**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed a day off on Monday...On Sunday, the team was swept in a doubleheader against the Rockies...The Mets have lost 15 of their last 17 games dating back to April 8 and have been outscored 87-39 during that span...The Mets are in the midst of a 10-day, nine-game homestand (2-4) against the Twins (2-1), Rockies (0-3) and Nationals (three games)...Following this homestand, the Mets head West to face the Angels (three games), Diamondbacks (three games) and Rockies (three games).

**LET'S NOT GO STREAKING:** The Mets have lost three straight games...The team has posted a 3.00 ERA (9 ER/27.0 IP) in that span with 13 walks and 33 strikeouts...They are hitting .216/.262/.268 in the stretch...They have been outscored 10-4.

**ROSTER MOVES:** Today, the Mets announced RHP Kodai Senga has been placed on the 15-Day Injured List, retroactive to April 27, with lumbar spine inflammation...RHP Christian Scott was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...Yesterday, the Mets announced the following roster moves - OF Austin Slater (#40) signed to a one-year Major League contract...He will be active for tomorrow's game...OF Tommy Pham was designated for assignment...INF Eric Wagan was claimed off waivers from Minnesota and optioned to Triple-A Syracuse.

**28 DAYS LATER:** The Mets 9-19 record is tied with the 1962 team, the 1964 team and the 1983 team for the second-worst 28-game start in franchise history...Only the 1981 team (8-19-1) had a worse record through the team's first 28 games of a season.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets start divisional action tonight...Last year, the Mets went 25-27 against the NL East division...They posted a 4.35 ERA, while slashing .266/.338/.452...This compared to a 30-22 record against the division in 2024.

**PRETTY, PRETTY, PRETTY GOOD:** Since the start of last season, Clay Holmes has thrown at least 5.0 innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in 22 of his 36 starts...His 22 such starts are tied for the seventh-most among NL pitchers during that stretch...Since the start of last season, Holmes is 14-10 with a 3.31 ERA (72 ER/195.2 IP) and 148 strikeouts...Among qualifiers, his 3.33 ERA is the sixth-best among NL pitchers and his 14 wins are tied for the eighth-most in the NL...Opposing batters are hitting just .234 (171-730) off Holmes and since the beginning of last season it is the ninth-best opponent batting average among qualifiers in the NL.

**STAYING GROUNDED:** This season, Holmes has produced a 55.6% groundball percentage, which is the seventh-best mark in the majors and the fourth-best in the NL among qualifiers...Last season, Holmes ranked fifth among qualifiers in the majors in groundball percentage, with a 56.7% mark...In each of the four prior seasons, Holmes' groundball rate ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season)... Since 2019, Holmes' 62.8% groundball rate is the fifth-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 64.8% clip, Jhoan Duran's (63.4%), Tim Hill's (63.2%), and Andre Pallante's (63.2%) (min. 1000 BF).

**COMING OFF THE BENGE:** Over the last four games, Carson Benge is 5-12 with two runs, one home run, one RBI, a .417 OBP and a 1.167 SLG.

**HOME, SWEET HOME:** The Mets are in the midst of their third homestand of the season...The team is 5-10 in New York this year...The team has posted a 4.27 ERA (66 ER/139.0 IP) at Citi Field in 2026... They are hitting .222/.287/.325 at Citi Field.

**SAY IT IS SOTO:** Juan Soto has safely reached base in all 13 of his games this season...This marks the first time in his career he has reached base safely in every game to start a season...He is batting .304 (14-46) with three runs, two doubles, one homer, five RBI, nine walks, a .418 OBP, a .413 SLG and an .831 OPS.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** Congrats to A.J. Ewing who was promoted to Triple-A...In 18 games at Double-A this year, Ewinging his .349/.481/.571 with 16 runs, six doubles, on triple, two homers, seven RBI, 12 steals, 17 walks and a 1.053 OPS...Ewing is ranked as the third-best prospect in the Mets system according to MLB Pipeline.com...He was selected in the fourth round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Springboro High School in Ohio.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**THIS DAY IN 1986:** The Mets were off on this day in 1986...The team is in the midst of an 11-game winning streak...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed two earned runs on five hits, one walk and three strikeouts over 7.0 innings on April 22 vs. Minnesota (7.0 IP, 5 H, 2 ER, HR, BB, 3 K)...Is the second time this season he has thrown at least 7.0 innings in a start, and he is one of seven NL pitchers with multiple starts of 7.0+ innings...He has completed 5.0 innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in all five of his starts this season...This season Holmes is 2-2 with a 2.10 ERA (7 ER/30.0 IP), 19 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .194 (21-108)...Among all qualified NL Pitchers, his ERA is the third best and his opponents' batting average is 11th.

