That's How Winning Is Done! The Brewers are 12-1 (.923) in their last 13 games.													
A Series Matter The Brewers have won 8 of their last 9 series, including 5 in a row.....their only series loss in this stretch came from 7/2-7/3 at New York-NL (1-2).													
Home Brewed The Brewers are 10-1 in their last 11 home games with a season-high 6-game winning streak.													
Cal's Streak Freddy Peralta has won each of his last 7 starts.....he is the first Brewers pitcher to do so since Cal Eldred won a franchise-record 10 consecutive starts from 8/8-9/29, 1992.													
Homebody Freddy Peralta is 7-0 with a 1.53 ERA in 10 home starts this season.....the team has gone 9-1 in those outings (58.2ip, 42h, 10r, 10er, 12bb, 62k, 3hr).													
That's a Fact, Jack! Jackson Chourio enters the day on a career-high 17-game hitting streak, batting .373 (25-for-67) with 3 HR and 15 RBI.....during this streak, he has a .403 OBP/.567 SLG/.970 OPS.													
Let's Touch Base Christian Yelich has reached base safely in 29 consecutive games, batting .325 (37-for-114) with 6 HR and 24 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .379 OBP/.535 SLG/.914 OPS..... he is a game from tying his career high (30 games, 8/11-9/15, 2018).													
Making a Run at It Christian Yelich needs just 4 runs for 1,000 in his Major League career.													

TODAY'S GAME: Is game 1 of a 6-game homestand against Miami (3g) and Chicago-NL (3g).....the Brewers are coming off a 5-1 road trip to Los Angeles-NL (3-0) and Seattle (2-1).....following an off day next Thursday, the team returns to the road for a 6-game trip to Washington (3g) and Atlanta (3g).
IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: 1B/OF Jake Bauers (left shoulder), LHP Nestor Cortes (left elbow), OF Sal Frelick (left hamstring), LHP Robert Gasser (left elbow), 1B Rhys Hoskins (left thumb), OF Garrett Mitchell (left oblique), LHP Connor Thomas (left elbow) and LHP Rob Zastryzny (ribs) are on the injured list.....Cortes, Gasser, Mitchell and Thomas are on the 60-day IL.
IN THE STANDINGS (129 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 15*, SECOND: 57, THIRD: 43, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently in first place, leading the second-place Cubs by 1.0 game (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).
SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The team is 20-11-2 in series play. Game 1: 20-13, Game 2: 20-13, Game 3: 18-14, Game 4: 3-1 Sweeps (6): vs. BOS (3g, 5/26-5/28), at PHI (3g, 5/30-6/1), at MIN (3g, 6/20-6/22), vs. LAD (3g, 7/7-7/9), vs. WSH (3g, 7/11-7/13) and at LAD (3g, 7/18-7/20) Were Swept (1): at NYY (3g, 3/27-3/30)
AT HOME: The team is 33-17 at home, going 12-4-0 in series play.....are 21-8 in the last 29 home games, including 10-1 in the last 11 with a season-high 6 straight wins.
ON THE ROAD: The team is 28-24 on the road, going 8-7-2 in series play.....are 18-6 in the last 24 road games.....have had three season-high 5-game road winning streaks, coming from 5/25-6/2, 6/19-7/2 and 7/6-7/21.
MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.
COACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).....first base coach Julio Borbón , lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the staff.
LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 15 replay challenges this season, going 9-6.....their last challenge (won) came on 7/7 vs. Los Angeles-NL as an out call at third base involving Isaac Collins was overturned.
BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.
BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24).....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 727 wins since 2017 (4th in MLB/2nd in National League).

PERALTA AT A GLANCE: All-Star Freddy Peralta, 29, will make his 22nd start of the season and first against the Marlins.....he last started last Saturday at Los Angeles-NL and earned an 8-7 win (5ip, 5h, 4r, 4er, 3bb, 4k, 1hr, 1wp, 93 pitches).....the team is 14-7 in his starts.....he has 9 quality starts.....opponents are batting .201 (86-for-427, 13hr).....he has won each of his last 7 starts, posting a 3.18 ERA (39.2ip, 28h, 14r, 14er, 9bb, 44k, 4hr).....Peralta was acquired from Seattle with RHP Carlos Herrera and RHP Daniel Missaki for 1B Adam Lind on 12/9/15.....on 2/28/20, he signed a 5-year contract through the 2024 season with club options for 2025 and 2026.

RIGHT SAID FRED: Peralta leads the Major Leagues with his career-high-tying 12 wins [also 2023].....he is also among National League leaders in opponent AVG (4th, .201), H/9IP (6th, 6.63), ERA (7th, 2.85) and WHIP (9th, 1.08).

FREDDY K-RUEGER: Peralta has 1,071 career strikeouts, trailing only **Yovani Gallardo** (1,226), **Ben Sheets** (1,206) and **Teddy Higuera** (1,081) on the all-time franchise list.

CAREER: Is 65-40 with a 3.67 ERA and 1 save in 199 games/150 starts (871ip, 355er).....is in his eighth Major League season, all with the Brewers (2018-25).....is 57-38 with a 3.65 ERA as a starter (787ip, 319er) and 8-2 with a 3.86 ERA in relief (84ip, 36er).....was an All-Star in 2021 and 2025.....was the Opening Day starter in 2024 and 2025.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 38-19 with a 3.27 ERA in 105 games/77 starts (465.2ip, 169er).....is 7-0 with a 1.53 ERA in 10 starts this season (58.2ip, 10er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 27-21 with a 4.13 ERA in 94 games/73 starts (405.1ip, 186er).....is 5-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 11 starts this season (58ip, 27er).

CAREER vs. MARLINS: Has gone 3-4 with a 4.31 ERA in 10 games/7 starts against Miami (39.2ip, 36h, 21r, 19er, 11bb, 49k, 8hr), including 0-2 with a 2.92 ERA in 2 starts last season (12.1ip, 10h, 6r, 4er, 6bb, 11k, 3hr).
