the NL.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets return home today...The Mets are 6-4 with a 1.75 ERA (17 earned runs/87.0 innings) with 21 walks and 107 strikeouts at home...The team's 1.75 ERA at home is the best in the majors...This compares to a 4.00 ERA (57 earned runs/128.1 innings) with 43 walks and 146 strikeouts on the road.

POLAR BURGER: In coordination with the talented chefs at Citi Field, Pete Alonso has created a unique new item available for purchase, the Polar Burger...The new menu item features Pat LaFrieda's black truffle blended burger patty, maple-spiced caramelized onions, smoked Gouda cheese, lettuce, tomato and claw sauce on a baked broche bun...In addition, he created Arctic Onions - "Polar spiced" shaved Vedralia onions with Claw sauce for dipping...The items are available for purchase starting this weekend near section 102, down the right field foul pole.

HONORING HIS LEGACY: The New York Mets will wear a "41" Tom Seaver tribute patch on the right sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2021 season...Seaver passed away on August 31, 2020 at age 75...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975 as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2016, Bartolo Colón at age of 42 became the oldest player in the history of MLB to hit his first career homer...Colón hit a two-run shot in the second inning as the Mets defeated the Padres, 6-3, in San Diego...He earned the win, allowing all three runs on six hits with a walk and five strikeouts in 6.2 innings of work...The team collected nine hits in the win, including home runs from Yoenis Céspedes and David Wright...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

HONORARY BAT GIRL: The New York Mets announced Stephanie Schmidt and Jackie Barber as the two Honorary Bat Girls who will represent the team in support of MLB's annual "Honorary Bat Girl" initiative, an effort commemorated each Mother's Day to highlight extraordinary efforts to support the fight against breast cancer...Schmidt and Barber, each of whom have demonstrated extraordinary strength in her battle against the disease, will be recognized at Citi Field on Mother's Day, Sunday, May 9th...Stephanie Schmidt is a NICU nurse at Cohen Children's Medical Center...Jackie Barber was a nurse at North Shore University Hospital when she was diagnosed with breast cancer...Stephanie and Jackie will be joined on Sunday by Mets' catcher James McCann's wife, Jessica...James and Jessica, along with the Mets, are honored to recognize these two incredibly strong women on Mother's Day and celebrate their strength and resiliency.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: In his last start, Peterson allowed one earned run over 5.0 innings pitched against Philadelphia at Citizens Bank Park...After giving up a home run to the first batter he faced, Peterson held the Phillies scoreless...The lefty allowed four hits for the third consecutive time and struck out eight batters, the second most in a start this season...Peterson did not factor in the decision, his first no-decision of the season.

VS. DIAMONDBACKS: Tonight, Peterson will make his first career start against the Diamondbacks...With teams only playing their division and their corresponding geographical division in 2020 due to health and safety protocols, Peterson will face his an opponent outside of the NL or AL East for the second time in his career.

AT HOME: In six career home starts, Peterson is 4-1 and owns a 3.30 ERA (11 earned runs/30.0 innings pitched) with 15 walks and 32 strikeouts...Peterson is 1-1 in two starts with a 2.25 (three earned runs /12.0 innings pitched) at Citi Field this season...Both starts have been quality starts...Had a 3-0 record with a 4.00 ERA (eight earned runs/12.0 innings pitched) four home starts last season.

LIMITING OPPONENTS: In 2020, Peterson ranked seventh in the NL with a .202 (36-178) opposing batting average (min. 200 batters faced)...That included a .161 (5-31) mark vs. left-handed batters.

10 K CLUB: Peterson joins Marlins LHP Trevor Rogers as the only pitchers that have recorded multiple double-digit strikeout games among starters that made their debut in 2020...He became the seventh Mets left-hander in club history to fan at least 10 in a start without issuing a walk (last done by Chris Capuano, August 26, 2011).

ATOP THE ROOKIE PETERBOARD: In 2020, Peterson led NL rookie pitchers with six wins...Ranked third among NL rookies with 49.2 innings pitched...Was eighth in that group with 40 strikeouts...Tied for the major league rookie lead in wins...Was eighth among major league rookies in innings pitched...Among rookies with 45.0 or more innings, Peterson was third in NL and fifth in the majors with a 1.21 WHIP, third in the majors in ERA (3.44) and fourth in the majors in BAA (.202).

IN RARE COMPANY: Last season, Peterson led the Mets pitching staff with six wins...He is one of six rookies in franchise history to finish the season as the team's win leader...Tom Seaver (16 in 1967), Jerry Koosman (19 in 1968), Mark Bombardieri (10 in 1980), Dwight Gooden (17 in 1984) and Dillon Gee (13 in 2011) are the others...Courtesy of Elias.

FIRST ROUND'S ON ME: Including Peterson, the Mets have four of their first-round selections on their roster...Peterson (20th overall pick in 2017) joins Michael Conforto (10th overall, 2014), Dominic Smith (11th overall, 2013) and Brandon Nimmo (13th overall, 2011) as Mets first-rounders on the active roster...In addition to those four, other clubs' first-round picks on the Mets roster include Francisco Lindor (eighth overall, Cleveland, 2011), Albert Almora Jr. (sixth overall, Chicago-NL, 2012), Marcus Stroman (22nd overall, Toronto, 2012) and Taijuan Walker (43rd overall, Seattle, 2010)...Noah Syndergaard, currently on the 60-Day IL, was Toronto's first-round pick in 2010.
