FIRST-PLACE REDS

For the **last 6 days** the Reds have at least shared first place in the **NL Central** and for the third straight day are in **first place alone**... prior to Tue hadn't held the top spot alone since **3/30/19**, when following a rainout of that season's second game they had a **1-0 record** and a lead in the **NL Central** of **.033 percentage points** over the **Brewers**...Tue and Wed held a **1.0-game lead**, their first division lead of at least 1.0g since **5/7/17** following **Scott Feldman's** 4-0 shutout vs **Johnny Cueto** and the Giants...haven't held a division lead of **more than 1.0g** since a season-high **1.5-game cushion** on **4/18/17**.

STREAKING

The Redlegs have begun a season with a **5-1 record** for the first time since **2016**...haven't begun a season **6-1** since **1994**...their active **5-game winning streak** is the **longest active streak** in the Major Leagues and 1 game shy of last season's high (6g, 9/13-9/18).

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Jonathan India leads the National League in hitting (.476) and ranks second with **10 RBI**, tied for **fifth-most** in Major League history by a player in his **first 6 career apps** behind only **Dale Alexander** (13 RBI in 1939), **Trevor Story** (12 in 2016), **Nico Hoerner** (11 in 2019) and **Mandy Brooks** (11 in 1925)...the RBI became an official statistic in **1920**.

LEADING OFF

Tyler Naquin is tied for the Major League lead in HR (4) and leads the National League in RBI (13)...on Tue and Wed vs Pit he became the first Reds batter with a **leadoff HR** in consecutive apps since **Eddie Milner** did it on **6/24 vs SD & 6/25 at SF, 1984**...**Pete Rose** (1976) and **Gary Redus** (1983) are the only other Reds batters with **leadoff HR** in consecutive apps...no Reds batter has produced 3 consecutive leadoff HR...**Naquin's 7 RBI** on Tue vs Pit tie **Brandon Phillips** (7/30/15 vs Pit) for the most in a game by a **Reds leadoff batter** since the statistic became official in 1920.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is the **Diamondbacks' 2021 home opener** and **Game 1** of the Reds' **first road trip** of the season (0-0 at Ari, 3g at SF)...the Redlegs began the **2021 championship season** with a **5-1 homestand** vs the **Cardinals** (2-1) and **Pirates** (3-0)...following this road trip return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the **Indians** (3g, off day) and these **Diamondbacks** (3g).

IN MEMORIAM: As part of tonight's Opening Night ceremonies the Diamondbacks will honor **Mike Bell**, who during spring training died of cancer at **age 46**...**Mike** is the son of **Buddy Bell**, the Reds' Vice President, Senior Advisor to President of Baseball Operations, and brother of Reds manager **David Bell**...**Mike** spent **13 years** working in the Diamondbacks' player development department before joining the Twins' Major League coaching staff in 2020...Reds Chief Executive Officer **Bob Castellini** said, "This great baseball family blessed thousands of people over the 70 years it has devoted to our game. We are honored that Mike, like his grandfather Gus, his father Buddy and brother David, wore a Reds uniform."...**Mike** appeared in 19 games for the Reds in **2000**...**Buddy** played for the Reds from **1985-1988**...**Gus** played for the Reds from **1953-1961** and was inducted into their Hall of Fame in **1964**...**David** and **Mike** graduated from **Archbishop Moeller High School** in Cincinnati.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Diamondbacks are meeting for the first time since 2019...the Reds are **5-3** in their **last 8 games** at **Chase Field**...are **34-19 at Ari** with the ballpark roof closed and **6-12** with the roof open...Cin won its **first 7 games** here until a 9-6 loss on **7/1/00**.

TAXI SQUAD: The **Taxi Squad** for the Reds' first road trip of the season includes **RHP Heath Hembree**, **RHP Art Warren**, **C Beau Taylor**, **IF Max Schrock** and **OF Mark Payton**...bio information on the members of the **Taxi Squad** is available on **Page 6**.

