METSCOLLAGE: The Mets fell to the Phillies, 7-5, yesterday...New York has lost three straight games and four of their last five...The Mets have outscored their opponents 103-80 in 21 games this month...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (7-9)...The Mets head out on their final road trip of the year, a seven-game trip (2-4) to Miami (2-1) and Philadelphia (0-3)... New York is off on Monday before they conclude the 2023 schedule with a six-game home stand against the Marlins (three games) and Phillies (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Drew Smith celebrates his 30th birthday today...We wish him well.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Rumble Ponies will open the Eastern League Championship Series at Mirabito Stadium on today against the Erie SeaWolves... RHP Blade Tidwell is slated to make the start tonight...In 25 starts between Brooklyn and Binghamton, Tidwell went 11-6 with a 3.88 ERA (46 ER/116.0 IP) with 63 walks and 153 punchouts.

BRETT THE MET: Over the last five games, Brett Baty is batting .368 (7-19) with five runs, two home runs, three RBI with a .685 SLG and a 1.053 OPS...Against right-handed pitchers, Baty has posted a .305 OBP this season.

EL JEFF-E: Over the last seven games, Jeff McNeil is batting .414 (12-29) with five runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, two RBI, two walks, one steal with a .452 OBP and a .655 SLG...He has recorded four multi-hit games in that span...McNeil has safely reached base in 16 straight games, which is the third-longest streak of his career...He has posted a .382 OBP in that span...In 50 games since the start of August, Jeff McNeil is batting .310 (62-200) with 31 runs, nine doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 20 RBI, nine walks with five steals, a .350 OBP and a .480 SLG...McNeil has an .914 OPS in 21 games this month, recording 10 extra-base hits.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil recorded his 206th career multi-hit game yesterday... That is the 18th-most in franchise history...Next up is Lee Mazzilli with 207, followed by Kevin McReynolds with 208 multi-hit games as a Met.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .387 (12-31) with six runs, three doubles, one triple, one home run, six RBI, four walks with a .457 OBP and a .645 SLG...He has safely hit in 22 of his last 24 games...Since August 28, Nimmo is batting .333 (34-102) with 16 runs, nine doubles, two triples, six home runs, 15 RBI, nine walks with a .393 OBP and a .637 SLG.

HEAR, YEAR: Nimmo has recorded 158 hits, 29 doubles, six triples and played in 149 games...He is one hit, double and triple away from tying his career-best numbers which he accomplished last season...Nimmo played in a career-best 151 games in 2022...He has socked a career-best 24 home runs this season and recorded a career-high 66 RBI in 2023.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga's 12 wins are tied for the most in franchise history by a Japanese born player...Masato Yoshii also had 12 in 1999...He is 12-7 with a 2.96 ERA (53 ER/161.1 IP) with 74 walks and 194 strikeouts in 28 starts this season...His 2.96 ERA ranks fourth in the majors and second in the National League...His 2.96 ERA is the seventh-lowest by a Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history (min. 100 innings).

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .294 with 47 runs, 15 doubles, four triples, 11 home runs, 39 RBI, 39 walks with a .375 OBP and a .429 SLG in 77 games on the road this season...This compares to a .247/.346/.452 slashline in 72 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .283/.347/.521 slashline with 56 runs, 23 doubles, two triples, 16 home runs and 26 walks in 80 games on the road in 2023...He has posted a .213/.311/.375 slashline in 73 games at Citi Field...Pete Alonso is slashing .233/.336/.544 with 24 home runs and 54 RBI in 76 road games...He is batting .202/.302/.473 at Citi Field.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: In 17 career games at Citizens Bank Park, Luis Guillorme is a .423 (11-26) hitter with three runs, one double, one triple, three RBI and four walks...Jeff McNeil has hit .323 (50-155) with 17 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, one homer, 11 RBI and 13 walks in 43 games at the yard...Brandon Nimmo has slashed .278/.421/.488 with 28 runs, seven doubles, three triples, seven home runs and 20 RBI in 50 games in Philly.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 95-86 all-time at Citizens Bank Park...The Mets are 18-10 vs. Philly over the last two years.

30-FOR-30: Francisco Lindor has recorded 30 stolen bases and 27 home runs this season...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season...He would join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson (1991, 1989, 1987) and Darryl Strawberry (1987).

DINGERS! The Mets feature eight players who have recorded at least 10 home runs this year...The team record is 10 players with 10 or more home runs, done in 2017...The 2019 team featured nine players, while the 2007 and 2005 teams feature eight players as well...The Mets have socked 204 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The 2023 team became the fifth team in franchise history record 200 or more homers in a year...The team's 204 home runs are the fourth-most in a single season in franchise history...They previous four years with 200 or more homers are: 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his second season with 45 or more home runs, becoming the only player in franchise history to do so...He recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is tied for second in the majors and is tied for second in the National League with 45 home runs... Alonso's 191 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

STEAL THIS ALBUM: The Mets lead the major leagues with a 89.8% success rate in stolen bases this season...The team has stolen 115 bases out of 128 attempts...It's the highest success rate in franchise history...The previous high was 82.3% which was accomplished in 2004.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 28 games, DJ Stewart is batting .300 (30-100) with 18 runs, six doubles, 10 home runs, seven walks, 23 RBI and a 1.035 OPS...In 51 games this year, Stewart is batting .262 (37-141) with 21 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 26 RBI, 14 walks, a .352 OBP and a .553 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969, for the first time in team history, the New York Mets clinched the National League East after defeating the St. Louis Cardinals, 6-0, in front of 54,928 fans at Shea Stadium...Gary Gentry was masterful, hurling a complete game and allowing only four hits, two walks and striking out five...Donn Clendenon hit two homers, while Ed Charles blasted one of his own...It marked the team's sixth straight victory.

 - Has reached the 40-homer mark for the third time in five big league seasons...Only one player (Ralph Kiner) has had more 40-HR seasons through his first five career seasons...Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons.
 - Has 14 home runs and 38 RBI in his last 43 games...Had his fifth multi-homer game of the season on September 3 vs. Seattle.
 - Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 191 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
 - Ranks 10th in franchise history with 495 career RBI...Passed Keith Hernandez (468) on August 16...Passed Kevin McReynolds (456) on August 1.
 - Tied for second in the majors with 45 home runs and ranks second with 115 RBI...Ranks ninth in the NL with a .510 slugging percentage...Tied for 15th in the majors and eighth in the NL with 66 extra-base hits...Tied for 10th in the NL with 276 total bases.
 - Has 32 extra-base hits (12 doubles, a triple, 19 homers), 52 RBI and 35 runs in his last 59 games since July 21...Was 13-95 (.137) with seven XBH and a .547 OPS in his previous 26 games (June 18-July 19).

 - Had a season-high 13-game hitting streak (.367, 18-49) from August 14-28, tied for the second-longest streak of his career...His longest was a 15-game streak from April 29-May 14, 2018 with Cleveland.
