ROSTER MOVES—The Rays have placed CF **Kevin Kiermaier** on the COVID-19 Related IL (general illness/symptoms) and selected RH **Joey Krehbiel** (KRAY-bull) from Triple-A Durham...Krehbiel was teammates with **Brett Phillips** at Seminole High School and committed to USF before signing with the Angels as a 12th-round selection in the 2011 Amateur Draft.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have won back-to-back games and three of the last 4 games following a 5-7 stretch from Sep 1-13...last night the Rays improved to 7-38 when trailing after 8 innings, 7-12 in extra-inning games, 2-6 at home in extras and recorded their sixth walk-off win of the season, first since July 21 vs. BAL...at 36 games over .500, the Rays are one shy of matching their high-water mark of the season...entering 2021, their most in the history of the franchise was 34 games over .500 (2008)...the Rays are 21-9 in their last 30 games and AL-best 39-19 since the All-Star break.

- + Last night marked the first time the Rays won on a walk-off homer since Sep 24, 2019 vs. NYY (**Ji-Man Choi**)...they scored 3 runs in the 9th inning to erase a 4-1 deficit, the first time they won after trailing by 3 runs (or more) in the 9th since **Daniel Robertson** hit the only walk-off grand slam in club history on July 22, 2018 vs. MIA.
- + The Rays have won a majors-most 9 games this season in which they trailed by 3 runs (or more) in the 6th inning or later, according to the Elias Sports Bureau (Pirates, 7)...last night marked their first win of this type since Aug 28 at BAL (trailed 3-0, won 4-3)...the Rays have trailed in 47.8 pct. (44 of 92) of their wins this season and their 44 come-from-behind wins lead the majors (Boston, 43).
- + The Rays have led the AL East since the end of play on July 31, a run of 50 consecutive days since then...they currently hold an 8½-game lead in the division and will set a franchise record for most consecutive days alone in first place at the end of play on Sep 20.
- + The Rays have reached 90 wins for the eighth time in club history, all in the last 14 seasons...only three other teams have a chance to reach 90 wins for the eighth time since 2008: Dodgers (9, includes this season), Yankees (7) and Red Sox (7)...the Rays became the first AL team to 90 after being the first previously to 80, 70, 40 and 30.
- + With 14 games remaining, the Rays are on pace to go 100-62, which would set a franchise record for wins in a single season over 2008 (97-65)...they would need to go 8-6 or better to reach 100 wins.
- + The Rays are 19-11 vs. AL Central opponents and 11-3 at home.
- + The Rays are a majors-best 38-17 (.691) in day games this season.

UNDER THE DOME—The Rays are 47-26 (.644) at home this season, 4th in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind the White Sox (49-27)...the Rays have a 2.98 ERA at home, which leads the AL over the Astros (3.49) and ranks 2nd in MLB behind the Dodgers (2.92)...the Rays are 40-14 (.741) at home since May 13, best in MLB ahead of the Dodgers (42-18), and have outscored opponents by 142 runs (312-170) over this span...this comes on the heels of a 7-12 start, which was 28th in the majors through May 12.

- + The Rays lead the majors with 428 runs scored on the road, but they rank 8th with 365 runs scored at home...their 116 HR on the road rank 2nd in the majors but their 90 HR at home rank 16th.
- + The Rays haven't been swept at home (regardless of series length) since April 19-21, 2019 vs. BOS (0-3)...no other team in the majors has gone as long since being swept at home, and the Rays are one of two to not be swept at home since the start of 2020 (Dodgers).

IT TAKES A VILLAGE—This season the Rays have used 59 players and 36 pitchers (excluding position players), both of which are franchise records...the previous highs were 57 players used and 31 pitchers in 2019.

- + The Rays have 10 players with 10 HR (or more), matching the club record from 2006 and tied with the Giants for most in the majors...the Rays have 14 players with 5+ HR, tied for 5th in the majors.
- + Excluding the shortened 2020 season, the Rays are attempting to join the 2018 Dodgers and 2017 Astros as the only teams in major league history to win their division without a qualifying pitcher.
- + The Rays have 13 pitchers with a save, breaking a tie with the 2020 Rays and 1973 Rangers for a major league record...the Rays had 11 pitchers with a save in 2019, 12 in 2020 and 13 in 2021, the first team to have 10+ pitchers with one in three straight seasons...since the All-Star break, 10 Rays pitchers have combined for 15 saves.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays lead the majors with 793 runs scored over Houston (785) and rank 1st in the majors at 5.36 runs per game by a slim margin over the Astros (5.34)...the 793 runs scored rank 3rd for a

single season in club history behind 2009 (803) and 2010 (802)...the Rays have held the major league lead in runs scored since the end of play on Aug 29, the latest in a season by games or date they have led the majors.

