STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their six-game road trip against the Orioles (0-2, one to play) and Tigers (three to play) today in Baltimore...despite dropping seven of their last nine (Aug. 14–pres.), they are tied for the best record in the AL (also BOS) since July 20 at 20–11, a stretch that comes on the heels of losing a season-high five straight (July 12–19)...the club holds a 3.0-game lead in the AL East and has spent 98 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 57 consecutive days in first since June 27...the 98 total days sitting atop the division are the fourth most in MLB behind the Dodgers (144), Braves (142), and Brewers (112)...they have led the AL outright for 96 of those days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), per Stats Perform.

- ✦ The Rays lost the second game of their three-game set in Baltimore, 3-2, in 10 innings...after winning five straight extra-inning games (April 5–May 12), they have lost five of their last six extra-inning contests.
- ✦ The Rays have lost three straight series for the first time since losing their final three sets of the 2025 season (Sept. 19–28).
- ✦ After beginning the season 19-7 against the AL East, they have dropped 13 of their last 18 matchups against the division (July 9–pres.).
- ✦ They have lost eight of their last nine games (June 29, 2025–pres.) at Camden Yards, including six straight (Sept. 25, 2025–pres.)...it is tied for their third-longest losing streak at the ballpark in team history (also: April 29–Aug. 11, 2005)...they last lost seven games or more in a row at the stadium between Sept. 2, 2015–June 26, 2016 (7G)...their longest losing streak at the ballpark in team history was a nine-game losing streak (Aug. 25, 2006–July 26, 2007).
- ✦ Today, they look to avoid being swept for the first time since July 17-19 at BOS (0-4) and for the fifth time this season.
- ✦ The Rays are 2-7 in their last nine games...they have dropped eight contests in a 10-game span once previous this season, going 2-8 from May 24–June 3...only twice in team history have the Rays gone 2-8 or worse over a 10-game span and led the division after the stretch, May 24–June 3, 2026 (2-8) and July 7-20, 2008 (2-8).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated **RHP Manuel Rodríguez** (recovery from right elbow surgery) from the 60-day IL (Feb. 10–Aug. 22) and designated **RHP Chris Roycroft** for assignment.

- ✦ Rodríguez made 31 relief appearances for the Rays in 2025, pitching to a 2.08 ERA (30.1IP 7ER) with 11 holds and a 1.05 WHIP...across 10 rehab appearance with FCL Rays (1G), Class-A Charleston (1G), and Triple-A Durham (8G), he went 2-0 with 14 strikeouts and allowing no earned runs in six of the 10 outings...his last major league appearance came on June 9, 2025 at BOS.

PLAYERS' WEEKEND—This weekend's series coincides with 2026 MLB Players' Weekend, a weekend which allows players the opportunity to showcase the people, passions, and causes that make them who they are on and off the field...after originally taking place from 2017-19 and being re-imagined in 2024, this sixth edition of Players' Weekend bring personal stories and self-expression to life through custom bats and cleats, and a wide breadth of storytelling...each day of the weekend has its own unique theme, with Friday's being "Off-Field Interests," showcasing players' passions and interests beyond baseball...yesterday's theme was "Causes," focusing on charitable and community efforts that are important to players...today's "Appreciation" theme celebrates the people who helped them on their paths to the major leagues.

- ✦ This series (0-2) marks the first time in team history the Rays have not won or split their series corresponding with the event...Aug. 25-27, 2017 at STL (2-1); Aug. 24-26, 2018 vs. BOS (3-0); Aug. 22-25, 2019 at BAL (2-2); Aug. 16-18, 2024 vs. AZ (3-0); and Aug. 15-17, 2025 at SF (2-1).

TAGGED, YOU'RE IT—Over their last 12 games (Aug. 10–pres.), the Rays staff has pitched to a 5.58 ERA (108.0IP, 67ER) with a .285 opp. average and an .821 opp. OPS...over that span, their 5.58 ERA is fourth highest in the majors to the Mariners (6.42), Athletics (6.25), and Rockies (6.06)...opposing hitters have tallied 123 hits and 22 home runs over that span, it is the 27th time in team history they have allowed as many hits and home runs in any 12-game span (last: May 22–June 5, 2026; 123H, 22HR)...it is the sixth pitching staff in team history to turn the trick at least once in a season (also: 2023, 2013, 2005, 2002, 2000)...they have yielded a home run in each game over this stretch, the 12th time in franchise history they have allowed a home run in 12 straight games or more (last: 12G, June 14-26, 2024)...if they permit a long ball today, it would mark the seventh time in franchise history they have allowed a blast in 13 straight (last: 13G, April 17–May 1[G2], 2019).

