METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Dodgers, 2-1, last night...New York will play 11 of their next 17 games at home...The Mets are 66-13 when scoring first this season...New York is now 29-8-3 in 40 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-day, 10-game homestand (4-2), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (3-1), Dodgers (1-1) and Nationals (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets have recalled RHP Adonis Medina (#68) and selected the contract of INF Deven Marrero (#15) from Triple-A Syracuse as the active roster expands to 28 players...Medina has appeared in 14 games (two starts) at Triple-A Syracuse going 1-0 with a 3.71 ERA (11 earned runs/26.2 innings) with 15 walks and 25 strikeouts...The righty has made 13 appearances with the Mets and is 1-0 with save, a 4.63 ERA (12 earned runs/23.1 innings) with five walks and 17 strikeouts...Marrero, 32, will make his second stint with the Mets this season...He has appeared in 36 games with Syracuse this season, hitting .217 (26-120) with a .309 OBP...In addition, RHP Connor Grey has been designated for assignment.

DANCING IN SEPTEMBER: New York has posted a 3.51 ERA as a team this year. That is the fifth-lowest mark in the majors and second-lowest in the National League...The team's 3.51 ERA heading into September is the lowest mark since 2015, when they team owned a 3.30 mark.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!: With anticipated high attendance figures this week due to the U.S. Open, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

RUBBERBAND MAN: The Mets are 14-3 in rubber games this season...According to Elias, that's the best winning percentage (.824) in such games this season... Today's rubber game will also decide the season series between the Mets and Dodgers.

SERIES-LY: The Mets are seeking their first series win against the Dodgers since September 3-5, 2011...It would be their first series win at home over LA since May 6-8, 2011.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 142 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: Through 13 starts at Citi Field this season, Chris Bassitt is 4-5 with a 2.75 ERA (26 ER/85.0 IP), 82 strikeouts and 18 walks...In his last eight starts at home, Bassitt owns a 2.00 ERA (12 ER/54.0 IP) with 51 strikeouts and 10 walks...In 62 career home games (56 starts), he is 17-19 with a 2.62 ERA (105 ER/360.2 IP), 338 punchouts and 89 walks...His 2.62 career ERA at home is the fourth-best home ERA among active pitchers (min. 50 starts) behind Jacob deGrom (2.07), and Clayton Kershaw (2.22) and Walker Buehler (2.62 ERA).

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 100 strikeouts...That is 16 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 52.1 innings...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K alltime...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.57 ERA (two earned runs/31.2 innings) with 15 hits, six walks and 62 strikeouts in 31 appearances since the start of June.

I SPEAK IT EVERY DAY: Díaz has only two runs in his last 33 outings dating back to June 22...He is 2-0 with 19 saves with a 0.53 ERA (two earned runs/33.2 innings) in that span, allowing 16 hits, seven walks and striking out 66...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is tied for fourth in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

MARTE PARTY: Starling Marte has homered in back-to-back games...He is 18-54 (.333) with nine runs, four doubles, a triple, four home runs, 11 RBI, three walks, three steals with a .400 OBP and a .667 SLG over his last 14 games...He is batting .307 (67-218) with 39 runs, 12 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 31 RBI, 12 walks with a .357 OBP, a .537 SLG and a .894 OPS in 57 games at home...This compares to a .279/.336/.416 slashline with a .752 OPS in 56 road contests.

DAY TRIPPER: The Mets have won 12 of their last 15 games in the sunshine... Overall, New York is 33-16 in day games this season...The team's .673 winning percentage in the sunlight is the third-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.02 ERA with 127 walks and 477 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.03 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and

AUGUSTUS BLOOM: The Mets finished August going 19-11...Their 19 wins are tied with May for the most wins in any month this year...Their 19 wins in August were the third-most in the majors...The team's 19 wins were the most since they recorded 20 in 2015...Jeff McNeil recorded 42 hits last month, which were tied for most in the majors...His 42 hits were the most in a calendar month for his career, passing his previous high set in June, 2019...Additionally, his 42 hits in August were tied for third-most in Mets history...Edgardo Alfonzo in 1998 and Keith Hernandez in 1986 also recorded 42 hits in August.

DODGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped the season series to the Dodgers in each of the last five seasons...The Mets are 2-14 against the Dodgers in their last 16 games at Citi Field.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won 12 of their last 15 games at home...Overall, the Mets are 44-21 at Citi Field...They are fourth in the majors and second in National League with a .677 winning percentage at home...The team's .677 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.03 ERA with 182 walks and 639 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 639 at home this year...That is already the 11th most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,235 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,245 have struck out more...The team's 1,235 strikeouts are already the ninth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019... Mets pitchers are averaging 9.54 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.6 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in

1010 WINS: The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the tied for the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 67 times this year, the most in MLB...Only the 2019 Mets recorded more double-digit strikeout games with 75...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 990 times this season...That is tied for the fourthfewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

EL JEFF-E: McNeil is tied for third in the majors in batting average this season with a .318 (133-418) mark...He finished August batting .385 (42-109) in August, which is the fourth-best average in the majors...In 29 games last month, he hit .385/.414/.560 with 14 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and four walks...It's his highest average in any month of his career...In 36 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .355 (49-138) with 17 runs, 15 doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, five walks, a .384 OBP and a .529 SLG...His .355 batting average is fourth in the NL.

