**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game homestand today with the second game of a three-game set vs. Toronto (0-1 thus far)...will also face Detroit in a three-game series from Tues.-Thurs....went 5-2 on their recent road trip after going 3-1 at Chicago-AL and 2-1 at Houston.

- ▶ **Their 78-63 (.553) record is the third-best in the AL,** trailing only Toronto (82-59, .582) and Detroit (81-61, .570).
- ▶ Have won six of their last seven completed series (since 8/11).
- ▶ **Are 9-3 in their last 12 games (since 8/24), 14-6 in their last 20 games (since 8/15), 16-7 in their last 23 games (since 8/11), 17-8 in their last 25 games (since 8/9) and a Major League-best 18-9 in their last 27 games (since 8/6).**
- ▶ Their +137 run differential is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (+165).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees fell to the Blue Jays, 7-1, in their series opener on Friday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Cam Schittler** (1.2IP, 5H, 4R/ER, 2BB, 2K, OHR, 1HP) started and took his third loss of the year after allowing a career-high 4R/ER in only 1.2IP...**LHP Ryan Yarbrough** (5.1IP, 3H, 1R/ER, OBB, 3K, 1HR) made his first appearance since being reinstated from the I.L. and allowed only 1R/ER over 5.1 innings of relief...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) recorded two of the Yankees' four hits and drove in the Yankees' only run with a solo home run in the second inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 1BB) reached base twice.

**STANTON ISLAND:** **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** recorded two of the Yankees' four hits and drove in the Yankees' only run with a solo home run in the second inning on Friday vs. Toronto...marked his 19th home run of the year...has 3HR in his last five games vs. the Blue Jays (since 7/2/25) and 6HR in his last 13 games against Toronto (since 4/6/24).

- ▶ **Has hit 2HR in his last three games (since 9/3), 7HR in his last 15 games (since 8/19), 9HR in his last 19 games (since 8/11), 15HR in his last 35 games (since 7/21), 18HR in his last 43 games (since 7/8) and 19HR in his last 47 games (since 7/2).**
- ▶ **His 19HR since 7/2 are the third-most in the Majors over that span** (second in AL), trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (24HR) and Tampa Bay's Junior Caminero (20HR).
- ▶ Is hitting .309/.377/.734 (43-for-139) with 28R, 5 doubles, 18HR, 41RBI, 14BB/2IBB and 1HP over his last 44 games (since 7/6)...among Major League batters over that span (min. 125PA), ranks second in the Majors in SLG (second in AL) and OPS (1.110, second in AL), is tied for third in HR (tied for second in AL) and tied for sixth in RBI (tied for fourth in AL).

**KING OF THE GIL:** **RHP Luis Gil** will make his seventh start of the season today vs. Toronto...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last five starts (since 8/9), going 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA (26.0IP, 7ER) in that span.**

**BRONX BOMBERS:** **Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 242HR this season, 36 more than the next highest team (Los Angeles-NL: 206HR) and 42 more than the next highest AL team (Seattle: 200HR)...their 242HR this season are the fifth-most by any Major League team through their first 141 games of a season,** trailing only the 2023 Atlanta Braves (273HR), 2019 Minnesota Twins (272HR), 2019 Yankees (263HR) and 2019 Los Angeles Dodgers (248HR).

- ▶ Have homered in a season-high 13 straight games (since 8/23), hitting 32HR over that span...marks their longest streak since a 13-game streak from 5/21-6/4/24...their last longer streak was a 19-game streak from 7/13-8/3/22.
- ▶ Have hit multiple home runs in three of their last four games (since 9/2), seven of their last nine games (since 8/27) and nine of their last 12 games (since 8/24).
- ▶ Have hit 59HR in their last 23 games (since 8/11).
- ▶ **The Yankees have six players with at least 20HR this year, tied with Chicago-NL for the most in the Majors** (Judge-43HR, Grisham-30HR, Chisholm Jr.-28HR, Bellinger-27HR, Rice-22HR, Wells-20HR)...**marks the sixth time in franchise history the Yankees have had at least six players hit at least 20HR...**had seven such players in 2009 and 2019, and six in 1961, 2004 and 2018.

