**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals fly to the Queen City to begin a four-game series/road trip with the division-rival Cincinnati Reds at Great American Ball Park ... St. Louis took two-of-three from the Brewers over the weekend at Busch Stadium.

**FLIGHT PATTERN:** The Cardinals enter today in 4th place in the National League Central Division, 4.5 games behind first place Chicago ... St. Louis has won four-of-five home series (10-5, .667), but yet to have win a road series (2-11, .154) ... Their 2-11 road record is the Cardinals slowest road start since the 1973 Redbirds (2-11) through 13 games away from St. Louis.

**BARRERO JOINS ST. LOUIS:** Prior to tonight's series opener, the Cardinals selected the contract of INF/OF **Jose Barrero** from Memphis (AAA), optioned INF **Thomas Saggese** to Memphis, and designated RHP **Ryan Loutos** for assignment ... The 27-year-old Barrero opened the season batting .301/.396/.530 (25-83) with four home runs, 13 RBI, and five stolen bases in 22 games with the Redbirds (AAA), while reaching base safely in his last 18 games since April 4 ... The former Reds 2021 Minor League Player of the Year and No. 1 prospect in 2023 played 139 games over parts of four seasons with Cincinnati (2020-23).

**NAVY HATS:** The Cardinals will wear their navy road hats tonight for the first time this season, which are typically worn against teams with primary red team colors (at Cincinnati, Washington, and LA Angels) ... St. Louis was 5-6 in navy hats last season (2-4 at Cincinnati).

**DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT:** **Brendan Donovan** continues his hot start, ranking among MLB leaders in batting average (.359, 3rd) and hits (37, T-3rd) ... His 37 hits tie **Edgar Renteria** (37 in 2003) for 2nd-most in the months of March/April in franchise history behind **Paul DeJong** (40 in 2019) ... Since 2023, Donovan leads MLB in batting average (.355), OBP (.467), and OPS (1.105) against Cincinnati.

**GIVING THEM THE WILLIES:** **Willson Contreras** is batting .371/.463/.514 (13-35) over his season-long nine-game hitting streak, 6th-longest active in MLB ... Contreras has homered (18 HR) against the Reds more than against any opponent, while his 10 blasts at Great American Ball Park are his most at any road stadium (excluding Busch Stadium & Wrigley Field).

**NOOOOOOOT** Leadoff hitter **Lars Nootbaar** has drawn 10 walks to open games this season, breaking **Davey Lopes's** (1975 Dodgers) MLB single-season record in the months of March/April ... The single-season monthly Major League record for leadoff walks is held by **Eddie Yost** aka "The Walking Man" with 12 in August of 1952 with the Washington Senators ... Nootbaar has reached base safely 52 times this season, tied for 5th-most in the months of March/April in franchise history and most among Cards leadoff hitters ... **Albert Pujols** (67 in 2008) holds the franchise record.

**GETTING DEFENSIVE:** The Cardinals lead Major League Baseball in Outs Above Average (17), Runs Prevented (14) and Fan-raphs' Defensive Runs Above Average (9.9), while ranking 6th in Defensive Runs Saved (13), T-3rd in fielding percentage (.989), and 7th in Groundball Out Pct. (77.0%).

**WINNING:** SS **Masyn Winn** is averaging 90.9 mph on the top 5% of his throws, 2nd-fastest among MLB infielders behind Cincinnati's SS **Elly De La Cruz** (93.0 mph) ... Winn ranks among MLB shortstops in fielding pct. (1.000, T-1st) range factor/game (4.78, 1st), outs above average (4, T-2nd), runs prevented (3, T-2nd), and Defensive Runs Above Average (3.8, 3rd).

#### CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Late Reds Executive Advisor **Walt Jocketty** served as the Cardinals GM for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, St. Louis compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06).

**José Barrero** played 139 games over parts of four seasons (2020-23) with Cincinnati...previously rated by *Baseball America* as the Reds No. 1 prospect and "Best Defensive Infielder" in 2023...2021 Reds Minor League Player of the Year...Originally signed with the Reds organization as an international free agent (June 10, 2017).

**Terry Francona** played in 86 games in 1990 with the Louisville Redbirds (AAA), including five at pitcher...his father, **Tito Francona**, played parts of two seasons (1965-66) with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade by Cleveland in exchange for a player to be named (Dec. 15, 1964)...originally signed by the St. Louis Browns before the 1952 season (MLB debut for Baltimore in 1956).

Reds pitching coach **Derek Johnson** played baseball & coached at Eastern Illinois Univ. (1991-94)...coached at Southern Illinois Univ.(1995-97)...was **Sonny Gray's** pitching coach at Vanderbilt Univ.

**Sonny Gray** pitched three seasons with Cincinnati (2019-21)...named a 2019 NL All-Star.

**Riley O'Brien** made his MLB debut with Cincinnati (Sept. 28, 2021 at Guaranteed Rate Field).

**Steven Matz** (June 28, 2015 at Citi Field) made his MLB debut vs. the Reds.

Reds Bullpen Coach **Matt Tracy** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College High School.

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons with the Reds (2009-12)...won the 2010 Gold Glove and was a two-time All-Star (2010-11).

