**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners play the 2nd of 3 games against the Pittsburgh Pirates (1-0)...Seattle will also visit the Cleveland Guardians (3 G, 6/26-28) on the trip...the Mariners are coming off a 6-game homestand (3-3) against the Baltimore Orioles (2-1) and the Boston Red Sox (1-2)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** as sideline analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Shannon Drayer** on the call.

**ODDS & ENDS**...the Mariners won last night's game by a 3-2 score over the Pirates...Seattle is 16-10 (.615) over its last 26 games since May 25.

- **Still In First** - The Mariners (41-39) are in first place in the American League West Division, 2.5 games ahead of the second place Athletics (38-41) and Rangers (38-41).
- **Punching Tickets** - The Mariners starting pitching staff leads MLB in strikeouts this season with 450, ranking ahead of the next-closest Brewers (446 SO).
- **Vs. Pittsburgh** - Mariners hold an all time record of 17-9 (.667) against the Pirates, the 2nd best record against an opponent, trailing only their record against the Reds (.778/21-6).
- **Closing the Side** - **Andrés Muñoz** struck out the side in order to lock down the save in last night's game...it marks the 7th time he has accomplished the feat in a save opportunity and first since Sept. 19, 2024 vs. NYY.
- **Live! On a Prayer** - The Mariners will reach the half-way mark of their season following tonight's game.

**PHASE 1 OF ALL-STAR VOTING CONCLUDES TOMORROW MORNING**...Phase One of voting for the 2026 All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia is set to close at 9:00 a.m. PT tomorrow...in the most recent voting update from Major League Baseball on Monday, the Mariners had a player in the Top 10 of voting at every position...OF **Julio Rodríguez** and OF **Randy Arozarena** headline the list, ranking 5th and 6th among AL outfielders, respectively and are on pace to advance to Phase Two...fans can submit up to 5 ballots per day until the conclusion of Phase One this Thursday on June 25...Phase Two, which takes the finalists at each position, will run from June 29-July 2 before the All-Star rosters are announced on July 4...for more information and to vote, visit [Mariners.com/Vote](http://Mariners.com/Vote).

**WHAT A HOMECOMING FOR COLE YOUNG**...**Cole Young** yesterday played in his first career game in his hometown of Pittsburgh, going 1-for-3 with a walk and a go-ahead, 7th-inning, 2-run home run...over his last 24 games since May 27, he is batting .287 (27x94) with 12 runs, 1 double, 4 home runs, 10 RBI and a .752 OPS, reaching base safely in 20 of the 24 games...his defense has remained among the top infielders in MLB, with his 11 defensive runs saved (*Sports Info Solutions*) trailing only Matt Chapman-SF (13 DRS) among MLB infielders...Young leads AL second basemen with 2.3 wins above replacement (*Baseball-Reference*).

**RANDY AROZARENA IS BACK**...**Randy Arozarena** was activated from the 10-day Injured List (left hamstring strain) prior to yesterday's game...in 72 games this season, Arozarena is batting .287 (76x265) with 47 runs, 18 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 33 RBI and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .373 clip and slugging .442 for an .814 OPS and an 133 OPS+...among qualified AL outfielders he ranks 5th in OPS+, 1st in stolen bases, 2nd in average, 5th in OBP and 8th in OPS.

**LOGAN GILBERT AL PLAYER OF THE WEEK**...Major League Baseball announced Monday that right-handed pitcher **Logan Gilbert** was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 15-21...it is the second Player of the Week honor for Gilbert (also: July 3-9, 2023)...during his two starts during the week, he went 2-0 tossing 13.1 IP allowing 5 hits, 2 runs, 3 walks and 18 strikeouts...holding hitters to a .116 (5x43) average with only 1 extra-base hit and a .401 OPS.

**DOM CANZONE: JUNE PLAYER OF THE MONTH CANDIDATE?**...among American Leaguers with at least 60 plate appearances in the month of June, **Dominic Canzone** ranks T-5th in batting average (.352), T-8th in on-base percentage (.417), 3rd in slugging percentage (.667) and 4th in OPS (1.120)...in 19 games during the month, Dom is batting .352 (19x54) with 10 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 10 RBI and 5 walks with 34 total bases in 60 plate appearances.