- + Since the July 23 debut of **Nelson Cruz**, the Rays have scored 319 runs in 51 games, leading the majors over the Blue Jays (297)...the Rays are averaging 6.25 runs per game since his debut, a mark that hasn't been reached in a full season since the 1950 Red Sox (6.67)...the Rays have scored 7+ runs in 52.9 pct. (27 of 51) of their games since Cruz debuted for them, compared to 30.9 pct. before that.
- + The Rays have increased their major league rank in runs scored in five straight years, from 25th in 2017 to 16th, T-15th, 12th and 1st.
- + The Rays rank 6th in the majors with 206 HR and 6th with 529 BB, and rank 7th in the AL with a .318 OBP and 6th in avg. with RISP/2 out (.237)...the Rays rank 2nd in the majors with 1,423 SO and rank 8th in the AL in overall avg. (.240) and 9th in avg. with RISP (.252)...their strikeout rate reached 28.2 pct. in May but has since dropped to 25.1 in June, 24.4 in July, 22.5 in August and 21.6 in September.
- + The Rays have a club-record nine grand slams, most in the AL and tied with the Dodgers for 3rd in the majors behind the Rockies (11) and Braves (10)...the Rays are batting .397/.460/.733 (46-for-116) with the bases loaded, leading MLB in avg., on-base pct. and slugging pct.
- + Since the All-Star break, the Rays rank 2nd in MLB with 96 HR.
- + This season the Rays are batting .296 (243-for-822) with RISP in the 92 wins, compared to .164 (68-for-414) with RISP in the 56 losses.

FASHIONABLY LATE—The Rays have scored a franchise-record and major-league-most 298 runs in the 7th inning or later (Giants, 255), including a majors-most 107 runs in the 8th (Phillies, 98) and majors-most 79 runs in the 9th (Padres, 63)...the Rays are on pace for 326 runs in the 7th inning or later, which would be the most for a club since the 2009 Yankees (336)...the Rays have outscored their opponents, 298-186, in these frames, and the 186 runs allowed are the 4th-fewest in the majors behind the Padres (178), Mets (182) and Indians (184)...their +112 differential in the 7th inning or later leads the majors ahead of the Padres (+57) and Giants (+50).

HERE'S THE PITCH—The Rays have pitched to a 3.78 ERA this season, 7th in the majors and 4th in the AL, and their 75 games of allowing 3 runs (or fewer) are one shy of the Astros for most in the AL...the Rays are attempting to finish among the majors' top ten in ERA for a fifth straight season.

- + Since June 15—the day after **Tyler Glasnow** left his start with injury—Rays starters are 21-15 with a 4.93 ERA (372.2-IP, 204-ER) in 81 games, the 9th-highest ERA in the majors...before that, Rays starters ranked 8th in the majors and 2nd in the AL with a 3.49 ERA.
- + The Rays led the AL in ERA as late as the end of play on Aug 10 but since then have a 4.41 ERA (314-IP, 154-ER) in their last 35 games.
- + The Rays bullpen has pitched to a 3.27 ERA this season, best in the AL over the Yankees (3.62) and 3rd in the majors behind the Giants (3.08) and Dodgers (3.12)...the bullpen leads the majors with 54 wins and 636.2 IP and leads the AL with a 1.15 WHIP and .293 OBP...the bullpen has yielded 2 runs spanning 18 IP over the last 4 games.

RAYS vs. TIGERS—Today marks the sixth of 7 games in the season series, all over a stretch of 10 days...the Rays are 3-2 against them (2-0 at home, 1-2 on the road) and held a lead in the 7th inning or later of both losses...the Rays are 80-80 all-time against the Tigers (43-37 at home, 37-43 on the road) and have won the last three season series...the Rays are 16-7 against them since the start of the 2017 season after going 14-26 from 2011-16.

- + The Rays are 10-1 against them at home since April 18, 2017.
- + Last night marked the 11th time in club history the Rays won in walk-off fashion over the Tigers and second walk-off homer, joining a **Jonny Gomes** 2-run shot on July 9, 2005 off **Troy Percival**.

BACKSTOP POP—**Mike Zunino** has homered in back-to-back games and has 31 HR this season, extending club records both among primary catchers and while playing the position...his 31 HR are tied with BAL/CHW **Charles Johnson** in 2000 for 5th in AL history among catchers (while playing the position), trailing TEX **Iván Rodríguez** (35) in 1999, OAK **Terry Steinbach** (34) in 1996, CHW **Carlton Fisk** (33) in 1985 and DET **Lance Parrish** (32) in 1982...69.4 pct. (43 of 62) of his hits this season have gone for extra bases and 50.0 pct. (31 of 62) have been homers...min. 200 AB, his 9.84 AB/HR ratio leads the majors over SD **Fernando Tatis Jr.** (10.85).

- + He has 4 HR in his last 7 games and 10 HR in his last 23 games.
- + Rays catchers lead the majors with 37 HR, 91 RBI and 63 XBH.

LAST APP—On Mon at TOR, suffered a fifth loss after allowing a season-high-tying 7 ER in 2.1 IP of relief...matched his most runs allowed in a relief app in his career, joining April 24, 2019 vs. KC...inherited 2-on, 1-out from opener **Collin McHugh** in the 3rd inning and walked his first batter faced before recording a pop out and a fielder's choice...yielded five straight 1-out hits in the 4th, leading to 5 runs...allowed 3 runs in the 5th, including a **Bo Bichette** solo homer, and replaced after a **Breyvic Valera** RBI single...his line: L, 2.1 IP, 10 H, 7 R, 1 BB, 1 SO, 1 HR, 77 pitches, 46 str.

