2024 MINOR LEAGUE SUMMARY

COMPOSITE RECORD: Pittsburgh's seven minor league affiliates combined for a 355-359 record (.497 winning percentage). Four of the team's seven minor league teams posted winning records.

PLAYOFF REVIEW: Greensboro earned a playoff bid after finishing the first half of the season with the best record (39-26) in the South Atlantic League's North Division. The Grasshoppers fell to Hudson Valley in the third and deciding game of the divisional playoffs that ended their season. The FCL Pirates beat the FCL Yankees 4-3 in the one-game semifinal round of the playoffs to advance to the league's championship series against the FCL Tigers. The FCL Pirates were then swept by the FCL Tigers in the best-of-three championship round.

MISC HONORS/FEATS:

INDIANAPOLIS: Bubba Chandler led the International League in both strikeouts (54) and ERA (1.83) from the time of his debut on August 9 through the end of the season.

ALTOONA: Termarr Johnson became the third-youngest player to suit up for the Curve in team history when he made his debut at 20 years, two months, and 16 days old on August 27. Thomas Harrington was named the Eastern League's Pitcher of the Month for July. Harrington became the first member of the Curve to earn monthly honors since Barrett Barnes in 2016.

GREENSBORO: The Grasshoppers led all teams at the High-A level in both home runs (175) and runs scored (710). The Grasshoppers had the best run differential (150) among all teams at the High-A level. Charles McAdoo, who began the year with Greensboro but was traded to Toronto, was named the South Atlantic League's Most Valuable Player.

BRADENTON: Esmerlyn Valdez led the Florida State League with 22 home runs. It marked the second straight season a member of the Marauders led the league in home runs after Rodolfo Nolasco did so in 2023.

FCL PIRATES: Zander Mueth was named the Florida Complex League's Pitcher of the Year. Mueth went 6-0 with a 1.64 ERA (44.0ip/8er) in his last 11 appearances (10 starts) in the Florida Complex League.

DSL PIRATES: The DSL Pirates Gold team finished fifth in the league in ERA (3.50) and fourth in strikeouts (517).

2024 INDIANAPOLIS INDIANS BATTERS

The Indians finished their regular season with a record of 77-70 after winning 18 of their last 25 games. The 77 wins marked their highest win total in a season since 2017 when the team finished 79-63 under Andy Barkett. The Indians led the International League with a .271 batting average (1336-for-4933) across 147 games, which was their first time pacing the league in that category since 2018 (.271). Indianapolis was also one of the league's most dangerous offensive teams during the final month of the season after leading the circuit during the month of September in batting (.308), runs scored (140), hits (213), total bases (344), triples (6), RBI (132), on-base percentage (.393), slugging percentage (.497) and OPS (.890).

Nick Yorke sparked the lineup upon his arrival to the Pirates organization through a trade with the Red Sox organization. Yorke, who was rated by MLB Pipeline as Boston's No. 6 prospect at the time he was acquired, reached base safely in 33 of his 40 games with Indianapolis while also earning post-season International League All-Star accolades. Between his time with Indianapolis and Worcester, Yorke ranked among International League qualifiers in batting average (first, .333), hits (first, 99), runs (second, 58), on-base percentage (third, .420), doubles (third, 25), total bases (fifth, 148), OPS (sixth, .918) and extra-base hits (tied for sixth, 33) from June 5 through September 15. He also ranked second in wRC+ (143) among International League hitters with at least 300 plate appearances.

Billy Cook joined Indianapolis in early August after being acquired from the Orioles organization at the trade deadline. Cook hit .278 overall for the season in 100 games between Norfolk and Indianapolis while his .862 OPS ranked ninth overall in the International League.

Ji Hwan Bae spent a majority of the season with Indianapolis while also having multiple stints with the Pirates. Among International League hitters with at least 250 plate appearances, the 25-year-old Bae ranked first in batting average (.341), third in on-base percentage (.433), fifth in wRC+ (147) and seventh in OPS (.937).

