METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 9-3, yesterday...The Mets are 7113 when scoring first this season...New York is 32-9-3 in 44 series this year...The Mets are coming off a seven-day, six-game trip (4-2) to Pittsburgh (2-1) and Miami (2-1)... Tonight, the Mets return home for a seven game homestand against the Cubs (three games) and Pirates (four games).

PETE \& PUPPIES: Pete Alonso via The Alonso Foundation will make a \$10,000 PETE \& PUPPIES: Pete Alonso via The Alonso Foundation will make a $\$ 10,000$ in front of the Mets dugout today at $4: 30 \mathrm{pm}$...North Shore Animal League is a leader in developing programs that increase pet adoptions and raise awareness about the plight of homeless animals.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .646 winning percentage (31-17) following the All-Star break...That is the second-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671) team and above the 1988 (.644) squad... The team's 31 wins are tied for tied for third-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .272/.342/.440 with 53 home runs in 48 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...They are averaging 4.77 runs per game after the All-Stare Game, compared to 4.70 prior...The Mets rank third in average and OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

BIG BASSITT FISHING: Chris Bassitt has struck out 153 batters this year... His careerhigh is 159 strikeouts set with the Athletics last season... He is set to make his 27 th start of the season tonight and his 15th at home...He is 13-7 with a 3.24 ERA with 41 walks and 153 strikeouts this year...Over his last 12 starts, Bassitt has gone $8-2$ with a 2.40 ERA ( 21 earned runs/ 78.2 innings) with 15 walks and 63 strikeouts... He is $5-5$ with a 2.77 ERA ( 28 earned runs/91.0 innings) with 21 walks and 86 strikeouts at home this year.

ESC. KEY: Eduardo Escobar is on a nine-game hitting streak, his longest as a Met and tied for the third-longest of his career... He is batting .500 (16-32) with eight runs, a double, five home runs, nine RBI, four walks with a . 541 OBP and a 1.000 SLG in that san...In 14 games since he returned from the IL on August 27, he is batting . 413 (19-46) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, nine RBI, four walks with a . 451 OBP and a .783 SLG.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Tomás Nido is batting .286 (22-77) with 12 runs, nine doubles, a home run, nine RBI, five walks with a .325 OBP and a .442 SLG in 28 games since the All Star Break...He is 6-12 (.500) with four runs, three doubles, a home run, three RBI, a walk with a .538 OBP and a 1.000 SLG over his last three games... James McCann is batting .246 (14-57) since the All-Star break...Over his last nine games, McCann is batting .360 (9-25) with six runs, two doubles, an RBI, four walks, a steal with a .448 OBP.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Francisco Lindor has recorded 91 RBI this season...That is one away from tying his career-high of 92 set with Cleveland in 2018...Pete Alonso is tied for second in the majors and tied for the National League lead with 109 RBI this season... Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team....The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright)

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor is on a four-game hitting streak, batting . 412 (7-17) with five runs, three doubles, a home run, five RBI, a walk with a .474 OBP and a .756 SLG over that span.... He is batting .306/.382/.464 with 32 runs, nine doubles, a triple, six home runs, 25 RBI, 20 walks with an .846 OPS in 48 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 5.7 fWAR this season

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 37 games over .500... Prior to this year, it is the most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for the year...New York has won 89 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the third-most in the majors...Their .631 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a $89-52$ record through the team's first 141 games...Only the 1986 (93-48) team posted a better record through the first 141 games of the season.

AND I WOULD PLAY . 500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 58-82 Cubs today...Each of their next seven games and 15 of the their 21 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 50-22 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .694 winning percentage...Their . 694 winning percentage is the third-highest in MLB vs. sub-. 500 opponents.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has safely reached base in seven straight games, batting . 269 (7-26) in that span with five runs, two doubles, a home run, three walks, four RBI, a 375 OBP and a . 462 SLG in that span...Over his last 23 games, Canha is batting . 303 (23-76) with 13 runs, 10 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, six walks with a . 391 OBP, a . 632 SLG and a 1.022 OPS...He has recorded 19 extra-base hits in 43 games since the break compared to 15 he collected in 77 first-half games. Canha slugging .496 in the second half ( .381 SLG in the first half).

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets are seeking their first season series victory over the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

INVADER NIMS: Brandon Nimmo reached the 200 RBI mark in his career yesterday.. Nimmo finished the game going 2-4 wih a run, a double, a home run, three RBI and two walks...Over the last 14 games, Nimmo is batting .309 (17-55) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple, three home runs, 11 RBI , seven walks, a steal with a .387 OBP an da .582 SLG .

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil is third in the majors and in the National League with a .322 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.331) and Paul Goldschmidt (.330) for the major league lead...Jose Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting . 337 in 2011.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting . 361 (13-36) with five runs, two doubles, seven RBI, three walks, two steals with a . 395 OBP in 10 games in September...He is slashing .356/.386/.506 in 46 games following the All-Star break...His 356 average is second in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just four strikeouts in his last 87 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.4 percent strikeout rate.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 94 times this year.. The team's 94 HBP is tied for the second-highest total in franchise history with the 2021 team...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 19 times this year, which is tied for second in the majors... His 19 hit by pitches are the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history...Brandon Nimmo set the record with 22 HBP in 2018.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,331 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,348 have struck out more...The team's 1,331 strikeouts are already the seventh-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019... Mets pitchers are averaging 9.56 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06... More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season ( 25.6 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won 18 of its last 24 games at home...Overall, the Mets are 46-23 at Citi Field...New York's 46 wins at home are fourth in the NL....They are fourth in the majors and second in National League with a .667 winning percentage at home...The team's .667 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, . 700 ), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.07 ERA with 192 walks and 673 strikeouts at Cit Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL....The Mets have struck out 673 at home this year, which is the second-most in the NL...That is already the eighth most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

