WE'RE WHERE THE HEART IS: The Detroit Tigers tonight welcome the Chicago White Sox to Comerica Park for the first of three games this weekend and the start of a season-long 10-day, 10-game, three-team homestand that continues next week with visits from the New York Yankees and Houston Astros ... tonight also marks the start of a 14-games-in-14-days stretch for the Tigers through July 2, their longest scheduled run of games without a day off this season.

- The Tigers return home on the heels of a "weather"-shortened 1-4 road trip through Cleveland (0-2) and Houston (1-2) ... this homestand marks the end of a stretch in which the Tigers will play 16 of 21 games at home from June 5-28 ... the Tigers are 5-6 thus far in this span.
- At 8-6, the Tigers own the second-best record in June in the American League and the sixth-best record this month in the majors ... Detroit's 3.32 team ERA (45 ER/122.0 IP) in June is the best mark in the A.L. and second-best in all of baseball this calendar month (Miami, 3.20 ERA).

HOME OWNER: Since the start of the 2024 campaign, Tarik Skubal is 20-2 with a 2.15 ERA (52 ER/218.0 IP) in 34 starts at home, the lowest home ERA and tied for the third-most wins in the A.L., while his .909 winning percentage is the best home mark of any pitcher in all of baseball.

- Last year Skubal went 9-1 with a 2.13 ERA (24 ER/101.1 IP) in 16 starts at Comerica Park, the lowest home ERA in the A.L. and the fourth-lowest home mark in the majors.

IT'S KEVIN AND BOBBY (CASE CLOSED): Kevin McGonigle (4.1 bWAR) and Bobby Witt Jr (4.3 bWAR) are the only two shortstops on the American League All-Star ballot with a bWAR greater than 2.5, making them the clear-cut favorites for the A.L. All-Star team this season ... Witt Jr. is second in all of baseball in bWAR while McGonigle is just behind at third-best in the majors.

- Despite the aforementioned data, McGonigle ranked third in MLB's recent All-Star fan ballot update behind Bobby Witt Jr (OK fine) and Toronto's Andres Gimenez and his electric 0.4 bWAR, which makes him tied for the 222nd-best position player in baseball.

IT'S TIME TO VOTE: Dillon Dingler is tied for 11th in all of baseball with a 3.1 fWAR this year ... he is tied for the seventh-best fWAR among all big league position players and leads all major league catchers ... the next closest catcher on the A.L. All-Star ballot is the Athletics' Shea Langeliers, who plays on the moon and is light years behind Dillon at a 2.4 fWAR.

- Dingler leads A.L. catchers with 51 RBI and ranks second in the A.L. with 16 homers, a .522 slugging and an .851 OPS ... metrics show Dingler has received 134.03 called strikes looking above expected called strikes, by far the best number in the majors (93.24 is next best).
- Despite the aforementioned data, Dingler ranked fourth in MLB's recent All-Star fan ballot update behind Shea Langeliers (OK maybe), Toronto's Alejandro Kirk, who has literally played a grand total of nine games this season, and Baltimore's Adley Rutschman, who is in an actual 50-50 timeshare at the position with his 21-year-old teammate.

GO GREENE: Riley Greene is batting .318 (68-for-214) with 12 doubles, eight homers, 27 RBI, a .406 on-base, a .486 slugging and an .892 OPS in his last 60 games over the past 10 weeks starting April 11 ... he ranks second in the A.L. in batting average and is third in on-base percentage in this span ... Greene ranks fifth in All-Star fan voting, which would advance him to the second round.

JUNE SLUG: The Tigers offense leads the majors with a .512 slugging percentage and ranks fourth in the A.L. with an .831 OPS in June ... the Tigers also rank second in the A.L. with an average of 5.57 runs scored per game this calendar month.

- With 32 home runs in 14 games in June, the Tigers have already blasted their way past their 18 homers in 28 games in May and matched their 32 homers in 27 games in April... the Tigers have scored 78 runs in 14 games this month, only three runs short of their 28-game total of 81 runs scored in May.

CLOSING IN: A.J. Hinch picked up career win number 994 Monday night, tying Al Dark for 70th place on the all-time managerial win list ... up next are Terry Collins and Bill Virdon in a tie for 68th place with 995 career wins as a major league manager.

START ME UP: Tigers starting pitchers have allowed four runs or less in 22-straight starts beginning May 24, the longest active streak in the A.L. majors and well ahead of next closest Tampa Bay (12 games) ... it's Detroit's longest such streak since May 16-June 13, 2025 (27 games).

