ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, RHP Drew Smith was placed on the 15-Day Injured List, retroactive to July 25, with a right lat strain...Last night, the Mets acquired outfielder Tyler Naquin [NAY-quinn] and LHP Phillip Diehl [DEAL] from Cincinnati in exchange for minor league RHP José Acuña and minor league outfielder Héctor Rodríguez...RHP R.J. Alvarez was designated for assignment...Naquin will wear #25.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets tonight return to action after an off day in Miami... New York just completed a five-game, six-day homestand (3-2) against the Padres (1-2) and the Yankees (2-0)...The Mets have won three-straight games and are 7-3 in their last 10 games...Tonight, the club begins a six-game trip to Miami (three games) and Washington (three games)...This road trip kicks off a stretch of 27 games in 26 days, a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 47-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 22-6-3 in 31 series this year.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: The Mets have struck out 235 hitters in the seventh month of the year...That ties a franchise record, set last year...The Mets are 14-8 with a .636 winning percentage in July...The team's 14 wins this month ties their mark in July of 2021...The last time the Mets recorded 15 or more wins in the month of July was in 2014, when they went 15-10...The team's 14 wins this month are the third-most in the National League.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: New York's 2.50 team ERA (56 earned runs/201.1 innings) this month is the best mark in the majors...The club's 235 strikeouts in July are second in the majors and the most in the National League...Mets starters have gone 8-5 with 2.29 ERA (33 earned runs/129.2 innings) with 30 walks and 153 strikeouts in 22 games in July...Their 2.29 ERA is the best in The Show, while their 153 strikeouts from starters in July are the second-most in the majors.

STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING DOORS, PLEASE: On Wednesday night, the Mets finished off a two-game sweep of the Yankees...It was their third sweep of the season...Marked their first two-game Subway Series sweep since May 12-13, 2014 at Yankee Stadium and the first one at Citi Field since May 27-28, 2013.

JUST ME AND THE OPEN ROAD: New York is 30-20 on the road this year...The Mets have matched their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .600 road winning percentage is the third-best in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...New York is batting .253/.322/.399 away from Citi Field...Their .253 road average ranks third in the NL.

TAKING OUR TALENTS TO SOUTH BEACH: Pete Alonso has 20 career homers vs. the Marlins, his most against any one opponent, fifth-most among active players and tied for 23rd all-time...David Wright (26) is the only Met with more home runs against Miami...Francisco Lindor has five home runs and 14 RBI in 11 games against Miami this year...Has seven homers and 24 RBI in his last 19 games against the Fish...J.D. Davis owns a lifetime .328/.450/.538 slashline vs. Miami...Davis ranks third in average, fourth in OBP, eighth in SLG and fifth in OPS (.987) vs. the Fish since 2019 (min. 100 PA)...Newly acquired Tyler Naquin is a .395 (17-43) hitter against the Marlins with a .435 OBP and .884 SLG in 13 games.

C-BASS VS. THE MARLINS...WHAT IS THIS, AN AQUARIUM?: Chris Bassitt tonight faces the Marlins for the fourth time in his last six outings...He made three consecutive starts against Miami from June 25-July 13 and threw a quality start each time...Before this stretch, Bassitt never once faced Miami in his career.

HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY: Bassitt has fired a quality start in each of his last six outings...He is 3-3 in that span with a 2.43 ERA...He has a team-high 12 quality starts overall this season...Bassitt has alternated wins and losses in each of his last seven starts.

SUPERNOVA: Starling Marte's walk-off single on Wednesday was the 11th walk-off knock of his career, all of which have come since 2014...No other player in the majors has had more than nine walk-off hits in that span...Marte leads the club and ranks seventh in the NL with a .300 (100-333) average...He has recorded multiple hits in five of his last six games and has 12 multi-hit games over his last 21 games...Marte is batting .381 (32-84) during that span since June 25, the third-highest average in the majors...He is on an eight-game road hitting streak, going 13-34 (.382) with a .447 OBP across games at Miami, Cincinnati and Chicago-NL.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 51-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game...The team's 51 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .911 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors...The Mets have won 19 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 29-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets rank third in the majors with 936 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 753 times this season...That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game seven times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 51 times this year, the most in MLB.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: These two clubs have played exactly 162 games since beginning a four-game series here in Miami on July 29, 2013, nine years ago today...The Mets are 94-68 in that span and have outscored the Fish, 699-583 (+116 run differential) in those games.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded a hit in nine of his last 10 games, going 14-37 (.378/.455/.730) in that period...He is batting .550 (11-20) with five extra-base hits and seven RBI over his last six games...Alonso had a 1.888 OPS on the just-completed homestand, batting .625 (10-16) with three doubles, two home runs, six RBI and five runs without striking out once...He has collected a career-high-tying 10 three-hit games, tied for second in the NL...He owns a .317/.408/.596 slashline in night games this year...His .317 average under the lights ranks sixth in the majors and third in the NL...He is fifth in the majors with 26 home runs and leads MLB with 84 RBI.

POLAREXPRESS: Alonso recently surpassed 1,000 career road plate appearances... Among the over 2,500 players in major league history with at least 1,000 PA on the road, Alonso's .944 OPS away from home ranks 14th, just ahead of Stan Musial (.944) and right behind Mickey Mantle (.958)...Only Mike Trout (.979) and Juan Soto (.970) have better marks among active hitters...Alonso's .585 career road slugging percentage leads active players and is the seventh-best all-time behind six of the top hitters in major league history: Babe Ruth (.681), Lou Gehrig (.644), Ted Williams (.615), Joe DiMaggio (.610), Barry Bonds (.597) and Mark McGwire (.586)... This season, Alonso ranks fourth in the majors with 15 road home runs and is eighth with a .564 SLG in away games.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor is batting .299 (19-64) with a .855 OPS in his last 16 games...He ranks second in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (23)...He is tied for 14th in the NL with 58 runs and is tied for seventh in MLB and fifth in the NL with 67 RBI...He ranks 16th in the majors and 10th in the National League with a 3.5 fWAR.