WINNING!: The Mets are seeking their 90th win today...It would be their most wins since they also recorded 90 in 2015...The Mets have clinched a winning record both at home and on the road...It is the first time the team has posted record winning records at home and on the road since 2016, when they collected 44 wins and home and 43 on the road

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Met single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre ( 1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year... He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 31 second-half wins.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 102 strikeouts...That is 14 strikeouts more than the second place reliever... He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster ( 51.0 IP in 2014)...Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K all-time...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.81 ERA (three earned runs/33. innings) with 15 hits, seven walks and 64 strikeouts in 33 appearances since the star of June.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is tied for seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year... He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

LAST TIME OUT: Started the first game of the team's doubleheader against the Pirates on September 7 earning one of their two wins in the team's sweep....Bassitt allowed one-run on five hits in 7.0 innings of work, while striking out 10 batters and walking only one... Bassitt threw 101 pitches, reaching $100+$ pitches for the 11th time in a start this season.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: Bassitt is $5-5$ with a 2.77 ERA ( 28 earned runs/91.0 innings), 86 strikeouts and 21 walks in 14 starts at Citi Field...In his last nine starts at home, Bassitt owns a 2.10 ERA (14 earned runs/ 60.0 innings) with 55 strikeouts and 13 walks...In 63 career home games ( 57 starts), he is $17-19$ with a 2.63 ERA ( 107 earned runs/ 366.2 innings), 342 punchouts and 92 walks... His 2.63 career ERA at home is the fourth-best home ERA among active pitchers (min. 50 starts) behind Jacob deGrom (2.07), and Clayton Kershaw (2.23) and Walker Buehler (2.62).

PICK SIX: With six wins in his last seven decisions, Bassitt set a career high for his most wins through a seven-game span...After earning his 13th win in his last start, Bassitt set a career-high in wins...Bassitt's six wins since the All-Star Break are the third-most among major league starters in that span...The Mets have won 18 of Bassitt's 26 starts this season, the most team wins among any starting pitcher this season.

VS. BEAR CUBS: The right-hander has faced the Cubs once in his career... His only start against them came on August 5, 2019 at Wrigley Field where he allowed two runs across 6.0 innings and striking out five batters and walking two...This season, Bassitt is 4-0 with a 1.27 ERA (five earned runs/ 35.1 innings) against the NL Central, with 34 strikeouts, seven walks and a . 211 (27-128) opponents batting average...His 2.27 career ERA ( 16 earned runs/63.1 innings) against the NL Central is his lowest against any division.

PREVENT DEFENSE: Chris Bassitt has not allowed a home run in his last eight starts... His eight starts without allowing a homer is the longest such streak of his career through a single season and the third-longest active streak in the majors among starters behind only Zac Gallen (9), and George Kirby (11)...The last Met to go eight starts in a single season without allowing a homer was Tom Glavine (July 31-September 8, 2007)...Only eight other Mets starters have ever had a longer such streak over the span of a single season...Al Leiter was the last Met to go nine straight starts without allowing a home run (July 20-September 2, 2003)...Currently, Sid Fernandez's 16 game-streak (1992) without allowing a homer is the longest such streak in franchise history.

GO LONG!: Recorded his eighth start this season of at least 7.0 innings, the second-most such starts in his career behind his 11-game total from 2021...This was his 21st start of at least 6.0 innings which is tied for the third-most in the NL and tied for the seventh-most such starts in the majors...After allowing only one run across 7.0 dominant innings in his previous outing, Bassitt earned his 17 th quality start of the season, a career high...Bassitt has struck out six or more batters in 15 of his 26 starts, going 6.0 inning or longer in 13 of those 15 starts.

FOURTH AND LONG: Bassitt has allowed four or fewer runs in 16 of his last 17 games...His 14 consecutive starts allowing four runs or fewer is the longest streak in his career over the span of a single season...Bassitt has allowed three or fewer runs in 12 of his last 14 starts.

LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI: His 153 strikeouts are the 10th-most and his 1.133 WHIP is the seventh-lowest in franchise history among pitchers through their first 26 games as a Met (Min 110.0 IP )...His 13 wins are tied for the fourth-most in that span.

THE PITCH...IS GOOD: Bassitt owns a 42.0 strikeout percentage on his four-seamer which is the highest strikeout percentage for any of his pitches... His $42.0 \mathrm{~K} \%$ is the second-highest percentage on that pitch in the majors behind only Luis Castillo, $45.4 \%$ (min. 100 PA)...His cutter has a 26.4 strikeout percentage which ranks fifth in MLB (min. 100 PA).

CAREER YEAR: Struck out Jack Suwinski in the second inning of his previous start to record his 650th career strikeout... He went on to strike out 10 batters for his second 10+ strikeout game of the season to set a personal single-season record...After completing his last start, Bassitt surpassed his single-season high in innings pitched...In 2021, Bassitt's 157.1 innings was his most in a season until surpassing that total with 161.1 innings this season...With today's start, Bassitt will tie a career high set in 2021 for most starts in a season (27).
TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB DEGROM [5-1, 1.66 ERA]
LAST START: Earned his third straight win to sweep the Pirates in the second game of the team's doubleheader on September 7 in Pittsburgh...Allowed three hits over 7.0 shutout innings, going 7.0 innings for a second-straight start, striking out eight and walking one.

VS. CUBS: Is 2-3 with a 3.13 career ERA (21 earned runs/60.1 innings) against the Chicago Cubs....DeGrom has struck out 70 Cubs batters and walked only 17 across his 10 career starts... His last start against the Cubs was on June 16, 2021 where he went only 3.0 innings before exiting early with injury.
