METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Phillies, 7-5, vesterday...New York has lost three straight games and four of their last five...The Mets have outscored their opponents 103-80 in 21 games this month...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (7-9)...The Mets head out on their final road trip of the year, a seven-game trip (2-4) to Miami (2-1) and Philadelphia (0-3)... New York is off on Monday before they conclude the 2023 schedule with a sixgame home stand against the Marlins (three games) and Phillies (three games).

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Rumble Ponies will open the Eastern League Championship Series at Mirabito Stadium on today against the Erie SeaWolves... RHP Blade Tidwell is slated to make the start tonight...In 25 starts between Brooklyn and Binghamton, Tidwell went 11-6 with a 3.88 ERA (46 ER/116.0 IP) with 63 walks and 153 punchouts.

**BRETT THE MET:** Over the last five games, Brett Baty is batting .368 (7-19) with five runs, two home runs, three RBI with a .685 SLG and a 1.053 OPS...Against right-handed pitchers, Baty has posted a .305 OBP this season.

EL JEFF-E: Over the last seven games, Jeff McNeil is batting .414 (12-29) with five runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, two RBI, two walks, one steal with a .452 OBP and a .655 SLG...He has recorded four multi-hit games in that span...McNeil has safely reached base in 16 straight games, which is the thirdlongest streak of his career...He has posted a .382 OBP in that span...In 50 games since the start of August, Jeff McNeil is batting .310 (62-200) with 31 runs, nine doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 20 RBI, nine walks with five steals, a .350 OBP and a .480 SLG...McNeil has an .914 OPS in 21 games this month, recording 10 extra-base hits.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil recorded his 206th carer multi-hit game yesterday That is the 18th-most in franchise history...Next up is Lee Mazzilli with 207, followed by Kevin McReynolds with 208 multi-hit games as a Met.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .387 (12-31) with six runs, three doubles, one triple, one home runs, six RBI, four walks with a .457 OBP and a .645 SLG...He has safely hit in 22 of his last 24 games...Since August 28, Nimmo is batting .333 (34-102) with 16 runs, nine doubles, two triples, six home runs, 15 RBI, nine walks with a .393 OBP and a .637 SLG.

**HEAR, YEAR:** Nimmo has recorded 158 hits, 29 doubles, six triples and played in 149 games...He is one hit, double and triple away from tying his career-best numbers which he accomplished last season...Nimmo played in a career-best 151 games in 2022...He has socked a career-best 24 home runs this season and recorded a career-high 66 RBI in 2023.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga's 12 wins are tied for the most in franchise history by a Japanese born player...Masato Yoshii also had 12 in 1999...He is 12-7 with a 2.96 ERA (53 ER/161.1 IP) with 74 walks and 194 strikeouts in 28 starts this season...His 2.96 ERA ranks fourth in the majors and second in the National League...His 2.96 ERA is the seventh-lowest by a Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history (min. 100 innings).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 6.0 innings against the Miami Marlins at loanDepot park on September 18...Allowed one earned run on four hits and one walk...Fanned six batters in a 2-1 Mets victory.

**FIGHTIN' THE PHILS:** Butto will face the Phillies for the first time this season and the second time in his career...Butto made his major league debut against the Phillies on August 21, 2022 at Citizens Bank Park, during which he allowed seven earned runs on nine hits and two walks while striking out five batters in 4.0 innings.

**BACK IN THE MAJORS:** Since being recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on September 1, Butto has pitched to a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) in three starts... During that span, Butto has 0.98 WHIP and has held opposing batters to a .194 (12-62) average...On September 12 vs. Arizona, Butto earned his first carer major league win and struck out a career-high seven batters.

**SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE:** Butto has made 19 starts in Syracuse this season, pitching to a 3-7 record with a 5.93 ERA (60 ER/91.0 IP)...In his last start on August 27 against the Buffalo Bisons, Butto suffered the loss after throwing 5.0 innings, during which he allowed four earned runs on seven hits and four walks while striking out three batters...Butto's last win came on August 10 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre against the Railriders, during which he tossed 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and one walk while fanning four batters... Butto leads the Syracuse Mets in strikeouts this season with 82.

**DEBUTTO:** RHP José Butto made his season debut on April 16 at Oakland in his last start...He threw 5.0 innings and allowed one run on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts...He did not factor into the decision as the Mets won in 10 innings, 4-3.

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Butto made two starts during the first week of the season for Triple-A Syracuse, going 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) to go along with eight strikeouts and five walks...For his efforts, he was named International League Pitcher of the Week...He also earned the honor during the final week of the 2022 season after throwing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and fanning 11 in a September 21 start at Worcester.

**2022:** He made his major league debut on August 21 last season in a start at Philadelphia...In that start, he threw 4.0 innings and allowed seven runs on nine hits with two walks and five strikeouts...New York came from behind to win, 10-9, thanks to a pair of late-inning home runs by Mark Canha.