- + His avg. cutter velocity was 78.9 mph, down 2.4 mph from his season avg., and he did not record a whiff on 13 swings against it.
- + Has yielded 14 runs in his last 4.1 IP, the first Ray with back-to-back apps of 7 runs (or more) since **Alex Cobb** from Sep 21-27, 2016.

SECOND HALF SLUMP—Is 2-2 with a 7.50 ERA (42-IP, 35-ER) in 9 apps (7 starts) since the All-Star break, and opponents are batting .311/.344/.514 (55-for-177) against him over that span...to compare, pitched to a 4.30 ERA (96.1-IP, 46-ER) in 18 apps (13 starts) in the first half of the season...his 7.50 ERA since the All-Star break ranks as the 6th-highest in the majors...has allowed 5 runs (or more) in five of his last 9 apps, and 8 hits (or more) four times...min. 40 IP, his second-half ERA is the 3rd-highest in club history, trailing **Jeff Niemann** (7.69) in 2010 and **Travis Harper** (7.59) in 2002.

IN CONTROL—Min. 125 IP, ranks among AL leaders this season in BB/9 IP ratio (1.69, 2nd) and SO/BB ratio (4.08, 9th)...has issued 1 BB (or fewer) in 19 of his 27 apps this season, and has not allowed more than 2 BB since July 30, 2020 at ATL (3)...has thrown first-pitch strikes to 68.4 pct. of batters faced over his last 10 apps (8 starts), up from 62.6 pct. to start the season...since 2019, has thrown first-pitch strikes to 65.5 pct. of batters faced, tied for 10th in the majors (min. 300 IP)...has issued just 7 BB in his last 8 apps (6 starts) spanning 36.1 IP, including a streak of 15 IP without one from the 2nd inning on July 31 vs. BOS through the 1st inning on Aug 25 at PHI.

- + Since entering the league in 2018, his 1.19 WHIP ranks 7th in the AL (min. 400 IP)...ranks 2nd in franchise history in WHIP behind **David Price** (1.14) and 2nd with a 3.66 SO/BB ratio (min. 400 IP).

vs. TIGERS—Is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.1-IP, 0-ER) in two career apps (1 start) against them, both coming at Tropicana Field...last faced them on Aug 17, 2019 when he took no decision despite pitching 6.1 scoreless innings with a career-high 10 SO...faced one over the minimum in his first 4 IP, with a hit batter in the 1st inning and a 4th-inning single which was erased by a double play grounder...pitched around a 1-out double in the 5th, retiring his next 6 BF before another 1-out double in the 7th, his last batter faced.

- + Is one of two clubs among the 21 opponents he has faced in his career to not allow a run against, along with the Mariners (8.2 IP).
- + Has held the Tigers to a .129 opp avg. (4-for-31) in his 2 apps.

KING OF WEAK CONTACT—Since 2018, has allowed an avg. exit velocity of 84.4 mph, according to StatCast. 2nd-lowest in the majors over that stretch (min. 500 batted balls) behind LAD **Kenley Jansen** (84.2)...his career hard-hit rate (95+ mph) of 26.5 pct. is the best in the majors over that stretch...has ranked 6th or better in both of those categories in each of the last three seasons...ranks 1st in the majors this season in both categories, with an 84.4 mph avg. exit velocity and 27.1 pct. hard-hit rate.

CUT IT UP—Over the last three seasons (2019-21), has thrown his cutter for 38.6 pct. of his pitches, according to StatCast, the 3rd-highest rate in the majors (min. 2,500 pitches) behind COL/SEA/CLE **Bryan Shaw** (75.8 pct.) and HOU/CIN **Wade Miley** (45.9)...batters have an avg. exit velocity of 83.4 mph against his cutter since then, the 4th-lowest mark in the majors over that stretch (min. 100 batted balls)...has recorded 106 SO with the cutter over the last three seasons, 6th in the majors over that stretch.

TROUBLE AT THE TROP—Is 4-3 with a 5.05 ERA (66-IP, 37-ER) in 13 apps (9 starts) at Tropicana Field this season, including 3-3 with a 5.76 ERA (50-IP, 32-ER) as a starter...min. 50 IP, his 5.25 ERA at home is 11th-highest in the AL...is 16-12 with a 4.62 ERA (235.2-IP, 121-ER) in 51 career apps at Tropicana Field, including 4-9 with a 5.53 ERA (122-IP, 75-ER) in 22 starts.

- + Min. 60 IP, his 5.05 ERA at Tropicana Field this season is the highest by a Ray since **Scott Kazmir** posted a 6.89 ERA at home in 2009.

- + His 19 HR rank 3rd in club history among rookies behind Evan Longoria (27) in 2008 and Jonny Gomes (21) in 2005...has 1 HR in 13 games in Sept.
- + Leads AL rookies in runs (87), hits (131), doubles (27), walks (48), avg. (.271), on-base pct. (.349) and on-base plus slugging (.806)...ranks 4th in RBI (65).
- + Made his first career Opening Day roster, a start in right field.
