TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 9-game road trip with the 2nd of 3 games against the Cleveland Guardians (1-0)...Seattle will also visit the Miami Marlins (3 G, June 21-23) and Tampa Bay Rays (3 G, June 24-26) on the trip...the Mariners are coming off a 7-game homestand (6-1) against the Chicago White Sox (3-1) and Texas Rangers (3-0)...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Mike Blowers on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports ( 710 AM) with Rick Rizzs and Gary Hill Jr. on the call.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners opened the road trip with an 8-5 victory over the Cleveland Guardians yesterday...the Mariners are 13-4 over their last 17 games ( $5 / 31-\mathrm{c}$ ) and $17-5$ over their last 22 games ( $5 / 26-\mathrm{c}$ )...the Mariners are 34-5 (.872) when scoring $4+$ runs in a game (2nd-best record in MLB behind the Yankees)...Seattle is $34-3$ when out-hitting its opponent.

- Buzzin' For A Bakers Dozen - Seattle (44-31) is a season-high 13 games above . 500 .
- Series-ly Sensational - The Mariners own a 13-4-1 series record over their last 18 series (4/15-c).
- Double Digits - Seattle (10.0 games up in the AL West) has the largest divisional lead in the Majors.
- Running Through the 6 - The Mariners are 37-14 (.725) when their starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings.
- Happy Birthday! - RHP Cody Bolton celebrates his 26th birthday today.

