WHAT'S BREWING?

Flipped the Calendar After going 0-4 in March, the Brewers hold the best record in the majors in April at 7-1 (.875) ahead of five teams at 6-2 (.750)....Milwaukee is tied for second in the majors in runs (51) and ranks third in ERA (2.07) in April.

Busting Out The Bats

The Brewers scored 17 runs yesterday at Colorado, marking the team's most runs since a 19-2 win at Pittsburgh on 7/1/22....it was the team's largest margin of victory since a 16-1 win at Miami on 9/22/23.....the Brewers have plated 39 runs over their last 4 games (9.8 runs per game).

Rocky Mountain High Last night's 17-2 win marked the Brewers' largest margin of victory ever against the Rockies.....the 17 runs scored were also a high vs. Colorado

Take 5

The Brewers scored 5 or more runs in three innings in a game for the first time in franchise history last night....Milwaukee plated 5 runs in the third and fifth innings and capped the game with 7 runs in the ninth inning.

Since going 0-for-5 with 5 strikeouts on Opening Day, **Jackson Chourio** has hit safely in 11 consecutive games, batting .347 [17-for-49, 4hr, 16rbi] with a .340 OBP/.755 SLG/1.095 OPS....it marks the second longest hitting streak of his career behind a 12-game run from 6/23-7/6, 2024.

Tap the Rockies
With last night's win, the Brewers
secured their first series win at Coors Field since taking 3 of 4 games from 5/10-5/13, 2018....Milwaukee is aiming for just its third sweep in Denver in franchise history and first since 6/20-6/22, 2014 (3g).

TODAY'S GAME: Is game 3 of a 6-game road trip to Colorado (2-0) and Arizona (3g)... the Brewers are coming off a 5-2 homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Cincinnati (3-1).....following this trip, the team returns to American Family Field for a 6-game, 7-day homestand against Detroit (3g) and the Athletics (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....Murphy was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after guiding the team to a 93-69 record and the NL Central division championship.....he became the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026

CDACHES: Returning from the 2024 coaching staff is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role)....first base coach Julio Borbón, lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

2024 IN REVIEW: The Brewers went 93-69 and finished in first place in the NL Central, 10.0 games ahead of the Cardinals and Cubs.....they tied the Padres for the fourth-best record in baseball behind the Dodgers (98-64), Phillies (95-67) and Yankees (94-68).... the Brewers lost to the Mets, 2 games to 1, in the NL Wild Card Series in Milwaukee.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times over the last seven seasons (missed in 2022) and have won the NL Central in four of the last seven seasons, three of the last four, and two straight.....the Brewers are one of just five teams to qualify for the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons.....they are joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24).....this does not include the shortened 2020 season.....the Brewers have 673 wins since 2017, which ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League.....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight consecutive seasons, missing out by just a game in both 2017 and 2022.

TODAY'S STARTER: #46 - RHP QUINN PRIESTER (SEASON DEBUT)

PRIESTER AT A GLANCE: Quinn Priester, 24, will be making his season and Brewers debut.....he was acquired from Boston on Monday in exchange for OF Yophery Rodriguez, a Competitive Balance Round A selection and a player to be named.....Priester began the season at Triple-A Worcester, where he made his only appearance in a start last Thursday, taking a 5-1 loss (4ip, 6h, 2r, 2er, 0bb, 6k, 1wp, 87 pitches).

LAST SEASON: Priester went 3-6 with a 4.71 ERA in 11 games/7 starts between Pittsburgh (10g/6gs) and Boston (1g)....his teams went 1-6 in his starts....he had 2 quality starts.....opponents batted .277 (56-for-202, 7hr)....he went 1-5 with a 4.42 ERA as a starter (36.2ip, 18er) and 2-1 with a 5.54 ERA as a reliever (13ip, 8er)....he was traded by Pittsburgh to Boston on 7/29/24 in exchange for INF/DF Nick Yorke.

CAREER: Is 6-9 with a 6.23 ERA in 21 games/15 starts (99.2ip, 69er) while pitching for Pittsburgh (2023-24) and Boston (2024).....he is 3-8 with a 6.22 ERA as a starter (76.2ip, 53er) and 3-1 with a 6.26 ERA as a reliever (23ip, 16er).....Priester was selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (18th overall) of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Cary-Grove (IL) High School.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Has gone 26-17 with a 3.61 ERA in 87 games/84 starts while pitching in the Pittsburgh (2019-24), Boston (2024) and Milwaukee (2025) organizations (408.2ip, 361h, 188r, 164er, 149bb, 428k, 27hr).....has held opponents to a .235 batting average.....was a 2023 International League All-Star and Triple-A Indianapolis Pitcher of the Year....was named Pirates Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2022.....was selected to the All-Star Futures Game in 2021.....was a 2021 East League All-Star and High-A East League Pitcher of the Year.
