**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets won, 7-6 in 10 innings Tuesday night...The Mets are on their final road trip before the All-Star break, taking on Baltimore (1-0) and Kansas City (three games)... New York is 20-25 on the road this year... The .444 winning percentage is the ninth-worst in the majors.

**DOUBLEHEADERS:** New York is set to play its third doubleheader of the year...They are 0-1-1 in their previous two...This will be the first time the Mets and Orioles play a doubleheader against each other.

**EXTRA, EXTRA:** New York improved to 5-4 in extra-innings this year...Mets pitchers have posted a 0.82 ERA in extra innings, allowing just one earned run over 11.0 innings, the third-best mark in the majors (the ghost runner is an unearned run).

**INTERLEAGUE:** The Mets are 14-14 in Interleague play this season as opposed to 39-25 against the NL.

**I'M FEELING '22:** Prior to Tuesday's win, the last time the Mets won a game after trailing by four or more runs in eighth inning or later was: on May 5, 2022 at Philadelphia when then Mets won 8-7 after scoring seven runs in the ninth inning (trailing 7-1 entering top of the ninth)...Courtesy of Elias.

**AIN'T LIFE GRAND:** Brandon Nimmo is scheduled to play in his 1,000th career game today...He will become the 11th player in franchise history to reach 1,000 games...Ed Kranepool holds the record appearing in 1,853 games.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** On Sunday, Major League Baseball announced that first baseman Pete Alonso and RHP Edwin Díaz will join starting shortstop Francisco Lindor on the National League All-Star team...The 95th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 15 in Atlanta...Alonso was named to the All-Star team for the fifth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history – two more than Keith Hernandez...Alonso becomes the sixth player in franchise history to be named to five or more All-Star teams, joining Tom Seaver (nine), David Wright (seven), Mike Piazza (seven), Darryl Strawberry (seven) and Carlos Beltrán (five)...Díaz was named to an All-Star team for the third time in his career and second as a member of the Mets (also in 2022)...He was an American League All-Star in 2018 with Seattle...Lindor was announced as the National League starting shortstop on July 2...Lindor will make his first trip to the Midsummer Classic as a member of the Mets and his fifth overall after making four straight American League All-Star teams with Cleveland from 2016-19.

**PITCHING IN:** On Tuesday, Alex Carrillo became the 36th different pitcher the Mets have used this season which is the most pitchers that any team in the majors has used this year...It is also already the fourth-most in a season in team history (behind 37 pitchers in 2023 and 2024 and 42 pitchers in 2021).

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo's 18 home runs are his most prior to the All-Star Break in any season...Over the last 39 games, Nimmo is batting .311 (47-151) with 24 runs, eight doubles, 10 homers, 2 RBI, 11 walks, eight steals and a .933 OPS...Nimmo scored his 552nd career run on Juan Soto's home run on Friday...He passed Carlos Beltrán for sole possession for place eighth place in franchise history...Six of Nimmo's last nine hits have gone for extra-bases (3 HR, 3 2B).

**ONLY JUAN:** Since May 30, Juan Soto is tied for second in the majors with 32 runs scored, third with a 1.173 OPS, second with a .474 OPS, fourth with a .699 slugging percentage and tied for fourth with 13 homers during that span.

**JUAN-DERFUL:** Overall, Soto leads the majors with 72 walks, is fourth in the majors with a .399 OBP, tied for fourth in the majors with 66 runs scored, and is seventh in the NL with a .908 OPS and tied for seventh with 21 homers.

**21 FOR THE POLAR BEAR:** Pete Alonso hit a game-tying two-run homer in the eighth-inning Tuesday...It was his 21st of the year and his third in his last three games...It was the 13th time in his career he's hit a game-tying or go-ahead homer in the eighth inning or later...Alonso has six seasons of 20 or more homers, tying Mike Piazza and David Wright for the second-most such seasons in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is first with eight seasons with 20 or more homes.

**RONNY RAKES:** Is batting .317 (13-41) with seven runs scored, two doubles, two homers, four RBI and four walks over his last 13 games dating to June 19.

**METS-ORIOLES NOTES:** The Mets are 4-6 at Camden Yards dating back to 2018.

**PEAK PETE PERFORMANCE:** Alonso is second in the majors with 25 doubles, tied for seventh in the NL with 21 homers, seventh with a .383 OBP, tied for seventh with a .551 slugging percentage and sixth with a .934 OPS.

**SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT:** According to Elias, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 197 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

**KEEPIN' IT 100:** Francisco Lindor picked up his 100th stolen base as a Met on Saturday becoming the 12th player in franchise history to reach the milestone...He is the sixth player to accumulate 100+ home runs and 100+ stolen bases as a Met...The others are Darryl Strawberry, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán, David Wright and José Reyes...He is also one stolen base away from 200 in his career.

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT:** RHP Jonah Tong and OF Carson Benge have been selected to participate in the 2025 All Star Futures Game on Saturday, July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Benge, the Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was promoted to Binghamton on June 23 after starting the year with High-A Brooklyn...Benge slashed .302/.417/.480 with an .897 OPS in 60 games with the Cyclones...He was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State.

**ED, EDD AND EDDY:** Edwin Díaz has recorded 18 saves in 19 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Díaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors with 18 saves...He has not allowed a run in 24 of his last 25 games dating back to April 26 with 37 strikeouts covering 25.0 innings.

