**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners play the first game of a 3-game series tonight at the Detroit Tigers... following the current series, Seattle will continue the 10-game road trip at the Baltimore Orioles (4 G, June 8-11) and at the Washington Nationals (3 G, June 12-14)...tonight's game against the Tigers will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Shannon Drayer** on the call.

**ODDS & ENDS**...the Mariners had their season-high, 8-game winning streak snapped Wednesday against the Mets...Seattle is 8-1 (.889) since May 25, 11-4 (.733) since May 18, and 16-10 (.615) since May 6.

- **First of All** - The Mariners (33-30) are in first place in the American League West Division, 2.5 games ahead of the second place Athletics (30-32) and Rangers (30-32).
- **Road Lid Lifters** - Seattle owns a 6-3 record in road series openers this season.
- **Connect Four** - The Mariners are 24-9 (.727) when scoring 4+ runs in a game, and 9-21 (.300) when scoring 3-or-fewer runs this season.
- **Happy Birthday!** - Mariners right-hander **Logan Evans** celebrates his 25th birthday today...Evans went 6-5 with a 4.32 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 16 games (15 starts) in his rookie season in 2025.

**SOAR FOR FOUR**...the Mariners have won 3 consecutive series, at the Athletics (3-0), vs. the Diamondbacks (3-0) and vs. the Mets (2-1)...Seattle goes for 4+ consecutive series victories for the first time since winning 6 consecutive series from Sept. 5-25 last season, when they went on a 17-1 run that catapulted them to an AL West Division title.

**PITCHCRAFT**...during the Mariners current 8-1 stretch (5/25-c), the pitching staff has allowed the fewest runs (25) across the big leagues, coming out to under 3 runs-allowed-per-game...Seattle pitchers lead the Majors in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.50) during that time frame (81 SO, 18 BB).

**OFFENSIVE COORDINATORS**...during the Mariners current 8-1 stretch (5/25-c), the offense leads the Majors in slugging percentage (.528) and home runs (22), ranking 5th in batting average (.283), 4th in total bases (168) and 4th in OPS (.858).

**MARINERS.COM/VOTE**...All-Star voting is underway for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...fans can submit up to 5 ballots per day until the conclusion of Phase 1 at 9:00 a.m. PT on June 25...Phase 2, which takes the finalists at each position, will run from June 29-July 2 before the All-Star rosters are announced on July 4 at 4:30 p.m. PT...for more information and to vote, visit [Mariners.com/Vote](http://Mariners.com/Vote).

**RALEIGH SET TO BEGIN REHAB SUNDAY**...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** (right oblique strain) is scheduled to begin a Major League rehab assignment with the High-A Everett AquaSox on Sunday, June 7...from there, he's scheduled to join Triple-A Tacoma starting Tuesday, June 9...fans with a **Mariners.TV** subscription have access to **MiLB.TV** and can watch Raleigh, along with Mariners top prospects like **Kade Anderson**, **Ryan Sloan**, **Lazaro Montes**, and others from across the Mariners top-ranked farm system.

**LAST TIME VS. DETROIT WAS SPECIAL**...this series marks the first time the Mariners and Tigers square off since the 2025 American League Division Series, when Seattle defeated Detroit in a winner-take-all Game 5 at T-Mobile Park...the epic Game 5 went 15 innings and ended on Jorge Polanco's walk-off single off Tommy Kahnle, scoring **J.P. Crawford** in the 3-2 Mariners win...**Luis Castillo** tossed 1.1 scoreless innings in relief and was the winning pitcher in Game 5.

**'PEN NAMES**...the Mariners bullpen has posted a 3.01 ERA (69 ER, 206.1 IP) this season, leading the Major Leagues in bullpen ERA...Seattle relievers also rank 4th in MLB in fielding independent pitching (FIP - 3.44) and 1st in the AL, 4th in fewest walks-per-9 innings (3.18), 2nd in fewest home runs-per-9 innings (0.65) and 1st in inherited runners scored (16.1%).