- ✦ During this 12-game run, Rays starting pitchers have a 5.34 ERA (60.2IP, 36ER) with just four outings going into the 6th inning and only two quality starts...over that span, they have received two runs of support or fewer in eight of the 12 games.
- ✦ On the season, the Rays have allowed 166 home runs accounting for 249 of their 542 runs allowed this season...their 45.9 pct. of runs allowed coming via the long ball is the second highest in the majors behind the Cubs (54.9%)...it is the fourth-highest clip in team history behind 2024 (48.0%), 2020 (46.3%), and 2016 (46.1%)...slightly ahead of 2025 (45.7%)...over the past three seasons (2024–pres.), only the Cubs (48.8%) have a higher percentage of runs allowed via home run than the Rays (46.6%)...despite the high percentage, of the 166 homers they have allowed this season, 64 have come with runners on base and, of those 64, only 16 have come with multiple runners on.
- ✦ This season, 21 of the 166 home runs they have allowed have come against the Orioles...if they permit a long ball today, it would mark their most home runs they have allowed to the Orioles since 2018 when they allowed 34 long balls, their most against any opponent during a single season in franchise history.

RISPY BUSINESS—This season, the Rays pace the majors with a .281 (303-for-1,080) average with runners in scoring position...it marks the third-highest average with RISP in a single season in team history behind 2005 (.285) and 2023 (.285; decimal points behind 2005)...despite the 2-7 stretch in their last nine games (Aug. 14–pres.), they are slashing .297/.341/.432 (22-for-74) with RISP over that span and have a strikeout rate of 14.5 pct...over that timeframe, their .297 average is the fourth best in the AL to the Angels (.313), Royals (.306), and Mariners (.304) and eighth best in the majors...their 14.5 pct. strikeout rate over that stretch is the second lowest in the majors behind the Phillies (11.0%).

RED LIGHT, GREEN LIGHT—In 19 games this month, **Chandler Simpson** paces the majors with 31 hits and eight stolen bases, trailing only **KC Jac Caglianone** (.403) in batting average (.392/.31-for-79)...the speedster has hit safely in 18 of the 19 games, including a season-best, 13-game hitting streak (Aug. 8–pres.) that is the second longest of his career, five games shy of his career-best, 18-game hitting streak between June 25–July 19, 2025...if he were to hit safely today, he would become the fourth Ray to have multiple streaks of 14 games or more in their career with the franchise, joining **Yandy Diaz** (3x), **Ben Zobrist** (2x), and **Aubrey Huff** (2x)...across his last 52 games (June 19–pres.), he is batting .370 (.74-for-200) with 9 2B, 2 3B, and 21 SB...over that span, he has nearly three times more multi-hit games (23) than games without a hit (8).

- ✦ He extended his hitting streak with an infield single last night, his 52nd infield hit of the year, according to Baseball Savant...it is the sixth most in a single season in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...he is five behind SEA **Ichiro Suzuki**'s 57 infield hits in 2008 for fifth most and 13 behind Suzuki's record of 65 infield hits in a single season set in 2010.
- ✦ Thirteen of his 52 infield hits have come from bunt hits, one fewer than **Jason Tyner's** (2001) franchise record of 14 for most bunt hits in a campaign.
- ✦ Simpson has stolen 79 bases in his career (44 in 2025; 35 in 2026), becoming one of 15 players in the modern era (since 1900) to swipe as many within their first two big-league seasons...he is one of 10 players in that timeframe to register 35 stolen bases or more in each of his first two major league seasons...only CAL **Chad Curtis** (1992-93), MON **Delino DeShields** (1990-91), STL **Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and NYY **Bert Daniels** (1910-11) have ever reached 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns in the modern era.