Nick Gonzales began the season with Indianapolis before being promoted to Pittsburgh in early May. At the time he joined Pittsburgh May 10, Gonzales was first in runs scored (33), first in doubles (14), tied for first in hits (43), second in batting average (.358, trailing teammate **Jake Lamb**), tied for third in extra base hits (20), tied for fourth in total bases (73), sixth in OPS (1.039) and seventh in slugging percentage (.608) in the International League.

Matt Gorski spent the entire year with Indianapolis while sharing the organizational lead in home runs with 23 along with **Shawn Ross**. Gorski also ranked tied for sixth in the International League in home runs, fourth in slugging and tied for fifth in extra base hits (52).

Liover Peguero led all Pirates minor leaguers with 79 RBI, 127 hits and 29 doubles while also receiving two separate promotions to Pittsburgh and being named Indianapolis' team MVP. In addition to leading the organization, Peguero's 79 RBI were also tied for the sixth-most in the International League.

Henry Davis spent a total of 57 games with Indianapolis where he hit .307 with a .956 OPS. During the month of July, Davis finished tied for ninth in the International League with a .359 batting average.

Jack Suwinski also ended the season on a high note with Indianapolis after hitting .310 (31-for-100) with a .930 OPS in his final 25 games.

2024 INDIANAPOLIS INDIANS PITCHERS

Indianapolis began and ended its season with the No. 1 prospect in the Pirates organization as a member of the team's starting rotation while racking up a franchise-high 1,348 strikeouts.

Paul Skenes dominated at the Triple-A level before making his big league debut in mid-May. During his time with the Indians, Skenes allowed a run just twice in his seven starts. At the time of his promotion to Pittsburgh, his 45 strikeouts were also the fourth-most among all International League pitchers.

Bubba Chandler headlined Indianapolis' starting rotation at the conclusion of the season while emerging as the organization's No. 1 prospect. Chandler, who finished first among all Pirates prospects with 148 strikeouts, ranked first among all International League pitchers in ERA (1.83) and strikeouts (54) from the time of his Triple-A debut on August 9 through the end of the regular season.

Thomas Harrington ended his season riding a five-game winning streak after spending a majority of the year at Altoona. Harrington lost his only decision with Indianapolis on August 10 after allowing two runs in 4.2 innings at Nashville. Beginning with his next outing on August 17 through the end of the season, Harrington's five wins were tied for the most among all pitchers in MiLB while his 2.52 ERA ranked fifth among all pitchers in the International League.

Mike Burrows made 10 appearances, including nine starts, with Indianapolis while making his way back from "Tommy John" surgery. Burrows was then promoted to the big leagues on September 28. In his final outing with Indianapolis on September 22, Burrows struck out a career-high tying 10 batters while earning the win against St Paul.

Braxton Ashcraft finished his 2024 campaign by posting an 0.47 ERA in five appearances (four starts) with Indianapolis. Between his time at Altoona and Indianapolis, the 24-year-old Ashcraft recorded a 2.84 ERA (73.0ip/23er) in 16 appearances (14 starts).

Eddy Yean made two scoreless appearances with Indianapolis to close out his season that had him post a 3.36 ERA (75.0ip/28er) in 48 outings between Double and Triple-A.

Isaac Mattson, who also received a late season promotion to the big leagues, went 4-0 with a 1.83 ERA (34.1ip/7er) in his final 18 appearances with Indianapolis.

2024 ALTOONA CURVE BATTERS

Altoona won 13 of its last 18 games under first-year manager Robby Hammock while going 62-76 overall for the season.

Infielder **Kervin Pichardo** was named Altoona's Most Valuable Player while spending his first season as a member of the Pirates organization. Pichardo, who was acquired on March 30 from the Padres organization, hit .254 on the season while recording the team's longest hitting streak (12 games) and second-longest on-base streak (17 games) in 2024.

Termarr Johnson spent a majority of the season with Greensboro before joining the Curve in late August. Johnson became the third-youngest player to suit up for the Curve in team history when he made his debut at 20 years, two months, and 16 days old on August 27. Johnson went 2-for-29 in his first nine games with Altoona before going on a 9-for-19 (.474) run with a pair of doubles, a home run and five RBI in his final five games.