**COLT CONTINUES TO SWING IT**...over his first 16 career games, **Colt Emerson** is batting .255 (13x51) with 7 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 8 RBI and 5 walks, getting on base at a .333 clip, slugging .549 with an .882 OPS and 150 OPS+...the Mariners are 11-5 (.688) since Colt debuted in the big leagues...the 20-year-old top prospect has 28 total bases across 57 plate appearances.

**J.P.'S POWER SURGE**...**J.P. Crawford** went 3-for-4 with a double and home run Wednesday, hitting his 17th career leadoff home run which are second-most in Mariners history to Hall of Famer Ichiro Suzuki (37)...J.P. has 10 home runs this season, tied for 5th-most among big league shortstops...June 3 is by far the earliest into a season that J.P. has notched his 10th homer, surpassing when he hit his 10th homer of the season in 2023 on Aug. 6 in the team's 112th game of the year...2023 was when Crawford registered a career-high 19 round-trippers.

**MARINERS POST-GAME ALUMNI HOME RUN DERBY SET FOR AUGUST 7**...the Mariners announced the club will hold its first ever Alumni Home Run Derby, with participants including Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki**, Mariners legend **Mike Cameron**, broadcasters **Ryan Rowland-Smith** and **Ryon Healy**, Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**, local radio host **Bucky Jacobsen** and former Mariner **Stefen Romero**...all fans with a ticket to the game on Friday, Aug. 7 will have access to the Alumni Home Run Derby.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...the Mariners are set to face left-hander Framber Valdez tonight...it will mark the 20th time in the regular season that Seattle will see Valdez and the first time they'll see him in a Detroit Tigers uniform, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...the Mariners have fared well against Valdez over the last 4 seasons?...from 2022-25, Valdez posted a 4.76 ERA (36 ER, 68.0 IP) with 30 walks and 67 strikeouts in 12 starts against the Mariners...from 2018-21, Valdez had much better success against Seattle in 7 games (5 starts), posting a 1.21 ERA (5 ER, 37.1 IP) with 18 walks and 38 strikeouts.

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 5

- **1988** - **Harold Reynolds** collected his 8th hit in his last 8 official at bats, breaking the old team record of 7, set by Bruce Bochte (1982) and Phil Bradley (1984).
- **1997** - Seattle shortstop **Alex Rodriguez** becomes only the second Mariners player ever to hit for the cycle in a 14-6 victory at Detroit. A lucky Mariners fan collected a \$1 million prize in a radio promotion due to Rodriguez's feat.
- **2010** - **Ichiro Suzuki** scores his 1,000th career run in the 5th inning in his 1,481st career game. He becomes the third Mariner to reach 1,000 runs with the club (also: Edgar Martinez - 1,219, Ken Griffey Jr. - 1,113).
- **2013** - The Mariners and White Sox were scoreless through 13 innings before both teams each scored 5 runs in the 14th inning. **Kyle Seager** hit a game-tying, 2-out, 2-strike grand slam to tie the game 5-5. The grand slam was the first by a player in extra innings to tie a game, and the 12 runs were the most by any teams after being held scoreless through 9 innings. The Mariners lost the contest 7-5 in 16 innings.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 13th start of the season and his 83rd career start...is also making his 1st start against the Tigers this season and the 3rd of his career.
• Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of California Polytechnic State University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
• Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 starts) for the Mustangs. Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.
• Was selected to the 2025 American League All-Star team for the first time in his career.

LAST TIME OUT...W#5 on May 30 vs. the Diamondbacks, throwing 7.0 scoreless innings with 9 strikeouts while allowing just 2 hits and no walks...he has not allowed an earned run over his last 3 home starts (19.0 IP).

WOOOO...has tossed 7.0+ innings in 4 starts this season (last: 5/30 vs. ARI) which is T-5th most such starts this season (also: 8 others)... has made 6 starts of 7.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer hits allowed, most in MLB since 2025....threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit on April 3 at LAA, his 3rd career start tossing 7.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits...his 3 such starts are tied for the most such games in MLB since 2025 (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD).

