TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Melody Yount's Cardinals and Game 4 (1-2) of the Reds' longest road trip of the season, an 11-day, 9-game jaunt through the NL Central to Chi's Wrigley Field (1-2), **Busch Stadium** (0-0) and Pit's **PNC Park** (3g) highlighted by off days in **St. Louis** yesterday and in **Pittsburgh** on Monday...is their longest road trip since 7/24-8/11, 2017, when they went 3-7 over 11 days at Cle (0-1), NYY (0-2), Mia (1-3) and Pit (off day, 2-1)...Friday will return to Great American Ball Park for their final homestand of the regular season (3g vs LAD, 3g vs Pit, 4g vs Wsh)...will finish the 2021 championship season on the road at Chi's **Guaranteed Rate Field** (3g) and Pit's **PNC Park** (off day, 3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Redlegs are 9-7 vs StL this season, including a 6-game winning streak from 6/3-7/24...was their longest winning streak vs the Cardinals since a 6-game winning streak from 5/5-5/14, 2003...the Reds went 7-7-3 in their previous 17 series vs StL, including 3-2 in series this season...from 6/3-6/7, the Reds earned their first 4-game sweep in St. Louis since 5/4-5/7, 1990...Joey Votto has 207 apps and 221 career hits vs StL, both the most among active players (221-722, .306)...in the live ball era, his **career .425 OBP vs StL** ranks ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (**Lefty O'Doul** .477, **Ralph Kiner** .424).

 $\underline{\textbf{PIRATES UP NEXT}}.$ Spanning last season and including 3 series wins and 2 series sweeps already this year, the Reds won **13** of the **last 14 games** vs the Pirates, including each of the last 12 games vs Pit at Great American Ball Park...are 16-4 vs Pit over the last 2 seasons, including 9-1 this season...the Reds are 8-19 at PNC Park the last 4 seasons, including an 11-game losing streak spanning 2018-2019 and an 8-game losing streak to begin the 2019 season.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: 2B Jonathan India is trying to become only the third rookie in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage (Cle's **Joe Jackson**, .468 in 1911 & Cin's **Cuckoo Christensen**, .426 in 1926)...India ranks seventh in the National League in on-base percentage (.380; Juan Soto 1st, .452)...in the first inning leads the Major Leagues in on-base percentage (.471) while ranking second in the National League in batting average (.366; C.J. Cron .378)...beginning 5/21 ranks fourth in the Major Leagues in **on-base percentage** (.400) behind **Juan Soto** (.469), **Bryce Harper** (.417) and **Freddie Freeman** (.403)...leads all Major League rookies in on-base percentage, OPS, doubles (tied) and walks. also leads all National League rookies in RBI, hits, extra-base hits, total bases and runs scored...India is trying to become the eighth Reds player and second Reds second baseman to win the BBWAA's Rookie of the Year Award (LF Frank Robinson 1956, 2B Pete Rose 1963, 3B Tommy Helms 1966, C Johnny Bench 1968, RHP Pat Zachry 1976, 3B Chris Sabo 1988, RHP Scott Williamson 1999).

CATCH YOU LATER: Reds catchers Tucker Barnhart and Tyler Stephenson combined have committed just 2 errors, both on catcher's interference on Barnhart (8/20 vs Mia, 8/28 at Mia), in 1,405 total chances and 1,250.2 innings caught...Barnhart has committed just 2 errors since 7/26/19, both catcher's interference calls and both with Mia's Jesús Aguilar batting...the catcher's interference on 8/20 at Cin snapped Barnhart's 161-game errorless streak, the club record

for consecutive errorless apps by a catcher...in his 2-year career, **Stephenson** does not have an error as a catcher...offensively, they combine to lead the Major Leagues at that position in hitting (.287), hits (146) and doubles (35) while ranking third in the majors in on-base percentage (.357) and ninth in slugging percentage (.433)...only twice since 1882 have the Reds finished season using only 2 catchers, in 1959 (Ed Bailey, Dutch Dotterer) and 1979 (Johnny Bench, Vic Correll).