IT'S BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in their 48 games since, the Tigers have gone 16-32 to drop their record to 30-44 and tied for fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 16-32 (.333) record in the last eight weeks starting April 24 is the lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 8-6 to start the month of June, the Tigers have lost 19 of their last 29 games, 22 of their last 33 games and 27 of their last 39 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: Dillon Dingler leads the majors with 31 two-out RBI this season, two more than his next closest competitor (Cody Bellinger, 29), and Dingler leads the A.L. with nine two-out homers, one shy of Juan Soto and his 10 two-out homers, tops in the big leagues.

- Set to make his first start at Comerica Park tonight since April 23 against Milwaukee...since the start of the 2024 campaign, he is 20-2 with a 2.15 ERA (52 ER/218.0 IP) in 34 starts at home, the lowest home ERA and tied for the third-most wins in the A.L., while his .909 winning percentage is the best home mark of any pitcher in all of baseball.
- Activated off the injured list on June 13, making his first start since April 29 that afternoon against Cleveland...allowed two earned runs over 4.2 innings, striking out four.
- Placed on the 15-day injured list on May 4 with loose bodies in his elbow and underwent surgery two days later...just over one month later, made a rehab start with West Michigan, striking out six batters over 5.0 innings.
- Made his 2026 home debut on April 12 against Miami after his first three starts of the season came on the road...earned his second win of the year, going 6.2 one-run, two-hit innings, allowing two walks while striking out seven...last year, he went 9-1 with a 2.13 ERA (24 ER/101.1 IP) in 16 starts at Comerica Park, the lowest home ERA in the A.L. and the fourth-lowest home mark in the majors.
- Suffered losses in back-to-back starts (April 1 at ARI, April 7 at MIN) for the first time since his first two starts of the 2025 season at Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle.
- Earned his first win of the season on Opening Day against San Diego, allowing no earned runs over 6.0 innings.
- The 29-year-old became Detroit's first starter to open the season in three consecutive years since his current rotation-mate Justin Verlander made seven consecutive Opening Day starts for the Tigers from 2008-2014...with the start, the Tigers have deployed a left-hander on Opening Day in seven consecutive seasons, marking the longest active stretch across the Majors.
- Posted a career-best 2.21 ERA (48ER/195.1IP) and 241 strikeouts last season...led the AL in ERA (second overall behind Paul Skenes), and second amongst all pitchers in strikeouts (Garret Crochet led with 251 K).
- Won the American League Cy Young Award for a second consecutive season, receiving 26 out of 30 first place votes (four for Garrett Crochet)...became the first repeat AL Cy Young winner since Pedro Martinez in 1999 and 2000...joins Denny McLain as the only Tigers to win multiple Cy Youngs with Detroit...while he did not receive the Triple Crown title, his 6.5 bWAR was a career best that topped Crochet (6.3) and Hunter Brown (6.1). His 7.3 strikeout-to-walk ratio outpaced Crochet's at 5.54, and Skubal's 187 ERA+ was the best by an AL pitcher since Justin Verlander in 2022.
- The back-to-back reigning AL Cy Young winner, who became the 12th pitcher in MLB history to win consecutive Cy Young Awards, will become the ninth pitcher to start on Opening Day following consecutive award-winning seasons, joining Hall of Famer Jim Palmer (1976-77); Hall of Famer Greg Maddux (1993-96); Roger Clemens (1998-99); Hall of Famer Randy Johnson (2000-03); Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez (2000-01); Tim Lincecum (2009-10); Clayton Kershaw (2014-15); and Jacob deGrom (2019-20).
- Set an MLB Postseason record with seven consecutive strikeouts on Oct. 10, 2025, against the Seattle Mariners...became MLB leader in single-postseason strikeouts per nine innings pitched, posting 15.677K/20.2 IP.

- Was an emergency starter on June 15 against Houston, allowing just one earned run on two hits and two walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings pitched.
- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.

- From April 11-May 15, Greene was hitting .398, becoming the first Tiger with a .398 batting average or better in any 30-game stretch (min. 100 at-bats) in 10 years when J.D. Martinez batted .411 during a 30-game stretch in 2016 and the first Tigers lefty to do so since Brennan Boesch in 2011 (also .398).
- Became only the eighth player in club history to reach 200 extra-base hits with the Tigers before turning 26-years-old, joining Ty Cobb, Hank Greenberg, Al Kaline, Willie Horton, Aurelio Rodriguez, Travis Fryman and Nick Castellanos...thanks to Elias.
- Became just the 14th player in franchise history to record 100 career doubles before turning 26 years old with his 100th double on April 16 against the Royals...his 101st double came in his next at-bat and tied the game in the bottom of the ninth inning in an eventual walk-off victory.