**FAN-TASTIC:** The Yankees recorded their 19th sellout of the season with a paid attendance of 46,055 on Friday vs. Toronto...**their 19 sellouts this year are their third-most in a single season at the current Yankee Stadium, trailing only their 23 sellouts in 2018 and 20 in 2011.**

▶ **Have averaged 42,623 fans per home gate this season, marking their second-highest average attendance through their first 69 gates of a season over the last nine full-attendance seasons (since 2015),** trailing only their 43,148 average home attendance in 2018...**own the highest average home attendance in the American League and the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (49,809).**

**PITCH PERFECT:** **Yankees pitchers** have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 17 of their last 23 games (since 8/11) and 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of those games, posting a Major League-best 3.38 ERA (208.0IP, 78ER) over that span.

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** reached base twice on Friday vs. Toronto...started in right field for the first time since 7/25 vs. Philadelphia...has reached base safely in 116 of his 131 games this year, batting .322/.442/.661 (153-for-475) with 112R, 28 doubles, 2 triples, 43HR, 97RBI, 101BB/30IBB, 5HP, 5SF and 95B...leads the Majors in BA by eight points, OBP by 41 points, SLG by 58 points and OPS by 114 points...his 7.8 WAR (FanGraphs) is 0.4 higher than the next highest player (Seattle's Cal Raleigh: 7.4 WAR).

- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in a Major League-leading 85 games this season.
- ▶ Has batted .333/.500/.636 (11-for-33) with 10R, 1 double, 3HR, 4RBI, 10BB/1IBB, 1HP and 15B over his last nine games (since 8/27).
- ▶ His 41HR vs. the Blue Jays are the most by a Yankee against Toronto in franchise history...also marks the second-most HR by any player vs. a single opponent since 2017, trailing only his own 48HR vs. Baltimore...**has hit 6HR in his last 15 games (since 6/30/24) against Toronto and 13HR in his last 33 games vs. Toronto (since 5/15/23).**
- ▶ Has reached base safely in 32-of-36 games vs. the AL East this year, hitting .331/.444/.639 (44-for-133) with 27R, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR, 24RBI, 26BB/9IBB, 1HP and 25B.

**MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham** has hit a career-high 30HR in 124G this season after hitting 9HR in 76G in 2024...ranks second on the team in home runs, trailing only Aaron Judge (43).

- ▶ **Has hit 5HR over his last nine games (since 8/27), 7HR over his last 12 games (since 8/24) and 9HR over his last 16 games (since 8/20).**
- ▶ **His 13HR since 7/30 are the third-most in the Majors over that span,** trailing only Tampa Bay's Junior Caminero (14HR) and Chicago-AL's Colson Montgomery (14HR).
- ▶ Is hitting .286/.434/.786 (12-for-42) with 12R, 7HR, 16RBI, 10BB, 1HP and 25B in his last 12 games (since 8/24).
- ▶ Has posted a .964 OPS over his last 25 games (since 8/9).

**GOT YOUR NUMBER: OF Jasson Dominguez** has hit .667/.667/1.333 (6-for-9) with 1 double, 1 triple and 1HR in his career vs. Toronto's RHP Chris Bassitt.

**BUNKER MENTALITY:** Beginning at approx. 11:00 a.m. today, the **Ryder Cup Trophy** will be on the field, and media members are welcome to take photos with it...additionally, PGA of America President **Don Rea** will be throwing the ceremonial first pitch...the Ryder Cup tournament will take place from 9/23-28 on Long Island at Bethpage Black.

**FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers** have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 of their last 12 starts (since 8/24), going 8-1 with a 2.19 ERA (65.2IP, 16ER) and 59K over that span...**have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 24 of their last 28 starts (since 8/5), posting a Major League-best 2.78 ERA (152.1IP, 47ER) over that span** (next: Pittsburgh: 3.23).

**AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells** has hit .381/.458/.952 (8-for-21) with 7R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 5RBI and 3BB over his last seven games (since 8/27).

**PEN PAL: LHP Ryan Yarbrough** made his first appearance since being reinstated from the I.L. and first since 6/18 vs. Los Angeles-AL, allowing only 1R/ER over 5.1 innings of relief on Friday vs. Toronto (3H, OBB, 3K, 1HR)...marked the longest relief appearance by a Yankee since Jhony Brito tossed 5.1 innings of relief on 5/15/23 at Toronto...is only the fourth Yankees reliever to toss at least 5.1IP in a game in the last 10 years (since 2016), joining Brito, Michael King (6.0IP on 4/4/21 vs. Toronto) and David Hale (5.2IP on 7/6/18 at Toronto).

- ▶ Over his last 11 games (eight starts), has gone 3-1 with a 3.24 ERA (50.0IP, 18ER) over that span (since 4/21).
- ▶ Has tossed at least 5.0IP and allowed 2R-or-fewer in six of his last eight games (since 5/11).

**SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger** is batting .329/.370/.575 (24-for-73) with 11R, 3 doubles, 5HR, 18RBI, 6BB, 2SF and 15B over his last 18 games (since 8/17).

- ▶ Has hit .342/.399/.583 (41-for-120) with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR, 62RBI, 16BB/1IBB and 75F with RISP this season.
- ▶ Has hit .301/.338/.561 (81-for-269) with 41R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 18HR, 51RBI, 16BB, 2SF and 45B over his last 66 games (since 6/17).

**McMAHON OF THE HOUR: INF Ryan McMahon** is batting .321/.394/.643 (9-for-28) with 7R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 7RBI, 4BB and 15F over his last nine games (since 8/27).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (2-1, 3.68 ERA)

**RHP Luis Gil** will make his seventh start this season in today's game vs. Toronto...the 27-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his sixth start of the season on Sunday at Chicago-AL, allowing 2R/ER over 5.1IP and did not record a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last five starts (since 8/9), going 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA (26.0IP, 7ER) in that span**...has tossed at least 5.0IP in each of those starts...in six starts this season, has gone 2-1 with a 3.68 ERA (29.1IP, 28H, 13R/12ER, 19BB, 29K, 2HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 60-day injured list on 8/3...made four combined rehab starts with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, posting a 5.65 ERA (14.1IP, 11H, 9R/ER, 7BB, 24K, 4HR)...missed the first 111 games of the season on the 60-day injured list (3/24-8/3) with a right lat strain...was named the Jackie Robinson American League Rookie of the Year in 2024 after going 15-7 with a 3.50 ERA (151.2IP, 104H, 60R/59ER, 77BB, 171K, 18HR) in 29 starts for the Yankees...**was the 10th player and fourth pitcher in franchise history to be named the AL Rookie of the Year**...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 29 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 18 of his starts and one-or-zero runs in 17 of his starts (including six scoreless starts)...**his 17 starts of one-or-zero runs allowed were the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Jack Chesbro (18 starts in 1904), Whitey Ford (18 starts in 1964) and Ron Guidry (18 starts in 1978)...*Elias* notes his 17 such starts were the second-most in Major League history by any rookie pitcher in a single season (since 1893 when current mound distance was set, excluding openers), trailing only Philadelphia-NL's George McQuillan's 21 starts in 1908...**his 171K were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's 209K in 1910**...in 42 career Major League starts, has gone 18-9 with a 3.57 ERA (214.1IP, 157H, 88R/85ER, 117BB, 243K, 24HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 32 of his first 42 career starts and one-or-zero runs in 22 of those starts...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Made his sixth start of the season on Sunday at Chicago-AL, allowing 2R/ER over 5.1IP and did not record a decision (4H, 2BB, 7K, 1HR)...was his fifth consecutive start of allowing 2R-or-fewer (since 8/9)...**marks the second-longest such streak of his career, trailing only his seven-start streak from 5/1-6/4/24**.