Nick Cimillo began the year with Greensboro before receiving a promotion to Double-A on July 19. Cimillo, who ranked first among all Pirates minor leaguers with a 1.038 OPS (minimum 150 at-bats), led the South Atlantic League in home runs (17) and was seventh in RBI (48) at the time of his promotion to the Eastern League. Cimillo's time in Altoona was highlighted by a 13-game on-base streak from July 25 to August 11 when he hit .348 with a .933 OPS.

Seth Beer split the season between Altoona and Indianapolis after being acquired in the Minor League Phase of the Rule 5 Draft in December. Beer highlighted his time with the Curve by hitting .326 (14-for-43) during a 12-game on-base streak from May 3-19 before eventually being promoted to Indianapolis in mid-June.

Sammy Siani was named the team's Unsung Hero while spending a majority of the season with Altoona. Siani, who hit a combined .265 between Greensboro and Altoona, finished tied for second in the Eastern League with six triples on the season.

Charles McAdoo hit .269 in his 27 games that he spent with the Curve after dominating the South Atlantic League while playing for Greensboro. McAdoo, who led all Pirates minor leaguers with a .315 average, was then traded to Toronto that helped the Pirates land Isiah Kiner-Falefa.

Tsung-Che Cheng finished tied for the team lead in home runs with 11 along with Kervin Pichardo. Cheng, who entered the season rated by Baseball America as Pittsburgh's No. 7 prospect, finished tied for ninth in the Eastern League in walks (61) while finishing the year with Indianapolis following the conclusion of the Double-A season.

2024 ALTOONA CURVE PITCHERS

Bubba Chandler began the 2024 season rated by MLB Pipeline as the No. 93 prospect in all of baseball. By the time the season ended, Chandler vaulted to 15th overall among the game's top prospects. Chandler spent a majority of the season with Altoona, where he represented the Pirates organization at the All-Star Futures Game while also being tabbed as the organization's minor league player of the year by Baseball America.

Chandler struck out 94 batters in 80.1 innings as a member of the Curve before being promoted to Triple-A on August 8. In his final outing with Altoona, he earned a win while holding Richmond to one run in 7.0 innings on August 2. Prior to that, he became the third pitcher in Curve history to strike out 10 or more batters in consecutive games on June 21 and June 27. The only pitchers to accomplish that prior to Chandler were Tyler Glasnow in 2015 and Roansy Contreras in 2021.

Thomas Harrington joined the Curve in mid-May and made a total of 13 appearances, including 12 starts, at the Double-A level. During the month of July, Harrington took home Eastern League Pitcher of the Month honors. He also became the fourth pitcher in Curve history to record back-to-back games of 10-plus strikeouts after doing so on July 10 and July 20. Harrington ranked first in the Eastern League in ERA (0.70), tied for seventh in strikeouts (32) and tied for fourth in batting average against (.170) during the month of July.

Braxton Ashcraft returned to his first full season of action after having "Tommy John" surgery performed in 2022. Ashcraft began the season with Altoona before being promoted to Indianapolis on June 11. During his final full month with the Curve, Ashcraft went 1-1 with a 1.95 ERA (32.1ip/7er) in six starts during the month of May. Ashcraft's 1.95 ERA during the month of May ranked fifth among all pitchers in the Eastern League while his 39 punchouts paced the circuit.

Hunter Barco made his final two starts of the 2024 campaign with the Curve before having his season end due to injury. Barco struck out five batters while allowing one hit in 3.0 scoreless innings in his Curve debut on July 21 at Somerset. Barco also posted a combined 1.80 ERA (15.0ip/3er) in his final four appearances, including two starts, between Greensboro and Altoona before being placed on the injured list on July 30.

Po-Yu Chen made every turn in the Altoona rotation, finishing the season seventh in Eastern League in ERA and innings pitched. Chen also finished tied for the lead among Pirates minor leaguers in starts while also ranking first in innings pitched and seventh in strikeouts.

