METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets swept a doubleheader against the Braves yesterday, winning game one 8-5 and game two, 6-2...The Mets have won 11 of their last 13 games and 15 of their last 20...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (8-2), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 53-11 when scoring first this season...New York is now 25-6-3 in 34 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (3-1), their longest of the year, against the Braves (3-1), Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

TAKE TWO: The Mets have swept two doubleheaders against the Atlanta this year... They won both games yesterday and both games on May 3 at Citi Field...According to Elias, this marks the second time in franchise history that the Mets have swept multiple doubleheaders against the Braves in a single season...The team did it one other time against the Braves in 1962 (May 12, May 20), when Braves were in located in Milwaukee then...The last time the Mets swept multiple doubleheaders against one team in a single season was in 1986...The Mets took both games against the Pittsburgh on June 15 and again on October 4.

BLACKJACK: The Mets have played 21 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in all 21 of their twinbills over the last two years...Elias notes the team's streak of 21 consecutive doubleheaders without being swept is the longest in Mets history...New York has swept four of their last seven doubleheaders, including three DH sweeps this season...The last time the Mets were swept in a doubleheader was September 26, 2020 at Washington.

PIX SIX: The Mets have scored six or more runs in a season-high five straight games... That is tied for the longest streak in the majors this season...It's their longest such streak since they set a franchise record with seven straight games with six or more runs from April 6-13, 2019...Over the last five games, the Mets have slashed .313/.389/.503 with 35 runs, and 19 extra-base hits.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets are 37-2 since May 27 when scoring at least four times... Overall, New York is 59-6 when scoring at least four runs in a game this year...The team's 59 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .907 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors.

JUST PEACHY: Jacob deGrom has a 1.96 career ERA against the Braves, the third-best mark all-time (min. 140.0 IP)...He has been even more dominant at home vs. Atlanta, posting a 1.30 ERA (10 ER/69.0 IP) with 91 strikeouts and just 10 walks in 11 starts...He has not allowed more than three runs in a home start against the Braves and has allowed more than three runs just once in 25 starts against the club overall.

IN DECITI: DeGrom today makes his 2022 home debut - a span of 396 days (July 7, 2021)...He has allowed more than three earned runs only once in his last 32 starts in Queens, posting a 1.60 ERA (36 earned runs/203.0 innings) at home since May 1, 2019...He had a 1.20 ERA (8 ER/60.0 IP) in 2021...His 2.10 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings) and the fifth-lowest all-time...The four pitchers with a better home ERA all had their careers end before 1930...He has not allowed more than two earned runs in his last 20 home starts, tied for the second-longest all-time...The only pitcher with a longer streak of starts with two or fewer ER allowed at home was Andrew Cashner (MLB-record 21 straight, 2013-2015)...Shohei Ohtani also had a 20-start streak that ended in May of this year.

MILESTONE ALERT: Today's start is the 200th of deGrom's career...The major league record for strikeouts through a pitcher's 200th career game belongs to Yu Darvish (1,517)...DeGrom enters today's game with 1,511 career punchouts...Carries a 2.49 lifetime ERA into this outing...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA after 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

NO MINOR THING: Brett Baty has been named the July MiLB Player of the Month for the Eastern League...Baty batted .365/.435/.688 and led the league in home runs (eight), RBI (27), total bases (66), slugging percentage (.688) and OPS (1.123)...He finished second in hits (35), third in average (.365), fifth in on-base percentage (.435) and sixth in runs (17). Baty had 13 multi-hit games and reached safely in 21 of 23 contests...He recorded a career-high seven RBI on Friday July 29 against New Hampshire, finishing 3-5 with two home runs, including a grand slam...From July 12-29, Baty hit .490 over a 12-game hit streak, nine of which were multi-hit games, including six consecutive, and hit five home runs, drove in 19 runs, and carried an OPS of 1.431...The 22-year-old was selected by the Mets in the first round (12th overall) of the 2019 MLB Draft out of Lake Travis High School in Austin, Texas.

HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK: The Mets are a season-high 30 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 32 games over with a record of 97-65 to end the 2006 season...New York has won 69 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .639 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 69-39 record through the team's first 108 games...Only the 1986 (73-35) team posted a better record through the first 108 games of the season.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East and 16 of their next 19 games vs. their division...The Mets are 8-2 during the stretch... Overall, the Mets are 36-14 against the East this year...Their .720 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...According to ESPN Stats & Info, New York has either won or tied each of their 15 series this season against the East...That is the third-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves went 16 straight to start the 1999 season...Since May 27, the team has gone 23-7 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.18 ERA against the East, while hitting .264/.342/.424...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents 260-166.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: Starting with this series, the Mets will play the Braves nine times over the next two weeks.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 11-4 in the second-half...The team's 11 wins are tied for the second-most in the majors, while their .733 winning percentage is second overall... The team is batting .298/.365/.484 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and are second in OBP and SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 81-56 following the break.

NINE IS FINE: Jeff McNeil is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .425 (17-40) with six runs, five doubles, two home runs, six RBI with a .439 OBP and a .700 SLG in that span... He has recorded six multi-hit games in that span...He has recorded 140 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 33rd in franchise history...Next up is John Milner at 141 multi-hit games.

DAY MAN: New York is 28-15 in day games this season...The team's .651 winning percentage in the sunlight is the third-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.09 ERA with 109 walks and 412 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.09 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL, while their 412 punchouts are fourth in the majors and the second-most in the Senior Circuit.

A CENTURY: Díaz has struck out 88 batters in 44 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season... The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019...His career-high best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019.

LET'S GO STREAKING!: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 17 outings dating back to June 22, covering 17.0 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...34 of Díaz last 47 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.38 ERA (one earned runs/23.2 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 50 strikeouts...He has converted all 14 saves in that period.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 88 strikeouts...That is 20 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.1% of batters faced (88/169), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 44 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.86 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 25 saves, a 1.42 ERA (seven earned runs/44.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 39-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In 15 games since the All-Star break, Pete Alonso is batting .393 (22-56) with 13 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI, nine walks with a .485 OBP and a .750 SLG...Alonso is tied for the major league lead with 93 RBI...He is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the NL with 29 home runs...Alonso is seventh in the majors and third in the NL with a .550 SLG.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played 52 games at Citi Field this year, which is tied for the fourth-fewest in the majors and tied for the third-fewest in the National League...By comparison, the Braves have played 59 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 34-18 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .654 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.41 ERA with 152 walks and 499 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the third-best home ERA in the NL.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor is on a 14-game on-base streak...Since July 23, he is batting .423 (22-52) with 14 runs, five doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, nine walks with a .500 OBP and a .692 SLG...In 32 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .328/.406/.560 with 23 runs, six doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 21 RBI, 16 walks and a .966 OPS...He ranks tied for third in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (28)...He ranks 10th in the majors and seventh in the National League with a 4.6 fWAR.

20/20 VISION: Francisco Lindor has recorded 77 RBI in 107 games this season (75 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He has hit 19 home runs this season (18 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 77 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with at least 75 RBI this year.

- Is third in the majors with 17 road home runs...Ranks seventh in Mets history with 77 career road homers...Dave Kingman (81) is next on the list.
- Named an All-Star for the second time...Drew a walk in his lone plate appearance in the Midsummer Classic...Reached the semifinals of the Home Run Derby.
- Broke David Wright's franchise record for first-half RBI, driving in 78 before the break...Wright drove in 74 before the break in 2006.

- Stole his 10th base of the season in the first half finale at Chicago-NL on July 17...Stole 10 bases all of last season...He is one of five players in the majors with 10+ home runs and 10+ steals in at least seven of the last eight seasons, joining José Ramírez, Trea Turner, Mookie Betts and Marcus Semien.
- Has 58 RBI and 50 runs scored in his last 73 games...Had a 10-game RBI streak from May 22-June 1 and had 20 RBI overall in that span...It was the longest streak in the majors this season and tied for the second-longest in Mets history...The only Met with a longer RBI streak is Mike Piazza (15 games).
- Has surpassed his season production from 2021 in hits, doubles and RBI...Had 16 home runs and 66 RBI in 92 first-half games this season...Last year, had 11 home runs and 36 RBI in 87 first-half games and finished the year with 20 home runs and 63 RBI in 125 games.
