RAYSPORT—The Rays open a 12-game, 14-day road trip against the Angels (3G), Mariners (3G), Athletics (3G) and Giants (3G) tonight in Anaheim...are coming off a brief three-game home swing against the Dodgers (1-2)...snapped a four-game losing streak yesterday, but have lost five of six, nine of 11, 11 of 14, 15 of 20, 19 of 26 and 23 of their last 32 games...started 21-26...went an MLB-best 25-9 from May 20-June 26 and are an MLB-worst 9-23 since June 27...need to win tonight to avoid falling four games under .500 for the first time since entering play on May 21 (22-26)...are fourth in the AL East for the 24th consecutive day, a season-high tying 10.0 GB the division-leading Blue Jays and 5.0 GB the Mariners for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 54 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ★ The Rays were defeated, 3-0, in yesterday's rubber match with the Dodgers at Steinbrenner Field, their fourth straight rubber-game loss.
- ★ Tampa Bay pitchers combined for 18.0 consecutive scoreless frames before LAD **Andy Pages'** RBI-single in the 6th inning yesterday...the starting rotation carries an active 10.1 scoreless inning streak into tonight's game...the bullpen has turned in a 1.95 ERA (32.1IP, 7ER) across the last eight games.
- ★ The Rays have dropped four straight series and nine of their last 10...they have lost six consecutive sets on the road, their longest skid since June 15-July 26, 2007 (7) and tied for the sixth longest streak in club history.
- ★ Tampa Bay is 1-10 in its last 11 road games and 3-15 in its last 18, its worst 18-game stretch away from home since June 20-July 26, 2016 (3-15).
- ★ Rays pitchers have generated a 24.7 pct. strikeout rate since the All-Star break, fourth in the majors behind the Rangers (26.7%), Reds (26.1%) and Tigers (25.9%)...they have fanned nine batters or more in 10 of their last 14 games.
- ★ The Rays are 46-15 when scoring four runs or more (20-8 on the road) compared to 9-43 with three runs or fewer (3-20 on road)...they have lost 15 straight games when plating three runs or fewer since their last win on June 25 at KC (3-0).
- ★ Under **Kevin Cash** (2015-pres.), the Rays are 165-110 (.600) in August, second in the majors, trailing only the Dodgers (187-92/.670).
- ★ The Rays have lost eight of their last 10 series openers...after a 4-2 win on July 28 at NYY, they are looking to claim back-to-back road openers for the first time since winning four straight from May 29-June 24.

BLANK SLATES—Last series against the Dodgers was the Rays first in which each game resulted in a shutout since since May 14-15, 2019 at MIA (2G) and their first in a series of three games or more since April 5-7, 2013 vs. CLE...it marked their first time playing in three consecutive shutouts, regardless of series, since blanking opponents in a club-record three straight games from April 8-10, 2023, and the seventh time in franchise history...they have never been part of four straight games ending in shutouts...the Rays have been shut out or shut out an opponent a combined 19 times this season—among AL clubs, only the Guardians (21G), Rangers (21G) and Royals (20G) have more...they had 20 combined shutouts all of last season (12 for, 8 against)...the franchise record is 40 shutouts (2014), followed by 28 (2011) and 25 shutouts (2x: 2012-13).

WILD WEST—The Rays continue a stretch of 19 road games in a 22-game stretch (July 25-Aug. 17) with a 12-game, West Coast trip starting tonight at Angel Stadium...it marks their longest road trip since a pair of 12-game treks in 2005: May 30-June 12 (12G, 3G each in OAK, SEA, CIN, PIT) and Aug. 2-14 (12G, 3G each in TEX, LAA, BAL, CLE)...it also marks their first four-city trip since June 2-13, 2011 (SEA, LAA, BAL, DET), which culminated with a one-game make-up in Detroit...they also had a 10-game trip from July 19-29, 2013 in which they traveled through Toronto, Boston and New York (Yankees) before returning to Boston for a make-up game to close the trip.

★ The current series was originally scheduled to take place Steinbrenner Field, but the clubs swapped home dates to avoid Florida's rainy season, creating the 12-game road trip...the series between the teams from April 8-10 in Tampa was first scheduled to take place in Anaheim.

★ The Rays will travel over 6,200 miles on this trip, venturing from Tampa through Anaheim, Seattle, West Sacramento and San Francisco before returning home.

HOUSE(R) CALL—**Adrian Houser**, who was acquired from the White Sox at the trade deadline for INF **Curtis Mead**, **RHP Duncan Davitt** and **RHP Ben Peoples**, will start this evening in his Rays debut...entering tonight's game, the Rays have used only six starting pitchers, fewest in the majors...four teams are tied for second fewest with seven starters: the Angels, Cardinals, D-backs and Nationals...20 players have recorded 20 starts or more for the Rays, tied with the Angels and Cardinals for the most in MLB...the rotation leads the AL in innings pitched (618.0IP) and is tied for first in quality starts (51) along with the Astros and Red Sox...from 2018-24, the Rays used 12 starters or more in each season, and their 61 total starters were third most in MLB behind the Rangers (71) and Angels (62).

