- The bid will tie him with Madison Bumgarner, Zack Greinke and lan Kennedy for third most Opening Day starts in club history, behind Randy Johnson (6) and Brandon Webb (4).

- ♦ Went a combined 1-0 with a 5.16 ERA (17 ER in 29.2 IP), 13 walks and 14 strikeouts in 16 games with the Astros and A's last season.
- ♦ Signed by D-backs as a Minor League free agent on February 25.
- ♦Began the 2024 season with the Astros, going 0-0 with a 5.71 ERA (11 ER in 17.1 IP), 7 walks and 9 strikeouts over 10 games before being traded to the A's.
- ♦ In 6 games with the A's, went 1-0 with a 4.38 ERA (6 ER in 12.1 IP), 6 walks and 5 strikeouts.
