Freddy Peralta is 10-1 with a 1.85 ERA in 18 home starts this season, which includes his win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago.....he has 117 strikeouts in 97.1 innings pitched at home in 2025 with opponents batting just .192.

Snell Ya Later The Brewers notched just 2 hits in last night's Game 1 loss, which marked the fewest hits in a postseason game in franchise history (60 games).

Hello Moto!

The Brewers earned a 9-1 win against Yoshinobu Yamamoto on July 7 in Milwaukee.....it was the shortest start of Yamamoto's career as he allowed 5 runs (3 earned) on 4 hits in two-thirds of an inning (2bb, 0k, 1hr).....he gave up a 3-run homer to Andrew Vaughn.

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: RHP Logan Henderson (right elbow), RHP Shelby Miller (right elbow), **DF Garrett Mitchell** (left oblique), **LHP Jordan Montgomery** (left elbow) and **LHP Connor Thomas** (left elbow) are on the 60-day injured list.

IN THE STANDINGS [195 days]: The Brewers spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 81, SECOND: 57, THIRD: 43, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the team finished in first place, ahead of the second-place Cubs by 5.0 games, third-place Reds by 14.0 games, fourth-place Cardinals by 19.0 games and fifth-place Pirates by 26.0 games.....the Brewers spent the last 63 days of the season [7/28-9/28] in sole possession of first place, clinching a postseason berth on September 13 and the NL Central on September 21.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and in three straight seasons.....the team has won the NL Central four times in the last five seasons and three years in a row....Milwaukee was just two games away from qualifying for the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers have produced 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25), including a franchise-record 97 this season....this does not include 2020....the Brewers (8), Astros (8) and Dodgers (13) are the only teams with 86+ wins in at least each of the last eight full seasons.....the Brewers have 763 wins since 2017 (4th in MLB/2nd in National League).

TEAM STREAK: The Brewers had a pair of double-digit winning streaks this season.. the team won 11 consecutive games from 7/6-7/21 and a franchise-record 14 in a row from 8/1-8/16.....the Brewers were the first team in the Major Leagues since the 2015 Blue Jays (11 games twice) to have multiple winning streaks of 11+ games in a season and the first National League team to do it since the 1935 Cubs (11 and 21 games).

AT HOME: The Brewers went 52-29 at home this season, tying the Dodgers and Padres for the third-best record in the Major Leagues.....the team was 17-8-1 in series play..... Milwaukee won 50+ home games for the eighth time and first time since going 51-30 in 2018....the team had a season-high 7-game home winning streak from 8/8-8/22

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers went 45-36 on the road this season, posting the best record in the Major Leagues....the team was 13-11-2 in series play.....Milwaukee had a franchise-record-tying 9-game road winning streak from 7/23-8/16.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy completed in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he became the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

GAME 2 STARTER: #51 - RHP FREDDY PERALTA (33gs, 17-6, 2.70) - 2025 ALL-STAR 2025 Arsenal: 4-Seam Fastball (53.5%) - Changeup (21.2%) - Curveball (15.9%) - Slider (9.4%)

PERALTA AT A GLANCE: All-Star Freddy Peralta, 29, went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA in a career-high 33 starts this season.....the team went 20-13 in his starts.....he produced 13 quality starts.....opponents batted .193 (124-for-643, 21hr).....Peralta led the National League in wins (17) and ranked among the leaders in opponent AVG (2nd, .193), H/9IP (2nd, 6.32), ERA (4th, 2.70), K/9IP (4th, 10.39), WHIP (5th, 1.08) and strikeouts (6th, 204)....he was acquired from Seattle with RHP Carlos Herrera and RHP Daniel Missaki for 18 Adam Lind on 12/9/15....on 2/28/20, he signed a 5-year contract through 2024 with club options for 2025 and 2026.

POSTSEASON: Is 1-2 with a 4.23 ERA in 8 career games/5 starts (27.2ip, 16h, 13r, 13er, 12bb, 37k, 5hr), including 1-1 with a 4.66 ERA in 2 starts in the NLDS against Chicago (9.2ip, 7h, 5r, 5er, 5bb, 15k, 3hr).....Peralta earned a 9-3 win in NLDS Game 1 in Milwaukee as he allowed 2 runs on 4 hits in 5.2 innings (3bb, 9k, 2hr, 95 pitches) and took a 6-0 loss in Game 4 in Chicago as he allowed 3 runs on 3 hits in 4.0 innings (2bb, 6k, 1hr, 84 pitches).....he has pitched in the postseason in 2018, 2020-21 and 2023-25.....has gone 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA as a starter (22.2ip, 12er) and 0-0 with a 1.80 ERA in relief (5ip, 1er).....his 37 career postseason strikeouts rank second in franchise history behind Brandon Woodruff (40).

CAREER: Is 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA and 1 save in 211 games/162 starts (931ip, 371er).....is in his eighth Major League season, all with the Brewers (2018-25).....was an All-Star in 2021 and 2025.....was the Opening Day starter in 2024 and 2025.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 40-20 with a 3.19 ERA in 112 games/84 starts (498.2ip, 177er).....went 9-1 with a 1.77 ERA in 17 starts this season (91.2ip, 18er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 30-22 with a 4.04 ERA in 99 games/78 starts [432.1ip, 194er]....went 8-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 16 starts this season (85ip, 35er).

CAREER vs. DODGERS: Peralta is 4-2 with a 3.29 ERA in 8 career starts against the Dodgers (41ip, 28h, 15r, 15er, 20bb, 40k, 6hr), including 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA in 2 starts this season (11ip, 10h, 4r, 4er, 4bb, 11k, 1hr).