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a 2.81 ERA (99 earned runs/317.1 innings) in 55 games with 342 strikeouts and 75 walks...The Dodgers are the only team with a better ERA (2.52) in that time frame...New Yorks' 343 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.50 in that span...The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.50 ERA from their starters.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 83 games this season, second-most in the NL and third-most in the majors...Their .634 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 83-48 record through the team's first 131 games...Only the 1986 (88-43) team posted a better record through the first 131 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 25-13 in the second-half...The team's 25 wins are tied for the third-most in the majors and their .658 winning percentage is third overall...The team is batting .269/.338/.433 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and rank fourth in average and SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 175-131 following the break.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 appearances...He has tossed 10.0 innings in that span, allowed seven hits, four walks, struck out 13 and posted a 0.90 ERA (one earned run/10.0 innings)...In 16 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.65 ERA (three earned runs/16.1 innings) with seven walks and 18 strikeouts.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 49.8% of batters faced (100/201), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 52 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.20 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 29 saves, a 1.38 ERA (8 ER/52.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 16 walks...The Mets are 46-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 25 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985)... According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 11 more gamewinning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 11 of the Mets' 24 second-half wins.

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched into the eighth inning for the third time this season (also, August 8, and June 14) going 7.1 innings...Allowed four runs on eight hits, striking out a season-low one batter and walking only one...Bassitt joins Taijuan Walker as the only Met with a start of 7.0 or more innings and one strikeout this season.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: Through 13 starts at Citi Field this season, Bassitt is 4-5 with a 2.75 ERA (26 earned runs/85.0 innings), 82 strikeouts and 18 walks...In his last eight starts at home, Bassitt owns a 2.00 ERA (12 earned runs/54.0 innings) with 51 strikeouts and 10 walks...In 62 career home games (56 starts), he is 17-19 with a 2.62 ERA (105 earned runs/360.2 innings), 338 punchouts and 89 walks...His 2.62 career ERA at home is the fourth-best home ERA among active pitchers (min. 50 starts) behind Jacob deGrom (2.07), and Clayton Kershaw (2.22) and Walker Buehler (2.62 ERA).

ALL I DO IS WIN: Bassitt has won four of his last five decisions...Prior to his last start, Bassitt had won four consecutive starts for the first time in his career allowing only two runs in that span...The last Met to earn a win in four straight starts and allow two runs or fewer was Jacob deGrom (9/21/18 - 4/3/19)...With a win in his start today, Bassitt would tie Carlos Carrasco for the longest win streak by a Mets starter this season with five wins in a six-game span.

2022 SEASON, PART 2: In seven starts since the All-Star Break, Bassitt has pitched to a 2.33 ERA (12 earned runs/46.1 innings) going 4-1, with 35 strikeouts and nine walks...He ranks ninthth in the NL in ERA since the break (Min. 7 GS)...Last year, Bassitt was 2-2 with a 2.75 post-All-Star Break ERA...He fanned 41 batters and walked 10 in eight games.

VS DODGERS: Bassitt has faced the Dodgers twice in his career, once in 2021, and once this season...When the Mets played the Dodgers on June 3 in Los Angeles, Bassitt allowed four runs, three earned, on five hits over 6.0 innings...He struck out eight batters and walked two...Bassitt will face an NL West team for a second consecutive start...Bassitt owns a 6.75 ERA (30 earned runs/40.0 innings) with 11 walks and 42 strikeouts, against the NL West.

ANOTHER ONE: Recorded his seventh start of the season going 7.0 innings or longer after 7.1 innings against the Rockies...His most such starts in a single season is 11 which he accomplished in 2021...It was also his 19th start of at least 6.0 innings, his most such starts in a single season for his career...His nine-game streak going 6.0 innings or more from 6/14 - 8/8 was the longest of his career... Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 14 of his 24 starts, going 6.0 inning or longer in 12 of those 14 starts...His 12 starts of 6.0 innings or longer and six strikeouts is his second-most such starts in a season in his career...His most came in 2021 when he had 14 starts with 6.0+ innings and six+ strikeouts.

NO RUNS FOR YOU: Bassitt has allowed four or fewer runs in 14 of his last 15 games...His 12 consecutive starts allowing four runs or fewer is the longest streak in his career over the span of a single season...Bassitt has allowed three or fewer runs in 10 of his last 12 starts...Prior to his last outing, Bassitt's four-straight starts without allowing more than three runs was tied for his fifth-longest streak in a single season in his career.

DON'T GIVE IN TO PEER PRESSURE: Opponents are 7-41 (.171) with RISP against him since the All-Star break, the second-best mark in MLB (min. 40 batters faced).

LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI: His 139 strikeouts are the 10th-most and his 1.133 WHIP is the sixth-lowest in franchise history among pitchers through their first 24 games as a Met (Min 110.0 IP).

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Bassitt owns a 41.7 strikeout percentage on his four-seamer which is the highest strikeout percentage for any of his pitches...His 41.7 K% is the second-highest percentage on that pitch in the majors behind only Luis Castillo (min. 100 PA)...His cutter has a 24.2 strikeout percentage which ranks eighth in the NL (min. 50 PA).

CAREER YEAR: Tied a career-high set in 2021, with three starts this season going 7.0 innings or longer without allowing an earned run...Those three games are tied with teammate Max Scherzer for the second-most such games this season...The only pitcher on the Mets staff with more such games is Taijuan Walker who has done it four times.