★ The White Sox won eac...from of Houser's final six starts with the club (June 22-July 25), with the right-hander going 4-0 with a 2.06 ERA (39.1IP, 9ER) in those games.

B-LOWE BLASTS—**Brandon Lowe** is 1 HR shy of his third consecutive 20-homer season and the fourth of his career...he would become the fifth active second baseman with four (or more) 20-homer seasons (min. 50% of games at 2B), joining HOU **Jose Altuve** (6), ATL **Ozzie Albies** (4), AZ **Ketel Marte** (4) and TEX **Marcus Semien** (4)...as it stands, Lowe is responsible for three of the seven 20-HR seasons by second basemen in Rays history—**Ben Zobrist** (2009 & 2011), **Jorge Cantú** (2005) and **Logan Forsythe** (2016) have the others...his 108 HR since 2021 are tied with Marte for third most among primary second basemen, trailing Semien (136HR) and Altuve (114HR)...he has achieved this despite appearing in only 521 games in that span compared to Semien's 756, Altuve's 638 and Marte's 592.

★ Lowe's next long ball would also make him the fourth Ray to record four seasons with 20 HR or more, joining **Evan Longoria** (9), **Aubrey Huff** (4) and **Carlos Peña** (4)...he would become the fifth Ray to hit 20 HR or more in three consecutive seasons, joining **Randy Arozarena** (2021-23), Longoria (2013-17 & 2008-11), Peña (2007-10), and Huff (2002-05).

★ Lowe's 145 career home runs are third most in franchise history, trailing Longoria (261HR) and Peña (163HR)...min. 2,000 PA, his 461 career slugging pct. ranks fourth in the majors since 1901 among primary second basemen (see table to the right).

HOMER HAPPY—Between **Junior Caminero** (28HR) and **Yandy Díaz** (20HR), the Rays are one of nine teams in the majors with multiple players who have reached the 20-homer mark...with **Brandon Lowe's** (19HR) next home run, they would join the Cubs (Busch/Crow-Armstrong/Suzuki), Diamondbacks (Carroll/Marte/Suárez) and Mets (Alonso/Lindor/Soto) as the only teams with three players who have hit 20 HR for them this season...it would tie the franchise record for most players with 20 HR before the end of August, a feat that has been accomplished six times: 2023 (Arozarena/Paredes/Siri), 2021 (B. Lowe, Meadows, Zunino), 2017 (Dickerson, Morrison, Souza Jr.), 2009 (Longoria/Peña/Zobrist), 2004 (Cruz Jr./Huff/Martinez) and 2000 (McGriff/Williams/Vaughn).

MILESTONE WATCH—**Yandy Díaz** is three runs from tying **Kevin Kiermaier** (410R) for fifth on the Rays all-time list...his 65 three-hit games are tied with **Aubrey Huff** (65G) for third...**Christopher Morel** is 4 RBI away from 200 for his career...**Jonny DeLuca** is one hit shy of 100 career hits and two games shy of 150...**Junior Caminero** (97 RBI) and **Nick Fortes** (96 RBI) are both closing in on 100 career RBI...**Pete Fairbanks'** 291 SO as a reliever are tied for third most in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 81 saves are four shy of **Fernando Rodney** (85SV) for third in team history.

HALO HAPPENINGS—The Rays and Angels conclude a six-game season series this week, with Tampa Bay trailing, 2-1...the Rays need to win two of three games to earn their ninth consecutive season series win, having won each of the previous eight (2016-2019, 2021-24)...their 38-20 record vs. the Angels in that span (2016-pres.) is their best against any AL opponent and the third best by any team against Los Angeles, trailing the Guardians (40-17/.702) and Astros (104-52/.667)...the Rays are 21-7 in their last 28 games at Angel Stadium and have won eight of their last nine series here, with the lone loss coming from May 9-11, 2022 (2-1).

★ **Josh Lowe** is 7-for-16 (.455) with 1 2B, 1 HR and 7 RBI in five career games against the Halos...**Nick Fortes** is hitting .381 (8-for-21) with 2 2B, 1 HR and 2 RBI in nine games, including 7-for-14 with 2 XBH over five contests in Anaheim.