Eddy Yean was named Altoona's Fireman of the Year as the team's most reliable arm during the season. The 23-year-old Yean finished second in the Eastern League with 46 appearances. In his final seven appearances with the Curve, Yean posted an 0.82 ERA (11.0ip/1er) while converting three saves.

Jack Carey spent time between Greensboro and Altoona at the beginning of the year before staying with the Curve for the duration of the season beginning on May 5. Carey ended the season with eight saves, which were tied for the fifth-most in the Eastern League.

2024 GREENSBORO GRASSHOPPERS BATTERS

Greensboro established itself as one of the best teams in all of High-A in 2024. The Grasshoppers advanced to the postseason after posting a 75-55 record before falling to Hudson Valley in three games during the first round of the South Atlantic League playoffs.

Offensively, the Grasshoppers led all teams at the High-A level with 175 home runs (the next-closest team was the Asheville Tourists with 154). The Grasshoppers also led all teams at the High-A level with 710 runs scored (the next closest team was the Everett AquaSox of the Northwest League with 695).

Charles McAdoo was the story of the South Atlantic League for much of the season before his promotion to Altoona. McAdoo took home South Atlantic League Most Valuable Player honors despite being promoted to Double-A on June 21. At the time of his promotion, McAdoo ranked first among all South Atlantic League hitters in batting, OBP, OPS (.976), hits, and total bases (125) while also being second in RBI and slugging.

Termarr Johnson, who entered the season rated by MLB Pipeline as the No. 1 prospect in the game among second basemen, began the season in the South Atlantic League. Johnson finished second in the league in walks, third in runs scored and fifth in on-base percentage while also receiving a late-season promotion to Altoona.

One year after being selected by the Pirates in the second round of the draft, **Mitch Jebb** spent his first full professional season with the Grasshoppers. Jebb was hitting .218 through the end of June before becoming one of the top hitters in the league during the remainder of the season. During the final two-plus months of the season, Jebb ranked fifth in the South Atlantic League in batting (.297) and OBP (.383), fourth in hits (57), tied for first in triples (five) and first in runs scored (35) and stolen bases (27).

Jack Brannigan was limited to 77 games due to injury but still finished the season ranked fourth in the South Atlantic League with 18 home runs. Prior to being placed on the injured list on July 27, Brannigan was tied for third in the league with 17 home runs, tied for sixth in RBI (51) and eighth in both OPS (.802) and slugging (.464).

Shawn Ross spent the entire year with the Grasshoppers while leading the South Atlantic League and finishing tied for the most home runs (23) among all Pirates minor leaguers. Ross also ranked sixth in the league in slugging and OPS (.793) and tied for eighth in RBI.

Nick Cimillo spent a majority of the year with Greensboro before moving up to Double A. Cimillo finished tied for fifth in the South Atlantic League in home runs while ranking second among all Pirates minor leaguers with 71 RBI.

2024 GREENSBORO GRASSHOPPERS PITCHERS

Greensboro's pitching staff was led by lefthander **Hunter Barco**. The 23-year-old Barco spent a majority of the season with the Grasshoppers before receiving a mid-July promotion to Altoona. Barco took a 2.55 ERA (42.1ip/12er) after his first 10 starts heading into June. In his final four appearances, including two starts with the Grasshoppers, he then posted a 1.80 ERA (15.ip/3er).

Carlson Reed made a smooth transition from Low-A to Greensboro after being promoted on July 31. Carlson posted an 0.87 ERA in six starts as a member of the Grasshoppers upon his arrival. Reed's 0.87 ERA from the time of his Greensboro debut to the end of the regular season was the lowest among all pitchers at the High-A level. Reed also finished the year tied for the 12th-most strikeouts (130) in all of MiLB among pitchers 21 years old or younger.

Righthander **Patrick Reilly** spent the first four months of the season as a member of the Grasshoppers before being dealt to the Orioles organization for Billy Cook. Reilly recorded a 2.12 ERA (46.2ip/11er) in his final nine starts with Greensboro while finishing fifth among all Pirates farmhands on the season with 108 strikeouts.

