THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

D-BACKS INAUGURAL HALL OF FAME INDUCTION CEREMONY: Tomorrow, during a special pregame ceremony, franchise legends Luis Gonzalez and Randy Johnson will become the first inductees into the Arizona Diamondbacks Hall of Fame.

- The Arizona Diamondbacks Hall of Fame was created to honor former players for their significant achievements, talents and contributions to our team, our franchise and our community.
- Two of the franchise's most prominent and iconic players, World Series champions Luis Gonzalez and Randy Johnson, are the inaugural inductees...the most decorated players in franchise history were instrumental in building the organization's foundation both on and off the field, guiding the team's successes, garnering their own individual honors and records while setting the tone for giving back to the community and the fans...their legacies live on through their continued contributions as valued members of the front office.

D-BACKS ACQUIRE A.J. PUK FROM MARLINS: Last night, the D-backs acquired LHP A.J. Puk (PUCK) from the Miami Marlins in exchange for INF Deyvison De Los Santos and OF Andrew Pintar, as well as designated LHP Joe Jacques for assignment.

- In 32 appearances (4 starts) with the Marlins this season, has gone 4-8 with 1 save, a 4.30 ERA ( 21 ER in 44.0 IP), opponent . 218 AVG ( 36 -for165)/. 667 OPS, 23 walks and 45 strikeouts.
- Since the start of June, has gone 4-2 with a 1.52 ERA (4 ER in 23.2 IP), opponent . 148 AVG (12-for-81)/. 410 OPS, a 0.68 WHIP, 4 BB and 30 K .
- Has 14 straight scoreless appearances (16.2 innings) since June 19, including 10 hitless outings, going 4-0 with an opponent .074 AVG (4-for54)/. 197 OPS with 3 walks and 25 strikeouts.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 8-6 in comeback fashion after plating 5 runs in the ninth inning on Wednesday night @ Royals.

- The D-backs combined for 4 homers in the game: Eugenio Suárez (solo), Joc Pederson (solo), Christian Walker (solo) and Ketel Marte (3-run).
- Gabriel Moreno knocked a go-ahead 1-out, 2-run double in the ninth.
Ketel Marte sealed the lead in the ninth with his 3-run homer.

FOR 4 OVER: With a win tonight, the D-backs would move to 4 games over .500 for the first time this season.

SERIES STRONG: The D-backs have 3 straight series wins... they have won or split their last 7 series (6-0-1) and 13 of their last 15 series overall since May 30, going 10-2-3.

BEST STRETCH IN THE MAJORS: Since June 29, the D-backs 14 wins ( 21 games) are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Rangers, Tigers and Mets), ahead of the Astros (13) and Pirates (13).

- In the span, the D-backs lead the Majors with a . 347 OBP, and are second with 5.86 runs per game, .808 OPS, 123 runs and 84 walks, and fourth with 192 hits.

VS. PIRATES: The D-backs host the Pirates for 3 games this weekend - the first of 6 meetings in a 10-day stretch.

- Since 2018, the D-backs are $24-9$ vs. Pirates, including 12-4 at home.
- In their last 7 meetings @ Chase Field, the D-backs are 5-2 vs. Pirates.

VS. NL CENTRAL: Since 2023, the D-backs' 31 wins vs. NL Central opponents are tied for the second most by a NL West/East team (also: Braves), behind the Phillies (34).

## SCORCHING MARTE: Ketel Marte's . 356 AVG since June 23

 ranks atop the NL.- In the span, Marte ranks among the Majors in OBP (4th, .453), AVG (5th, .356), walks (T-8th, 16), fewest strikeouts (T-10th, 12) and RBI (T-10th, 22).
- Has not struck out in 57 of his last 65 plate appearances since July 4.

KETEL GOES FOR 4 STRAIGHT: Ketel Marte has homered in 3 consecutive games for the second time this season (also: April 3-6) and fifth time in his career....he is the third D-back to do so this season (also: Christian Walker/July 2-4 and Lourdes Gurriel Jr./March 28-30).

- Eduardo Escobar was the last D-back to hit a homer in 4+ consecutive games (April 8-11, 2021)
- In 2024, only 8 players have hit a homer in 4+ straight games: Rafael Devers/BOS (6), Tyler Fitzgerald/SF (5), Michael Busch/CHC (5), Mookie Betts/LAD (4), Gunnar Henderson/BAL (4), Corey Seager/TEX (4), Aaron Judge/NYY (4), Yainer Diaz/HOU (4).

ANSWERBACKS: On Wednesday @ Royals, the D-backs tallied their fifth comeback victory of the month and 17th overall this season.

HOMER HAPPY: The D-backs' 31 homers in July are the third most in the NL, behind the Rockies (36) and Reds (35).

WHEN SCORING FIRST: In July, the D-backs are 10-2 in games where they are first to score (T-2nd most wins in MLB).
NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (4-6, 3.74)

- Has pitched 16.1 consecutive scoreless innings (July 6/Bot 2 - July 21/Bot 7)...the third longest active streak by a starter, behind Taj Bradley/TB (23.0 IP) and Dylan Cease/SD (22.0 IP).
- Made his lone start vs. Pirates on the road on May 20, 2023 (ND; 3 ER in 5.1 IP - D-backs won 4-3).
