## Detroit Tigers (19-23) at New York Mets (16-25)

**ANOTHER BITE AT THE APPLE:** The Detroit Tigers tonight play the middle game of their three-game set at the New York Mets after dropping the series opener last night, 10-2 ... the Tigers are now 1-3 through the first four games of this two-city, six-game trek that started in Kansas City (1-2) ... Detroit has dropped 11 of its last 16 games after winning 10 of its previous 13 games into this span.

- The Tigers have now dropped eight series openers in a row dating to April 17 in Boston, the longest active streak in baseball and Detroit's longest such drought overall since a 10-game-series-opener losing skid from July 28-August 30, 2022.
- Last night began a run of 13-games-in-13-days for Detroit ... after this three-game series in New York, the Tigers will return to Detroit to host a two-team, seven-game homestand against Toronto (three games from Friday-Sunday) and Cleveland (four games from May 18-21)

**NIGHT OWNS:** Tonight marks the 11th-and-final-consecutive night game for the Tigers, the club's longest streak of night baseball in nearly 27 years since an 11-game run from August 16-28, 1999 ... including a 3-7 record thus far this stretch, the Tigers are 8-20 at night this year, which is a .286 winning percentage, last in all of baseball ... the Tigers are 11-3 during day games this year, good for a .786 winning percentage, the best mark in the majors ... yes, the missing L in the header is ironic.

**ROAD WOES:** Detroit is 7-17 on the road thus far, a .292 winning percentage, the lowest road mark in the majors and the club's roughest 24-game road start since a 6-18 opening salvo in 2022 ... the Tigers have been 7-17 or worse through 24 road games just 12 times in franchise history.

**THIS IS 40:** Kevin McGonigle is 40 games into his big league career and leads all major league rookies with 45 hits, 12 doubles, a .300 batting average and a .403 on-base percentage ... he has 24 walks compared to only 22 strikeouts, one of only six big leaguers, rookie or non-rookie, with more walks than strikeouts (minimum 24 walks) this season.

- Since the year 2000, McGonigle is one of only four players with at least 45 hits and 24 walks in his first 40 major league games, joining Logan Morrison (Marlins, 2010), Kosuke Fukudome (Cubs, 2008) and Daric Barton (Athletics, 2007-08).
- McGonigle is the first player 21-years-old or younger with at least 45 hits and 24 walks in his first 40 major league games since Delino DeShields in 1990 with the Montreal Expos (49 hits, 26 walks), the first to do so with more walks than strikeouts since Tim Lincecum from 1980-81 with the Expos (45 hits, 29 walks, 16 strikeouts).
- McGonigle is the first player in Tigers history with at least 45 hits and 24 walks in his first 40 big league games ... the last two Tigers with 45 hits in their first 40 big league games both came in 2010: Austin Jackson (58) and Brennan Boesch (51) ... only six Tigers, including McGonigle, have 45 hits in their first 40 games in the last 50 years, and only 22 Tigers have done so ever.

**IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING:** Kevin McGonigle has a 2.2 bWAR through his first 40 major league games, the fifth-best mark in the A.L. and trailing only Bobby Witt Jr (2.9 bWAR), Aaron Judge (2.8 bWAR), Cody Bellinger (2.4 bWAR) and Shea Langeliers (2.3 bWAR) ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

**CATCH-22:** Riley Greene has reached base safely in 22-straight games, extending his career high ... his previous best was 20 games from August 20-September 14, 2022 ... it is the longest streak by a Tiger this season, the longest by any Tiger since Gleyber Torres last season (25 games) and the third-longest active streak in baseball behind Nick Kurtz (35) and Ronald Acuna Jr (23).

- This run marks Greene's second streak of reaching base safely in 16 or more games already this season, as he started off by reaching base safely in his first 16 games of the campaign.
- Greene has the longest streak by a Tigers left-handed hitter since Kerry Carpenter had a 24-game run in 2023.

**EXTRA, EXTRA!** Detroit has an extra-base hit in 40-straight games dating to March 28, the longest active streak in all of baseball ... Baltimore is next at 35-straight games ... this is Detroit's longest extra-base hit streak since a 44-game run from August 4-September 23, 2025.

**GREENE WITH ENVY:** Riley Greene is now batting .379 (36-for-95) with nine doubles, four homers, 14 RBI, a .478 on-base percentage, a .600 slugging percentage and a 1.078 OPS in his last 28 games over the past month starting April 11 ... he leads the majors in on-base percentage, ranks second in the majors in batting average and is third in the majors OPS in this span.

**IT'S A DIFFERENT LEAGUE:** The Tigers briefly returned to interleague play this week after seeing 21 of their first 32 games through the end of April take place against National League competition.

- The Tigers have made up for lost time, however, as they began a stretch on May 1 that sees all but these three games at the Mets (59 of 62 contests) against A.L. foes through July 9.

**AND FINALLY:** Kevin McGonigle is only the second Tiger in franchise history, age 21-years-old or younger, to tally 45 hits in his first 40 major league games, joining Travis Fryman who had 47 hits in his first 40 major league games in 1990.

- Set to make his first start since serving his five game suspension for hitting Trevor Story in the fourth inning against Boston.
- Allowed seven earned runs on nine hits including three home runs last time out against Boston...pitched 3.0+ innings and got ejected in the fourth after following back-to-back solo home runs.
- Tied his career high allowing eight earned runs including six in the first inning on April 8 against Minnesota...had previously surrendered eight earned runs twice, both with the Astros while facing the Angels.
- Spun six scoreless innings in his home debut and Detroit's home opener on Friday, April 3 against St. Louis.
- Made his Tigers debut on Friday, March 27 against San Diego...allowed one earned run on seven hits and a walk while striking out five over 6.0 innings.
- Signed with the Detroit Tigers as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...went 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA in four Spring Training starts for the Tigers.
- In 2025, led the Astros in wins (13) and innings (192)...marked the 3rd-highest win total of his career behind his 17 wins in 2022 and 15 wins in 2024...also led the team in starts alongside RHP Hunter Brown (31).
- Among AL pitchers on the 2025 season, finished 2nd in GB% (59.2), 2nd in opponent GDP (22), 2nd in GDP/9 (1.03), 5th in Pitching WAR (4.3), T-5th in quality starts (20), 6th in innings pitched (192.0), T-6th in wins, and 10th in opponent OPS (.667).
- Surpassed 1,000 career strikeouts in his start on July 28, 2025, vs. WSH, finishing the season with 1,053...surpassed 1,000 career innings during his start on July 5 at LAD last season.

- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on April 22...recalled on April 29 after making one relief appearance with the Mud Hens...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two over 2.0 innings in the outing.
- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.