**ON A ROLL:** **Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last five starts (since 8/9), going 2-0 with a 2.42 ERA (26.0IP, 7ER) in that span**...has tossed at least 5.0IP in each of those starts.

- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in five of his six starts and 1R-or-fewer in two starts.
- ✦ Has allowed 1HR-or-fewer in each of his six starts this season and has not allowed a HR in four starts, posting a 0.61 HR/9.0 ratio.
- ✦ Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in three of his six starts this season.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Will be making his fourth home start of the season today...in three starts at Yankee Stadium this year, has gone 1-0 with a 2.35 ERA (15.1IP, 4ER) and 15K...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those starts.

- ✦ In 15 home starts last season, went 6-4 with a 3.57 ERA (75.2IP, 51H, 31R/30ER, 38BB, 93K, 11HR)...posted a .184/.294/.361 (51-for-277) slash line at Yankee Stadium in 2024...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 15 home starts and one-or-zero runs in nine of those starts (three scoreless starts)...11 of his 31R were allowed in two starts (7R on 6/20 vs. Baltimore and 4R on 7/2 vs. Cincinnati).
- ✦ In 24 career home starts, is 8-5 with a 3.29 ERA (120.1IP, 86H, 47R/44ER, 67BB, 146K, 16HR)...has held opponents to a .194/.308/.354 (86-for-443) slash line...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 20 of his 24 home starts and one-or-zero runs in 13 of those starts (six scoreless)...has recorded six-or-more strikeouts in 14 of his 24 career home starts and eight-or-more strikeouts in seven of those starts.

**VS. TORONTO:** Will be making his fourth career start vs. Toronto...in three starts vs. the Blue Jays, has gone 0-1 with a 5.68 ERA (12.2IP, 8ER) and 20K.

- ✦ Made two starts against Toronto in 2024, going 0-1 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1IP, 5ER) and 14K.

**2024:** Was named the Jackie Robinson American League Rookie of the Year after going 15-7 with a 3.50 ERA (151.2IP, 104H, 60R/59ER, 77BB, 171K, 18HR) in 29 starts for the Yankees...opponents batted .189/.297/.345 (104-for-550, 18HR); LH .210/.314/.393 (55-for-262, 10HR); RH .170/.282/.302 (49-for-288, 8HR).

- ✦ **Was the 10th player and fourth pitcher in franchise history to be named the AL Rookie of the Year**...joined Aaron Judge (2017), Derek Jeter (1996), Dave Righetti (1981), Thurman Munson (1970), Stan Bahnsen (1968), Tom Tresh (1962), Tony Kubek (1957), Bob Grim (1954) and Gil McDougald (1951)...**was the fifth Dominican-born player and the second pitcher to be named AL Rookie of the Year**, joining Julio Rodríguez (2022), Neftali Feliz (2010), Angel Berroa (2003) and Alfredo Griffin (1979).
- ✦ Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 29 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 18 of his starts and one-or-zero runs in 17 of his starts (including six scoreless starts)...his 17 starts of one-or-zero runs allowed were tied with Detroit's Tarik Skubal and Chicago-AL's Garrett Crochet for the most such starts in the Majors...**his 17 starts of one-or-zero runs allowed were the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Jack Chesbro (18 starts in 1904), Whitey Ford (18 starts in 1964) and Ron Guidry (18 starts in 1978)...*Elias* notes his 17 such starts were the second-most in Major League history by any rookie pitcher in a single season (since 1893 when current mound distance was set, excluding openers), trailing only Philadelphia-NL's George McQuillan's 21 starts in 1908.
- ✦ **According to *Elias*, his six scoreless starts were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's eight such starts in 1910**.
- ✦ Among Major League pitchers that tossed at least 150.0IP, ranked second in opponents' BA (.189, first in AL), third in H/9.0IP (6.17, second in AL) and tied for seventh in wins (15, tied for fifth in AL)...among AL pitchers (min. 150.0IP), ranked fourth in K/9.0IP (10.15), sixth in opponents' SLG (.345) and 10th in opponents' OPS (.643).