**PRETTY, PRETTY, PRETTY GOOD:** Since the start of last season, Holmes has thrown at least 5.0 innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in 22 of his 36 starts...His 22 such starts are tied for the seventh-most among NL pitchers during that stretch...Since the start of last season, Holmes is 14-10 with a 3.31 ERA (72 ER/195.2 IP) and 148 strikeouts...Among qualifiers, his 3.33 ERA is the sixth-best among NL pitchers and his 14 wins are tied for the eighth-most in the NL...Opposing batters are hitting just .234 (171-730) off Holmes and since the beginning of last season it is the ninth-best opponent batting average among qualifiers in the NL.

**VS. WASHINGTON:** Has made six career appearances against Washington (one start) and he is 1-1 with one save and a 1.76 ERA (3 ER/15.1 IP)...His lone start against them came last season on April 26 at Washington, when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings while recording two strikeouts and he earned his second win of the season.

**SUPER SEVEN:** Fired 7.0 scoreless innings and struck out four on April 4 at San Francisco (7.0 IP, 3 H, 2 BB, 4 K ...Tied the longest outing of his career (also: 7.0 IP on 6/1/25 vs. COL) and marked the longest scoreless outing of his career...Was just the fourth time a Mets pitcher has thrown at least 7.0 scoreless innings since the beginning of last season (last: Nolan McLean 8.0 IP scoreless on 8/27/25 vs. PHI).

**SINK OR SWIM:** So far this season, he has thrown his sinker 49.2% of the time, and batters are hitting .173 (9-52) in at-bats ending with the sinker...The pitch has produced a run value of four, which ranks tied for 31st among all pitches in the majors this season and is tied for 12th among all sinkers according to *Baseball Savant*...Opposing batters are just slugging .365 against Holmes' sinker this season.

**NEW ROLE WHO DIS:** In his first season with the Mets, Holmes was a mainstay in the rotation, starting 31 of his 33 games...Prior to last season, Holmes had only started four Major League games, all of which came in his first season, 2018...The right-hander established career highs in innings (165.2), strikeouts (129) and wins (12)...Additionally, Holmes ranked ninth among qualifiers in the NL with a 3.53 ERA (65 ER/165.2 IP).

**ALL-AMERICAN CLAY:** Was a part of Team USA at the World Baseball Classic, where he made one appearance... He was the winning pitcher on March 7 in their 9-1 win over Great Britain...Holmes threw 3.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit and didn't walk a batter...He struck out six of the 10 batters he faced.

**A TALE OF TWO SEASONS:** In his first 17 starts of the 2025 season, Holmes went 8-4 with a 2.99 ERA (31 ER/93.1 IP)...Holmes allowed three or fewer runs in 15 of those starts and did not allow more than four runs in any of those starts...Holmes pitched 6.0 or more innings in seven of nine starts from April 2-June 7...Six of Holmes' eight quality starts came during that span...On June 1 vs. Colorado, Holmes allowed three runs over a career-high 7.0 innings...In his final 16 outings of the season, Holmes went 4-4 with a 4.23 ERA (34 ER/72.1 IP)...During that span, the right-hander allowed a season-high five runs on three separate occasions and failed to complete 5.0 innings five different times...Only twice during that span (8/23 at ATL and 9/27 at MIA) did Holmes complete 6.0 or more innings.

**WHAT A RELIEF:** Holmes made two relief appearances in consecutive outings, September 21 vs. Washington and September 24 at Chicago-NL...On September 21 vs. Washington, Holmes threw 3.2 scoreless innings in relief of Sean Manaea and struck out four without issuing a walk...The outing marked the longest scoreless relief appearance of his career...On September 24 vs. Chicago-NL, Holmes allowed one unearned run over 1.0 hitless inning.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** In his first 17 starts of the 2025 season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .111 (7-63) average with runners in scoring position...During that span (March 27 - July 7), Holmes ranked tied for fourth in opponents' batting average with RISP and also ranked fourth in opponents' OPS with RISP, a .372 clip (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Over his final 16 outings of the season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .250 (18-72) average and a .654 OPS...Overall, Holmes ranked second in the majors among qualifiers in OPS with RISP and fourth in average...Additionally, Holmes was one of four pitchers in the majors to allow one or zero homers with RISP and one of two pitchers to allow five or fewer extra-base hits (min. 125 batters faced w/RISP).

**HOLMES RUNS:** Holmes did not allow a home run in each of his first seven starts of the 2025 season...The righty joined Ed Lynch, Tim Leary, Dwight Gooden, Al Leiter and Orel Hershiser as the only pitchers in Mets history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the club...Over his next 10 starts, May 9-July 2, Holmes surrendered 11 home runs over 56.2 innings...In his final 14 outings of the season, Holmes only allowed three home runs over 72.1 innings...Overall, Holmes ranked sixth in the NL and ninth in the majors among qualifiers with a 0.76 HR/9 rate...Additionally, Holmes was one of nine pitchers in the majors to throw 150.0 innings and allow 14 or fewer home runs.

**10 K CLAY:** On April 8 vs. Miami last season, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut, joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/64 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10 K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...At the time, 5.1 innings were the second-most he had ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career Big League start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.