RIP TO THE SAY HEY KID...Willie Mays passed away yesterday at the age of 93...Mays had a profound impact on Mariners legend Ken Griffey Jr., who yesterday called him "the Godfather of all center fielders"... Griffey Jr. (630) and Mays (660) are the only 2 center fielders ( $\mathrm{min} .80 \%$ of career games in CF) with $600+$ career home runs, while they sit side-by-side on the all-time home run leaderboard.
BEST IN THE WEST...the Mariners (44-31) hold 1st place in the American League West Division by a season-high 10.0 games over the Houston Astros (33-40) and Texas Rangers (33-40) who are tied for 2nd place...Seattle has its largest divisional lead since the end of the 2001 season...the Mariners have held 1st place for 38 consecutive days (5/12-c).
VIVE LA FRANCE!...Ty France returned from the 10-day Injured List yesterday, going 0-for-2 with 3 walks...since May 13, Ty is batting .272 ( $22 \times 81$ ) with 9 runs, 5 doubles, 5 home runs, 16 RBI, 13 walks and 4 hit-by-pitch, getting on base at a 398 clip and slugging .519 (. 917 OPS)...among MLB first basemen with at least 90 plate appearances since May 13, France leads the Majors in wRC+ (167), while ranking among the leaders in OBP (2nd), SLG (5th) and OPS (4th).
ROAD D-MOLITION...Dylan Moore went 2 -for-4 with 3 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 1 RBI, 1 walk and 1 stolen base in yesterday's game...in 31 games this season on the road, Moore is batting . 278 (27x97) with 21 runs, 10 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 14 RBI and 8 stolen bases, getting on base at a .411 clip and slugging .557 (. 968 OPS)...among players with at least 100 plate appearances on the road this season, Moore ranks 8 th in OPS and 11th in slugging percentage.
BIG THUNDER STILL SWINGING IT...Luke Raley went 2 -for-5 with 1 run, 1 home run and 1 RBI in yesterday's game...over his last 51 games ( $4 / 15-\mathrm{c}$ ), Raley is batting .277 ( $43 \times 155$ ) with 23 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs, 19 RBI and 5 stolen bases, getting on base at a . 329 clip and slugging .484 (. 813 OPS)...during that span, Raley ranks 15 th among AL outfielders (min. 100 PA) with a $135 \mathrm{wRC}+$.
MASTERING THE MOUND...the Mariners pitching staff leads MLB in WHIP (1.06), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.41), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.53) and quality starts (46), while ranking 2 nd in opponent batting average (.216), 5th in ERA (3.43) and 3rd in fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.17).
WATCH US WHIP...Seattle has 3 starters that rank among the top-10 in the American League in WHIP this season: Logan Gilbert ( 0.92 WHIP, 3rd), Bryce Miller (1.01 WHIP, 9th) and George Kirby (1.01 WHIP, 10th), while Luis Castillo ranks 17th with a 1.14 WHIP...the last team to finish a season with 4 qualified pitchers posting a WHIP of 1.15-or-lower was the 2016 Chicago Cubs.
NEVER DONE WITH ONE-RUN...Seattle is 17-7 (.708) in 1 -run games, most 1 -run wins in the big leagues... Seattle's 1-run record is 2 nd-best in the Majors, trailing only Minnesota (14-5/.737) ...since Scott Servais took over as Mariners manager (2016-c), Seattle owns the most 1-run wins (231) and best 1-run winning percentage (.570/231-174) in the Majors during that span.
ANDRÉS MUÑOZ: AL ALL-STAR?...right-hander Andrés Muñoz has 13 saves and a 1.47 ERA (5 ER, 30.2 IP) with 42 strikeouts and 10 walks in 29 appearances this season...Muñoz has posted a 0.95 WHIP and limited opposing hitters to a .176 batting average...the 25 -year-old is 1 of 2 American League pitchers with 12+ saves and a sub-2.00 ERA this season, along with Emmanuel Clase-CLE...Muñoz has recorded 5 saves of at least 4 outs, the most in the Majors this season
GARV SAUCE...Mitch Garver went 2 -for- 5 with 2 doubles, and 2 RBI in yesterday's game, and has reached base safely in 11 of his last 14 games ( $6 / 2-c$ ), batting .250 ( $10 \times 40$ ) with 5 runs, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 13 RBI and 11 walks, getting on base at a 412 clip and slugging . 600 (1.012 OPS)...his 11 walks in June are tied for 5th-most in MLB, trailing only Juan Soto-NYY (18), Freddie Freeman-LAD (14), Aaron Judge-NYY (12) and Bryce Harper-PHI (12).
CAL RALEIGH? CAL RALLY!...Cal Raleigh has 24 RBI in the 7th inning and later this season, most in MLB...Raleigh is the only player in the Maiors with 3 go-ahead or game-tying home runs in the 9th inning or later this season, and is also the only player with 2 go-ahead grand slams...Cal is toting a . 956 OPS in "Late \& Close" situations on Baseball-Reference, batting $.250(11 \times 44)$ with 3 doubles, $4 \mathrm{HR}, 18 \mathrm{RBI}$ and 8 walks. STOP IT!...Seattle's infield defense has impressed with its . 987 fielding percentage ( 18 errors in 1,340 total chances) between 1B/2B/3B/SS ranking 2nd-best in the American League behind Minnesota (.988)...Josh Rojas' 7 Outs Above Average are the most among third basemen via Baseball Savant...J.P. Crawford leads MLB shortstops in fielding percentage (.994), committing just 1 error across 164 total chances
THE NEXT HOMESTAND...following the current road trip, the Mariners will return home for 9 -game homestand from June 28-July 7, hosting the Minnesota Twins (3 G, June 28-30), Baltimore Orioles (3 G, July 2-4) and Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, July 5-7)...upcoming promotions on the homestand include J.P. Crawford "City Connect" Bobblehead Night on June 28, Aloha Shirt Night on June 29, Bark at the Park on July 2, Patriotic Fireworks on July 3 and Patriotic Cap on July 4.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Bryan Woo is $3-0$ with a 1.07 ERA (4 ER, 33.2 IP), 2 walks, 24 strikeouts and a 0.54 WHIP in 6 starts this season, the lowest ERA through a pitcher's first 6 starts of a season in franchise history, and...YOU MAY ALSO KNOW...that Woo ranks among the league leaders (min. 30.0 IP) in WHIP (1st), ERA (2nd), BB/9 (1st, 0.53), and SO/BB (1st, 12.00), while opponents are slashing just .139/.160/.183 (.342 OPS) the lowest in the Majors in each category, but...DID YOU KNOW? ...that Woo's 342 opponent OPS is the 3rd-lowest in as single season (min. 30.0 IP ) in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)?...he trails only Ed Roebuck-WSH/PHI (. 271 in 1964) and Mike Adams-SD (. 315 in 2009).

## ABOUT BRYAN WOO.

- The 24-year-old right-handed pitcher is making his 7th start of the season tonight and his 1st against Cleveland...it is his 25th Major League start and 1st career start against the Guardians.
- Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
- Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances ( 6 GS ) for the Mustangs.
- Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.