Garrett McMillan continued to dominate at High-A after beginning the season with Bradenton. McMillan, who was selected by the Pirates in the 14th round of the 2023 draft, struck out 28 batters in 21.0 innings while recording an 0.43 ERA in seven appearances, including three starts, with Greensboro.

Righthander **Wilber Dotel** finished sixth among all Pirates farmhands with 106 strikeouts while spending the entire season in the South Atlantic League. The 22-year-old Dotel finished tied for the league lead with nine wins while ranking seventh in the league in innings pitched.

Dominic Perachi posted a 2.29 ERA (51.0ip/13er) in his final 10 appearances (nine starts) from the beginning of June through the end of July. Perachi's 2.29 ERA during that time ranked fifth in the South Atlantic League, while his 121 strikeouts for the season ranked third among all Pirates farmhands.

Michael Kennedy ended his season on a strong note with the Grasshoppers after being promoted from Bradenton. Kennedy, who was ranked by MLB Pipeline as Pittsburgh's No. 15 prospect, allowed one run in a combined 10.0 innings in his two starts with Greensboro to end the season.

Luis Peralta dominated out of the bullpen before moving up to Altoona in late June. The 23-year-old southpaw recorded an 0.47 ERA (19.1ip/1er) in his final 13 outings before being promoted to Altoona on June 25. **Mike Walsh**, who began the year with Bradenton, recorded an 0.90 ERA (10.0ip/1er) in his final nine outings of the season. **Cy Nielson** spent a majority of the year with Greensboro before ending the year in Altoona. In his final 11 outings (one start) with the Grasshoppers, Nielson recorded a 2.31 ERA (11.2ip/3er). **Jaden Woods** began the season with Greensboro before being promoted to Altoona in late June. In his final 13 appearances prior to this promotion, Woods recorded an 0.56 ERA (16.0ip/1er) and .164 batting average against. **Alessandro Ercolani**, who spent the entire season with Greensboro, had a 5.09 ERA through the end of June. In his final 11 appearances, including one start, he recorded a 1.25 ERA (36.0ip/5er), 44 strikeouts and .181 batting average against.

2024 BRADENTON MARAUDERS BATTERS

The Marauders posted a 54-77 record for the season, going 29-37 during the first half and 25-40 in the second half. Bradenton's season was highlighted after winning a team-record 11 straight games from May 2-14. The Marauders also paced the Florida State League with 111 home runs, which were also the second-most among all teams at the Low-A level behind Modesto (113).

Esmerlyn Valdez led the Florida State League and all players at the Low-A level with 22 home runs. Valdez' 22 bombs also tied the Marauders record for the most in a single season along with Dylan Busby in 2019. Valdez also finished the season ranked first in the Florida State League in OPS (.816), second in slugging, fourth in RBI and total bases (166) and fifth in OBP.

Axiel Plaz, who began the season in the Florida Complex League, finished fifth in the Florida State League in home runs. Plaz went deep in each of his first two games with the Marauders, while his 15 home runs from May 17 through the end of the regular season were tied for the second-most among all players at the Low-A level.

Omar Alfonso spent a majority of the season with Bradenton before receiving a late-season promotion to High-A. The 21-year-old Alfonso headed into the month of June with a .399 on-base percentage, which ranked third among all Florida State League players.

Jhony Severino, who was rated by MLB Pipeline as Pittsburgh's No. 19 prospect at the end of the season, ended his first full season as a member of the Pirates organization with a strong final month with the Marauders. The 19-year-old infielder hit for the cycle on August 27. He also finished tied for third in the Florida State League in total bases (43), tied for second in extra base hits (12) and seventh in slugging (.489) for the month of August.

Carlos Caro hit a combined .292 (45-for-154) with an .815 OPS in 49 games between the Florida Complex League and Florida State League. The 19-year-old infielder reached base safely in six of his seven games as a member of the Marauders while also hitting .306 during the month of July in the complex league.