BIRDLAND—The Rays conclude their season series against the Orioles today and a stretch of seven games against the club in a 10-day span (Aug. 14-23)...the Rays have dropped the season set to the Orioles for the fourth straight season (2023–pres.) after winning six straight from 2017-22...since the start of 2023, the Rays have gone 3-10-3 in series play vs. Baltimore.

- ✦ In nine games against the Orioles this season, **Ryan Vilade** has slashed .455/.552/.864 (10-for-22), with nearly half of his hits going for extra bases (2B, 3B, 2HR), while adding 7 RBI...he homered in back-to-back games against the Orioles (Aug. 16-17)...he has registered his career-high of three hits five times in his career, with two of the five efforts coming against the Orioles (May 18 vs. BAL & Aug. 16 vs. BAL).
- ✦ **Yandy Diaz** has hit .372 (16-for-43) this season against the Orioles with 4 2B, 2 HR, and 7 RBI...dating back to Sept. 7, 2024, he has hit safely in 21 of 24 games against the club and reached base safely in 22 of 24...12 of those 24 games have been multi-hit efforts.

ENGINE SWAP—The Rays begin a three-game set in Detroit tomorrow...the Rays were swept in their home series against the Tigers this season (June 1-3)...with a sweep of their own, they can tie the season series for the second straight year (3-3 in 2025)...the Rays lost the season set in 2024 (1-5), which came on the heels of five season series wins in a six-season span from 2017-23 (clubs did not meet in 2020)...since winning nine of 10 against the Tigers between May 17, 2022–Aug. 4, 2023, the Rays have gone 5-12 against the club, including 1-6 in their last seven (June 22, 2025–pres.)...they have lost back-to-back sets at Comerica Park (2024–pres.) since taking two of three in 2023 and three of four in 2022.

TODAY'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 25th start of the season and 12th on the road...marks his 154th career start (305th appearance) and fourth start (sixth appearance) opposite the Orioles...ranks second in the AL in winning pct. (.750) to BOS **Sonny Gray** (.842/16-3), is tied for third in wins (career-high 12), and owns the fifth-best ERA (3.05)...the Rays are 18-6 in his starts, including 9-2 on the road...has yielded three runs or fewer in 19 of 24 starts (T3rd in AL/T9th in MLB) and two runs or fewer in 17 of 24 (T3rd in AL/T8th in MLB)...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- His 2.61 ERA (41.1IP, 12ER) in day games ranks fifth among AL qualifiers...half (6) of his 12 runs allowed in daytime affairs came on June 3 vs. DET—he has a 1.45 ERA (37.1IP, 6ER) in his other six day starts.
- Today, he is set to become the fourth Rays pitcher to make 25 starts in an age 35-or-older season (age as of June 30), joining **Corey Kluber** (31) in 2022, **Charlie Morton** (33) in 2019, and **Bobby Witt** (32) in 1999.

LAST TIME OUT—Took his second loss in as many home starts in a 10-5 setback on Aug. 18 vs. TOR (3.2IP, 9H, 6ER, 2BB, 5SO), matching season highs in hits (3x, last: June 3 vs. DET) and runs (3x, last: July 31 vs. CWS)...allowed a pair of runs in the opening frame on three straight hits, all with two outs...stranded a runner in scoring position in the 2nd before the Rays fell behind in the 3rd after he allowed a walk followed by a two-run homer to **Alejandro Kirk**...was chased with two outs in the 4th following a six-pitch walk, which came on the heels of a two-out RBI-single and a run-scoring wild pitch.

- It marked his shortest start since Aug. 15, 2025 vs. MIL (2.2IP) and was his first time throwing 80 pitches or more (82) while failing to complete 4.0 IP since July 4, 2017 vs. BOS (3.2IP, 80 pitches) as a member of the Rangers.
- He permitted a season-high four two-out hits in the loss, his most since Aug. 15, 2025 vs. MIL (5), and yielded 3 RBI...opponents batted .196 (9-for-46) with 5 RBI in two-out situations across his previous seven outings (July 3–Aug. 11).
- His leadoff walk to **Nathan Lukes** in the 3rd frame snapped a career-high streak of four straight starts/130 BF without issuing a free pass.

