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TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 7-game homestand against AL West opponents with the 3rd of 4 games against the Athletics (0-2)...Seattle will also host the Texas Rangers for a 3-game set (9/8-10) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 6-game road trip where they saw both the Red Sox (2-1) and the Blue Jays (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryon Healy** on the call and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's game to the Athletics by a 7-6 score...Seattle is 49-21 (.700) when they score at least 4 runs, 42-12 (.778) when they score at least 5 runs and 56-36 (.609) when they hit a home run.

- **Offensive Explosion** - Over the last 5 games since Aug. 31, the Mariners offense has scored 35 runs and is batting .303 (56x185) with 13 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 33 RBI, 5 stolen bases and 25 walks, reaching base at a .398 clip and slugging .481 for an .879 OPS.
- **Four With a Score of Homers** - **Randy Arozarena** (22 HR), **Dominic Canzone** (21 HR), **Cal Raleigh** (21 HR) and **Julio Rodríguez** (20 HR) are 1 of 5 teammate quartets with 20+ homers apiece this season, along with the Cubs, Reds, Braves and Nationals.
- **Western Section** - The Mariners are in the middle of a 13-game stretch against AL West opponents (9/3-16)...6 of Seattle's last 7 series of the season are against AL West opponents, including each of its last 6 games of the year (2 G vs. HOU, 4 G vs. LAA)...Seattle is 20-15 against AL West opponents this season, including 10-5 at home.
- **Bean Ball** - Mariners hitters have 85 HBP this season, tied for the most in the AL with Boston and trailing only St. Louis (87 HBP) for the MLB lead...the Mariners have led MLB in HBP in each of the last 3 seasons (2023-25) and led the AL in each of the last 4 seasons (2022-25).
- **Kirb Your Enthusiasm** - **George Kirby** is making his first start at home since he allowed just 1 run over 7.2 innings with 9 strikeouts on Aug. 25 vs. PHI...overall this season, Kirby is 6-4 with a 3.21 ERA (31 ER, 87.0 IP) in 14 starts at T-Mobile Park.
- **J.P. J.P. J.P.** - **J.P. Crawford** is batting .700 (7x10) with 1 double, 2 RBI, 7 walks and 0 strikeouts with an 1.578 OPS over 4 games in September.
- **That's a Spicy Meatball** - Over his last 23 games since August 9, **Dominic Canzone** is batting .277 (26x94) with 8 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 14 RBI and an .804 OPS.

JULIO REACHES 20/20. AGAIN...**Julio Rodríguez** secured his 5th-consecutive 20+ home run and 20+ stolen base season, becoming the **first player in Major League history** to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in each of the first 5 seasons of their career...with 4 more home runs, Bobby Witt Jr.-KC could join Julio as players with 20/20 seasons in their first 5 MLB seasons.

- **Juliooooo** - Through his first 5 career seasons, Julio has amassed 25.1 *Baseball-Reference* Wins Above Replacement (bWAR), the 11th highest bWAR by a centerfielder (min. 50% G as CF) through a players first 5 seasons in MLB history.

A RALEIGH GOOD STRETCH FOR CAL...over his last 13 games since Aug. 21, **Cal Raleigh** is batting .326 (15x46) with 12 runs, 3 doubles, 8 home runs, 14 RBI and 8 walks, reaching base at a .426 clip and slugging .913 for a 1.339 OPS in 54 plate appearances...during that span, Cal leads the Majors in slugging percentage and OPS...Raleigh, who is the reigning American League Player of the Week, hit his 20th home run of the season in Monday's game at Boston for his fifth consecutive 20+ homer season (2022-c), becoming the 8th Mariners player with at least five 20+ homer seasons.

RANDY TO ROLL...over his last 23 games since Aug. 11, **Randy Arozarena** is batting .247 (22x89) with 19 runs, 4 doubles, 8 home runs, 17 RBI, 13 walks, a .374 on-base percentage and slugging .562 for a .936 OPS...Arozarena's 4.5 bWAR this season ranks T-8th in the American League.

