METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Rays, 7-6, in 10-innings yesterday... Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 16-13...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 consecutive games and 26 games in 27 days...The Mets are 3-7 in that stretch...The Mets continue a six-game trip (0-3) to Tampa Bay (0-1) and St. Louis (three games)...New York is off on Thursday before returning home for a five-game homestand against the Braves (three games) and Phillies (two games).

SAY HAPPY BIRTHDAY KID: Happy Birthday to Willie Mays...In a surprise in 2022, the New York Mets announced that the club retired Willie Mays' uniform #24 as part of the Old Timers' Day ceremonies...Mays, 93, who was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1979, spent the final two years of his illustrious career with the Mets (1972-1973). His final home run, the 660th of his career, came on August 17, 1973 vs. Cincinnati at Shea Stadium...Mays played for the New York Giants at the Polo Grounds from 1951-1957 before the Giants moved to San Francisco where he played from 1958 until he was traded to the Mets on May 11, 1972.

HEAD FOR THE MOUNTAINS: In 14 career games at Busch Stadium, Pete Alonso has hit .327 (16-49) with 13 runs, three doubles, five home runs, eight RBI, nine walks with a .459 OBP and a .694 SLG...Omar Narváez is a .308 (16-52) hitter with four runs, three doubles, one triple, four RBI with a .390 OBP and a .404 SLG in 15 games at the yard...Tyrone Taylor has slashed .290/.357/.435 with five extra-base hits and six RBI in 25 games, while Jeff McNeil has hit .294 (15-51) with nine runs, five doubles, a home run, fix RBI with a .368 OBP and a .451 SLG in 14 games at the ballpark.

MILB PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Congrats to Binghamton's RHP Joander Suarez who was named the Eastern League's Pitcher of the Week...Suarez made one start on May 2 vs. Hartford...He hurled 6.1 hitless innings and struck out seven in the process...The Rumble Ponies would go on to win 2-1...In five games (four starts) this year, the 24-year-old has gone 1-1 with a 2.60 ERA (8 ER/27.2 IP) with eight walks and 24 strikeouts...Across six minor leagues seasons, all with the Mets, Suarez is 10-17 with a 4.11 ERA (111 ER/243.0 IP) with 103 walks and 278 strikeouts.

MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: Sean Manaea is set to make his seventh start of the season tonight...He is 1-1 with a 3.07 ERA (10 ER/29.1 IP) with 18 walks and 30 strikeouts...In three starts on the road, Manaea is 1-0 with a 1.84 ERA (3 ER/14.2 IP) with nine walks and 15 strikeouts...Tonight will make his fourth start under the lights...In his previous three starts, he has posted a 1.69 ERA (3 ER/16.0 IP)...This compares to a 4.73 ERA (7 ER/13.1 IP) in the daytime.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is in the midst of their third road trip of the year...The team is 7-8 away from Citi Field...New York is batting .262/.336/.411 on the road this year...Their .262 batting average is the fourth-best in the majors...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401...The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

WAY AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: Brandon Nimmo is batting .260/.448/.500 with 13 runs, four doubles, one triple, two home runs, 11 RBI, 11 walks and a .948 OPS in 14 games on the road this year...This compares to a .194/.318/.278 slashline in 19 games at Citi Field in 2024...Jeff McNeil is hitting .296/.387/.426 with five extra-base hits with an .813 OPS in 15 road games...He is batting .175/.246/.206 in 18 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor is slashing .246/.286/.523 with eight extra-base hits and 14 RBI in 15 road games...In 19 games at Citi Field, he is hitting .171/.275/.271...Omar Narváez is 8-22 with four runs, two doubles, four RBI and an .846 OPS in seven road games...He is 0-21 in 10 games at Citi Field in 2024.

WALK THIS WAY: Brandon Nimmo is tied for fifth in the majors and is tied for second in the NL with 24 walks...He is walking at a 15.8% rate, which is seventh-best in the majors and the fourth-best in the NL...He has recorded 421 walks in his career, 13th-most in Mets history...Mike Piazza is next with 424 walks, followed by José Reyes who earned 428 free passes as a Met.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen owns a 2.90 ERA (42 ER/130.1 IP) with 64 walks and 167 strikeouts...Their 2.90 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit and fifth in the majors...Their 167 strikeouts from the bullpen are the most in the major leagues...They lead the majors in batting average (.194) and are second in the NL in WHIP (1.18)...The also lead the majors with a 11.53 K/9 IP ratio.

I FEEL THE NEED FOR REED: Reed Garrett has allowed one earned run in 17.0 innings, giving him a 0.53 ERA...He is tied for the major league relievers... His 29 strikeouts are tied for the most by a reliever the most in the majors... He has struck out 29 of the 67 batters (43%) faced this year...Right-handed hitters are batting .091 (3-33) against him this season.

STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING LINDOR: After going 1-31 in his first eight games, Francisco Lindor is batting .260/.313/.500 with 18 runs, seven doubles, six home runs, 18 RBI, eight walks and four steals in 26 games since April 7.

TAYLOR MADE: Tyrone Taylor is hitting .288 (21-73) with nine runs, four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI, three walks, three steals with a .736 OPS...He is batting .326 (15-46) with five extra-base hits against right-handed pitchers this year.

DOWN ON THE FARM: OF Nick Morabito has been transferred to High-A Brooklyn from the St. Lucie Mets...Morabito, the 75th overall pick (2nd round) in the 2022 Draft, was recently named the Florida State League Player of the Month for April...He led the circuit in batting average, hits, OBP, and OPS... Morabito slashed .397/.518/.529 in April with the club...In 24 games total with the St. Lucie Mets, the Washington D.C. native has slashed .397/.530/.513 with five extra-base hits, 10 RBI, 28 walks and 11 steals.

STRAWBERRY FIELDS FOREVER: On Saturday June 1, the New York Mets will retire Darryl Strawberry's No. 18 in a special pregame ceremony... Strawberry was a seven-time All-Star with the Mets after he was selected first overall in the 1980 June Draft...Strawberry earned National League Rookie of the Year honors in 1983 when he slugged a then-club rookie record 26 homers...He is the Mets all-time leader in home runs (252), ranks second in RBI (733) and walks (580), third in extra-base hits (469) and runs (662) and fourth in slugging (.520).

MANAEA NEWS & NOTES

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut...He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit *Elias*.

29/30: Tonight, Manaea will make his first career start against the Cardinals... St. Louis will become the 29th opponent Manaea has made one or more start against for his career...The only other team Manaea has never started against is Oakland, the team he spent his first six big league seasons with...Manaea has faced the Cardinals one time in his career, April 25, 2023, and allowed one run over 1.1 inning of relief...Tonight also marks Manaea's first career outing at Busch Stadium, one of two current ballparks he has yet to pitch at (Also: Oriole Park at Camden Yards).

HARD TO HIT: This season, Manaea is one of 10 pitchers in the majors to allow one or zero home runs (Min. 25.0 IP)...His 0.34 HR/9 rate is th eighth-lowest mark in the majors (Min. 25.0 IP)...He is just the seventh Mets pitcher in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995) to allow one or zero home runs in his first six starts with the club joining Al Leiter, Orel Hershiser, Matt Ginter, Pedro Martinez, Taijuan Walker and Jose Quintana...This season, Manaea has allowed four or fewer hits in five of his six starts, including three with three or fewer hits allowed.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Last Season, Manaea appeared in 37 games (10 starts) with the San Francisco Giants...Made his first start of the season vs. Kansas City on April 8 and allowed one run over 6.0 innings while tallying eight strikeouts...Was a starter in six of his first eight games of the season before becoming a full-time reliever on May 16...Tied a season-high eight strikeouts in just 3.2 innings of relief on May 22 at Minnesota...Became the first MLB left-hander to throw at least 80 pitches and strike out eight+ batters in a scoreless relief outing since Randy Johnson struck out 16 in 7.0 innings on July 19, 2001...Courtesy of *OptaSTATS*... Did not allow a home run in a 53.2 inning stretch from May 22 through his first inning of work on August 21 at Philadelphia...Rejoined the rotation on September 12 and started his final four games of the season, going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (6 ER/24.0 IP)...Pitched to a 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP), the third-best mark in the NL and ninth-best in the majors (Min. 50.0 IP)...In 23 career games (11 starts) at Oracle Park, Manaea has a 3.44 ERA (33 ER/86.1 IP) and 90 strikeouts.

SWEEPIN SAMOAN: At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal...Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering...Through his first four starts of the 2024 season, opposing batters are 2-17 with 11 strikeouts in at-bats ending with the pitch...His 61.1K% with the pitch is the fourth-highest mark in the majors this season.

SUPERB SOUTHPAW: Since his debut season, 2016, Manaea ranks in the top-10 among left-handed pitchers in several categories including innings (1027.0, seventh), wins (66, t-ninth) and strikeouts (952, eighth)...In 2021, Manaea was tied for the AL lead with 32 games started and ranked eight in the AL with a career-high 194 strikeouts...In 2018, Manaea ranked sixth in the AL in WHIP with a 1.08 clip (Min. 150.0 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JOSÉ BUTTÓ (0-2, 2.57)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss on May 1 vs. Chicago-NL after allowing just one run on four hits over 6.0 innings...Recorded six strikeouts, his fourth start with six or more punch-outs this season.

QUALITY EATS: Dating back to September 6, 2023, Buttó has pitched to a 2.93 ERA (18 ER/55.1 IP) over 10 starts...Six of those starts have been quality starts and the right-hander has held opposing batters to a .189 (37-196) average during that span.
