THE PIRATES:...beat the Reds 9-5 last night in the middle game of this three-game series...Have gone 14-12, including 5-6 on the road, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone 29-3 (.906 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Are hitting . 300 ( 48 -for-160) with runners in scoring position this month, which ranks fifth in MLB...Have gone $9-5$ this month in games when the team does not make an error...Have the third-best ERA (3.45) among starting rotations this month behind the Astros (3.21) and Mariners (3.24)... Have surrendered the second-fewest home runs (18) among all teams in MLB this month (the Phillies have allowed a league-low 17 home runs this month)...Have drawn at least one walk in 44 straight games; the second-longest active streak in MLB behind the Phillies ( 63 straight)...Have not been shut out in 24 straight games, which is the eighth-longest active streak in MLB (the Cardinals have the longest active streak at 55 games)...Have gone deep in a season-high tying seven straight games (also 5/11-17).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting . 360 (32-for-89) with seven doubles, a triple, six home runs and 16 RBI during his current career-high 22-game hitting streak...lt's the longest hitting streak in MLB this season...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate since 2003...That year Kenny Lofton hit safely in 26 straight games, Jason Kendall had a 23-game streak, and Aramis Ramirez hit safely in 22 straight games...Reynolds' 22-game hitting streak is two games shy of tying Maury Wills'

RUN-PRODUCING REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds has knocked in a run in six straight games, which is the longest RBI streak by a Pirate this year...Reynolds also recorded an RBI in six straight games on two occasions in 2023, doing so from April 2-8 and from April 22-30...The only three players in MLB with longer active RBI streaks are Shohei Ohtani (nine games), Brendan Donovan (seven games) and Yandy Díaz (seven games)...The last Pirate with an RBI in seven straight games was Pedro Alvarez in 2010.

NICKY G: Nick Gonzales reorded the third three-hit game of his career Tuesday...Gonzales is the fifth Pirate since 1948 with at least 65 hits and 40 RBI in his first 75 career games, joining Andrew McCutchen (2009), Warren Morris (1999), Dick Stuart (1958-59), and Dale Long (1951-55).

ABOUT TODAY'S STARTER: Luis Ortiz gets the start this afternoon in the finale of this three-game
series against the Reds...The 25 -year-old righthander ranks third among all relief pitchers in MLB in innings pitched (47.0)...Ortiz will become the 10th different pitcher to start a game for the Pirates this season...The Marlins and Brewers have each used a leagueleading 13 different starting pitchers this year.

WHAT'S AT STAKE: The Pirates are 1-1 heading into the deciding game of this three-game series against the Reds...The Pirates have won their last two series against the Reds, including two of three games last week at PNC Park...Pittsburgh's five series wins against the Reds since 2022 are its most against any single opponent in that span...The only times this century Pittsburgh has won three straight series against Cincinnati were in 2018 (four) and 2011 (three).


THE FIRST PIRATES ALL-STAR OF 2024: Major League Baseball announced
yesterday that Pirates assistant athletic trainer Tony Leo will serve as a trainer for this year's AllStar Game at Globe Life Field...Leo is in his fourth season as a member of the Pirates and 28th overall in professional baseball.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today three strikeouts shy of tying Billy Wagner for the most punchouts (1196) by a left-handed relief pitcher in MLB history... The 36 -year-old Chapman is tied for seventh in strikeouts (45) among all National League relief pitchers this season.

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen is two walks shy of tying Ralph Kiner (795) for fifth place on the Pirates all-time base on balls list...McCutchen is also two extrabase hits shy of tying Max Carey (590) for sixth place in that category on the Pirates all-time list.

June 26, 2001: Rob Mackowiak became the third player to have a walkoff hit in PNC Park history after he singled home Kevin Young in the 12th inning to lift the Pirates to a 7-6 win against Milwaukee. STARTING OFF: The 25 -year-old righthander is in his third Major League season, all with the Pirates...Entering today, he's made 43 career appearances (19 starts) for the Bucs, including 21 relief appearances in 2024 (no starts)... He made the first Opening Day roster of his career with the Pirates in 2024 after making just two appearances (both starts) with the club in 2022 and 18 appearances ( 15 starts) over two stints with the Bucs in 2023...Ortiz was signed by the Pirates as an international free agent on October 2, 2018 and is one of four players to come up through the Pirates' Dominican Academy and reach the Major Leagues with the club, joining RHP Yerry De Los Santos, RHP Osvaldo Bido and INF Rodolfo Castro.

LIKE RIDING A BIKE: Today will be Ortiz' 20th career Major League start and his first of the season, having last took the mound in a starter's role on September 28, 2023 at Philadelphia (W, 1 ER in 5.0 IP)...Each of his last three appearances since June 8 have been in the bulk role in games Carmen Mlodzinksi has opened, pitching to a 4.73 ERA (7 ER in 13.1 IP) in those games...Ortiz threw 4.1 shutout frames on June 8 vs. Minnesota, allowed one run in 5.0 IP on June 14 at Colorado and allowed 6 earned runs in 4.0 innings pitched in his last outing on June 21 vs. Tampa Bay.

Ortiz was a starter in 19 of his first 22 career Major League games with the Bucs from 2022-23 before primarily pitching out of the bullpen this season.

- He started 67 of his 72 appearances in the Minor Leagues from 2019-2023

LAST TIME OUT: Ortiz allowed six runs on 10 hits over 4.0 innings pitching in the bulk role on June 21 vs. Tampa Bay.

- The outing snapped a streak of 14 consecutive outings of allowing two earned runs or fewer this season dating back to April 20 vs. Boston.

VS. CINCINNATI: Ortiz will be making his third career appearance (second start) against Cincinnati...He owns a lifetime 2.89 ERA (3 ER in 9.1 IP) with 10 strikeouts against five walks vs. the Reds.

Last appeared against the Reds on September 22, 2023 in a relief role, allowing three runs on four hits with five strikeouts in 3.2 innings pitched.
His only other appearance against Cincy was his Major League debut on Sept. 13, 2022, where he threw 5.2 shutout innings of one-hit baseball, striking out five.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Ortiz has made 11 appearances on the road this season, pitching to a 2-1 record with a 2.70 ERA ( 7 ER in 23.1 IP), 20 strikeouts and eight walks...Over his last six appearances on the road since April 28, Ortiz has posted a 1.15 ERA (2 ER in 15.2 IP).

SHUTTING IT DOWN: Ortiz earned the first save of his big league career on June 1 at Toronto, facing a total of 10 batters in 3.0 scoreless innings while throwing 36 pitches.

DAY MAN: Ortiz will be making his 14th appearance of the season in a day game today, where he has posted a 2-1 record with a 1.32 ERA (4 ER in 27.1 IP) and . 170 opponents average.

2023 RECAP: Ortiz had two different stints with the Pirates last season, going 4-5 with a 4.93 ERA ( 40 ER in 73.0 IP) in his 15 starts and $1-0$ with a 3.95 ERA ( 6 ER in 13.2 IP) in three relief appearances.

Pitched with the Dominican Republic team in the World Baseball Classic, making one appearances and striking out three batters in 2.0 scoreless innings.

AS A PROSPECT: Entered the 2023 season ranked by Baseball America as Pittsburgh's fourth-best prospect...He was named Double-A Altoona's Pitcher of the Year as well as the Pirates' organizational Teammate of the Year in 2022.