BIRDLAND—Martinez is set for his fourth career start/sixth appearance against the Orioles, including his third start/appearance at Camden Yards...he hasn't pitched against the club since a 2.0-IP, home relief outing on May 4, 2024 with the Reds...Martinez has taken the loss and yielded multiple home runs in each of his previous three starts against the Orioles, all coming from 2014-15 with Texas, despite working a quality start in his last such outing on July 1, 2015 in Baltimore (6.2IP, 7H, 4R-3ER, BB, 5SO, 2HR)...Baltimore is the only AL team Martinez has yet to earn a win against in his career and one of five franchises overall (also: MIL, PHI, TEX, WSH).

- He has turned in a 4-1 record and 3.32 ERA (38.0IP, 14ER) in seven starts opposite AL East foes this season, with the Rays winning each of his first six such outings before his last start on Aug. 18 vs. TOR...the Rays have won each of his three road starts against divisional opponents, with Martinez going 2-0 with a 1.53 ERA (17.2IP, 3ER) in those outings despite allowing opponents to bat .310 (22-for-71), due in part to a .176 (3-for-17) clip with RISP.

ROAD TRIPPIN'—Martinez's 2.14 ERA (67.1IP, 16ER) as a visitor ranks third in the AL behind Cy Young frontrunners NYY **Cam Schlitler** (1.14) and TOR **Dylan Cease** (1.67) and is sixth best in the majors...he is on pace to surpass **Blake Snell's** franchise-record 2.45 road ERA (95.2IP, 26ER) from 2018...the right-hander has produced a 1.80 ERA (45.0IP, 9ER) when pitching on the road in AL ballparks (7GS).

- He has earned the win in each of his last three road starts, tying the longest streak of his career (also: July 2–Aug. 9, 2025) while matching **Drew Rasmussen** (July 21–pres.) for the longest streak by a Ray this season.
- Today, he looks to become the third Tampa Bay hurler since the start of 2020 to record wins in four straight road starts...he would join **Zack Littell** (4GS, April 27–May 31, 2025) and **Shane McClanahan** (4GS, April 5–May 8, 2023).

ICANGO THE DISTANCE—On Aug. 11 at ATH, Martinez recorded his first career 9.0-inning complete game, the third by a Ray since the start of 2017 along with **Zack Littell** on May 31, 2025 at HOU and **Ryan Yarbrough** on June 3, 2021 at NYY... he became oldest pitcher in franchise history to record a 9.0-inning complete game and one of five pitchers since the start of 2020 to do so after turning 36 (9x), joining AZ **Merrill Kelly** (May 15, 2026 at COL), STL **Adam Wainwright** (5x, last: Aug. 13, 2022 vs. MIL), HOU **Zack Greinke** (June 4, 2021 at TOR), and WSH **Max Scherzer** (May 2, 2021 vs. MIA)...he became the eighth pitcher in franchise history (15x) to toss a 9.0-inning complete game on 101 pitches or fewer and the first since **Chris Archer** on Aug. 20, 2015 at HOU (98 pitches).

- He was the first pitcher in the majors to toss a 9.0-inning complete game while allowing four earned runs or more since KC **Jordan Lyles** on May 9, 2023 vs. CWS and the first to turn the trick and earn the win since MIN **Bartolo Colon** on Aug. 4, 2017 vs. TEX...Martinez is the 10th pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to earn the win in a 9.0-inning complete game while throwing 101 pitches or fewer and allowing four earned runs or more.
- It marked his second career complete game overall, joining an 8.0-inning effort in a 1-0 loss on Sept. 27, 2024 at CHC as a member of the Reds.

AGE IS BUT A NUMBER—Martínez has a chance to become the fifth AL pitcher (6x) in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to make 30 starts or more and record a sub-3.00 ERA in an age-35-or-older campaign (age as of June 30)...he would join TEX **Jacob deGrom** (30GS/2.97 ERA, 2025), HOU **Justin Verlander** (2018-19), OAK **Bartolo Colon** (30/2.65, 2013), and TOR **Roger Clemens** (33/2.65, 1998)...the right-hander's 12 wins are second most in franchise history during such a season behind **Corey Kluber** (16) in 2022 (age 35), and his 141.2 IP are fourth most, trailing **Charlie Morton** (2019, 194.2IP), **Bobby Witt** (180.1IP, 1999), and Kluber (180.1IP, 2022).