**JUST JOSHING AROUND**...after batting .118 with a .390 OPS over his first 19 games this season, **Josh Naylor** is batting .302 (64x212) with 24 runs, 9 doubles, 6 home runs, 26 RBI and 14 stolen bases, getting on base at a .358 clip and slugging .429 (.787 OPS) over his last 54 games since April 17...during that span, he ranks 8th in the AL in average and 3rd in lowest strikeout rate (11.2%).

**JULIO IS APPROACHING**...**Julio Rodríguez** recently became the 3rd-fastest player in MLB history (665 G) to record 125+ 2B, 125+ HR and 125+ SB, trailing only Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (591 G) and Alfonso Soriano-NYY/TEX (643 G)...he also became just the 3rd player in franchise history to record 125+ doubles, 125+ homers and 125+ stolen bases, joining Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodríguez...in 79 games this season, Rodríguez is batting .244 (77x315) with 15 doubles, 14 home runs, 37 RBI and 10 stolen bases with a .733 OPS.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...the Mariners have excelled late in games, recording 17 go-ahead hits in the 7th-inning-or-later, tied for the 2nd-most in MLB this season trailing only the Yankees, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...**Cole Young** leads MLB with 5 go-ahead hits in the 7th-inning or later this season?...he ranks ahead of a trio of players with 4 such hits (Bobby Witt Jr.-KC, Bryan Reynolds-PIT and Richie Palacios-TB), and...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...that the Mariners lead MLB in go-ahead hits after the 6th inning since the 2022 season with 140?...current Mariners Josh Naylor (1st, 25) and Cal Raleigh (T-2nd, 21) rank among the leaders.

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 24

- **1997** - Randy Johnson sets an AL record for strikeouts by a left-handed pitcher after he K's 19 Athletics in a 4-1 loss vs. Oakland.
- **1998** - Ken Griffey Jr. belts HR #30 on the year and joins Mark McGwire as the only player with 30 homers before the break. Alex Rodriguez steals a career-high three bases and joins his second consecutive 20-20 club.
- **2012** - Starting pitcher Hector Noesi went 2-for-2 at the plate in 2-0 loss at San Diego. Noesi became the 2nd Mariners pitcher (3rd time) to record a multi-hit game, joining Freddy García (7/18/00 at ARI & 6/19/02 at CIN).
- **2016** - Adam Lind hit his 4th career walk-off home run, a 3-run blast to beat the Cardinals 4-3.
- **2025** - **Matt Brash** recorded his first save of the season in the 6-5 win over the Twins, extending his scoreless streak to 16 games since returning from the Injured List on May 3... Brash and **Andrés Muñoz** have become the first teammates to register 16+ game scoreless streaks to start their season since Oakland's Brad Ziegler (29 G, 5/31-8/12/2008) and Santiago Casilla (18 G, 3/26-5/6/2008) accomplished the feat to begin their 2008 season.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 16th start of the season and his 86th career start...is also making his 1st start against the Pirates this season and the 2nd of his career.
Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of California Polytechnic State University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 starts) for the Mustangs. Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.
Was selected to the 2025 American League All-Star team for the 1st time in his career.

LAST TIME OUT...W#6 on June 18 vs. Baltimore, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings and allowing 3 hits and 1 walk with 9 strikeouts...he threw 89 pitches (61 strikes) in his 4th consecutive scoreless start at home (5/6-c)...became 1 of 8 pitchers to throw 7.0+ IP without an earned run allowed in 3-or-more games this season.

MORE THAN BASEBALL...during his last start on June 18 vs. BAL, Woo was wearing custom cleats that were presented to him by 11-year-old Charlotte and 12-year-old Cooper on behalf of around two dozen patients at Seattle Children's who painted custom designs on the cleats.

NEARING 500 x 2...is approaching both 500 career innings (484.2 IP) and 500 career strikeouts (480 SO)...would become the 19th pitcher in Mariners history to record 500+ career innings and 500+ career strikeouts with the club, joining current teammates Logan Gilbert, George Kirby, and Luis Castillo.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES...is making his first career start at PNC Park and his 2nd ever start against Pirates, last throwing 6.0 scoreless innings with 3 hits, 2 walks, and 8 strikeouts on July 4, 2025 at T-Mobile Park...PNC Park is 1 of 7 ballparks Woo has yet to play at (also: ATL, CHC, COL, MIA, MIL, and PHI).