THE LAZER SHOW HAS ARRIVED...**Lazaro Montes** made his MLB debut on Tuesday at Boston, going 2-for-4 with 1 walk, 1 home run and 2 RBI...he became the youngest Mariners player and 6th overall to hit a home run in his debut and also became the first Mariners player since Hall of Famer Ichiro Suzuki to record multiple hits in their debut...the No. 56 overall prospect (*MLB Pipeline*) slugged 38 home runs over 123 games between Triple-A and Double-A this season, tied for 2nd-most among all MiLB batters at the time of his call-up.

A 20-20 DUO...**Randy Arozarena** and **Julio Rodríguez** have both recorded 20/20 seasons in back-to-back years (2025-26), joining Alex Rodríguez and Ken Griffey Jr. (1998-99) as the only other pair of Mariners teammates with a 20/20 season in the same year, also doing so in consecutive seasons...Arozarena and Rodríguez are the only teammates in MLB this season to each reach 20+ HR and 20+SB.

HITTING MACHINE...**Josh Naylor** went 3-for-4 with 1 double and 1 RBI in yesterday's game...since the All-Star break (7/17-c), he is batting .305 (50x164) with 16 runs, 8 doubles, 2 home runs, 13 RBI, 8 stolen bases and an .741 OPS...he ranks 10th in the AL in average (min. 150 PA) and T-6th in multi-hit games (16) during the second half.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** recently became the first player in MLB history to begin their career by recording 5-consecutive 20+ home run, 20+ stolen base seasons, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**... Julio is also the **only player in Major League history** to record at least 130 doubles, 130 home runs and 130 stolen bases over their first 5 career seasons?...J-Rod is also 1 of 4 players in MLB history to reach those milestones in their age-25 season or younger, joining Alex Rodríguez (228 2B, 241 HR, 151 SB), Mike Trout (200 2B, 201 HR, 165 SB) and Ronald Acuña Jr. (137 2B, 161 HR, 180 SB).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 5

- **1983** - Harold Reynolds makes his ML debut at Kansas City. Starting at 2nd base Reynolds goes 2-3, with a double a triple and two runs scored.
- **1984** - With two runs in the top of the 10th inning, the Mariners swept the Texas Rangers for the second time in '84 with a 6-5 victory.
- **1999** - Edgar Martinez receives AL Player of the Week honors.
- **2001** - Seattle becomes the 2nd-fastest team to reach 100 wins by calendar date, after a 12-6 win over Tampa Bay
- **2008** - Brandon Morrow made his first career start against the New York Yankees after 100 appearances as a relief pitcher in 2007 and 2008. Had a no-hitter through 7.2 IP. Morrow set career highs in innings (7.2), pitches (106) and strikeouts (8).
- **2018** - Mitch Haniger extended his hitting streak to 17 games, long surpassing his previous career high.
- **2021** - The Mariners offense scores 7 runs in the top of the 11th inning to complete 3-game sweep of Arizona.
- **2025** - Catcher Harry Ford made his Major League debut as a pinch hitter in the 7th inning.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 27th start of the season and 1st against the Athletics...will be the 139th start of his career and his 10th career start against the Athletics.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...ND at Boston, tossed 5.0 innings, allowing 5 runs (5 ER) on 7 hits (2 HR) and 2 walks with 2 strikeouts...threw 86 pitches and 56 strikes.

A+ APPEARANCES...has made the 5th most appearances against the Athletics of any opponent over his career (9 G)...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 7 of his 9 appearances against the A's including 5 outings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed and 7 quality starts...his 6 quality starts against the team ranks T-3rd most in MLB since 2022...has struck out 9 batters and walked 1-or-fewer in 4 starts and in 2 of his last 3 starts against the A's...the Mariners are 7-2 over his 9 starts...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his last the 5 games since May 4, 2023, owning a 3.19 ERA (11 ER, 31.0 IP) with 26 strikeouts to 5 walks for a 5.2 K/BB against the A's which ranks 11th-best in MLB since 2023 (min 20.0 IP).