HISTORIC: Reds batters have produced **57 runs** runs, the highest total in franchise history through the first 6 games of a season...**Reds batters** lead the Major Leagues in runs scored, RBI, batting average and slugging percentage while ranking second in the majors in home runs and on-base percentage.

ALL-STAR GAME STATEMENT: The decision to move the **All-Star Game** was made by the Commissioner **Rob Manfred** and Major League Baseball...the Reds will support the **All-Star Game** wherever it is played because it is so important to baseball...we thank the **Colorado Rockies** and the city of **Denver** for agreeing to host the All-Star Game, to make sure this important jewel event takes place.

SHADES OF GRAY: RHP **Sonny Gray** (muscle strain in his back) on Monday at the alternate site in Louisville pitched in the scrimmage vs Royals affiliate **NW Arkansas**...**Gray** started and threw 60 pitches in 4.2 innings without issue.

DISCIPLINED: Reds RF **Nick Castellanos** on Monday received from **Major League Baseball** a **2-game suspension** and an **undisclosed fine** for his aggressive actions and for instigating a benches-clearing incident in the bottom of the fourth inning of Sat's 9-6 win vs StL...he will continue to play **while he appeals** the suspension...teammates **Eugenio Suárez** and **Jesse Winker** also were fined undisclosed amounts, as were **Nolan Arenado**, **Jordan Hicks** and **Yadier Molina** of the Cardinals...in the fourth inning, **Castellanos** was ejected for the first time in his career after play was halted for 10 minutes when benches cleared...he reached base that inning when he was hit in the ribs by a **Jake Woodford** pitch and later scored on a wild pitch.

VOTTO RETURNS: **1B Joey Votto** on Opening Day was reinstated from the injured list...he **missed 13 days** of spring training camp (3/8-3/20) after testing positive for the **COVID-19 virus**...returned to camp on **3/21** and 5 days later was back in the starting lineup...played in 3 of the Reds' last 4 spring games...the **2010 MVP** and **6-time All-Star** gave the team permission to disclose the positive test result.

SHIFTING: Beginning with an exhibition game on 3/16, **Eugenio Suárez** made his last 10 starts of the spring at **shortstop** and **Mike Moustakas** made his last 9 starts at **third base**...**Jonathan India** led the team with 16 spring training starts at **second base**...in 2015, **Suárez** led the Reds in starts **SS** but in each of the last 5 seasons led the team in starts at **3B**...he holds the National League record for **home runs** by a **third baseman** (49hr in 2019)...in the first 9 seasons of his Major League career through 2019, **Moustakas** made **1,042 apps** at **3B** and **47 apps** at **2B**...he received **Rawlings Gold Glove Award** votes for defensive excellence at **third base** in 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2019, finishing second in the balloting in 2012...last season he played **second base** full-time for the first time in his career and led the Reds in games at that position.

2020 RED HOTS

- The **2020 Championship Season** was shortened to **60 games** by a global pandemic fueled by the **COVID-19 virus**.
- With 7-2 win at Min in the **58th game** of the season, the Reds clinched their first **Postseason berth** since **2013**...**Joey Votto** was the only player or coach remaining from that **2013 club**.
- Reds won their **last 5 series** of the regular season, including **4 series wins** vs **Postseason teams** (StL, Mil, WSox, Min).
- The Reds were the **only road team** to win a series at Min's **Target Field**, where the **Twins** finished with the best home record in the **Major Leagues** at **24-7**.
- The Reds joined the **1906 White Sox** and **2007 Diamondbacks** as the only teams ever to **finish last** in the league in **batting average** and still earn a **Postseason berth**.
- Became the first Reds team, since 1900, with **more walks** (239) than **singles** (221).

WELCOME: In the **2020 Opening Day** win vs the Tigers, **OF Shogo Akimaya** became the first player **born in Japan** to appear in a game for the Reds...**Akiyama** pinch hit for **Phillip Ervin** in the sixth inning and produced an RBI-single off **José Cisnero**...prior to 2020, Cincinnati was the only Major League franchise never to have an appearance by a player born in that country...prior to this 2021 season, **70 players** born in Japan appeared in at least 1 Major League game, including **9 last season**.