TONIGHT’S START—Adrian Houser will make his first career start for the Rays tonight after being acquired from the White Sox on July 31 for INF Curtis Mead, RHP Duncan Davitt and RHP Ben Peoples...it marks his 12th start of the season and his first against the Angels...it also marks his 116th start (164G) of his career and his first against Los Angeles-AL...he was originally drafted by the Astros in the second round (No. 69 overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT—Earned the win in a crosstown rivalry on July 25 vs. CHC (W, 6.2IP, 5H, 3R, 3BB, 3SO, HR, HBP)...it marked his fourth straight winning decision (June 28-pres.)...the White Sox won each of his last six starts for the club and were 8-3 with him on the mound...he retired each of the first eight batters to come to the plate in the game...he worked around a single and a walk in the 4th inning without allowing a run...his 7th inning opened with a walk-walk-strikeout-fly out-home run sequence resulting in a three-run home run for Reese McGuire and all three of his runs allowed in the outing.

- ★ The six game winning streak when he starts is tied for the third-longest active streak in the majors with BOS Hunter Dobbins and behind MIL Quinn Priester and NYM Kodai Senga.

HALO WORLD—In seven seasons with Milwaukee, one season with New York-NL and one season with Chicago-AL, Houser has never faced the Angels in his career...they are one of the three clubs (also: Milwaukee and Boston) that he has never faced in his career.

- ★ In 12 career appearances (9GS) against the AL West, he is 5-3 with a 2.83 ERA (47.2IP, 15ER), a .227 (41-for-181) opp. average...he has made two starts against the AL West this season to a 1-1 record, 2.45 ERA (11.0IP, 3ER) and a .216 (8-for-37) opp. average.

AWAY FROM THE HOUSER—He has made six starts on the road this season to a 1-2 record, 2.75 ERA (36.0IP, 11ER) and a .273 (38-for-139) average...his 2.75 ERA on the road is the best single-season mark of his career (min. 2.0IP)...in five of the six road starts, he has gone at least 5.0 innings with three runs or fewer allowed...in each of his road starts in 2025, he has received three runs or fewer in run support.

- ★ Across 58 career road starts, he is 17-23 with a 4.71 ERA (296.0IP, 155ER) and a 0.94 home run per 9.0 IP rate...he has spun 17 quality starts in those outings and his teams have gone 11-6 in such starts.

BETTER THAN EVER—2025 marks his first time pitching in the American League and it has turned into a career year for the right-hander...in eight previous major league seasons from 2015-24, Houser made 104 starts in 152 appearances to a 32-39 record, 4.21 ERA (608.2IP, 285ER) and a 1.38 WHIP...thus far in 2025, he is 6-2 with a 2.10 ERA (68.2IP, 16ER) and 1.22 WHIP...his 2.10 ERA, 1.22 WHIP, nine quality starts and 3.22 FIP are all career-bests.

SUMMER STARTER—His 2025 debut came on May 20 vs. SEA for the White Sox, throwing 6.0 scoreless innings with two hits allowed, three walks allowed and two strikeouts in a winning decision...since May 20, he has made nine starts with 6.0 innings or more and three runs or fewer allowed, that is tied for the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...over that span, his 2.10 ERA (68.2IP, 16ER) ranks second in the AL and sixth in the majors among pitcher with 60.0 innings or more, only trailing DET Tarik Skubal (1.87) in the AL.

SLIDE DOWN—Houser has used his sinker as his primary pitch since 2019, but his usage of his slider has dropped this season from his second most thrown pitch in 2024 to his least thrown pitch in 2025...he threw his slider at a 17.3% rate in 2024 and has dropped that to a 9.0% rate in 2025...opposing hitters batted .286 (12-for-42) against the pitch in 2024 and have batted .231 (6-for-26) against it this year.

FEELING SUPPORTED—As a starting pitcher, he has received three runs or more of support in 46 career starts...his teams in those starts are 38-8 and he has earned a 25-5 record with 18 quality starts...in those starts, he has a 3.78 ERA (247.1IP, 104ER) and a 0.69 home runs per 9.0 IP...in 69 career starts with two runs or fewer of support, his teams are 24-45 and with a personal record of 7-35.

RIGHT, RIGHT—Right-handed batters this season are batting .208 (26-for-125) this season compared to .288 (36-for-125) against left-handers...he has allowed 12 extra-base hits (6 2B, 3 3B, 3HR) against lefties compared to five extra-base hits (5 2B) against righties...min. 130 BF, his .208 opp. average is the 17th best among all AL pitchers.

EARLY 2025—He signed a minor league contract with the Texas Rangers on Dec. 3, 2024 and was a non-roster invite to spring training...in the Cactus League, he was 0-1 with a 3.77 ERA (14.1IP, 6ER) in six games (2GS)...he joined Triple-A Round Rock and pitched to a 5.03 ERA (39.1IP, 22ER) across nine outings (8GS) in the Pacific Coast League...he was released from Round Rock on May 15 prior to signing with Chicago-AL on May 20.