**Randy Wynne** played college baseball at Missouri Baptist University in St. Louis.

**Julio Rangel** served as Bullpen Coach for the Reds in 2019.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for Cincinnati in 1996.

Reds Senior Advisor to the GM **Cam Bonifay** played two minor league seasons with the Cardinals...worked for St Louis as a professional scout and special assistant.

Tonight's Game:

- Making his 6th start of the season tonight, as he makes his 36th career start in his 144th career game.
- It's his 4th road start of the season; the Cardinals are 1-2 in his three prior road starts (4/6 at BOS, 4/17 at NYM & 4/22 at ATL) and 2-0 in his home starts.
- Is 3-6, 4.30 ERA in 17 career road starts; His last road win came on 8/23/24 at MIN (6-1).
- Tonight will be his 6th career start vs. CIN (his most against any team)**, but his just 2nd at Great American Ball Park; He posted a 5-3 win here on 5/29/24.
- Since returning to the Cardinals starting rotation on May 26, 2024 he has led the team in wins (10, tied with **Sonny Gray**), qualifying ERA (3.65) and opponent BA (.233) in 25 starts; He's one of just 17 National League starting pitchers with 10+ wins dating back to his insertion into the rotation last May 26.
- Is leading the MLB with his 67.4 groundball pct. & is ranked 2nd in Groundball/Flyball ratio at 3.86 behind the Angels Jose Soriano (4.08).** Since he started his career in 2022, has the 2nd-best ground ball percentage (66.3%) in MLB trailing only the Mets **Clay Holmes** (66.9%). min. 140 appearances.
- Since moving into the Cardinals starting rotation 5/26/24 he's 4th among NL starters in opponent's slugging pct. (.347); has a .422 Opp. SLG pct. this season.**
- As a starting pitcher in 2024 was 8-7 with a 3.56 ERA over 20 starts after going 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA in nine relief appearances in April.
- Ranked 3rd on the Cardinals with eight wins in 2024 while his 3.78 ERA was the lowest among the club's pitchers with 100 or more innings.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed 4 runs on 7 hits in his start last Tue. (4/22) at ATL as he matched his shortest outing of the season with 4.1 IP; took a no decision in the Cardinals 10-7 win as they combined for 6 runs scored in their final two innings. He allowed multiple HR's (2) for the 1st time this season and just the 2nd time over the past two seasons (2024-25).

2025/Career Notes:

- Made the Cardinals Opening Day Roster for the 4th time (2022-2025).
- Suffered his 1st loss of the season on 4/17 at NYM in the opening game of the Cardinals last road trip; threw a season-high 95 pitches over 6.0 IP with all 4 of his runs allowed in the 4-1 defeat coming in the Mets 2nd inning
- Improved his record to 2-0 in a combined 2-0 shutout win over the Philadelphia Phillies 4/11 at Busch Stadium, allowing just 2 hits in his 7.0 IP (93 pitches). After an injury to Masyn Winn, catcher Pedro Pages played 4 innings (2nd thru 5th) of that game at 2nd base.
- Took a no-decision in the Cardinals 5-4 loss in extra innings in Game 1 of 4/6 doubleheader at Boston
- Utilized as a hybrid pitcher during his 2022 rookie season with 47 appearances and 10 starts. Led the Cardinals with 62 relief appearances in 2023. Began the 2024 season in the bullpen, was optioned on April 21, and returned to the rotation on May 26 finishing the season with 20 starts as one of the Cardinals most effective starters.
- Established single-season highs in wins (8), games started (20), innings pitched (121.1), strikeouts (94) and quality starts (7) in 2024.
- His first start came in his 18th career appearance, on June 4, 2022 at Chicago Cubs in the second game of a doubleheader. Threw 4.0 innings allowing one run in a no-decision the Cardinals rallied to win in extra innings (7-4).
- Started vs. San Francisco (June 20, 2024) at Rickwood Field in Birmingham, Ala., tossing 5.1 innings in the 6-5 Cardinals win. Was the first Cardinals starting pitcher to earn a win at a neutral site since Alan Benes vs. San Diego on April 19, 1997 at Aloha Stadium in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- Pitched for Team Italy in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.
- The San Clemente, Calif. native was 4th round (125th player overall) draft selection in 2019 out of University California-Irvine.
- Graduated from San Clemente High School that also produced Cardinals 2021 1st round pick RHP Michael McGreevy and Braves 2015 1st round pick Kolby Allard.

Pallante vs. Cincinnati:

- Tonight will be his 6th career start vs. CIN (his most against any team)**, but just his 2nd career start at Great American Ball Park; He posted a 5-3 win here on 5/29/24.
- Is 5-1 with a 1.83 ERA (39.1 IP/8 ER) in 15 career games against the Reds, including his 5 starts, and the Cardinals are 10-5 in those 15 contests.
- In his 5 careers starts vs. CIN, has gone 4-1 with a 2.03 ERA; Won each of his 1st four career starts against the Reds before losing in his last meeting (3-0) on 9/10/24 at STL.
- Went 2-1 in three starts vs. CIN last season, recording a 1.65 ERA and .224 Opp. BA, but walked 11 batters over 16.1 IP.
- Has yet to allow a HR when pitching against the Reds during his career among 171 batters faced.**
- His 5 career wins, 39.1 IP and 32 strikeouts vs. CIN are his most against any team.