RED HOTS

- Last name rhymes with rally.
- Doesn't turn 27 years old until 9/29 but already has completed 4 Major League seasons.
- Made his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster and started the second game of this championship season.
- Has made 62 of his 63 Major League apps as a starting pitcher...made his only relief appearance, following 54 career starts, on 8/12/20 vs KC...entered that 5-4 loss in the second inning to replace starter Wade Miley...is his only professional relief appearance since 2015, when he made 26 starts and 1 relief appearance.
- During the 2020 season, opponents hit just .198.
- Was on the Reds' 2020 Wild Card Series roster but didn't pitch in the 2-game series sweep loss at Atl.
- In 2020 pitched out of the starting rotation in each of his first 2 apps (0-0, 1.80, .194oba) and in each of his last 7 apps (2-2, 3.67, .198oba).
- From 8/28-9/8 produced 3 consecutive quality starts, tying his career high (1-1, 3.48).
- In the minor leagues threw a no-hitter on 6/13/16 for Class A Daytona at Jupiter in which he faced the minimum 27 batters (4-0 win, 6k, 1hbp, 105 pitches) and a 9-inning perfect game on 4/22/17 for Class AA Pensacola at Mobile (1-0 win, 8k, 88 pitches, 68 strikes).
- In 2015 received the Sheldon "Chief" Bender Award as the Reds' Minor League Player of the Year.

RED HOTS

- Is making his second start of the 2020 season and his sixth career start vs the Diamondacks, his first vs Ari since 2019.
- Is in his first season with the Reds.
- Threw 5.0 innings in his season debut, a 12-1 win vs StL in the Reds' third game of the season...became the first pitcher to throw at least 5.0 innings in his Reds debut since Tyler Mahle threw 5.0 innings on 8/27/17 vs Pit.
- On 11/25/20 was acquired from the Rockies, along with minor league RHP Case Williams, for RHP Robert Stephenson and minor league OF Jameson Hannah.
- In 2020 for the Rockies made 16 apps, a single-season career-high in relief, during the shortened season.
- 8 times last year threw more than 1.0 inning, including a career-high 3.0 innings in relief on 8/8 at Sea.
- In that 5-0 win on 8/8 at Sea, allowed the only Mariners hit in the fifth combined 1-hitter in Rockies history.
- Was selected by the Blue Jays in the first round (9th overall) of the June 2014 first-year player draft...was rated the No. 13 prospect in that draft...became East Carolina University's highest pick in any MLB, NBA, NHL or NFL draft.
- Prior to that June 2014 draft, had "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow after experiencing soreness during his final season at East Carolina University.
- Made his Major League debut in 2016, just his second as a professional, with 8 apps for the Rockies.

- In 2020 led the National League with 615 strikeouts (504ip), a new NL record for strikeouts by pitchers through the first 60 games of a season (590, 2018 Nationals)...the Indians led the Major Leagues with 621 strikeouts (536ip), a new Major League record for strikeouts by pitchers through the first 60 games (619, 2018 Astros).

REDS STARTERS

Homestand: 4-1, 3.73

- During this 5-game winning streak have posted an ERA of 1.61 (28ip, 5er).
- Have thrown 17.0 scoreless innings since José De León allowed a pair of HR in the first inning of Mon's 5-3 win vs Pit (De Leon 4ip, Wade Miley 6ip, Luis Castillo 7ip).
- In 2020 led the National League and ranked second in the Major Leagues with 381 strikeouts in 311.1 innings (Cle, 3401k, 349.2ip)...allowed 34 HR, third-fewest among Major League rotations (Min 30, Mil 33).

- This spring was 1 of 18 players invited to early minor league camp, then on 3/12 officially was added to the Major League spring training camp roster.