Yordany De Los Santos hit a combined .297 (83-for-279) in a total of 82 games between the complex league and Florida State League. The 19-year-old De Los Santos had a strong finish to end his season after going 8-for-27 with a home run and five RBI in his final eight games with the Marauders.

2024 ninth round pick **Duce Gourson** began his professional career in the Florida State League by posting an .830 OPS in his first 10 games before eventually moving up to High-A Greensboro on August 27.

2024 BRADENTON MARAUDERS PITCHERS

Carlson Reed spent the first four months of the season with Bradenton before earning a promotion to Greensboro on July 31. At the time of his promotion to High-A, Reed's 2.43 ERA ranked second among all Florida State League pitchers with at least 75.0 innings of work. In his final two outings with Bradenton, Reed allowed two unearned runs in a total of 9.0 innings.

Michael Kennedy, who ended the season rated as Pittsburgh's No. 15 prospect by MLB Pipeline, spent a majority of the season with Bradenton before moving up to Greensboro in late August. Kennedy ended his final month with the Marauders with the lowest WHIP (0.78) and third-lowest ERA (2.33) in the Florida State League in July.

2023 Competitive Balance B round selection **Zander Mueth** finished his first full professional season by making seven starts with the Marauders. In his final three outings, Mueth posted a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) while recording an .056 batting average against (2-for-36) and 0.83 WHIP.

Carlos Jimenez went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA (51.0ip/15er) in his last 14 appearances, including six starts, with Bradenton before moving up to Greensboro. The 22-year-old Jimenez ended up with a combined 3.33 ERA (75.2ip/28er) and 92 strikeouts in 26 appearances (11 starts) between the two stops.

Connor Wietgreffe began his first professional season with the Marauders after being selected by the Pirates in the seventh round of the draft earlier in the summer. The 22-year-old southpaw was charged with just one earned run in 10.0 innings in five appearances, including four starts, after making his debut on August 13.

Righthander **Khristian Curtis**, who was selected in the 12th round of the 2023 draft, had a strong finish to his first professional season after posting a 3.14 ERA (43.0ip/15er) in his final 10 outings (eight starts).

Magdiel Cotto posted a 2.63 ERA in his 31 appearances out of the bullpen, which was the fifth-lowest ERA in the Florida State League among relief pitchers with at least 48.0 innings. **Inmer Lobo** posted a 1.54 ERA (23.1ip/4er), .141 batting average against and 0.94 WHIP in his final nine outings with the Marauders. Between the Florida Complex League and his time with the Marauders, Lobo went 4-0 with a 1.75 ERA (46.1ip/9er) in 27 relief appearances. **Yoldin De La Paz**, who began the season with Bradenton, posted an 0.69 ERA (13.0ip/1er) in his final six outings with the Marauders before being promoted to Greensboro on May 28. **Mike Walsh** posted an 0.71 ERA (12.2ip/1er) in seven appearances in July before being promoted to Greensboro at the end of the month. 2023 14th round pick **Garrett McMillan** began the year with the Marauders before moving up to Greensboro after putting together a strong season in the Florida State League. After posting a 5.19 ERA (8.2ip/5er) during the first month of the season, McMillan recorded a 2.43 ERA (40.2ip/11er) in his final 21 appearances (one start) before being promoted to Greensboro on August 6.

2024 FCL PIRATES HITTING

The Florida Complex League Pirates ended the regular season riding a seven-game winning streak while finishing with the third-best record (36-23) in the league. The team then beat the FCL Yankees in a one-game semifinal before being swept in a best-of-three series against the FCL Tigers in the championship round.

Yordany De Los Santos set the tone for a strong campaign during the first month of the season after leading the league with a .406 average (28-for-69) during the month of May. The 19-year-old ended the season ranked third among all Florida Complex League hitters in batting, fifth in RBI, eighth in slugging and OPS, first in hits, and tied for second in total bases (97). De Los Santos was then promoted to Low-A Bradenton on July 30 for the remainder of the season.