TOP OF THE ORDER: Reds batters in the top 3 spots in the starting lineup combine to lead the Major Leagues in hitting (.291), hits (501), doubles (118) and extra-base hits (209) while leading the National League and ranking second in the majors in slugging percentage (.516) and total bases (888)... are 24-12 (.667) when Jonathan India, Jesse Winker and Nick Castellanos hit first, second and third, respectively, in the starting lineup...that trio last started together in that order on 8/15 at Phi.

INTERNATIONAL TREASURE: Joey Votto has 2,013 career hits, 324 HR and 1,052 career RBI...he is only the second Major League player ever to record in the same season his 2,000th hit, 300th home run and 1,000th RBI...Billy Williams did it in 1971...Votto recorded his 300th HR on 4/30 vs Cubs (2-run off Jake Arrieta), his 1,000th RBI on 6/30 vs SD (solo HR off Joe Musgrove) and his 2,000th hit on 8/16 vs Cubs (single off Michael Rucker)...courtesy @EliasSports.

<u>DOT, DOT.</u>..: The **Brewers' Magic Number** to clinch the **NL Central** is **10**...the Reds are are **10-8** (.556) after off days... are 21-17 (.553) in 1-run games...haven't had a winning record in 1-run games since 2013 (.551, 27-22)...are tied for the National League lead and rank T3rd in the Major Leagues with **36 come**from-behind wins (TB 43, Bos 40, NYY 36, SF 36)...the Reds went 20-20-7 in their previous 47 series, including 10-10-4 at GABP and 10-10-3 on the road.

- Last name rhymes with rally.
- Has established single-season career highs in starts, wins, innings pitched, strikeouts and quality starts (9). Is 4-3, 6.09 in 13 starts at Great American Ball Park (.276baa) and 7-2, 1.90 in 15 starts on the road (.190baa).
- In his last 21 starts on the road beginning 9/18/19 is 8-4, 2.18 (.193baa) and didn't allow more than 3 runs in any of those apps...is the longest active such streak in the Major Leagues, not counting Rays "opener" Ryne Stanek's streak of 66 such starts over the 2018 and 2019 seasons, and the longest ever by a Reds pitcher since 1900...the Reds' previous record for consecutive road starts without allowing more than 3 runs was 16, shared by Fred Toney (1915-1916) and Bruce Berenyi (1982-1983)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Has been the victim of a blown save 7 times...2 other starts, both 4.0-inning stints, also included blown saves...his 9 starts that included at least 1 blown save are the most in the Major Leagues.
- Leads the staff and ranks among the National League leaders in strikeouts (9th) and strikeouts per 9 innings (5th, 10.68).
- From 8/3-8/17 faced 57 consecutive batters over 15.2 innings without issuing a walk.
- In his 2-1 win on 6/16 at Mil tied his career high with 12 strikeouts, the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season...retired his last 12 batters.
- Doesn't turn 27 years old until 9/29 but already has completed 4 Major League seasons...made his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster.

JOEY VOTTO, 1b

- In the fourth inning of Wed's 10-inning, 4-1 loss at Cubs homered to tie the game at 1-1 and snap his season-high 16-game homerless streak...was the 324th HR of his career, tying Frank Robinson for second on the Reds' all-time list (Johnny Bench, 389)...in 7 apps this season at Wrigley Field he hit .391 with 7 HR, 1 shy of the single-season record for an opponent (8hr, Mike Schmidt, 1980), and 11rbi (.464obp, 1.348slg, career-high 1.812ops).
- Beginning 7/20, in his last 46 apps has 18 HR and 45 RBI (1.081ops), including a franchise record 7-game home run streak from 7/24-7/30...his 14 HR from 7/24-8/13 are the most by any Reds batter over any 19-game span.

- Received NL Most Valuable Player Award votes 7 times in the previous 11 seasons, 6 times finished among the Top 10 and 3 times finished among the Top 3...finished first in 2010, sixth in 2011, 14th in 2012, sixth in 2013, third in 2015, seventh in 2016 and in 2017 second by 2 points to Mia's Giancarlo Stanton in the fourth-closest vote ever.