SHERIFFS IN TOWN...across 46 career starts against AL West teams, Kirby is 28-7 and owns a 2.85 ERA (86 ER, 271.1 IP) with 269 strikeouts to 41 walks (6.56 K/BB)...among all-time MLB pitchers with 200.0+ innings pitched against the AL West, he leads in K/BB and ranks T-7th in WHIP (1.03)...has allowed 2-or-fewer runs over 5.2 innings pitched in all 3 of his home starts against the AL West, including a 2 run, 8.0 inning performance on June 29...over 20 home starts has recorded 5.0 innings in 19 and allowed 2-or-fewer runs in 18 of those 19 starts.

THE HOME STRETCH...over his last 6 home games since June 17, Kirby owns a 1.59 ERA (7 ER, 39.2 IP) with 32 strikeouts to 6 walks (5.33 K/BB) and a 0.983 WHIP...his 1.59 ERA is his best mark across a 6-game span at home since he recorded a 1.41 ERA (6 ER, 38.1 IP) from April 27-July 7, 2024...his 39.2 innings pitched are the most he has tossed across a 6-game span at home in his career...has recorded a quality start in 5 of his last 6 starts at home and has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his last 6 home starts...his 6 consecutive starts are tied for the 2nd longest such streak of his career (also: 9 G, 7/26/22-9/28-22).

GOOD TO BE HOME...owns a 1.48 career BB/9 at home which ranks T-18th in MLB all-time and 2nd in MLB since 2022 (min. 200 IP) while his 6.14 SO/BB ranks 5th-best all time...his 39 career home starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer earned runs allowed are tied for 4th-most in Mariners history and are T-3rd most in MLB since 2022.

ALL IN A DAY'S WORK...in his last home start on Aug. 25 vs. PHI put together his 6th outing of the season with 3-or-fewer runs allowed over 7.0+ IP, tied for 12th most in MLB this season...his 28 career games are tied for 13th most in MLB since 2022...his last start also marked his 2nd since the start of August with 1-or-fewer runs allowed over 7.0+ IP...is 1-of-13 pitchers with multiple such outings over that span...went 7.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 8 vs. MIN for his first 7.0+ inning scoreless outing since Sept. 12, 2025 and the 10th of his career, ranking T-5th most in the AL since 2022...is 1-of-4 pitchers this season with 4+ outings of 7.2+ innings pitched.

MAINTAINING THE RATIO...on Aug. 25 vs. PHI, recorded his 16th career game with 9+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks...his 16 such career games rank 6th most in the AL since 2022...has made 14 starts this season with 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks, ranking T-14th most in the AL...his 76 career games are 11th most in MLB since 2022...ranks 10th among qualified AL pitchers with a 3.56 K/BB this season...his career 5.81 K/BB ranks 3rd-best in MLB all-time (min. 400.0 IP).

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 15.5 pitches per inning this season tied for the 12th lowest mark among qualified MLB pitchers, matching **Bryan Woo**...has tossed 6 quality starts with 90-or-fewer pitches thrown in the outing this season, T-13th most such starts in MLB...records a first pitch strike 65.2% of the time in 2026, 9th highest in MLB with a first pitch swing 36.4% of the time, 6th highest in MLB this season...owns 101 strikeouts to 12 walks (8.42 K/BB) with a 1.071 WHIP after a 0-1 count.

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown 14 quality starts this season (last: 8/25 vs. PHI), tied for 7th-most in the AL...his 77 career quality starts are tied for 5th-most in MLB since 2022...has thrown 39 career quality starts without any walks allowed (4x this season, last: 7/8 at MIA), most in MLB since 2022, ranking ahead of Zack Wheeler-PHI (29 G) and Tarik Skubal-DET/LAD (29 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 21 career home games (last: 7/8 at MIA), most in MLB since 2022...his 21 such games at home are also 3rd-most in Mariners history, just trailing Jamie Moyer (22 G) and Félix Hernández (22 G)...with his next quality start, Kirby will become 1-of-9 pitchers with 15+ quality starts in 3+ seasons since 2023...is already 1-of-6 pitchers with 10+ QS in each of the last 5 seasons since 2022.

- On Call Often - His 66 relief appearances this season lead the Mariners bullpen and ranks T-6th in MLB...his 26 holds also rank 5th in MLB.

- **Steak Streak** - Recorded an RBI in 6-consecutive games (4/24-29), the longest streak since Eugenio Suarez's franchise record streak (10 G, July 25-Aug. 4, 2023).