Jhonny Severino spent his first full season as a member of the Pirates organization and emerged as one of the league's top power-hitting prospects. The 19-year-old infielder finished tied for the Florida Complex League lead with 10 home runs while also ranking second in RBI and extra base hits (25), fourth in slugging, sixth in OPS and tied for sixth in hits. Severino's 103 total bases also paced all Florida Complex League players, which was also tied for the fifth-most among all teams at the rookie level.

Tony Blanco Jr. hit .305 with an .890 OPS in 30 games prior to having his season cut short due to injury. During his last full month of action, Blanco hit at a .341 clip (15-for-44) with a .976 OPS in 14 games in June.

Catcher **Miguel Sosa** began the year in the complex league before moving up to Bradenton in early July. The 20-year-old Sosa hit .364 in 12 games in May while hitting safely in 11 of his 16 games in June for a .306 average.

2024 FCL PIRATES PITCHING

One year after being selected 67th overall in the draft, **Zander Mueth** took home Florida Complex League Pitcher of the Year honors during his first professional season.

Mueth, who is currently rated by MLB Pipeline as Pittsburgh's No. 12 prospect, won each of his last six decisions to end the regular season before receiving a promotion to Bradenton. During his six-game winning streak, Mueth recorded an 0.60 ERA (30.0ip/2er), 33 strikeouts, a .183 batting average against and 0.97 WHIP in six starts. The 19-year-old Mueth ended the season with a league-leading 1.58 ERA, tied for the league lead with six wins, and ranked second in both batting average against (.206) and WHIP (1.27).

Eighteen-year-old **Carlos Castillo** finished second on the team behind Mueth by making nine starts. One year after being named a Dominican Summer League mid-season All-Star during his first professional season, Castillo posted a 2.86 ERA in his 12 outings in the Florida Complex League.

2024 DSL PIRATES GOLD

Pittsburgh's Gold team produced a 32-22 record while finishing 3.0 games behind the front-running DSL Cleveland Goryl team in the North Division. The Gold team sent four players to the league's mid-season All-Star team, while manager Jose Mosquera also served as a coach in the game.

The pitching staff finished the season fifth in the league with a 3.50 ERA and fourth with 517 strikeouts. Individually, **Carlos Aquino** ranked first in the league in ERA and WHIP (0.76), tied for fourth in wins, and fifth in batting average against. The 19-year-old Aquino ended the season by being named as one of the starting pitcher's for the league's end-of-season all-star team. Mid-season all-star **Brandon Polanco** allowed just one earned run in 17.2 innings in his 12 appearances in relief while also recording an .089 batting average against and 0.57 WHIP. **Reinold Navarro** also represented the Gold team on the mid-season all-star team after getting off to a strong start with a 1.84 ERA (14.2ip/3er) and .143 batting average against in his first six appearances (five starts) on the season.

Isaias Dipre, who was named to the mid-season All-Star team, led the way offensively for the Gold team after ranking seventh in the league in slugging and OPS (1.020) and tied for seventh in home runs.

Mid-season All-Star **Edward Florentino** began the season hitting .208 through his first 17 games during the month of June. He went on to hit .290 with a .950 OPS in his final 32 games through the end of the regular season.

The Pirates signed 19 of their 21 selections from the 2024 draft, which included each of their first 16 picks.

The team also signed four of MLB Pipeline's top 100 draft prospects in Konnor Griffin (ninth), Wyatt Sanford (35th), Levi Sterling (58th) and Josh Hartle (70th).

MLB PIPELINE RANKINGS

The Pirates had five players among the game's top 100 prospects in MLB Pipeline's rankings that were released on August 15. Right-handed pitcher Bubba Chandler, who was selected in the third round of the 2021 draft, ranked 38th among MLB Pipeline's top 100 prospects. Konnor Griffin, selected ninth overall in 2024, ranked 51st among Pipeline's top 100 prospects. Termarr Johnson, who was the No. 4 overall selection in 2022, ranked 78th. Braxton Ashcraft ranked 87th while Thomas Harrington was 95th in the latest rankings.