ONE-HIT WONDERS...has tossed 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (4/3 at LAA and 5/6 vs. ATL) and in 5 starts since 2025, which leads MLB, ranking ahead of Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD (4 G)...Woo and Emerson Hancock are 2 of 7 pitchers with multiple games of 6.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer hits allowed this season...the Mariners pitching staff has combined for 5 such games this year (also: Luis Castillo), which leads MLB.

QUALITY STUFF...has tossed a quality start in 5 of his 6 home starts and in 8 total starts this season...threw a quality start in 21 of his 30 starts last season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors that season...his 29 quality starts since 2025 are 2nd-most in MLB, trailing only Christopher Sánchez-PHI (31 QS).

MAY WRAPPED...went 4-2 with a 3.03 ERA (12 ER, 35.2 IP), 41 strikeouts and 8 walks while throwing 4 quality starts across 6 starts in May...his 41 strikeouts in May ranked T-7th most in MLB while his 0.87 WHIP during the month was 9th-best in MLB and 4th-best in the American League...in addition, his 41 strikeouts in May were the most he has tossed across starts in a single month across his career (prev: 39 SO in August 2025).

AGAINST THE TIGERS...is making his 3rd career start against the Tigers and his first since Aug. 14, 2024 when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings with 6 strikeouts and just 4 hits allowed at Comerica Park...he has reached the 7th inning and thrown a quality start in both of his 2 prior starts against Detroit.

SHUTTING IT DOWN...has thrown 6.0+ innings without an earned run allowed in 4 starts this season, including each of his last 3 starts at home...is 1-of-6 pitchers with 4+ such starts this season...he has thrown 6.0+ IP without an ER in 9 starts since 2025, 8th-most such starts in MLB across that span.

PLENTY OF PUNCHIES...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 9 strikeouts in 4 starts this season, including his last start on May 30 vs. Arizona...his 4 such starts are tied for most in MLB this season (also: Chase Burns-CIN, Jacob Misiorowski-MIL, Christopher Sánchez-PHI, and Gavin Williams-CLE)...his 10 starts of 6.0+ IP and 9+ strikeouts since 2025 are 3rd-most in MLB.

WATCH ME WHIP...his 0.98 career WHIP is 2nd-best in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing only Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91) and ranks ahead of teammate Logan Gilbert (3rd, 1.00 WHIP)...his 0.978 career WHIP is also the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP), ranking ahead of Gilbert (1.062).

GOING THE DISTANCE...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 9 starts this season and in 53 career starts...his 36 starts of 6.0+ IP since 2025 are most in MLB while his 257.1 IP since 2025 are 3rd-most in MLB.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 14.7 pitches per inning this season, which ranks 6th-best in MLB...is currently averaging 14.8 pitches per inning across his career, T-2nd-fewest P/IP among qualified pitchers since 2023 (min. 400 IP), alongside Tarik Skubal-DET (14.8) and trails Christopher Sánchez-PHI (14.7).

DOMINATING THE ZONE...his 71.3% first pitch strike percentage currently leads the league this season, ranking ahead of teammate Logan Gilbert (2nd, 69.0%)...Woo's 68.4% first pitch strike percentage across his career ranks 3rd-best in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing Miles Mikolas-STL (69.1%) and Tarik Skubal-DET (68.6%).

FEW FREE PASSES...among qualified pitchers since 2025, he ranks 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.32), 3rd in walks-per-nine (1.75), and 3rd in walk percentage (5.0%)...in addition, he has tossed 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks in 9 of his 12 starts this season and in 36 total starts since 2025 which leads MLB across that span.

WOO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.24 career ERA (168 ER, 466.1 IP) is a franchise best mark among Mariners starters (min. 75 GS), ranking ahead of Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...is 17-9 with a 3.00 ERA (88 ER, 264.0 IP), 249 strikeouts and 49 walks allowed across 46 starts pre All-Star Break...among pitchers with 200+ IP in the first half since 2023, he ranks 4th in WHIP (0.951), 4th in opp. OBP (.249), 5th in BB/9 (1.67) and 8th in SO/BB (5.08).