HIT IT TO THE CHAIRS: The Mets have hit 25 home runs in 22 games this month, already more than the 24 they socked in 25 June games...New York has tallied multiple homers nine times in July, their most multi-homer games in a calendar month since last July, when the club had two or more homers 10 times...This season, the Mets are 20-5 when hitting multiple home runs in a game.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with 12 saves, a 0.41 ERA (one earned run/22.0 innings) with 11 hits, three walks and 47 strikeouts over his last 22 appearances since May 27...27 of his last 36 outs have been recorded via the strikeout, equal to a rate of 20.25 K/9...He has recorded 22 saves this season, which places him fourth in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 81 strikeouts...His 17.93 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 81 of the 157 batters he faced, good for 51.6%...He is 2-1 with 22 saves, a 1.60 ERA (seven earned runs/40.2 innings), allowing 26 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 36-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

PUT IT IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Edwin Díaz has converted 86 saves as a member of the Mets...That moved him into a seventh place tie with Tug McGraw on the team's all-time list...Tuesday vs. the Yankees was his 14th career save of more than 1.0 and the fifth with the Mets...Díaz has struck out 319 batters as a member of the Mets... That is eighth all-time by a Mets reliever.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 65 times this year... The Mets have been hit 299 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is the most in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 66 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 49 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 39 HBP...Brandon Nimmo has tied a franchise record with 50 HBP in his career... Michael Conforto was also plunked 50 times...Pete Alonso is one away from tying the record as well.

FOR STARTERS: Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 1.74 ERA (21 earned runs/108.1 innings) in the team's last 18 games with 123 strikeouts and 27 walks...That is more than a full run better than the next-best club, the Dodgers (2.79)...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.61 in that span...The Mets rank sixth in the majors and third in the National League with a 3.61 ERA from their starters.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 61 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .622 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 61-37 record through the team's first 98 games...Only the 1986 (66-32) team posted a better record through the first 98 games of the season.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Went 7.0 innings for the third time this season...Tied a career-high with 11 strikeouts against the San Diego Padres on July 23 at Citi Field... Allowed a two-run homer to Manny Machado in the sixth inning to make up the Padres only two runs of the game...Did not walk a batter for the third time in four starts.

WELCOME TO MIAMI: Bassitt has won five of his eight road starts this season, going 5-2 with a 4.67 ERA (23 earned runs/44.1 innings)...Across those starts he has struck out 47 batters and walked 14...In his career, Bassitt is 23-13 with a 4.38 road ERA (158 earned runs/324.1 innings) with 295 strikeouts and 122 walks.

I'M FINE. TOTALLY FINE: Bassitt has faced the Marlins in three of his last five games with his last start against them coming on July 8 at Citi Field, where he went 6.1 innings and allowed two runs...Bassitt has eight starts against the NL East, going 4-3 with a 2.50 ERA (14 earned runs/50.1 innings), 50 strikeouts and 10 walks.

I'M BREEZY: Across his eight seasons in the majors, the most quality starts Bassitt has had in a season is 16 in 2021...Currently, Bassitt has 12 quality starts on the season...In his last six starts, Bassitt owns a 2.43 ERA (11 earned runs/40.2 innings).

RIGHTY-TIGHTY: Against right-handed batters Bassitt owns a .209 opponent batting average which ranks third in the NL and ninth in the majors...His .569 OPS and 2.69 ERA against right-handers rank fourth-lowest and seventh-lowest in the NL and eight-lowest and 11th-lowest in the majors (min. 200 batters faced).

I WISH I COULD, BUT I DON'T WANT TO: The right-hander has not walked a batter in three of his last four starts...In his career, he has allowed two or fewer free passes in a four-start span only four other times in his career...The last time he did so was in 2021 from April 24 - May 11.

SEVEN, SEVEN, SEVEN! Bassitt's four starts going 7.0 innings or longer is tied for the second-most he has had in a season in his career...In 2021, Bassitt had a career-high 11 starts where he went 7.0 innings or more in a start.

HOW YOU DOIN'?: Chris Bassitt owns the fourth-lowest exit velocity in the majors (85.6 mph) among qualified starting pitchers...His 85.6 average exit velocity is the lowest of his career.

COULD I *BE* PITCHING ANY BETTER?: Has gone 6.0 innings or longer in 14 of his 18 starts this year, allowing three earned runs or fewer in all but four of his starts...The right-hander has five starts with at least 6.0 innings and three or fewer hits allowed...Ranks tied for ninth in the majors in that category...Bassitt has thrown for 7.0 innings or more in four starts this season...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 13 of his 18 starts...Those 13 games with six or more strikeouts ranks fifth-most in the NL and tied for eighth-most in the majors.

WAPAH! Bassitt's fastball has produced 39 strikeouts this season, which is his most with any pitch...His second-most strikeouts comes on his slider with 24 Ks...His strikeout percentage on his fastball is 44.8 percent (39 Ks in 87 plate appearances).

NEW YORK GROOVE: His 115 strikeouts through 18 games this season are tied for the seventh-most he has had in his career during a 18-game span in a single season...Those 115 strikeouts are the eighth-most in franchise history among starters through their first 18 games as a Met.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (10-4, 4.07 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Faced the San Diego Padres on July 24 at Citi Field...Went 5.0 scoreless innings allowing six hits...Carrasco allowed two walks and struck out only one batter.

100 for 100: Carrasco is one win away from becoming the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone...His 10 wins on the season are tied for sixth in the majors...He has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career.