AGAINST THE NL...is 2-1 with a 3.91 ERA (10 ER, 23.0 IP) and 22 strikeouts across 4 starts this season against National League teams...across 20 career starts against NL teams, he is 9-5 with a 3.31 ERA (44 ER, 119.2 IP), 105 strikeouts and 21 walks allowed...among AL pitchers with 20+ starts against NL teams since 2023, he ranks T-3rd in WHIP (0.95), 5th in BB/9 (1.58) 6th in ERA and 7th in SO/BB (5.00).

WATCH ME WHIP...his 0.98 career WHIP is tied for 3rd-best in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing only Tarik Skubal-DET (0.92) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.94) while ranking alongside Zack Wheeler-PHI...his 0.984 career WHIP is also the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP).

SHUTTING IT DOWN...has thrown 6.0+ innings without an earned run allowed in 5 starts this season, including each of his last 4 starts at home (5/6-c)...is 1-of-6 pitchers with 5+ starts of 6.0+ IP and 0 ER this season...his 10 such starts since 2025 are T-6th most in MLB across that span...his 16 such starts across his career are T-11th most in franchise history, 1 game shy of tying Jim Beattie (19980-86) and Erik Hanson (1984-89) for 9th-most.

GOING THE DISTANCE...has thrown 6.0+ innings in 11 of his 15 starts this season and in 55 career starts...his 38 starts of 6.0+ IP since 2025 are most in MLB while his 275.2 IP since 2025 are 6th-most in MLB...has also thrown 9 quality starts this season and 30 total QS since 2025, most in the American League and 3rd-most in MLB across that span.

WOOOO...has tossed 7.0+ innings in 5 starts this season (last: 6/18 vs. BAL)...has made 6 starts of 7.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer hits allowed since 2025, most in MLB across that span while his 7 starts of 7.0+ IP and 3-or-fewer hits are T-4th since 2025...threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit on April 3 at LAA, his 3rd career start tossing 7.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits...his 3 such starts are 2nd-most in MLB since 2025, trailing Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD (4 G).

CRUISE CONTROL...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 9+ strikeouts in 5 games this season, tied for most such games in MLB, alongside Jacob Misiorowski-MIL and Christopher Sánchez-PHI...his 11 such starts since 2025 are 3rd-most in MLB trailing, Garrett Crochet-BOS (13) and Tarik Skubal-DET (13).

FEW FREE PASSES...among qualified pitchers since 2025, he ranks 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.50), 2nd in walks-per-nine (1.70), and 3rd in walk percentage (4.8%)...in addition, he has tossed 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks in 11 of his 15 starts this season and in 38 total starts since 2025, which leads MLB.

KEEPING BASE PATHS CLEAN...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 5-or-fewer baserunners allowed in 6 starts this season, tied for most in MLB (also: Shohei Ohtani-LAD, Jacob Misiorowski-MIL, and Paul Skenes-PIT)...his 17 such starts since 2025 are also tied for most in MLB across that span (also: Paul Skenes-PIT and Tarik Skubal-DET)...his 29 career starts of 6.0+ IP and 5-or-fewer base runners are T-5th most in Mariners history, alongside Hisashi Iwakuma...Woo's 9.30 base-runners per nine innings this season is T-8th among qualified players, while his 9.17 career BR/9 ranks 3rd-best since 2023.

COMMANDING THE ZONE...is 1 of just 4 pitchers with 450+ strikeouts and fewer than 100 walks allowed since 2023 (480 SO, 96 BB), joining teammate George Kirby (572 SO, 94 BB), Tarik Skubal-DET (628 SO, 90 BB), and Paul Skenes-PIT (493 SO, 92 BB).

WITHIN THE SPLITS...has yet to allow a run in the 4th inning across 14 games this season, limiting batters to a .070 average (3x43) and .130 OBP with a 10.93 SO/9, 5.67 SO/BB and 0.429 WHIP in the inning...is 1 of 3 pitchers with a 0.00 ERA in the 4th inning this season (min. 10+ IP).

IT'S BEEN DECIDED...has factored into the decision in each of his last 8 consecutive starts (5/6-c), going 5-3 across the 8-game stretch...it's his longest streak of decisions across his career, surpassing a 6-game streak from July 30-Aug. 27, 2025 (4-2)...Woo's 8-game streak with a decision is the longest by a Mariners pitcher since George Kirby's 9 consecutive starts from Aug. 14, 2025-April 24, 2026 (6-3).

WOO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.34 career ERA (180 ER, 484.2 IP) is a franchise-best mark among Mariners starters (min. 75 GS), ranking ahead of Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA.
