\section*{500 Doubles}

OF Nick Markakis doubled twice last night, giving him 25 for the season and 499 for his career. With his next double, he would become the 64th player in major league history to reach 500 . Only three active players have reached this milestone: Albert Pujols (661), Miguel Cabrera (577) and Robinson Canó (561).




TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Royals finish a two-game series tonight with the fourth and final meeting between the clubs this season...Kansas City took both games at SunTrust Park, July 23-24.

A The Braves have dropped their last four games and six of their last seven with Kansas City following the Royals' sweep earlier this season and last night's 9-6 loss.

A This series marks the Braves' third ever trip to Kauffman Stadium...They split a two-game series in 2013, before dropping two-of-three games in 2016.

A RHP Josh Tomlin is set to face Kansas City for the 29th time in his career and for the 23 rd time as a starter...The righty is $10-5$ with a 3.85 ERA ( 64 ER/149.2 IP) against the Royals, after he got a double play from the only batter he faced on July 23 of this season.

A LHP Mike Montgomery is 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (12 ER/23.0 IP) in eight career games, three starts, against the Braves...The lefty has faced the Braves three times this season, with all of the appearances coming while he was with the Cubs...He went 0-1 with a 7.71 ERA (4 ER/4.2 IP) in these three games.
TOMLIN STARTING: RHP Josh Tomlin is set to make his first start with the Braves tonight after making 49 relief appearances this season...Tomlin takes RHP Mike Soroka's rotation turn, after the righty was pushed to start Sunday in the season finale.

A Tomlin is set to become the 11th different starter the Braves have used this season...The Braves have used the same five starters (RHP Mike Foltynewicz, RHP Mike Soroka, LHP Max Fried, RHP Julio Teheran, LHP Dallas Keuchel) over the last 47 games, with the rotation going 23-11 (.676) with a 3.54 ERA (104 ER/264.2 IP) during this stretch.
A RHP Kevin Gausman started on August 2, the last time the Braves did not use one of their five starters.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves will play their final four games of the season on the road, and will finish the regular season on Sunday in New York...The Braves have the best road record in the National League at 46-31, and trail only Minnesota (51-25, .671) and Tampa Bay (47-31, .603) for the major league lead.

A The Braves finished 47-34 (.580) away from SunTrust Park last season, tied for the best road record in the National League with Los Angeles.

A The Braves hit two home runs last night, giving them 114 away from SunTrust Park this season... They are now 10 away from the franchise record for most road homers in a single season.
A The 2003 and 1957 both hit 124 road home runs.

OZZIE HITS: 2B Ozzie Albies singled, doubled and homered last night, giving him 186 hits this year, which sets the single-season Atlanta-era record for most hits by a second baseman...Felix Millan set the previous record of 183 in 1970 .

A Albies' 186 hits are the second most in the NL, trailing Ketel Marte's $187 \ldots$...With Marte out for the remainder of the season, Albies is looking to become the fifth Atlanta-era player to lead the league in hits, joining Freddie Freeman (2018), Terry Pendleton (1991 and 1992), Ralph Garr (1974) and Felipe Alou (1966 and 1968).
A The Braves are looking to become the first National League team to have consecutive hit leaders since Chicago in 2005-2006...Derek Lee had 1999 in 2005 before Juan Pierre had 204 in 2006.

OZZIE RUNS: 2B Ozzie Albies scored his 99th and 100th run of the year last night, becoming the third Braves player to reach triple-digit runs scored this season.

A Along with Ronald Acuña Jr.'s National Leaguemost 127 runs and Freddie Freeman's 112, this Braves club became the fifth in modern-era franchise history to have a trio of players score double-digit runs...The 2003 club was the last do so, when a record five players scored 100 runs (Furcal, Giles, A. Jones, C. Jones, Sheffield)...The Milwaukee trio of Hank Aaron, Bill Bruton and Eddie Mathews did this twice, first in 1955 and again in 1960...The 1999 club was the other to accomplish this (Boone, C. Jones, Jordan).