LAST TIME OUT...W\#3 on 6/6 at Oakland...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed 2 hits with 0 walks and 6 strikeouts...recorded his 4th quality start of the season...marks his 2nd start of 6.0+ innings and 2-or-fewer hits.
WOO THE GREAT...when pitching 6.0+ innings he is 4 -for-4 in quality starts... in 4 of his 6 starts he has allowed 0 runs... he is also the $2 n d$ pitcher in MLB history with a sub-1.20 ERA and 12.0+ strikeout-to-walk ratio thru his first 6 starts of a season, joining Cliff Lee-CLE in 2008.
MAKING HIS WAY...his 1.07 ERA through 6 starts this season is the best mark in franchise history...he is in front of Erik Hanson (1.29) and Randy Johnson (1.21).

PITCHING POWERHOUSE ...is averaging 13.0 pitches-per-inning, which is the 2nd-best mark in the Majors this season (Tyler Holton-DET, 12.7)...his 13.0 pitches-per-inning is tied for the 26th best mark since at least 1988 (min. 30 Pitch.

HIT LIMITER...in 13 of his 24 career starts he has allowed 3 -or-less hits...Woo allowed 3 -or-less hits with $4.0+$ innings pitched in each of his first 3 starts to begin the year...he has had 3 -or-less hits in 5 out of 6 games this season.
LIKE HE NEVER LEFT....has begun the year with only 19 baserunners allowed ( 16 hits, 3 BB) across his 6 starts ( 33.2 IP)...in his first 3 starts he is the only pitcher this season to allow 8 baserunners.
MAKING UP FOR MISSED TIME...leads MLB in WHIP (0.53), on-base percentage against (.160), OPS against (.342), opponent slugging percentage (.183) and ranks 5th in batting average against (.139) (min. 30 IP).

WHAT A WOO-DERFUL TIME...the right-hander is the 4 th pitcher in franchise history to allow no more than 1 run across his first 3 starts of a season...Bryce Miller in 2023 (1 ER, 19.0 IP), Logan Gilbert in 2022 (1 ER, 16.2 IP) and James Paxton in 2017 (0 ER, 21.0 IP) are the previous Mariners to do so.

TWENTY WOO...recorded 101 strikeouts through his first 20 career starts...became the 8th player in franchise history with at least 100 strikeouts in his first 20 career starts, joining Félix Hernández (124), Michael Pineda (123), George Kirby (109), Logan Gilbert (106), Mark Langston (105), Roenis Elías (104) and Bryce Miller (100).
FIRST THINGS FIRST...in his first time through the order this season, opposing hitters are hitting . 094 ( $5 \times 53$ ) with 1 walks and 13 strikeouts.
MAKING A MARK ...in his start against the New York Yankees on $5 / 21$ he pitched 6.0 scoreless innings with 2 hits and 7 strikeouts...it is the first game in his career where he's pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed 2 or fewer hits....he became the first pitcher in the Majors this season to toss 6.0+ scoreless innings while allowing 2-or-fewer hits against the Yankees this season.
REHAB RECAP...began the 2024 season on the 15-day Injured List with right medial elbow inflammation...in 3 games with the Rainiers during his rehab assignment, had a 0.00 ERA ( 0 ER, 11.1 IP ), with 0 walks and 17 strikeouts...opponents hit just . 128 ( $5 \times 39$ ) with 2 extra-base hits ( 2 doubles).
ABOUT LAST YEAR ...started in 18 games and had a 4.21 ERA (41 ER, 87.2 IP) with 31 walks and 93 strikeouts...among rookie pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched in 2023, he ranked 6th in SO/9 (9.55), 7th in WHIP (1.21) and 7th in Opp. AVG (.225).
EXPECTATIONS...finished 2023 with a .227 ( $75 \times 331$ ) batting average against, a .393 opponent slugging percentage and a 4.21 ERA ( 41 ER, 87.2 IP)....per Baseball Savant, all three were higher than their expected value...with his xBA at .219, xSLG at . 348 and xERA of 3.45.
IN THE ZONE...allowed 31 walks while striking out 93 batters in 2023...he had a 3.00 strikeout-to-walk ratio...owned a 9.55 strikeouts-pernine which ranked 2nd on team among starters behind Luis Castillo (10.0) (min. 80 IP)...Woo's 3.2 walks-per-nine ranked 5th among Mariners starters.
IN THE WIN COLUMN...Woo earned his 1st career win on 6/22/23 against New York-AL...he carried a no-hitter into the 6th inning before giving up a 1-out single to Gleyber Torres....he became the 5th Mariners pitcher last season to carry a no-hitter into the 6th inning (also: Bryce Miller, Logan Gilbert, Luis Castillo and Easton McGee).