**JEFF McHITS:** Is batting .274 (32-117) with 14 runs scored, five doubles, seven homers, 19 RBI and a .837 OPS over his last 33 games dating to May 27.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Picked up his sixth win of the season after allowing one earned run over 6.2 innings on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (5 H, 2 R, 3 BB, 4 K, HR, HP, BK)...Did not allow a hit to his first 14 batters faced (3.2 IP)...The Mets moved to 9-0 in games that Peterson has started at home this season...The team's nine consecutive wins in Peterson home starts is the second-longest season-opening win streak in franchise history...He only trails David Cone's 11 straight home starts with a Mets win to open the 1989 season...Courtesy of *Elías*.

**ON A ROLL:** Over 17 starts this season, has gone 6-4 with a 3.18 ERA (36 ER/102.0 IP), 37 walks and 87 strikeouts...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 15 of his 17 starts this season and in 16 of his last 18 starts dating back to September 29, 2024...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from 6/5-17...Pitched 5.0 innings or more in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Had also recorded three consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings from June 5-17, joining himself (3 GS from 8/19-29/24) as the only Mets pitcher to do so since Zack Wheeler's four such starts from 9/10-26/19...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is fifth in groundball percentage (56.4, third in NL), tied for the fifth-most opponent GIDP (13, second in NL) and seventh in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.62, fifth in NL)...Is also eighth in the NL in opponents' SLG (.351) and 12th in ERA.

**YEAR IN REVIEW:** Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 31 of his 38 starts, going 16-7 with a 3.03 ERA (75 ER/223.0 IP), 83 walks and 188 strikeouts...22 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 25-13 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just four runs in the first inning, which is the fewest in the majors during that span (min. 30 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 30 GS), he is sixth in HR/9.0 IP (0.61, fourth in NL), seventh in groundball percentage (53.1, fourth in NL), 11th in opponents' SLG (.350, fifth in NL), tied for 11th in wins (tied for fifth in NL) and 13th in ERA (3.03, sixth in NL).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** Has made eight road outings this season, his first six being quality starts...His six straight quality starts to open the season on the road were the most by a Mets starter since Noah Syndergaard's six such starts from April 5 - June 8, 2016...Despite his six QS, the Mets have gone 1-7 in his road starts compared to a 9-0 record when he starts at home...Has combined to go 1-4 with a 4.44 ERA (23 ER/46.2 IP), 22 walks and 42 strikeouts on the road this year...In 20 road starts since his start to the 2024 season, Peterson has gone 7-5 with a 3.32 ERA (44 ER/119.1 IP), 48 walks and 92 strikeouts...He has recorded quality starts in 14 of those games, including 11 of his last 15 (since August 3, 2024)...Allowed two runs or less in 14 of those 20 road outings.

**LEFTY LEADERBOARD:** With one strikeout today, David Peterson will tie Steven Matz (552) for the 10th-most strikeouts by a lefty pitcher in franchise history...Al Jackson is next on the list with 561...Among left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he is seventh in strikeouts (28) and groundball percentage (63.3)...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

**SOUTHPAW SHUTOUT:** On June 11 vs. the Nationals, Peterson tossed a complete game shutout for the first time in his career (6 H, 0 BB, 6 K)...Was the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He is the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT)...Became the fourth pitcher in the majors this season to throw a 9.0+ IP complete game shutout without allowing a walk, and the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom (4/23/21 vs. WAS)...He became the 63rd pitcher in franchise history to record a shutout without allowing a walk.

**VS. BALTIMORE/AL EAST:** Will be making his fifth appearance (fourth start) against the Orioles today, going 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (6 ER/16.2 IP) in those games...Has made two starts against AL East opponents this season, allowing just two earned runs over 10.2 innings (1.69 ERA)...Over his last eight outings (seven starts) against the AL East (since 7/23/23), has gone 1-1 with a 2.48 ERA (10 ER/36.1 IP), 21 walks and 39 strikeouts...Has allowed just two home runs to 162 batters faced in those games, posting a 0.50 HR/9.0 IP ratio.

**ELECTRIC SLIDE:** David Peterson has used his slider 20.7% of the time this season...Of his 87 strikeouts, 48 have come using this pitch...Has recorded a 32.4% put away rate and a 34.4% whiff rate with the pitch this season, both rates the highest among pitches in his arsenal.

**QUALITY CONTROL:** Has recorded 10 quality starts in 17 total outings this season, including eight of his last 11 starts...Had four consecutive quality starts from May 6-24, which was the second-longest such streak of his career (longest: five quality starts from 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 22 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 20 of them coming in his last 33 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of 12 pitchers (one of six in NL) to record at least 20 quality starts and one of five left-handers to do so.

**APPLE PICKING:** This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of five (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which is tied for the second-highest in the majors behind only teammate Griffin Canning (six) and Max Fried (six)...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 29 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Teammate Griffin Canning is next on the list with 22...Peterson has recorded 17 career pickoffs (two this season), which is the eighth-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20), Sid Fernandez (18)...According to *OPTA*.

**CAREER NOTES:** With a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) last season, Peterson became the 10th left-hander in franchise history to record an ERA of 3.00-or-under while making at least 20 starts and was the first to accomplish the feat since Johan Santana's 2.98 ERA (66 ER/199.0 IP) over 29 starts in 2010...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 34-28 with a 3.92 ERA (242 ER/556.0 IP), 234 walks and 551 strikeouts in 118 games (102 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