A Boston's Mookie Betts, Xander Bogaerts and Rafael Devers are the only other trio in baseball this year to each score 100 runs.
A Acuña Jr. is within four of tying the franchise modern-era record for a single season...OF Dale Murphy scored 131 times in 1983.
OZZIE EXTRA-BASE HITS: 2B Ozzie Albies collected his 43rd double and 24th home run last night, and is looking to become the third player in franchise history with 45 doubles and 25 home runs in a season.
A Tommy Holmes was the first to do so, collecting 47 doubles and 28 homers in 1945...Hank Aaron was the other, finishing with 46 and 39 in 1959.
LOOKING AHEAD TO THE NLDS: The Braves were eliminated from the race for the top seed in the National League last night, and are set to open the postseason at SunTrust Park on Thursday, October 3 against the winner of the National League Central.
A The Braves have lost nine consecutive playoff rounds, dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona.
A That streak is the second longest in MLB history... The Braves last won a playoff round in 2001, sweeping Houston in the NLDS.
A Only Chicago (NL) owns a longer such skid, losing 10 consecutive rounds from 1910 through 1998

## Tonight's Game

A Makes his first start of the season and his 50th appearance.
A Set for his 145th career start...Spent the majority of his career as a starter with Cleveland, and is $57-50$ with a 4.67 ERA ( $439 \mathrm{ER} / 845.1 \mathrm{IP)}$ ) in the majors as a starter.

A Set for his 29th career appearance and 23rd start against the Royals, including his second game this season...Is 10-5 with a 3.85 ERA (64 ER/149.2 IP) in his first 28 games.
A Pitched 0.2 scoreless innings of relief against the Royals on July 23 at SunTrust Park.
A Three of his five career complete games have come against Kansas City, including his last on May 28, 2017...Allowed six hits and one run in Cleveland's 10-1 win.
Makes his eighth Interleague appearance of the season, and the 32nd of his career... Is his 22 nd career start against the opposing league.
A Is 11-6 with a 4.80 ERA (73 ER/137.0 IP) in his career in Interleague Play, including a 6.75 ERA (7 ER/9.1 IP) in seven games this season.
A Last made an Interleague start on April 24 of last season vs. the Cubs, and allowed seven hits and five runs in 3.2 innings.
A Has walked just seven batters in 75.1 innings this season.
$\mathcal{A}$ His rate of 0.84 walks per 9.0 innings is lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 75.0 innings of work.
A Has not walked more than one batter in a single outing this season.

A Is 2-1 with a 3.82 ERA (32 ER/75.1 IP) in 49 games this season.
A All 75.1 of his innings have come in relief, fifth most in the National League.
\& Recorded his first career save, $6 / 9$ at MIA, tossing 1.0 scoreless inning with a pair of strikeouts.
A Record his second save, 7/31 at WSH, with a scoreless bottom of the 10th.
A Is 2-for-4 in save chances this season.
A Pitched a career-most 5.0 innings of relief, $8 / 15 \mathrm{vs}$. NYM... Threw 67 pitches.
Allowed just three of 25 inherited runners to score (12.0\%).
A Is one of two pitchers in the majors to inherit at least 25 runners and allow no more than three to score...Cleveland's Nick Wittgren has allowed just two of his 26 inherited runners to score.
Atlanta signed him to a minor league contract on $3 / 21$, after he opened the spring season in camp with the Milwaukee Brewers.
A The Braves selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett on 3/28, and he made Atlanta's Opening Day roster.

A Prior to this season, spent his entire professional career with Cleveland after the club selected him in the 19th round of the 2006 draft out of Texas Tech University.
A Over parts of nine major league seasons with the Indians, went 61-53 with a 4.77 ERA (476 ER/898.2 IP).

Among all active pitchers in the majors with at least 900.0 innigs pitched, ranks first with just 1.29 walks per 9.0 innings in his career...Has walked 140 batters in 974.0 innigs.

A Masahiro Tanaka ranks second, with a 1.79 mark.
